Since May 8, Mariners starters are 24-8 (.750)...their .750 winning percentage is the best in the Majors in that span, ranking ahead of Houston (.686/24-11).

The Mariners have won a season-high 7 consecutive games...the last time the Mariners won 8 consecutive games was Sept. 7-14, 2016...Seattle's current 7-game winning streak is the longest active streak in the Majors.

The Mariners are 2nd in the Majors with 8 starts of at least 8.0 innings pitched this season, trailing Cleveland (10)...Mike Leake and James Paxton have each made 3 such starts, followed by Marco Gonzales and Félix Hernández with 1 apiece.

The Mariners are a season-high 23 games over .500 at 54-31...with a win tonight, Seattle would be 24 games over .500 for the first time since being 93-69 (.574) at the end of the 2003 season.

Dee Gordon enters tonight's game with 299 career stolen bases, 1 steal shy of becoming the 3rd active player (currently on a 25-man roster) with at least 300 career stolen bases: Jose Reyes (516) and Rajai Davis (410).

VS. ANGELS

The Mariners and Angels meet for the 7th (4-2) of 19 games this season...the Mariners went 1-2 in the first series (5/4-6) before sweeping a 3-game series from the Halos, June 11-13...these two clubs will play their final 3 head-to-head series in Anaheim: July 10-12, July 27-29 and Sept. 13-16:

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 10-day, 9-game homestand with the first of 3 games vs. Los Angeles-AL...began the homestand with a 3-game sweep of Kansas City...will also face Colorado (3 G) on this homestand...went 5-5 on a recently-concluded 11-day, 10-game, 3-city road trip to New York-AL (0-3), Boston (1-2) and Baltimore (4-0)...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners have won a season-high 7 straight games and are 8-6 over their last 13 contests...they have won 14 of their last 21 games, 21 of their last 30, 25 of their last 36, 30 of their last 42 and 32 of their last 46...Seattle is 40-20 in its last 60 games, 45-23 over its last 68 games and 50-27 in its last 77 games...Seattle is 16-14 during the day and 38-17 at night...Seattle is 28-14 at Safeco Field, 26-17 on the road.

- **Corner of Edgar & Dave** - the Mariners are 28-14 (.667) at Safeco Field this season, the 4th-best home winning percentage in the Majors...they trail New York-AL (.705/31-13), Boston (.700/28-12) and Cleveland (.675/27-13), while ranking ahead of San Francisco (.650/26-14)...the Mariners have won 12 of their last 14 home games (5/31-c) and are 19-4 at home since May 18.
- **Get Used to It** - nine of the Mariners next 20 games will be against the Los Angeles Angels...the Mariners begin a 3-game series vs. the Halos tonight at Safeco Field, which marks the final meeting between these clubs in Seattle this season...the Mariners will travel to Anaheim for a 3-game series July 10-12 and again July 27-29...Seattle will also travel to Anaheim during the final road trip of the regular season...the Mariners (54-31) currently lead the Angels (43-42) by 11 games for the 2nd AL Wild Card.
- **Multi-Hit Madness - Jean Segura** is tied for the Major League lead with 35 multi-hit games, along with Nick Markakis-ATL...Segura leads the Majors with 15 games of 3+ hits, ahead of Nicholas Castellanos-DET (12) and Francisco Lindor-CLE (12).
- **First Things First - Dee Gordon** is batting .329 (23x70) when leading off a game this season.
- **Four Score** - The Mariners are 39-10 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 15-21 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- **Series Stuff** - the Mariners have won or tied 23 of their first 28 series, posting a series record of 17-5-6.

ELECTRIC EDDIE...Edwin Díaz leads the Majors with 32 saves, while ranking 2nd among all relievers with 71 strikeouts (Josh Hader-MIL, 81)...Díaz is the 2nd pitcher in Major League history with at least 30 saves and 70 strikeouts prior to the All-Star Break, joining Eric Gagne-LAD in 2003 (31 SV, 76 K)...Díaz's 32 saves are tied for 2nd-most all-time in a club's first 85 games of a season (also: Mariano Rivera-NYY, 2004), trailing only Francisco Rodriguez-LAA, 34, 2008)...of Díaz's 32 saves, 20 have come in one-run games, most in the Majors this season (Craig Kimbrel-BOS, 11)...his 20 one-run saves are only 3 shy of equaling the Major League single-season record, set by Rodriguez in 2008 (23)...the Mariners are 40-0 when Díaz enters with a lead this season, including 22-0 when he enters with a 1-run lead...Díaz is 20-for-22 in 1-run save opportunities (90.9%) with a 0.81 ERA (2 ER, 22.1 IP) with 40 strikeouts and 5 walks.

CLOSE CALLS...with Sunday's 1-0 win against the Royals, the Mariners are now 26-11 (.703) in one-run games this season...the Mariners lead the Majors in one-run wins, while ranking T1st in one-run games played (also: Tampa Bay) and 2nd in one-run winning percentage (Philadelphia, .708/17-7)...Seattle's 26 one-run wins are tied with the 1979 Houston Astros for the most in a club's first 85 games of a season in Major League history (Elias Sports Bureau)...the Mariners have won 10 of their last 12 one-run games (6/1-c) and are 17-4 in one-run games since May 18.

ONE IS ALL IT TAKES...the Mariners improved to 5-0 this season in 1-0 games with Sunday's 1-0 win over Kansas City...the Mariners 5 wins in 1-0 outcomes are tops in the Majors in 2018, ranking ahead of Pittsburgh (4), Tampa Bay (3), San Francisco (3) and Kansas City (3)...in club history, only one Mariners club has won more 1-0 games than the 2018 squad: 2012 (6)...since 1968, the Mariners are only the 4th club to have five 1-0 wins in their first 85 games of a season, joining the 1984 Astros, 1991 Astros and the 2011 Twins.

FOR STARTERS...Mariners starting pitchers have combined to for 500.0 innings pitched this season, 3rd-most by a team's starting staff...they trail only Houston (536.1 IP) and Cleveland (523.1 IP), while ranking ahead of Boston (496.0 IP) and Washington (483.1 IP)...four Mariners have already eclipsed the 100.0-inning plateau: James Paxton (111.2 IP), Mike Leake (107.2 IP), Marco Gonzales (100.1 IP) and Félix Hernández (100.1 IP)...the Mariners are one of two clubs with at least 4 pitchers with at least 100.0 innings pitched apiece, joining Houston (Gerrit Cole, Dallas Keuchel, Lance McCullers Jr., Charlie Morton and Justin Verlander)...Paxton ranks T6th in the American League (also: Cole) in innings pitched...this marks the 8th season in club history in which at least 4 Mariners pitchers reached 100.0 innings before the All-Star Break and the first since 2011 (Hernández, Doug Fister, Michael Pineda and Jason Vargas)...those 8 seasons include 2 years in which 5 Mariners entered the All-Star Break with 100+ innings pitched: 2003 and 2006.

BENNY WITH THE JETS...in 33 games since May 16, Ben Gamel is batting .373 (38x102) with 13 runs, 7 doubles, 2 triples, 1 home run, 7 RBI, 2 HBP, 9 walks, 4 stolen bases, a .434 on-base percentage and a .510 slugging percentage (.943 OPS)...among all players with at least 100 plate appearances during that span, Gamel leads the Majors in batting, while ranking 8th in on-base percentage...after entering play on April 29 with a .107 (3x28) batting average and a .167 on-base percentage, he is now batting .300 (48x160) with a .371 on-base percentage.

AMONG THE BEST...since May 8, the Mariners have a .673 (35-17) winning percentage, which puts them in a virtual tie with Houston (.673/33-16) for the best winning percentage in the Majors over that span...the Mariners rank ahead of New York-AL (.625/30-18), Boston (.615/32-20), Atlanta (.600/30-20), Chicago-NL (30-20/.600) and Milwaukee (.600/30-20) over that stretch...the Mariners 35 wins are the most in the Majors since May 8, ranking ahead of the Astros (33-16)...the Mariners join the Astros, Red Sox and Yankees as the only American League clubs with a .600 winning percentage since May 8.

AS YOU KNOW...the Mariners have won five 1-0 games this season, including Sunday's victory over the Royals...AND AS YOU MAY KNOW...Mariners closer Edwin Díaz has notched a save in each of the club's 1-0 wins this season, including Sunday when he struck out the side in the 9th...BUT DID YOU KNOW?...in the five 1-0 wins Edwin has saved this season, he's thrown five 1-2-3 9th innings, striking out 14 of the 15 batters he's faced?...in those 5 appearances, Edwin has struck out 14 consecutive batters since Chicago's Wellington Castillo grounded out to begin the 9th in Seattle's 1-0 win April 24 at the White Sox.

ABOUT LEBLANC...

- 33-year-old left-hander is making his 17th appearance and 12th start of the season, his 193rd career appearance, 91st career start and 2nd start (2nd appearance) vs. the Angels tonight.
Signed with Seattle on March 25 after being released by New York-AL at his request.
Previously played with Seattle in 2016...acquired on June 22, 2016 from Toronto in exchange for a player to be named later or cash considerations...was traded to Pittsburgh on Sept. 13, 2016 in exchange for a player to be named later or cash considerations.
Selected by San Diego in the 2nd round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft.
Native of Lake Charles, LA...attended Alfred M. Barbe High School.
Made his Major League debut with the Padres on Sept. 3, 2008 at Los Angeles-NL (L,4,0,8,5,5,3,1,HR-2).
Pitched for the University of Alabama, 2004-06...was 24-9 with a 2.81 ERA (100 ER, 320.1 IP) and 334 strikeouts in 46 career G/45 GS...holds Alabama's all-time record for strikeouts with 334...National Freshman of the Year (Baseball America) and SEC Freshman of the Year in 2004 after going 8-4 with a 2.08 ERA (26 ER, 112.2 IP) with 98 strikeouts in 16 G/15 GS while posting 8 complete games, including 2 shutouts.
Went 2-5 with a 4.23 ERA (21 ER, 44.2 IP) in 8 starts with the Seibu Lions in the Japan Pacific League in 2015.
Is 4-4 with a 4.15 ERA (37 ER, 80.1 IP) in 29 career games/9 starts in July.

LAST OUTING...did not factor into the decision in the Mariners 8-7 extra-innings win in Baltimore on June 27...allowed 4 runs (3 earned) on 7 hits and 0 walks while striking out 2 batters across 5.2 innings pitched...surrendered a two-run homer to Danny Valencia in the 1st inning; 2 runs (1 earned) scored on a Mark Trumbo single in the 3rd...retired 8 of the last 9 batters he faced.

FOR STARTERS...since moving into the Mariners rotation on May 3, is 3-0 with a 3.09 ERA (20 ER, 58.1 IP) with 44 strikeouts and 12 walks in 11 starts...the Mariners are 8-3 in those 11 starts...among American League leaders during that span, ranks 4th in BB/9.0 IP (1.85/12 BB, 58.1 IP), 12th in ERA (3.09) and 12th in K/BB (3.67/44 K, 12 BB).

START IT UP...in 19 career starts with the Mariners, is 6-0 with a 3.67 ERA (42 ER, 103.0 IP) with 78 strikeouts and 21 walks...the Mariners are 15-4 in his 19 starts with the club...made 8 starts with Seattle in 2016, going 3-0 with a 4.43 ERA (22 ER, 44.2 IP) with 34 strikeouts and 9 walks.

HE'S A WINNER...has made 19 career starts with the Mariners without suffering a loss...only 1 American League pitcher in the live-ball era has had a longer such streak to begin a tenure with a single club (Whitey Ford-NYY, 22, 7/6/50-6/12/53)...among all pitchers in the live-ball era, LeBlanc's streak trails only Ford and Kirk Rueter-MON (22, 7/7/93-6/15/94)(STATS).

AS A RELIEVER...is 0-0 with a 4.61 ERA (7 ER, 13.2 IP) in 5 relief appearances this season...tossed a season-high 4.2 innings of relief in a 4-10 Mariners loss on April 23 at Chicago-AL...limited the White Sox to 2 runs on 6 hits while striking out 6 after entering the game with the Mariners trailing 0-8 in the 4th inning.

WELCOME (BACK) TO SEATTLE...signed with Seattle on March 25 after being released by New York-AL at his request...became the 43rd player in club history to have spent at least two different stints with the Mariners...Mike Blowers (1992-95, 1997, 1999), Raúl Ibañez (1996-2000, 2004-2008, 2013), Norm Charlton (1993, 1995-97, 2001) and Jeff Nelson (1992-95, 2001-03, 2005) are the only players who spent three separate stints with the Mariners.

2017 SEASON...went 5-2 with 1 save and 4 holds in 50 appearances (0 starts) with a 4.50 ERA (34 ER, 68.0 IP), 54 strikeouts and 17 walks with Pittsburgh...held right-handed batters to a .217 (38x175) batting average against with a .270 on-base percentage and a .389 slugging percentage (.658 OPS against).

LAST TIME AROUND...appeared in 11 games (8 starts) with the Mariners in 2016, going 3-0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (25 ER, 50.0 IP)...was 3-0 with a 4.43 ERA (22 ER, 44.2 IP), 34 strikeouts and 5 quality starts in 8 starts with the Mariners...held opponents scoreless in 2 of his 3 relief appearances...went 0-0-1 with a 5.06 ERA (3 ER, 5.1 IP) with 7 strikeouts in 3 relief appearances.

IT HAD BEEN A WHILE...in his Mariners debut on June 24, 2016, LeBlanc made his first Major League appearance since Sept. 28, 2014 at Seattle with Los Angeles-AL, a span of 634 days between appearances...LeBlanc made his first ML start since Sept. 23, 2014 at Oakland with Los Angeles-AL, a span of 639 days between starts.

FIRST SEATTLE WIN...earned his first win with Seattle on July 1, 2016, vs. Baltimore (6,0,3,2,2,1,5,HR-1), his first Major League win since Sept. 23, 2014, with the Angels at the A's, a span of 646 days between Major League wins.

IN JAPAN...spent the 2015 season with the Seibu Lions in the Japan Pacific League...went 2-5 with a 4.23 ERA (21 ER, 44.2 IP) in 8 starts...tossed his second career complete game on April 2, 2015 at Rakuten Golden Eagles, allowing 2 earned runs on 2 hits 9.0 innings (also: 4/25/14 at Reno w/Salt Lake).

CAREER...10-year MLB veteran with 7 clubs (San Diego, Miami, Houston, Los Angeles-AL, New York-AL, Pittsburgh & Seattle)...overall, is 33-35-3 with a 4.29 ERA (309 ER, 648.2 IP) in 192 career appearances/90 starts...in 90 career starts, is 25-31 with a 4.38 ERA (237 ER, 487.1 IP) with 338 strikeouts and 159 walks...in 102 career relief appearances, is 8-4-3 with a 4.02 ERA (72 ER, 161.1 IP) with 125 strikeouts and 43 walks...appeared in 11 games (8 starts) with the Mariners in 2016, going 3-0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (25 ER, 50.0 IP).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: RHP MIKE LEAKE (8-4, 4.01 ERA)

30-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 18th start of the season tomorrow vs. Los Angeles-AL...has thrown 7.0+ innings in 7 of his 17 starts this season, including 3 outings of 8.0 innings...no decision in his last start, a 4-2 Mariners extra-inning win at BAL on 6/28 (7.0,5,2,2,1,6,HR-2)...went 4-0 with a 2.63 ERA (14 ER, 48.0 IP), 28 strikeouts and 5 walks over 7 games from May 10 to June 12...2017: Went 10-13 with a 3.92 ERA (81 ER, 186.0 IP) in 31 starts combined between St. Louis (4/7-8/26) and Seattle (9/1-24)...went 3-1 with a 2.53 ERA (9 ER, 32.0 IP) in 5 starts with the Mariners after being acquired by Seattle on Aug. 30...CAREER: In 9 Major League seasons with Cincinnati (2010-15), San Francisco (2015), St. Louis (2016-17) and Seattle (2017-c), is 91-81 with a 3.98 ERA (688 ER, 1554.0 IP) with 1,051 strikeouts and 366 walks in 255 career games (250 starts)...is 1 of 4 pitchers to make at least 30 starts in every season from 2012-17 (also: Ian Kennedy, Jon Lester and Max Scherzer)...originally signed by Cincinnati with the 8th overall pick of the 2009 MLB Draft out of Arizona State University...vs. LAA: Is 3-1 with a 2.49 ERA (7 ER, 25.1 IP) in 4 career starts vs. Los Angeles-AL...is 1-1 with a 3.18 ERA (4 ER, 11.1 IP) in 2 starts against the Angels in 2018.
