MIAMI MARLINS (63-98) 2018 SEASON SUMMARY

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH

Marlins fans saw the Major League debuts of 10 Marlins in 2018, which was tied with Kansas City for the ninth-most individual debuts among Major League teams. The Angels and Padres led with 16, while on the opposite end the Indians, Dodgers and Mariners each saw just two players make their first career appearance. The 10 debuts this season tied the 1996 Marlins for the sixth-most in a single season in Franchise history. The 2010 Marlins saw 16 players make their debut, followed by 1998 (14), 2013 (11), 2006 (11), and 2005 (11). Miami called on the services of 24 rookies, which ranks as the second-most rookies used in a single season in Club history. The only Marlins team to use more was the 1998 squad that set a Major League record with 27.

YOUTHFUL EXUBERANCE

Miami began the season with the third-youngest active roster among all Major League teams, and at season's end had the fourth-youngest roster (not including DL players) with an average age of 27 years, 115 days. The San Diego Padres had the youngest at 26.259, followed by Baltimore (27.011), and Tampa Bay (27.104). - *Stats LLC*

YOUNG GUNS

Of the Marlins' 63 wins this season, 25 were recorded by rookie pitchers (39.7 pct.). The 25 wins by rookies were tied with San Diego for second-most in the National League, and fourth in the Majors, behind Tampa Bay (42), the Angels (28), and Atlanta (26). Overall, 10 different rookies earned a win in 2018. The 10 different rookies to record a win were tied with the Braves for second-most in the Majors, and is also tied with four other teams for sixth-most in a single season in MLB history. The 2018 Rays, '17 Reds, '07 Yankees, '03 Tigers, and '02 Padres each had 11. - *Stats LLC*

PLAYING UNDER THE STARS

The Marlins played with the roof open at Marlins Park a franchise-record 20 times in 2018, posting an 11-9 record when doing so. The previous high for most games with the roof open was in 2013, when the Marlins played under open skies 14 times. Since 2012, the Marlins are 29-41 when playing with the roof open.

S.O.S = STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

Miami faced the seventh-most difficult schedule in 2018, fourth-hardest among National League teams, as determined by *Elias*. Miami's opponents played to a .512 winning percentage this season. Baltimore faced the toughest (.528), followed by Texas (.520), Cincinnati (.516), San Diego (.515), the Angels (.513), and San Francisco (.513). Miami played .500-or-better against three 2018 playoff teams: 4-2 vs. Colorado, 4-2 vs. the Dodgers, and 2-2 vs. the Yankees.

FALL/WINTER BALL

Miami will have seven representatives playing for the Salt River Rafters in the Arizona Fall League, which will begin play on October 9. OF Monte Harrison, Miami's top prospect, will be joined by INF Bryson Brigman (no. 26), RHP Tommy Eveld, RHP Kyle Keller, OF Brian Miller (no. 11), RHP Chad Smith, and RHP Jordan Yamamoto (no. 16). The Marlins will also have several players participating in various winter leagues. The Marlins Communications Department will send out weekly updates tracking the progress of each of the Marlins winter league participants.

MARLINS ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

Brian Anderson finished his first full Major League campaign leading all qualifying National League rookies in games played (156), at-bats (590), runs (87), hits (161), doubles (34), multi-hit games (46), average with runners in scoring position (.367), batting average (.273), on-base percentage (.357), and slugging percentage (.400). He ranked second in RBI (65), walks (62), and extra-base hits (49); tied for third in triples (4); and tied for sixth in home runs (11).

- His 161 hits were the most by a Marlins rookie since Chris Coghlan in 2009 (162). Only Hanley Ramirez (185 in 2006), Jeff Conine (174 in 1993), and Dan Uggla (172 in 2006) had more hits in their rookie season with the Club.
- His 87 runs ranked as the third-most all-time among Marlins rookies behind Hanley Ramirez (119 in 2006) and Dan Uggla (105 in 2006). His average with RISP ranked as the third-highest by a rookie in Club history, behind Miguel Cabrera (.375; 2003) and Kevin Millar (.367 in 1999).

HIT TO THE NINES

With 165 hits this season, **Starlin Castro** reached the 130 hit mark for the ninth time in his Major League career. He joined a list of five others who debuted in the last 20 years to record 130+ hits in each of his first nine Major League seasons. See list at right provided by *Stats LLC*. He established a career high with 48 walks and had his most runs scored (76) since '12 (78).

Casto's 165 hits were his most since recording 183 in 2012, and ranked second among Major League second basemen in total hits, behind Scooter Gennett (178). He was tied with DJ LeMahieu and Yoan Moncada for second among Major League second basemen in doubles (32) and ranked fourth among qualifying second basemen in average (.280).

Additionally, he has collected at least 10 home runs for the eighth straight season, making him one of 18 players to reach the plateau in each season since 2011. Only two other middle infielders have accomplished the feat - Asdrubal Cabrera and Ian Kinsler.

FOR LOVE OF COUNTRY

With his first home run of the season on May 5 at Cincinnati, **Starlin Castro** became the 38th Dominican-born player in Major League history to record 100 career home runs and 500 RBI, doing so in 1,186 career games. Among the 38 players to accomplish those feats, he was one of 13 active players. Albert Pujols, who reached the 3,000-hit club on May 4, leads all Dominican players with 633 career home runs and 1,982 RBI. Adrian Beltre ranks second with 477 HR and 1,707 RBI.

CHEN'S REMARKABLE HOME SEASON

Wei-Yin Chen provided one of the best home seasons in Club history in 2018. He ranked second among National League starters (fourth in MLB) with a 1.62 ERA (78.0/14) at home (min. 10 GS). Only Blake Snell (1.27), Jacob deGrom (1.54), and Ryne Stanek finished with lower marks. His home ERA ranked as the fourth-lowest in a single season in Franchise history (min. 10 GS). José Fernández posted a 1.19 ERA in 2013, followed by Josh Johnson (1.57 in 2010), and Henderson Alvarez (1.60 in 2014).

Chen finished his home season with just 51 hits allowed over 13 starts (78.0 ip), marking the fifth-fewest hits allowed at home in Club history (min. 10 GS) in a single season, tied with Josh Beckett (2002) and Tony Saunders (1997). Liván Hernández allowed 47 in 10 starts in 1997; Al Leiter allowed 48 over 12 starts in '97; A.J. Burnett surrendered 49 hits in 11 starts in 2004; and **Dan Straily** gave up 50 in 11 starts this season.

He allowed 5.88 hits per 9.0 innings at home, the fourth-lowest average in Marlins history. José Fernández held opponents to 5.14 hits/9.0 in 2013, and he is followed by Al Leiter with a 5.17 mark in 1996 and 5.76 mark in 1997. His .185 average against at home ranked as the third lowest, behind Fernández (.164 in '13) and Leiter (.168 in '96).

Of his 13 starts at Marlins Park, he limited opponents to one-or-zero runs 10 times. He allowed a season-high four runs twice (June 11 vs. SF and August 12 vs. NYM), and three runs once (July 24 vs. ATL).

ON THE MOUND

The 2018 Marlins pitching staff combined to strikeout 1,249 batters, the second-highest single-season total in franchise history, behind only the 2016 staff that recorded 1,379. Miami's strikeouts-per-9.0 rate of 7.80 and strikeout percentage of 20.0 marked the second-highest rates in Club history, again trailing the 2016 staff that had marks of 8.65 and 22.4, respectively.

STARTING OFF

The Marlins starting rotation completed the 2018 campaign by allowing the fewest hits and owning the lowest hits-per-9.0-innings rate in franchise history (not including strike shortened seasons) with marks of 763 and 8.22, respectively. Prior to this season, Marlins starters had allowed fewer than 900 hits just twice; 848 in 2017 and 866 in 2016. Miami's rotation allowed just 1,127 baserunners, the fewest in franchise history, while its baserunners/9.0 of 12.14 ranked sixth. Additionally, starters recorded a strikeout/9.0 rate of 7.67, second to only 2016, while their 20.1 strikeout percentage also ranked second to '16 (21.5).

IN THE FIELD

As a team, Miami committed just 83 errors this season, the fourth-fewest in a single season in Club history, trailing 2017 (73), 2015 (77), and 2003 (78). Marlins fielders posted a .986 fielding percentage, also ranking as the fourth-best in franchise history, behind '17 (.988), '15 (.987), and '03 (.987).

GOING STREAKING

Marlins rookie third baseman **Brian Anderson** hit safely in each of his first seven games to start the season, a streak that was snapped on April 7 at Philadelphia. His streak was one shy of the Franchise record for a season-opening hitting streak by a rookie, behind eight-game runs from Hanley Ramirez (2006) and Alejandro De Aza (2007). *See chart at right.*

GOING STREAKING II

Starlin Castro hit safely in each of his first eight games to start the season and his Marlins career. The eight-game run marked the longest hitting streak to start a Marlins career since Alejandro De Aza (8 gms) in 2007, and he became just the fifth Marlins player to collect such a streak. *See chart at right.*

CAUGHT IN THEIR TRACKS

Miami catchers led the National League and ranked second in the Majors with a 41.2 caught stealing percentage (42 caught stealing/102 stolen base attempts). The Angels led baseball with a 41.8 mark (33 CS/79 SBA). The Marlins caught stealing percentage ranked as the fourth-best in Club history, behind 1994 (46.8), 1997 (42.4), and 1999 (41.6). **Bryan Holaday** owned the third-best caught stealing percentage among players with a minimum of 50 games played at 44.7, behind Martin Maldonado (48.6) and Salvador Perez (48.1). Teammate **J.T. Realmuto** ranked sixth among catchers with a 38.2 mark. Holaday's caught stealing percentage ranked as the sixth-highest in Franchise history, and highest since Matt Treanor in 2006 (47.1). Holaday trailed Charles Johnson (47.6 in 1999), Johnson (47.5 in '97), Benito Santiago (47.1 in '94), Treanor, and Jorge Fabregas (44.8 in '98).

DOC HOLADAY

On April 5 at Philadelphia, the Phillies successfully stole three bases against **Bryan Holaday** before he caught César Hernández trying to steal third. Holaday then proceeded to throw out nine consecutive baserunners to mark the longest catcher caught stealing streak in Club history. The previous Club record was seven, done by Benito Santiago in 1994. The nine consecutive baserunners caught stealing were the most since Miguel Montero caught nine-straight in August 2011. - *Stats LLC*

SPEAKING OF CATCHERS

J.T. Realmuto turned in one of the finest offensive seasons ever by a Marlins catcher, batting .273 (118x433) with 68 runs scored, 28 doubles, three triples, 18 home runs, and 63 RBI when behind the plate. The 2018 National League All-Star tallied the second-most home runs ever by a Marlins catcher, one shy of Charles Johnson's Club record done in 1997. His offensive totals were the highest by a Marlins backstop since Pudge Rodriguez in 2003, when he hit .300 (150x500) with 89 runs scored, 35 doubles, three triples, 16 home runs and 82 RBI. Overall this season, Realmuto with a .277 (132x477) average, 74 runs scored, 30 doubles, three triples, 21 home runs and 74 RBI in 125 games. Miami went 9-0 in first nine games that he homered in 2018, which tied the longest season-opening winning streak when an individual homers in Club history (also, Josh Willingham in 2007, Mike Lowell in 2004). - *Elias*

GETTING REAL

In his first seven games following reinstatement from the DL, **J.T. Realmuto** connected for four home runs. Only one player in Marlins history, Miguel Cabrera in 2004, recorded more homers over his first seven games of a season. Realmuto tied Alex Gonzalez (2003), Cliff Floyd (2001 & 1998), and Jeff Conine (1995 & '94) for the second-most through a player's first seven games of a season. - *Stats LLC*

STARTING WITH(OUT) A BANG

Jarlin García made his debut as a starter on April 11 vs. the Mets, tossing 6.0 scoreless innings without allowing a hit. He went on a record-setting run over his first five starts of the season, combining to allow just nine runs. The nine runs allowed through five starts is tied for the third fewest by any Marlins starter, behind Anibal Sánchez (6) and Michael Tejera (8). A list of his accomplishments as a starter follows:

- Limited opponents to just 10 hits over his four starts this season, marking the fewest hits allowed over a pitcher's first four career starts in Marlins history. Brad Hand previously held the record, limiting opponents to 13 hits over his first four starts in 2011. There had been only three pitchers since 1996 to allow fewer hits over their first four career starts than García; Cory Rasmus (6 in 2014), Andrew Cashner (7 in 2011-12), and Archie Bradley (9 in 2015). Only 10 pitchers total have allowed fewer hits in their first four career starts dating back to 1913. - *Stats LLC*
- Over his first four career starts, limited opponents to a total of two runs. It was the fewest allowed by a Marlins' starter over his first four career starts, besting Anibal Sánchez, who allowed five over his first four starts in 2006. García became just the seventh pitcher since 1913 to allow two-or-fewer runs over his first four combined starts, tying Hector Carrasco (2000-05), Kyle Davies (2005) and Boo Ferriss (1945) with two. The only pitchers to allow fewer were Kenta Maeda (1 in 2016), Jorge Campillo (1 from 2005-08) and Fernando Valenzuela (1 in 1981). Valenzuela holds the record for fewest runs allowed over a pitcher's first five career starts, giving up just one. - *Stats LLC*
- Became first pitcher in Club history with four-or-fewer hits and one-or-zero runs in each of his first three career starts; first pitcher in MLB to do so since fellow southpaw Eduardo Rodriguez in 2015. - *Elias*
- Five hits combined over his first three career starts was lowest total in Club history, besting Brad Hand (2011), Josh Beckett (2001), Josh Johnson (2005-'06), and Vladimir Nunez (1999), who all had nine. García was the first starter in MLB to have five-or-fewer combined hits over first three career starts since Cory Rasmus in 2014, and first lefty since Tom Fordham in 1997-98. - *Elias*
- Had not allowed a run over his first 14.0 innings as a starter, a streak snapped by Kiké Hernández's fourth-inning on April 23 at Dodger Stadium.
- In his first career start, tossed 6.0 no-hit innings, April 11 against the Mets at Marlins Park, becoming the only pitcher in Marlins history to go as many as 6.0 innings in his starting debut without allowing a hit (*Elias*) and the first Major League pitcher to throw 6.0-or-more no-hit innings in his first career start since Ross Stripling of the Dodgers on April 18, 2016 at San Francisco (7.1 ip).
- In his second start, held the Yankees hitless until a one-out double in the fifth, finishing with 5.0 scoreless innings and just the one hit allowed. Snapped a streak of 38 consecutive batters faced without allowing a hit.
- According to *Elias*, his 10.0 IP hitless streak to begin his career as a starting pitcher tied the Modern Era (since 1900) record (also the St. Louis Browns' Bobo Holloman, 10.0 IP in May 1953, which included a 9.0-inning no-hitter in his first career start on 5/6/53 vs. Philadelphia. Holloman had made four prior career relief appearances).
- Additionally, according to *Elias*, García's 10.0-inning hitless streak was tied for the second-longest in Marlins history (Armando Benitez-11.0 IP in Aug.-Sept. 2004; Al Leiter-10.0 IP in May 1996; Kevin Brown-10.0 IP in June '97; and Anibal Sanchez-10.0 IP in Sept. '06).

THE WEEK THAT WAS

Over a seven-game stretch from April 22-29, Marlins starters allowed two-or-fewer runs in each game, and one-or-zero in each of the final six.

- The seven consecutive starts with two-or-fewer runs allowed tied the fourth-longest such streak in Club history, last done from April 22-28, 2015.
- The six straight games with one-or-fewer runs allowed by starters tied the third-longest streak in Club history, equaling a six-game run from August 9-14, 2005.

ELIAS SAYS

Miguel Rojas stroked a two-out single off Brandon Morrow in the 17th inning to send home the long-awaited winning run as the Marlins nipped the Cubs, 2-1, on March 30. In a game that produced 34 strikeouts but only 20 hits, the features were the extra-inning relief performances of Miami's **Jarlin García** (six innings, no runs) and Chicago's Eddie Butler (seven innings, one run). That night's game was the first in the Majors in which each team used a relief pitcher for at least six innings since a Marlins-Mets game on June 8, 2013, when Miami's Kevin Slowey pitched seven innings and New York's Shaun Marcum went eight.

Prior to that night, the only instance in Major League history of teams playing a game as long as 17 innings in either their first or second game of a season came on April 9, 1969, when the Royals defeated the Twins, 4-3, in 17 innings in what was the second game of the season for each team (and the second in franchise history for the Royals).

THE SERIES THAT DIDN'T END

The first three games of Miami's season-opening series against the Cubs lasted a total of 36 innings; 17 on March 30 and 10 on March 31. The last time two teams played as many as 36 innings over the first three games of the season was when Cleveland and Toronto went for 37 in 2012: their Opening Day tilt went 16 frames, game two went 12 and the finale went 9 (*Stats LLC*). The most innings the Marlins had played over the first three games of the season prior to this year was 31 in 2001 and '05.

EXTRA BASEBALL

The Marlins played a total of 76 innings over their first seven games of the season - including a 17-inning win on March 30 vs. the Cubs, a 10-inning loss on March 31 vs. the Cubs and a 13-inning loss on April 3 vs. Boston. It marked the most innings played by a team over their first seven games since 1982, when the then-California Angels played 83 innings, the Seattle Mariners went 81 innings and Oakland Athletics played 79 frames. Miami's 76 innings played were the most by a National League squad since 1968 when both the Astros and Mets played 78 innings in their first seven games. See chart at right.

SHUCKIN' IT UP

JB Shuck went 4x4 with a triple and two runs scored in his Marlins debut, April 13 vs. Pittsburgh. His first hit with Miami was a second-inning triple, becoming only the fourth player in Club history to record a triple in his first plate appearance with the team: the others were Andy Gonzalez (July 9, 2009 vs. Arizona), Darrell Whitmore (June 25, 1993 vs. Expos), and Walt Weiss (April 5, 1993 vs. Dodgers). In addition, he tied a franchise record for most hits in a Marlins debut, joining Emilio Bonifacio (April 6, 2009), Carlos Delgado (April 5, 2005), and Jeff Conine (April 5, 1993).

MIAMI 5-0

On April 13 vs. Pittsburgh, Miami scored its first five runs without the benefit of a run-producing hit (wild pitch, sac fly, error, error, sac bunt). The previous team to score its first five-plus runs in a game without the benefit of a run-scoring hit was the Los Angeles Angels on July 6, 2016 at Tampa (also first five runs in a 7-2 win: walk, fielder's choice, error, sac fly, sac fly). - *Elias*

LEWIS LONGBALL

On April 19 at Milwaukee, **Lewis Brinson** became the first Marlins player with a multi-HR game within his first 19 games with the club since Hanley Ramirez in 2016 (two HR in his 15th game).

BEAR-ING DOWN

Marlins reliever **Kyle Barraclough** earned the Hartford Presents National League Reliever of the Month honors for June. In 12 games during the month, Barraclough tossed 12.0 scoreless innings, went 7-for-7 in save chances, and allowed just one hit over 38 total batters faced (.028 average against). He and Dellin Betances both allowed just one hit in 36 at-bats, marking the lowest June opponent average in the Majors since 1913 (min. 35 BF). Their average against was the lowest by a MLB reliever over any calendar month since Craig Kimbrel had a .025 (1x40) in May 2017. Barraclough's average against in June was the fifth lowest by any NL reliever since 1913 (min. 35 BF), behind Brad Clontz (.024; 1x41 in April 1998), Jim Brewer (.027; 1x37 in April 1970), Todd Wellemeyer (.027; 1x37 in May 2005) and Carlos Torres (.027; 1x37 in July 2012). He became the first Marlins reliever to win a monthly award since Todd Jones in August 2005.

A COUPLE OF ZEROES

Kyle Barraclough (12.0 ip) and **Drew Steckenrider** (12.1) combined to toss 24.1 scoreless innings in the month of June. The pair were the first set of teammates to each toss 12.0-or-more scoreless innings in a calendar month since David Robertson (15.0) and Aroldis Chapman (12.0) in Sept. 2017. They became just the second pair since 1920 to do so in the month of June, joining Seattle's Charlie Furbush (17.0) and Tom Wilhelmsen (15.2) in 2012 (*Stats LLC*). Additionally, they became the seventh and eighth relievers (eighth and ninth time) in Club history to toss as many as 12.0 innings without allowing a run in a calendar month, joining Justin Wayne (April 2004, 12.0 ip), Robb Nen (May 1996, 14.0 & August 1995, 13.2), Chad Qualls (July 2013, 12.0), Brad Ziegler (August 2017, 13.0), Braden Loper (Sept. 2002, 15.0), and Clay Hensley (Sept. 2010, 12.2). Lastly, Steckenrider became the first pitcher in Club history to make 14-or-more appearances in a calendar month without allowing a run.

CEASE AND DESIST ORDERS

From the end of May to the beginning of July, **Kyle Barraclough** and **Drew Steckenrider** posted career-best scoreless inning streaks, as Barraclough tossed 20.2 scoreless, and Steckenrider hurled 19.2 consecutive scoreless frames. According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, it was the first time in Club history that two relief pitchers had active scoreless streaks of 14.0-plus innings at the same time.

EARLY RETIREMENT

Miami's bullpen recorded the third-longest consecutive batters retired streak in Club history by retiring 17 consecutive batters to finish out their game against Colorado on June 24, and the first five the following night against Arizona. The streak of 22 consecutive batters retired by the bullpen fell short of two 24-batter runs, one in 2013 and one in 2005. - *Stats LLC*

THE FIRST IS THE HARDEST

José Ureña earned his first win of the season on June 5 at St. Louis. The win snapped a 14-game stretch where the Marlins were winless when he started. The 14-game streak without a team win was the longest in Franchise history, as he passed Brian Moehler's stretch of 12 straight starts without a win from July 26, 2005-April 28, 2006. In addition, he snapped a seven-game slide to open the season, which was tied for the longest such streak in Franchise history, equaling that of Joe Fontenot in 1998 and Edinson Volquez in 2017.

CENTURY CLUB

With his eighth-inning single on June 12 vs. San Francisco, **Brian Anderson** reached the 100 hit mark for his career, doing so in his 92nd career game. He tied Chris Coghlan for the third-fewest games needed to reach 100 career hits by a Marlins rookie. Edgar Renteria needed just 81 games in 1996, and Dan Uggla 88 in 2006. He and Gaby Sanchez tied for the fourth-fewest at-bats needed to reach 100 career hits, doing so with just 335. Renteria needed just 327, followed by Jeff Conine (332), and Bruce Aven (324). - *Stats LLC*

THAT ROCKY MOUNTAIN AIR

Derek Dietrich finished Miami's three-game series against the Rockies from June 22-24 at Coors Field with eight hits in 13 at-bats, the most hits by a Marlins player in a three-game series since Giancarlo Stanton recorded eight against San Diego from August 25-27, 2017 at Marlins Park. The eight hits in a three-game series are tied for the third-highest hit total over a three-game series in Franchise history. Hanley Ramirez (August 24-26, 2010 at Mets) and Preston Wilson (May 11-13, 2001 at SD) each had 10, while five others have recorded nine.

SMALL STEP FOR MAN, GIANT LEAP FOR MIAMI

Sandy Alcántara earned his first Major League win in his first career start on June 29 vs. the Mets, and **Pablo López** followed suit the next day in his Major League debut. The pair became the first set of teammates to earn wins in their first career starts in consecutive days since April 9-10, 2012, when Yu Darvish and Neftalí Feliz each made their first career starts with the Rangers. The last National League team to have such a duo was the Reds on April 15-16, 1967 with Gary Nolan and Mel Queen. - *Stats LLC*

A SWIFT 0 to 100

Starlin Castro went 2x3 on July 4 vs. Tampa Bay and recorded his 100th hit of the season with a single to center in the sixth inning, doing so in his 87th game. It was the fifth-fastest by game that he reached the 100-hit mark in his career, behind 72 in 2011, 82 in 2017, and 85 in 2010 and '12. It marked the fourth-fastest in terms of at-bats (342), behind 2011 (308), 2010 (310) and 2017 (325). - *Stats LLC*

EXTRA-ORDINARY GROUP

On July 7 at Washington, **J.T. Realmuto** homered in the fourth inning to give him 35 extra-base hits on the season, reaching the mark in each of his first four full Major League seasons. According to *Stats LLC*, Realmuto became just the third catcher ever to accomplish the feat, joining Johnny Bench and Mike Piazza.

AT LONG LAST

According to research by the *Elias Sports Bureau*, **Isaac Galloway**, who had appeared in 947 career Minor League games at the time of his first Major League call-up on July 31, had the most career Minor League games played by a Marlin at the time of his Major League debut since Brian Daubach, who had 965 when he debuted on September 10, 1998.

- With his debut on July 31 at Atlanta, Galloway became the sixth-oldest player (28 years, 294 days) to make his MLB debut with the Marlins. Joe Strong was the oldest at 37 years, 245 days when he made his debut on May 11, 2000. Current coach Ed Lucas was second oldest at 31.009 when he debuted on May 30, 2013. The list continues with Chuck Smith (30.236 on June 13, 2000), Joe Dillon (29.289 on May 18, 2005) and Tommy Phelps (29.027 on March 31, 2003). - *Stats LLC*
- He became the 197th player (73rd position player) to make his MLB debut with the Marlins and the 35th to record his first Major League hit in his first plate appearance. - *Stats LLC*

URENA'S ARENA

With his strikeout of Aaron Knapp in the fifth inning of his August 4 start at Philadelphia, **José Ureña** recorded the 300th strikeout of his career. Ureña finished the season with 329 career strikeouts, marking the second-most by a Dominican-born player in Franchise history, behind Jesus Sánchez, who recorded 368 from 1998-2001. Ureña leads all Dominican pitchers in wins (28) and is tied with Sánchez for the most starts (80) in Franchise history.

DEAN DINGER

Austin Dean collected his first Major League hit on August 17 at Washington, a seventh-inning solo home run off Trevor Gott. Dean became the 11th Marlin in franchise history to homer for his first MLB hit, first since John Baker on July 10, 2008 at Dodger Stadium. Dean was recalled from Triple-A New Orleans on August 15 and made his Major League debut that night, starting in left field, becoming the ninth Miami player to make his Major League debut in 2018.

HEART & HUSTLE AWARD

On August 24, the Major League Baseball Players Alumni Association named **J.T. Realmuto** as Miami's 2018 Heart & Hustle Award winner. This esteemed award honors active players who demonstrate a passion for the game of baseball and best embody the values, spirit, and traditions of the game. The Heart & Hustle Award is also the only award in Major League Baseball that is voted on by former players. Voting is conducted prior to the All-Star Break. The overall winner will be announced Nov. 8, 2018, at the 19th annual Legends for Youth Dinner in New York City.

ROBERTO CLEMENTE DAY

On September 4, Major League Baseball announced the Club nominees for the 2018 Roberto Clemente Award, given annually to recognize those players who best represent the game of baseball through extraordinary character, community involvement, philanthropy, and positive contributions, both on and off the field. **Martín Prado** is the Marlins nominee, and the 2018 Roberto Clemente Award recipient will be announced during the World Series.

AND THE WINNER IS...

On September 20, the South Florida Chapter of the BBWAA announced its 2018 Marlins award recipients. **Lewis Brinson** was honored with the Charlie Hough Good Guy Award; **Miguel Rojas** was named winner of the Jeff Conine Mr. Marlin Award; **Brian Anderson** took home the José Fernández Rookie of the Year Award; and **J.T. Realmuto** was named MVP. The following night, the Marlins honored their 2018 Minor League award winners in a pregame ceremony; Player of the Year **Austin Dean**, Pitcher of the Year **Nick Neidert**, Student of the Year **Walner Espinal**, and Staff Member of the Year **Bruce Walton**. In addition, the Marlins named Team MVPs for each of their affiliates: New Orleans - RHP **Jeff Brigham**; Jacksonville - INF **Isan Diaz**; Jupiter - RHP **Parker Bugg**; Greensboro - INF **Jose Devers**; Batavia - LHP **Manuel Rodriguez**; GCL - OF **Davis Bradshaw**; and DSL - LHP **Luis Palacios**.

MINOR LEAGUE SPOTLIGHT

The 2018 Miami Marlins Minor League award winners were highlighted by Player of the Year **Austin Dean**, Pitcher of the Year **Nick Neidert**, Student of the Year **Walner Espinal**, and Staff Member of the Year **Bruce Walton**. In addition, the Marlins named Team MVPs for each of their affiliates: New Orleans - RHP **Jeff Brigham**; Jacksonville - INF **Isan Diaz**; Jupiter - RHP **Parker Bugg**; Greensboro - INF **Jose Devers**; Batavia - LHP **Manuel Rodriguez**; GCL - OF **Davis Bradshaw**; and DSL - LHP **Luis Palacios**.

FIRE IN THE HOT CORNER

Marlins third basemen recorded an 84-game errorless streak from June 5 to September 11, surpassing a 72-game streak from July 11-September 29, 2004 to mark the longest errorless streak by third basemen in Club history. **Martín Prado** made 25 starts at third during the record-breaking streak, while **Miguel Rojas** made 24 starts (27 appearances), **Brian Anderson** 21 starts (26 appearances), and **Yadiel Rivera** 14 starts (24 appearances).

2-FOR-1

Sandy Alcantara made his second start and appearance of the season for Miami on September 5 vs. Philadelphia, marking his second career Major League starting assignment (appeared in eight games out of the bullpen for St. Louis last year). He improved to 2-0 on the year after tossing 7.0 shutout innings against the Phillies, allowing just three hits and two walks, while striking out a career-high six. In his Marlins debut on June 29 vs. the Mets, he allowed just one run on three hits and five walks over 5.0 innings in an 8-2 win. According to the *Elias*, he became just the seventh pitcher in Marlins' history to allow up to one run over his first two career starts, the third this season. The others were: Andy Larkin (1996-1998); Tommy Phelps (2003); Alex Sanabia (2012); José Fernández (2013); **Jarlín García** (2018); and **Elieser Hernandez** (2018).

THREE 10'S

With **Sandy Alcantara's** 10-strikeout performance in the season's final game at Citi Field, the Marlins received three 10-strikeout games from rookies. **Caleb Smith** tossed the first 10-K game on April 22 vs. Milwaukee, and Trevor Richards followed with a 10-strikeout performance on April 25 against the Dodgers. Alcantara, Smith, and Richards became the first rookie trio to record 10-or-more since Luis Castillo, Amir Garrett and Robert Stephenson did so with the Reds in 2017, while becoming the first trio to do so in the same season in Marlins history.

IT'S NOT HOW YOU START...IT'S HOW YOU FINISH

José Ureña won each of his five September starts, becoming just the fourth Marlins starting pitcher to record five wins in the month: Pat Rapp (1995), Anibal Sánchez (2006), and Javier Vázquez (2011) were the others to do so.

CONTINUED SUPPORT THROUGH THE END

The final weekend attendance of 37,625 marked the second-largest weekend draw of the season. The highest grossing weekend was April 13-15 vs. Pittsburgh, when the Marlins welcomed 44,289 to Marlins Park. The Marlins also drew over 10,000 fans in each of the last three games, marking the third weekend of 10,000-or-more on the season (also Opening Weekend and 25th Anniversary Weekend vs. San Diego).

CELEBRATIONS ABOUND

With Miami's shutout win over Cincinnati on Mexican Heritage Day at Marlins Park on September 23, the Marlins improved to 7-1 on heritage celebration days. The only loss came on Colombian Heritage night on July 27, when the Marlins dropped a 9-1 decision to the Nationals.

WALKING OFF WINNERS

The Marlins recorded nine walk-off wins in 2018, their most walk-off wins since 2015 (9). The nine walk-off wins were tied for the second-most in Marlins Park history (also 2012), behind 11 in 2014. The Club record for most walk-off wins in a single season is 16, done in 1997.

LEADER OF MEN

Manager **Don Mattingly** finished his third campaign at the helm of the Marlins, compiling a 219-265 in his three seasons. Mattingly ranks fourth in Marlins history in games managed (484), behind Fredi González (555), Jack McKeon (538), and Rene Lachemann (506). His 219 wins also rank fourth among Marlins managers, behind McKeon (281), González (276), and Lachemann (221). Among current managers, he ranks fourth in wins since the start of 2013 with 499. Joe Maddon leads with 556, followed by Terry Francona (545) and Clint Hurdle (515).

OPENING DAY ROSTER

The Marlins opened the 2018 season with 12 pitchers, three catchers, six infielders and four outfielders. **PITCHERS:** RHP Kyle Barraclough, RHP Odrisamer Despaigne, LHP Jarlin García, RHP Tayron Guerrero, LHP Chris O'Grady, LHP Dillon Peters, RHP Caleb Smith, RHP Drew Steckenrider, RHP Junichi Tazawa, RHP Jacob Turner, RHP José Ureña, and RHP Brad Ziegler. **CATCHERS:** Bryan Holaday, Tomás Telis, and Chad Wallach. **INFELDERS:** Brian Anderson, Justin Bour, Starlin Castro, Garrett Cooper, Yadiel Rivera, and Miguel Rojas. **OUTFIELDERS:** Lewis Brinson, Derek Dietrich, Braxton Lee, and Cameron Maybin. The following players began the season on the 10-day disabled list, retroactive to March 26: LHP Wei-Yin Chen (left elbow strain), RHP Elieser Hernandez (tooth infection), RHP Dan Straily (right forearm strain), C J.T. Realmuto (low back contusion), INF Martín Prado (left hamstring strain), and INF JT Riddle (right shoulder tendinitis). RHP Brett Graves (left oblique strain) began the season on the 60-day disabled list.

ROSTER ODDS AND ENDS

According to *Elias*, Miami's Opening Day roster was the third-youngest in Baseball, with an average age of 27 years, 351 days. The Phillies featured the youngest OD roster in the Majors, with an average age of 26.334, followed by Cincinnati at 27.196. Miami's OD roster had 12 players born outside of the US, third most among Major League teams behind Texas (14) and the White Sox (13). The Marlins OD roster consisted of seven players from different countries and territories outside of the US, tied with Atlanta and Seattle, behind the Dodgers, who had eight.

Jeff Brigham finished his fifth professional campaign in the Marlins starting rotation, posting an 0-4 record and 6.06 ERA (16.1 ip/11 er) in four starts. In 17 starts across three levels in the Marlins system prior to his selection to the 40-man roster on September 1, went 10-3 with a 2.36 ERA (95.1 ip/25 er).

Named Triple-A New Orleans Team MVP after going 5-2 with a 3.44 ERA (52.1 ip/20 er) in nine starts with Baby Cakes. His 2.36 season ERA ranked as the second-lowest among Marlins Minor Leaguers this season, behind only Batavia's Manuel Rodriguez (2.13). His 10 wins ranked second organizationally behind Nick Neidert (12).

Of his 17 starts, allowed two-or-less runs 14 times. Reached 6.0 innings pitched nine times and a career-high 7.0 innings twice; July 19 at Oklahoma City and August 22 vs. Memphis.

Began 2018 at Double-A Jacksonville, where he posted a 4-1 record and 1.18 ERA (38.0/5) over seven starts. He walked nine and struck out 41. He missed the entire month of May with a right oblique strain and was activated from the seven-day disabled list on June 22 following a one-start rehab assignment with GCL Marlins.

Made three starts with Jacksonville before going on the seven-day disabled list on April 27. Over those three starts, allowed one run in 15.0 innings with three walks and 20 strikeouts.

In second start of season, tied career high with 10 strikeouts.

Took first loss of season on July 3 vs. Montgomery, snapping four-game winning streak. Allowed three runs on six hits and two walks, with four strikeouts, over 6.0 innings.

Promoted to New Orleans on July 13 and made first career Triple-A appearance on July 14 vs. Colorado Springs, allowing two runs on six hits and two walks, with six strikeouts, over 5.0 innings.

Allowed exactly two runs in five of his first six starts with New Orleans, tossing 6.0-or-more innings four times. Other start in that span was a 6.2-inning scoreless outing against Reno on July 25.

Made Major League debut on September 2 against Toronto, surrendering three runs on four hits and four walks, with two strikeouts and a hit batter, over 3.0 innings. Became the 10th Marlins player to make his Major League debut this season, tying the 1996 Marlins for the sixth-most debuts in a single season in Club history.

In second Major League start, game two of Miami's September 13 doubleheader at Citi Field against the Mets, allowed three runs on five hits with a walk and two strikeouts over 4.1 innings. Notched first career hit in the game, leading off the top of the third with a single to center field.

In third start, Sept. 20 vs. Cincinnati, turned in longest outing of the season with Miami, allowing two runs on three hits with four walks and a Major League high six strikeouts over 5.0 innings. Despite allowing just two runs, took third consecutive loss.

- He allowed 8.84 hits per 9.0 innings, his lowest full-season mark since allowing 8.69 in his rookie season of 2012. His 7.49 strikeouts per 9.0 was the highest single-season mark of his career, as was his 19.4 strikeout percentage. He also walked 3.17/9.0, also a single-season high.
- Ranked second among National League starters (fourth in MLB) with a 1.62 ERA (78.0/14) at home (min. 10 GS). Only Blake Snell (1.27), Jacob deGrom (1.54), and Ryne Stanek finished with lower marks. His home ERA ranks as the fourth-lowest in a single season in Franchise history (min. 10 GS). José Fernández posted a 1.19 ERA in 2013, followed by Josh Johnson (1.57 in 2010), and Henderson Alvarez (1.60 in 2014).

- Finished his home season with just 51 hits allowed over 13 starts (78.0 ip), marking the fifth-fewest hits allowed at home in Club history (min. 10 GS) in a single season, tied with Josh Beckett (2002) and Tony Saunders (1997). Liván Hernández allowed 47 in 10 starts in 1997; Al Leiter allowed 48 over 12 starts in '97; A.J. Burnett surrendered 49 hits in 11 starts in 2004; and Dan Straily gave up 50 in 11 starts this season.
- Allowed 5.88 hits per 9.0 innings at home, the fourth-lowest average in Marlins history. José Fernández held opponents to 5.14 hits/9.0 in 2013, and he is followed by Al Leiter with a 5.17 mark in 1996 and 5.76 mark in 1997. His .185 average against at home ranked as the third lowest, behind Fernández (.164 in '13) and Leiter (.168 in '96).
- Of his 13 starts at Marlins Park, he limited opponents to one-or-zero runs 10 times. He allowed a season-high four runs twice (June 11 vs. SF and August 12 vs. NYM), and three runs once (July 24 vs. ATL).
- On the road, finished with a 9.27 ERA (55.1/57) in 13 starts, the highest road ERA of any Major League starter (min. 10 GS). He possessed the highest road/home ERA differential (7.65) this season, ahead of Sam Gaviglio (4.50; 7.91 road/3.41 home) and Junior Guerra (4.43; 6.97/2.54). According to Stats LLC, the 7.67 difference in road/home ERA is the largest gap for any pitcher in the Majors since Dallas Keuchel had an 8.15 difference (11.10 on road/2.95 at home) in 2012 (min. 15 GS total).

- Reached 6.0 innings pitched in nine of 13 home starts, but only completed 6.0 innings on the road once: June 16 at Baltimore (6.0 ip).
- Among pitchers born in Taiwan, he leads all in innings pitched (996.1), starts (170) and strikeouts (783). He ranks second in career wins with 59, behind Chien-Ming Wang (68). Wang ranks second in innings pitched (845.2), starts (126), and strikeouts (394).
- Pitched to a 1.54 ERA in four August starts, the lowest monthly ERA (min. 4 GS) of his career. His previous low was a 2.05 ERA in five starts in September 2014. His August ERA ranked 10th among Major League starters (min. 4 GS), behind leader Cole Hamels (0.69).
- Made season debut on April 28 vs. Colorado, earning a win after allowing just one run on four hits (one home run), two walks, and a hit batter over 5.1 innings, with three strikeouts. Began the season on the 10-day Disabled List with a left elbow strain. Made two rehab starts with Single-A Jupiter prior to being activated, allowing just one run and five hits over 7.2 innings.
- On August 25 vs. Atlanta, limited Braves to six hits, while walking two and striking out a season-high 10, over 6.0 shutout innings. Tossed season-high 109 pitches and reached 100-pitch mark four times this season. His pitch total in the game was the most since throwing 111 on September 26, 2015 at Boston. Has broken 100-pitch plateau nine times dating back to the start of 2016 (53 starts). Over his first four Major League campaigns, eclipsed 100-pitch mark 54 times in 117 starts.
- Tied a career high with 8.0 innings pitched on September 1 vs. Toronto. Marked longest start since going 8.0 innings on July 12, 2015 vs. Washington. Limited Blue Jays to just three hits and one run while walking none and striking out seven.
- On September 21 vs. Cincinnati, tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed just three hits and no walks. Marked second career start with at least 7.0 shutout innings and no walks allowed; also June 11, 2014 vs. Boston (7.0 ip, 4 h, 7 so).

Pablo López finished his fifth professional season, and first at the Major League level, on the 60-day disabled list with a right shoulder strain. In 10 starts with Miami, he went 2-4 with a 4.14 ERA (58.2 ip/27 er). In addition, he made 12 starts between Double-A Jacksonville and Triple-A New Orleans, combining on a 2-3 record, 1.44 ERA (62.1/10), and .196 (46x235) opponents average. He did not allow more than three runs in any one start, and limited opponents to two-or-fewer eight times.

He began the season at Jacksonville, making eight starts with a 1-2 record and 0.62 ERA (43.2/3). He had a 1.6 BB/9.0 rate, while his strikeouts per 9.0 was 10.6.

Over his first four starts with Jumbo Shrimp, allowed just nine hits over 19.0 scoreless innings. Allowed first run of season in the fourth inning of May 13 start at Montgomery, running season-opening scoreless streak to 23.0 innings.

Took loss on May 13, allowing just one run on five hits over a season-high 7.0 innings. Didn't walk a batter while recording seven strikeouts. Jumbo Shrimp dropped each of his first seven starts of the season despite him allowing a total of just four runs (one earned).

Took loss in next start, May 18 vs. Mobile. Allowed three unearned runs and five hits over 5.2 innings while striking out a career-high 10.

Earned first win in following start, May 24 at Mississippi. Held Braves scoreless on five hits while walking none and striking out five over 6.0 innings.

Earned Southern League All-Star honors, but did not participate in the game due to his promotion to Triple-A New Orleans on June 6.

Made first career Triple-A appearance on June 6 in a start at Las Vegas. Earned win after holding 51's to three runs (two earned) on six hits with a walk and four strikeouts over 6.0 innings.

In four starts with the Baby Cakes, posted 1-1 record and 3.38 ERA (18.2/7). Allowed three runs in each of his first three starts, with no more than six hits allowed.

Made final Triple-A start on June 26 vs. Iowa, tossing just 1.2 innings with one hit allowed and two strikeouts.

Was recalled by Miami on June 30 and made his Major League debut that night against the Mets. Limited New York to two runs on six hits and a walk (intentional), while striking out five, over 6.0 innings.

At the time of his promotion to Miami, he ranked sixth among all full season Minor League pitchers in ERA and WHIP (0.93), and 12th in average against. He led all Marlins farmhands in ERA and ranked fourth in strikeouts (66).

He became the 12th starter in Marlins history to earn a win in his Major League debut, and first since Chris O'Grady on July 8, 2017 at San Francisco. He was the first right-hander to start and win his debut since Anthony DeSclafani on May 14, 2014 at the Dodgers.

The night before his debut, Sandy Alcantara made his first career Major League start and also earned a win. The pair became the first set of teammates to earn wins in their first career starts in consecutive days since April 9-10, 2012, when Yu Darvish and Neftali Feliz each made their first career starts with the Rangers. The last National League team to have such a duo was the Reds on April 15-16, 1967 with Gary Nolan and Mel Queen. - Stats LLC

Earned second win of season/career on July 21 at Tampa Bay. Limited Rays to two hits and one run (home run) with a walk and six strikeouts over 6.0 innings. Tied season high in strikeouts, equalling his previous start total on July 10 vs. Milwaukee.

Tossed season-high 7.0 innings on August 7 vs. St. Louis. Allowed two runs on four hits and a walk, with five strikeouts. Marked fifth of seven starts totaling 6.0-or-more innings.

Recorded first Major League hit on July 10 vs. Milwaukee, a single to left field off Jhoulys Chacin. Appeared as a pinch-hitter twice. In final pinch-hit appearance, on July 15 vs. Philadelphia, he singled, marking Miami's first pinch-hit by a pitcher since a two-run double by José Fernández on July 1, 2016 at Atlanta.

Trevor Richards completed his third professional season in the Marlins starting rotation, posting a 4-9 record and 4.42 ERA (126.1 ip/62 er) in 25 starts. In addition, he made six starts at Triple-A New Orleans, going 3-2 with a 2.06 ERA (39.1/9).

He established professional single-season highs in appearances (31), starts (31), innings pitched (165.2), and strikeouts (167).

He began the season in Miami's rotation, making his Major League debut on April 2 vs. Boston. He surrendered five runs on eight hits (one home run) and a walk, while striking out five, over 4.1 innings. Surrendered just two hits over first three innings, but was touched for three runs in fourth and two in fifth, leaving with one out and a runner on first.

Tossed 7.0 shutout innings on April 14 vs. Pittsburgh, throwing just 82 pitches on his way to giving up just two hits and a walk, while striking out two. Needed 82 pitches to make it through 4.0 innings in previous start, April 8 at Philadelphia.

In the Pittsburgh start, became the first Marlins rookie starter to work at least 7.0 innings and allow two-or-fewer hits since Justin Nicolino on September 26, 2015 vs. Atlanta (7.0 ip, 2 h). He became just the 15th pitcher in Club history to do so (22nd time).

On April 25 against the Dodgers in Chavez Ravine, struck out 10 in just 4.2 innings. He became just the sixth rookie pitcher since 1913 to record as many as 10 strikeouts in less than 5.0 innings pitched, and first since Jon Gray on Sept. 23, 2016 (10 in 4.0 IP). The others to accomplish the feat were Noah Syndergaard (10 in 4.0 IP on June 2, 2015), Rick Ankiel (10 in 4.2 IP on July 27, 2000), Bobby Witt (10 in 4.2 IP on Sept. 16, 1986), and Bill Caudill (10 in 4.1 IP, Aug. 17, 1979).

In five April starts, he posted an 0-2 record and 4.94 ERA (23.2/13) before being optioned to New Orleans on April 27.

Allowed two-or-fewer earned runs in each of his six starts after being sent to Triple-A New Orleans. Tossed a career-high 7.1 innings against Round Rock in his first career game at the Triple-A level, on May 1. Struck out nine batters in that game, a Minor League season-high that he tied on May 26 at Iowa. Posted 37 strikeouts against just four walks with the Baby Cakes.

He was recalled by Miami June 7 and made the start that night in St. Louis, taking the loss after allowing three runs on seven hits, with no walks and four strikeouts, over 5.0 innings.

Earned first Major League win on June 12 vs. San Francisco, holding Giants to one run and two hits over 6.0 innings.

Allowed a season-high six runs in next start, June 17 at Baltimore. He would equal the total again on September 4 vs. Philadelphia and Sept. 12 at the Mets (four earned).

In his start on June 23 at Colorado, picked up a win after tossing 6.0 innings, allowing just one run on three hits and two walks, with eight strikeouts (tied for third-most strikeouts at Coors Field by a starter in Club history).

From June 23 to August 8, allowed 15 total runs over 48.0 innings pitched in nine starts for a 2.81 ERA. Allowed three-or-fewer runs in eight of the nine starts, and two-or-less six times.

From July 8 to August 8, recorded six straight starts with four-or-fewer hits allowed. It tied the second-longest such streak in Marlins history, behind a stretch of eight consecutive games by Dan Straily from April 11-May 20, 2017.

On September 23 vs. Cincinnati, tossed 7.0 shutout innings with three hits allowed, one walk and nine strikeouts. Over three previous starts, had surrendered 16 runs (14 earned) and 16 hits over 11.1 innings pitched. The 7.0 innings equaled the longest start of his Major League career, as he tossed 7.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, one walk, and two strikeouts in third career start, April 14 vs. Pittsburgh.

Finished season with 13.2 scoreless innings over final two starts, allowing just nine hits and three walks, while striking out 17. Ran season-best scoreless streak to 15.2 innings, including final two innings of Sept. 17 start vs. Washington.

Caleb Smith was a bright spot in the Marlins rotation until suffering a season-ending injury on June 24 at Colorado. Until that time, he went 5-6 with a 4.19 ERA (77.1 ip/36 er) in 16 starts with the Marlins. He underwent surgery to repair a Grade 3 lat strain on July 9.

Led all MLB rookies in strikeouts (88) at the time of his injury. His 88 strikeouts were the most by a left-handed rookie in the first half in Club history. They were the second-most overall in Club history, behind only José Fernández (103 in 2013).

Among pitchers with at least 15 starts, ranked 15th in the National League with a strikeout rate of 27.0% (88/326 BF). He ranked 10th in the NL in strikeouts/9.0 at 10.24. Among left-handed pitchers, ranked third in strikeouts/9.0 and fifth in strikeout percentage.

Also among pitchers with at least 15 starts, ranked 15th in the NL in hits allowed per 9.0 innings (7.33). Ranked third among NL lefties, behind only Robbie Ray (7.06) and Patrick Corbin (7.29).

His .220 (63x286) average against ranked 13th among NL starters (min. 15 GS), third among lefties behind Robbie Ray (.216) and Patrick Corbin (.218).

He made his Marlins debut on March 30, limiting the Chicago Cubs to one run on four hits and three walks, while striking out eight, over 5.1 innings. The eight strikeouts matched the second-most ever in a Marlins debut, behind a 10 strikeout performance by Mark Redman on April 3, 2003 vs. Philadelphia. Dillon Peters (Sept. 1, 2017 vs. PHI) and José Fernández (April 7, 2013 at NYM) also had eight strikeouts in their Marlins debuts.

Provided his best start of the season April 22 at Milwaukee, despite taking a loss. Limited Brewers to two hits and two runs over 6.0 innings (a career high until his next start), with no walks and a career-high 10 strikeouts. Became 10th Marlins pitcher (17th time) to record as many as 10 strikeouts in a game without issuing a walk, following Dan Straily a year to the day on April 22 at San Diego (14 SO). April 22 was also witness to another such occurrence; José Fernández struck out 14 Braves at Turner Field in 2014.

The 10 strikeouts were the most by a Marlins rookie starter since José Fernández struck out 14 Cleveland Indians on August 2, 2013 at Marlins Park. Became the eighth Marlins rookie to record a 10+ strikeout game (17th time). Trevor Richards followed with 10 strikeouts three days later on April 25 at Los Angeles-NL.

Owned the longest scoreless streak by a Marlins starter topping out at 15.2 innings from April 22-May 10 (was later tied by Trevor Richards over his final three starts). From April 22-May 28, posted a 4-3 record and 2.21 ERA (40.2/10). In first four starts leading up to April 22, was 0-2 with a 6.89 ERA (15.2/12). Over his final five appearances, went 1-1 with a 6.00 ERA (21.0/14).

He earned his first Major League win on April 29 vs. Colorado, after starting the season with three consecutive losses. Held Rox scoreless on two hits and a walk, while striking out nine, over a career-best 7.0 innings.

Followed that start with 5.2 scoreless frames on May 5 at Cincinnati, allowing just three hits and a walk, while striking out seven to earn his second win of the season.

Had scoreless streak snapped in second inning of May 10 start vs. Atlanta. Took the loss in the game despite holding Braves to just two runs, seven hits, and two walks (one intentional), with five strikeouts, over 5.1 innings.

He equaled a season-high with 7.0 innings pitched on May 28 at San Diego, where he earned his fourth win of the season.

➤ Dan Straily completed his seventh Major League season making 23 starts for Miami, posting a 5-6 record and 4.12 ERA (122.1 ip/56 er). Missed final three weeks of the season due to a right oblique strain suffered on September 7. Also missed first three weeks of the season because of right forearm inflammation.

➤ Allowed 7.87 hits per 9.0 innings, the third-lowest of his career. He posted a career best 7.24 in 2016 with Cincinnati, and 7.80 in 2013 with Oakland.

➤ He led Major League Baseball with a .138 average (13x94) when facing a lineup for the third time. It ranked as the fifth-lowest single-season average in the Majors since 1974, behind Pedro Martinez (.132 in 2000), Nolan Ryan (.133 in 1974), Clay Buchholz (.135 in 2013), and Ryan (.137 in 1991).

➤ Finished his home season with just 50 hits allowed over 11 starts (61.1 ip), marking the fourth-fewest hits allowed at home in Club history (min. 10 GS) in a single season. Liván Hernández allowed 47 in 10 starts in 1997; Al Leiter allowed 48 over 12 starts in '97; and A.J. Burnett surrendered 49 hits in 11 starts in 2004.

➤ Began the season with five consecutive team wins, going 2-0 with a 3.12 ERA (26.0 ip/9 er) in that stretch. Miami won just five of his final 18 starts of the season, seeing him go 3-6 with a 4.39 ERA (96.1/47).

➤ In 11 starts at Marlins Park, went 3-1 with a 3.96 ERA (61.1/27). For his career, owns a 21-11 record and 3.79 ERA (360.2/152) in 68 home games (63 starts). In 74 career road appearances (69 starts), has gone 21-25 with a 4.63 ERA (395.0/203), including 2-5, 4.28 (61.0/29) marks in 12 road starts this season.

➤ In 17 starts with either four or five days rest, went 2-6 with a 5.07 ERA (85.2/48). In six assignments with six or more days rest, went 3-0 with a 1.96 ERA (36.2/8).

➤ Posted 2-3 record and 4.89 ERA over first 10 starts of the season. Improved as the season progressed, going 3-3 with a 3.66 ERA over his final 13 starts. Allowed more than three runs in just two of those 13 starts.

➤ Made first start of the season on April 30 vs. Philadelphia, allowing four runs, six hits, and four walks, while striking out one, over 4.0 innings. Over next four starts, limited opponents to six total runs (five earned), 13 hits, and 13 walks (one intentional), with 18 strikeouts over 22.0 innings (2.05 ERA).

➤ On May 18 at Atlanta, earned second win of the season, holding the Braves scoreless on three hits and three walks (one intentional), while striking out six, over 7.0 innings. Marked first of four starts this season with 7.0-or-more innings pitched.

➤ Made shortest career start on June 19 at San Francisco, going just 1.1 innings. Allowed four runs on four hits with two walks and one strikeout. His shortest career start prior to was August 29, 2016 at the Angels (2.2 ip). Was ejected from the game and handed a five-game suspension for hitting Buster Posey.

➤ From June 25-July 20, went 2-1 with a 2.78 ERA (32.1/10), marking his best five-star stretch of the season.

➤ Allowed season highs in hits allowed (11), runs (8), and earned runs allowed (5) on July 31 at SunTrust Park. Walked one and struck out four in 3.2 innings. He became the 10th pitcher in Club history to allow 11+ hits in as few as 3.2 innings. Jeff Locke was the last Marlins starter to allow similar numbers, surrendering 11 hits in 2.2 innings to St. Louis on July 3, 2017.

➤ On August 5 at Philadelphia, allowed one hit over 5.1 innings. Marked fourth career start with at least 5.0 innings pitched and one-or-fewer hits allowed. Had two such starts last season; May 15 vs. Houston (5.0/1) and April 16 vs. the Mets (5.1/0). Other instance was July 4, 2013 vs. Cubs (7.0/1).

➤ Tossed season-high 8.0 innings on August 31 vs. Toronto, allowing just one run and four hits with a walk and four strikeouts. Marked longest start since going a career-high 8.1 innings on July 7, 2017 at San Francisco.

➤ José Ureña finished the 2018 season with a 9-12 record and 3.98 ERA (174.0 ip/77 er) in 31 starts for Miami. Led Marlins staff in wins (9), starts (31), innings pitched (174.0), and ERA, and was tied with Trevor Richards for the team lead in strikeouts (130).

➤ He established career bests in starts, innings pitched, strikeouts, strikeouts/9.0, hits/9.0, strikeout percentage, and walk percentage. Despite his record, made considerable improvements in several categories over a 2017 season that saw him go 14-7 (see chart at right).

➤ Among National League starters, was tied for 17th in starts, ranked 19th in innings pitched, 21st in hits/9.0, and 22nd in walks/9.0 and baserunners/9.0 (11.28).

➤ Over the last two seasons, is tied with Jon Lester (14) in the National League for the second-most wins following the All-Star break, behind only Rich Hill (16). His 27 post All-Star starts are tied with 10 others for fourth-most, behind Jon Gray (28), German Marquez (28), and Nick Pivetta (28).

➤ He became the sixth starter in Marlins history to post back-to-back sub-4.00 ERA campaigns, joining Pat Rapp (1994-95), Kevin Brown (1996-97), Dontrelle Willis (2005-06), Josh Johnson (2009-10), and Anibal Sánchez (2010-11).

➤ Began the season with seven consecutive losses over his first 12 starts and finished the season with six consecutive wins over his final seven starts. He became the second starter in Marlins history to record a losing streak of seven-or-more games and winning streak of six-or-more in the same season. Chris Hammond had a seven-game losing streak and eight-game winning streak in 1993. The last Major Leaguer to do so was Mike Foltynewicz last season, as he recorded a seven-game slide and six-game win streak. - *Elias*

➤ In addition, he became the first Major League starter to begin a season with seven-or-more losses and finish with nine-or-more wins: Barry Zito began his 2008 campaign with eight losses en-route to a 10-17 final record. - *Elias*

➤ Earned Opening Day start against Cubs on March 29 at Marlins Park. Was seventh different OD starter in last seven openers for Miami. Took the loss, allowing five runs on six hits over 4.0 innings. Hit three batters in the first inning, becoming only the second Marlins pitcher to ever tally three HBP in a single inning (Sergio Mitre on Aug. 31, 2007 vs. PHI).

➤ Picked up his first win of the season on June 5 at St. Louis. It snapped a skid of 14 consecutive team losses in his starts, dating back to September 26, 2017, the longest streak in Club history. Picked up the win despite allowing a season-high 10 hits, and surrendering four runs.

➤ On June 15 at Baltimore, tossed 8.0 shutout innings to pick up his second win of the season (3 h, bb, 4 so, hb). It was his fourth career game tossing at least 8.0 innings. Also threw a career-high 112 pitches.

➤ Was placed on 10-day DL on June 21 with right shoulder impingement, following his start at San Francisco the previous day. Missed only one turn through the rotation, making his next start on July 4 vs. Tampa Bay.

➤ Snapped streak of 14 consecutive home starts without a win on July 29 vs. Washington. Allowed just one hit and four walks, with five strikeouts, over 6.0 scoreless innings.

➤ The stretch of 14 home starts without a win was the longest such streak in Franchise history. Anibal Sánchez previously owned the longest stretch when he made 13 straight home starts without a win from June 20, 2011 to May 24, 2012. The win also snapped an eight-game home losing streak, which was also the longest such streak in Club history. Jack Armstrong (7/22-10/3/93), Livan Hernández (7/9/98-4/6/99), Vladimir Núñez (8/5/99-4/22/01), and Dontrelle Willis (5/9-8/3/07) all had seven-game home slides. - *Stats LLC*

➤ On August 15 at SunTrust Park, made one pitch before being ejected after hitting Ronald Acuna Jr. According to *Stats LLC*, he was the first starter in the live-ball era to hit a batter on the only pitch he threw. The only other starters to hit the only batter they faced were Bob Shaw (1965), Scott Elarton (2001) and John Lackey (2009).

➤ On August 19 start at Nationals Park, tossed first career complete game and first by a Marlins starter since Edinson Volquez no-hit the Arizona Diamondbacks on June 3, 2017 at Marlins Park. Needed 108 pitches to complete the game, allowing one run on two hits and two walks, while striking out four. Was eighth complete game by a Marlins starter against Washington (since 2005), and first since Ricky Nolasco on September 9, 2012 at Nationals Park.

➤ On September 3 vs. Philadelphia, limited Phillies to one run on four hits, while walking none and striking out seven over 7.0 innings. Marked third career start of 7.0 innings or more without walking a batter; Sept. 11, 2016 vs. the Dodgers and Sept. 20, 2017 vs. Mets.

➤ Over his final seven starts, went 6-0 with a 1.80 ERA (45.0/9). In the lone start without a decision, allowed four runs on six hits over 6.0 innings to Boston on August 28. In other six starts, limited opponents to one-or-zero runs and five-or-fewer hits in each outing.

➤ Won each of his five September starts, becoming just the fourth Marlins starting pitcher to record five wins in the month: Pat Rapp (1995), Anibal Sánchez (2006), and Javier Vázquez (2011) were the others to do so.
