**LEADING OFF:** On this day, Patriot Day, we honor the 2,977 people who perished due to terrorist attacks 17 years ago today...Angels play the second game of a seven-game home stand (0-1) vs. Texas (Sept. 10-12; 0-1) & Seattle (Sept. 13-16)...LAA has won four of five, are 5-4 this month, 8-5 last 13 games at 22-25 since the break...Club is 1-7 across last eight home games (7-3 last 10 road affairs)...Angels have spent last 75 days in fourth place...17 remaining games are with divisional foes: Six vs. Oakland (3 home, 3 road), four vs. Texas (all at home), four vs. Seattle (all at home) & three at Houston...Angels are 20-20-7 thru 47 series...Following the home stand, Angels set out on final road trip to Oakland (Sept. 24-26) and Houston (Sept. 21-23).

**STARTING OVER AGAIN:** Jim Johnson will be the 16<sup>th</sup> different starting pitcher for the Angels this season (club record is 17 in 1967)...Will mark Johnson's second big league start, first since MLB debut with Baltimore in 2006 (has made 666 career relief appearances between starts – MLB record is 670 by Tyler Clippard - STATS LLC).

**SHO OFF:** In his last five games, Shohei Ohtani is 10-for-19 with eight runs scored, two doubles, a triple, three HRs and 10 RBI...He is riding a season best eight-game hit streak (.448; 13/29, 11 R, 2 2B, 3B, 4 HR, 11 RBI, 3 SB) raising his season average from .275 to .294...Has homered in three of six games & five of last 12 contests (6 HR total)...With his 19<sup>th</sup> HR Friday night, Ohtani passed Seattle's Kenji Johjima (18 HR in 144 games in 2006) for most rookie HRs by a Japanese native...Ohtani has 19 HRs in 86 non-pitching games...With next HR, he will be second-fastest Halo rookie to reach 20 HR (Wally Joyner hit 20 by his 82<sup>nd</sup> game in 1986) and eighth rookie in club history to reach 20 HRs...Ohtani is lone MLB player this season with multiple games of two HRs and a stolen base – ESPN STATS.

**OHTANI NAMED A.L. PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Ohtani was named American League Player of the Week for the period ending Sept. 9 – his second such honor this season...In five games, the rookie batted .474 (9/19) with eight runs, a double, a triple, four home runs, 10 RBI and two stolen bases (1.828 OPS)...He is the first Halo to win Player of the Week honors twice in one season since Tim Salmon in 2000.

**ROAD WORK:** Halo starters logged a 1.92 ERA (56.1 IP – 12 ER) on the 10-game trip, the second lowest mark in club history for a trip of at least 10 games...Lowest ERA in club annals was a 1.85 mark over 13 road affairs July 17-26, 1964 (STATS LLC).

**HEAN MACHINE:** Andrew Heaney has set new career highs in wins (9), starts (27), strikeouts (161) and innings pitched (165.0)...He is the first Halo to reach 160+ Ks since 2015 (Garrett Richards; 176 & Hector Santiago; 162) and has four 10+ strikeout games this season...In his last outing Sunday at CWS, he logged a career-high 12 strikeouts joining Frank Tanana as only left-handers in team history to record 12+ Ks with zero walks in a game.

**FISH FACTS:** Mike Trout has reached base safely in 13 of his last 19 plate appearances and 14 of last 23...On Saturday at CWS, he went 5-for-5 with two HRs and five RBI – marked his 14<sup>th</sup> career multi-HR game, fourth this season (second in 2018 vs. CWS)...Also second career five-hit game (May 26, 2018 at NYY)...Last Friday Trout tied the Angels' record reaching base 4+ times for the 16<sup>th</sup> time this season to equal the mark set by Brian Downing in 1987 (STATS LLC)...This season, Trout joined Willie Mays as the only players with three seasons of 30 HR/20 SB prior to their age-27 campaign...Trout's 62.8 career WAR is currently second-highest all time by a position player through age-26 season (Ty Cobb, 63.4).

**OHTANI MEDICAL UPDATE:** On Sept. 5th, Ohtani underwent an MRI on his right elbow which revealed new damage to his ulnar collateral ligament (UCL). UCL reconstruction surgery is the recommended plan of care. Updates to come when appropriate.

**PUJOLS SURGERIES:** Albert Pujols will undergo another surgery tomorrow on his right elbow ago, a procedure to remove a bone spur from his left elbow...He had an arthroscopic debridement of his left knee on August 30<sup>th</sup>...Pujols ranks 23<sup>rd</sup> all-time with 3,082 hits (Ichiro is 22<sup>nd</sup> with 3,089) and sixth all-time with 633 home runs (Willie Mays is 5<sup>th</sup> w/660 HR)...He is one of four players with 3,000 hits & 600 HR (Mays, Hank Aaron & ARod).

**DID YOU KNOW?** RHP Junichi Tazawa is the fifth Japanese native in Angels' history (Shigetoshi Hasegawa, Hideki Matsui, Hisanori Takahashi & Ohtani).

**2019 SCHEDULE:** Angels' highlights of the 2019 schedule include a two-game series (May 4-5) against Houston at Estadio de Béisbol in Monterrey, Mexico...LAA heads south of the border for first time since 2000 when hosting an exhibition game vs. Arizona in Hermosillo, Mexico...Matching up against the N.L. Central for interleague play, LAA faces St. Louis at Busch Stadium (June 21-23), Albert Pujols' first visit to St. Louis as an opponent.

**HI, MY NAME IS...** 58 players (36 pitchers-16 starters) have appeared in 2018 to set single-season franchise marks (MLB record for players used is 64 by 2014 Texas Rangers)...15 players have made MLB debuts in 2018 breaking team record of 12 (1996 & 1975).

**GOLD STANDARD:** Three-time Gold Glover Andrelton Simmons leads MLB shortstops with 212 putouts and has second fewest errors (8) in junior circuit among shortstops (min. 100 GS)...Leads MLB with a 16.1 Ultimate Zone Rating in 2018 (UZR) – FanGraphs...Since 2015, his 95 defensive runs saved (DRS) also lead MLB...Thru 911 career games, Simmons' defensive WAR is 25.0 – best by any shortstop in MLB history.

**GLOVE STORY:** Halos have not committed an error in last eight games...With 67 errors this season, Angels are on pace to break club record for fewest miscues in a full campaign (80 set last season)...Fewest in a strike-shortened season is 76 in 1994...Club ranks tied for third in A.L. with .987 fielding pct...Halos lead MLB turning 155 double plays (team record is 203 in 1985)...Catchers own a 40.6 caught stealing pct. (28 of 69), tops in A.L...Mike Trout is only CF in MLB (min. 70 G) with a 1.000 fielding pct...Kole Calhoun's 27 OF assists since 2016 lead A.L.

**BULLPEN BITS:** 3.66 bullpen ERA ranks sixth in A.L...Halo relievers lead MLB in inherited runners scored pct. allowing just 21.8 % to score (50 of 229)...Bullpen has logged 546 IP, second in A.L. to TB... Since 2016, Jose Alvarez's 199 games pitched lead A.L. (165.0 IP)... Over last two seasons (2017-18), Alvarez is tied for A.L. lead with 135 games pitched – Blake Parker ranks tied for third in span (133 games pitched)...Jaime Barria has allowed one earned run or less in five of last seven starts...He leads MLB rookie starters with 10 wins (min. 15 GS).

**THIS N' THAT:** 36 players on Angels' current active roster...Club is 19-27 when a lefty starts (52-46 vs. RHS)...LAA had a club-record 15 players on D.L. simultaneously twice this season...Halos sent 25 different players to D.L., most in MLB this season...Angels are one of seven teams in A.L. with a positive run differential (+39)...Halos' 186 HRs hit rank fifth in A.L...Andrelton Simmons leads MLB in PA per SO at 15.88 (540 PA/34 K) – also ranks second in MLB batting .294 (50/170) with two strikes...Mike Scioscia (1,641 wins) ranks 18<sup>th</sup> on the all-time managerial wins list (Jim Leyland 17<sup>th</sup> with 1,769)...Trout leads the Majors with 111 walks...Ohtani is the first player in MLB history with 15+ HR & 50+ pitching Ks in same season (STATS).

**HOT HALOS:** Over his last five starts, Felix Pena has posted a 2.81 ERA (32 IP – 10 ER)...Last night (4 IP, 3 K) marked the fourth scoreless relief outing of 3 IP-or-more for Taylor Cole...Shohei Ohtani is batting .368 (31/83) with 23 runs, five doubles, a triple, 10 home runs, 29 RBI and seven stolen bases over his last 29 games (raised average from .267 to .294 in span)...Andrelton Simmons has 10 RBI his last 11 games (3 HR last 9 G)...Jose Fernandez has hit safely in 16 of 22 games with LAA this season (hits in 13 of 16 starts)...19 of last 22 outings for Justin Anderson are scoreless...David Fletcher has hits 20 of last 24 games (10 multi-hit efforts) and is batting .333 (33/99) with 17 runs, six doubles, a triple and 11 RBI in span...Jose Alvarez has not been scored upon in 19 of last 21 outings (1.00 ERA; 18 IP – 2 ER)...Mike Trout has reached base safely in 25 of his last 26 games with 22 runs, eight home runs, 18 RBI & 27 walks in span.

**Vs. TEXAS:** Halos lead 2018 season series 8-6 (3-2 at home)...Four games remain with Texas (all at home)...David Fletcher is batting .394 (13/33) against Texas this season.

**MARINERS ON DECK:** Mariners lead 2018 season series 8-7...Angels are 10-5 in last 15 home games vs. Seattle...LAA is 105-81 vs. M's since 2009...Trout has hit safely in 14 of 15 meetings against Seattle this season, batting .446 (25/56) with 15 runs, six doubles, one triple, six HRs & 10 RBI (13 BB/7 IBB).

### THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

#### September 11

(2001) MLB halted play for six days due to the terrorist attacks that took place at the World Trade Center and the Pentagon; (2011) Bobby Abreu steals 2 bases, reaching 20 SBs for the 13<sup>th</sup> consecutive season...Longest such streak in the majors since Rickey Henderson had 23 straight from 1979-2001.

#### September 12

(1999) Tim Salmon collected his 1,000<sup>th</sup> career hit in a 6-3 win at Minnesota; (2012) Albert Pujols recorded his 30<sup>th</sup> home run of the season to become the only player to ever hit 30+ home runs in each of his first 12 Major League seasons.

**TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP JIM JOHNSON**

**5-3, 3.81 ERA**

*First Major League start since July 29, 2006 (Major League debut)*

- **BULLPEN DAY:** Making 56<sup>th</sup> appearance of the season and first start of the year...First start in the Majors since his Major League debut with Baltimore on July 29, 2006 vs. White Sox (L; 3 IP, 9 H, 8 R, 8 ER, 3 BB, 0 SO).
- **IT'S BEEN A WHILE:** Since making his only previous start in career in Major League debut, has made 666 consecutive appearances in relief prior to today's start...According to STATS LLC, his 666 relief appearances between starts is the second longest streak in Major League history; Earlier this season, **Tyler Clippard** established the mark with 670 consecutive relief outings before his Aug. 2 start for Blue Jays at Seattle.
- **STARTER #16:** With today's start, becomes 16<sup>th</sup> different starting pitcher for Angels this season...16 different starters ties Tampa Bay for the most in the Majors this season...Third time Angels have had at least 16 different starters in a season; club record is 17 (1967) and team also used 16 different starters in 2000.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Worked one perfect inning with two strikeouts in last relief appearance on Saturday at Chicago (A.L.).
- **STARTING AND FINISHING:** Becomes 18<sup>th</sup> different Major League player this season to have recorded a save and made a start this season...Last year, 27 different players did so in the Majors.
- **IN THE BULLPEN:** In 55 relief appearances this season, is 5-3 with one save and a 3.81 ERA (56.2 IP – 24 ER) and 40 strikeouts...Recorded first save of the season on May 10 vs. Minnesota and the 177<sup>th</sup> of his career (eighth most among players on active rosters)...Tossed a season-high 2.1 innings pitched on July 29 vs. Seattle, which marked longest outing since June 28, 2014 (2.1 IP for A's at Miami).
- **DL STINT:** Missed 32 games on disabled list this season with a lumbar strain...Reinstated from disabled list on July 22.
- **VS. TEXAS:** In 23 career games against the Rangers (all in relief), is 1-1 with six saves and a 5.48 ERA (23 IP – 14 ER)...In five outings this season, is 0-0 with a 7.20 ERA (5 IP – 4 ER).
- **AT ANGEL STADIUM:** In 46 career games (all in relief) at Angel Stadium, is 6-1 with a 2.22 ERA (48.2 IP – 12 ER) and 30 strikeouts...In his 30 home appearances this year, is 4-1 with a 3.00 ERA (30 IP – 10 ER) and 21 strikeouts.
- **CAREER NOTES:** Native of Johnson City, NY...Originally selected by Baltimore in fifth round of 2001 First-Year Player Draft out of Union-Endicott HS (NY)...Made Major League debut with Baltimore on July 29, 2006...Has appeared in Majors with Baltimore (2006-13), Oakland (2014), Detroit (2014), Atlanta (2015-17), L.A. Dodgers (2015) and Angels (2018)...Selected to A.L. All-Star team in 2012 with Orioles...Recorded 101 saves for Baltimore between 2012-13 seasons; second player in MLB history with consecutive 50+ save seasons.

### #48 JOSÉ ÁLVAREZ (LHP)

AGE: 29

- Recorded first save of season Sunday at Chicago (A.L.).
- Earned fifth win of season on Aug. 15 at San Diego; sets new career-high in wins
- 71 appearances are second most in Major Leagues this season and are the most by a left-hander in Angels history (previous was 66 games by Mike Holtz in 1997).
- Has stranded 42 of 49 inherited runners this season...49 IR are tied for the most in the Majors...85.7% stranded rate is fourth best in Majors.
- Has allowed seven ER against the Astros this year (5 games; 2 IP) and 10 ER against all other opponents (57 IP).
- 48 appearances before the All-Star Break are an Angels record.
- Matched season high with three strikeouts on May 27 at Yankee Stadium.
- **Last Outing:** 9/9 @ CWS (SV; 0.1 IP, 1 SO)      **Holds:** 11    **Saves/Opps:** 1/4

### #38 JUSTIN ANDERSON (RHP)

AGE: 25

- Has not allowed a run in 12 of last 14 outings.
- Stranded 21 of 24 inherited runners this season.
- Charged with loss Aug. 16, at TEX after allowing season-high four earned runs.
- Struck out all four batters faced on 8/10 vs. OAK...First Angels pitcher to do so (min. 4 BF) since Cory Rasmus (4 BF – 4 SO) on Oct. 4, 2015 at TEX.
- Earned third win of season Aug. 3 at Cleveland after working one perfect inning.
- Matched season-high with 1.2 scoreless innings on July 29 vs. Mariners.
- Made 34 first half appearances, going 2-2 with four saves, a 3.38 ERA (34.2 IP – 13 ER) and 45 strikeouts.
