WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have lost seven consecutive games as they continue their penultimate trip of the season tonight with the series finale at Kansas City.
- LHP Carlos Rodón, who has made five straight quality starts on the road, will take the mound for the White Sox.
- The Sox have lost the first two games of this series at Kauffman Stadium, scoring three runs in each contest.
- Following tonight's series finale at the Royals and an off day tomorrow, the White Sox will continue the trip with three-game series at Baltimore (9/14-16) and Cleveland (9/18-20).
- The Sox went 3-7 on their last homestand vs. Boston (2-2), Detroit (1-2) and the Angels (0-3) from 8/30-9/9 and 5-2 on their last trip to Detroit (3-1) and New York-AL (2-1) from 8/23-29.

TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox have lost seven consecutive games, one shy of their season-long losing streak (eight from 6/14-22).
- Chicago needs to win seven of its final 17 games to avoid the fourth 100-loss season in franchise history (on pace to go 63-99).
- The Sox are 5-8 in the last 13 games vs. Kansas City after winning the first five in 2018 ... they are trying to avoid being swept for the first time since 7/21-23/17 at Kauffman Stadium.
- Chicago has scored four runs or less in each of the last eight games (2.5 R/G), its longest such streak since 7/22-30/17 (nine).
- Carlos Rodón is 3-0 with a 2.34 ERA (9 ER/34.2 IP), .152 opp. average, 1.04 WHIP and 26 strikeouts over his last five road starts (five QS) ... he has allowed two runs or less four times.
- Matt Davidson needs one home run to set a new club record for homers vs. Kansas City in a single season.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- Kansas City overcame an early one-run deficit by scoring six times from the third inning through the fifth en route to a 6-3 win.
- Avisail García hit a RBI single in the third before the Royals scored three in the third, one in the fourth and two in the fifth.
- Dylan Covey suffered the loss in his first start since replacing Michael Kopech in the Sox rotation ... he allowed six runs (five earned) on six hits with three walks and four strikeouts in 4.1 IP.
- Rob Scamill worked a scoreless eighth in his Sox debut.
- Tim Anderson went 1-4 with a RBI, and Yoán Moncada was 0-3 with two walks and a RBI ... Chicago left eight runners on base, went 2-7 with RISP and struck out nine times.

RODÓN ON A ROLL

- Carlos Rodón is 5-2 with a 2.53 ERA (21 ER/74.2 IP), .171 opp. average and 1.04 WHIP in his last 11 starts (nine QS) ... his 2.53 ERA is third-lowest in the American League behind Cleveland's Carlos Carrasco (2.43) and Boston's David Price (2.47).
- Rodón's streak of nine straight quality starts while allowing five hits or less from 7/5-8/27 was the longest such streak by a White Sox pitcher since at least 1908 (Baseball Reference).

BROADCAST BOOTH SHUFFLE

- Jason Benetti and Steve Stone will call 11 of the final 17 White Sox games in 2018 ... the following changes have been made for six broadcasts on NBC Sports Chicago and WGN-TV:
 - ♦ 9/14 at Baltimore: Chuck Swirsky and Stone ... Benetti will miss the broadcast due to ESPN college football play-by-play duties.
 - ♦ 9/18 at Cleveland: Benetti and Tom Paciorek ... Stone will miss the broadcast due to Yom Kippur.
 - ♦ 9/20 at Cleveland: Stone and Paciorek ... Benetti will miss the broadcast due to ESPN college football play-by-play duties on 9/21.
 - ♦ 9/21-23 vs. Cubs: Ken "Hawk" Harrelson and Stone ... Harrelson will call the final three games of his illustrious and iconic career.

ON-BASE MACHINE

- Yolmer Sánchez has reached base safely in 27 of his last 28 games (hit safely in 24), hitting .298 (31-104) with eight doubles, one HR, five RBI, 14 walks, three HBP and seven multihit efforts.
- Sánchez reached base safely in a career-high 22 consecutive games from 8/11-9/3, the longest streak by a White Sox since 1B José Abreu (29 games) from 8/2-9/2/16.

POSTSEASON VOYAGE

- Advanced Rookie Great Falls last night defeated Grand Junction, 12-9, in Game 1 of the Pioneer League championship series.
- 1B Ryan Fitzpatrick went 3-5 with two home runs and four RBI, and 3B Bryce Bush was 1-4 with a homer and three RBI ... Nick Johnson worked 2.0 scoreless IP for the save.
- Great Falls will host Game 2 on Thursday (8:00 p.m. CT), and a winner-take-all Game 3 on Saturday (8:00 p.m. CT).
- The Voyagers lost to Ogden in the 2017 championship series.

WHITE SOX VS. KANSAS CITY

- The White Sox lead the season series, 10-8, going 5-4 at Guaranteed Rate Field and 5-4 at Kauffman Stadium.
- Chicago is 5-8 over the last 13 games after winning the first five of the season series in April.
- The Sox are hitting .280/.347/.502 with 33 home runs, own a 3.69 ERA (66 ER/161.0 IP) and have made eight quality starts ... they have outscored the Royals, 100-79.
- The White Sox are 20-17 vs. Kansas City since 2017 after going 40-72 from 2011-16 ... they are averaging 5.6 runs per game (207 runs) with 49 homers during the 37-game stretch.
- The Sox lead the all-time series, 395-380 ... they are 219-174 at home (127-104 at Guaranteed Rate Field) and 176-206 on the road (165-184 at Kauffman Stadium).

LOOKING FOR CENTRAL COMMAND

- Chicago is 27-38 against the American League Central in 2018, going 13-21 at Guaranteed Rate Field and 14-17 on the road.
- The Sox need to win each of their final 11 games vs. the division to record a .500 mark this season.
- The White Sox have won 10 of the last 17 games by a 82-76 margin ... they have won three of the last five games and six of the last nine on the road.
- The White Sox are 318-415 vs. the AL Central since 2009, posting a losing record every season except 2012 (37-36).

PALKA POWER

- Daniel Palka, who was claimed off waivers from Minnesota on 11/4/17, ranks among the American League rookie leaders in home runs (3rd, 22), RBI (3rd, 57), extra-base hits (T3rd, 39), total bases (5th, 173) and runs scored (5th, 48).
- Palka's 22 homers are tied with Pete Ward (1963) for the most by a left-handed hitting rookie in White Sox history.
- His three pinch-hit homers this season are tied with Oscar Gamble (1977), John Romano (1959) and Ron Northey (1956) for the White Sox franchise record, and his nine RBI are the most by a Sox pinch-hitter since Jerry Hairston in 1987 (10).

POWER AND SPEED

- Tim Anderson (18 HR/26 SB) is one of four players in the major leagues with at least 18 home runs and 26 stolen bases this season, joining Boston's Mookie Betts, Pittsburgh's Starling Marte and Cleveland's José Ramírez.
- Anderson is attempting to become the first White Sox shortstop to record a 20-HR/20-SB season, and could join Alex Ríos (2010) and Tommie Agee (1966) as the only players in franchise history to post 20 homers and 30 steals in one season.

GRAB SOME BENCH

- Chicago has struck out 1,401 times in 2018, the most in MLB and the most in a single season in franchise history.
- Yoán Moncada leads MLB with 196 strikeouts in 2018 ... he is 26 shy of tying Adam Dunn (222 in 2012) for the club record.

ABREU'S HISTORIC RUN

- José Abreu needs three homers to become the ninth player in MLB history with 25-plus homers in his first five-plus seasons.
- He is on-pace for 25 HR/87 RBI in 2018, and was on-pace for 29 HR/102 RBI before missing 18 games while on the DL.
- Abreu (2014-17), Hall-of-Famer Joe DiMaggio (1936-41) and Albert Pujols (2001-10) are the only players in major-league history to begin their careers with at least four consecutive seasons of 25-plus home runs and 100-plus RBI.
- He already has joined Al Simmons (11, 1924-34), Pujols (10, 2001-10), Ted Williams (1939-42, '46-49) and DiMaggio (1936-42) as the only players in history to record 100 or more RBI in each of his first four seasons.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY

- The White Sox have made 1,381 quality starts since the start of the 2003 season tied with the New York Mets for the highest total in the major leagues, and 52 more than Oakland (1,329), the next-closest American League team.
- The Sox rank third in the AL with 66 quality starts in 2018... RHP James Shields is tied for seventh in the AL with 17 QS.

ON DECK: AT BALTIMORE ORIOLES

- Following tomorrow's off day, Chicago continues this trip with a three-game weekend series at Baltimore ... RHP James Shields (6-16, 4.58) is scheduled to start Friday night's opener.
- The White Sox and Orioles split a four-game series from 5/21-24 at Guaranteed Rate Field ... the Sox are hitting .274/.344/.437 with four homers, own a 3.75 ERA (15 ER/36.0 IP) and own a 19-15 edge in runs scored.
- Chicago has lost three straight and six of eight at Oriole Park.

RODÓN AT A GLANCE

- The 25-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 17th start of the season, ninth on the road and first against the Kansas City Royals.
- Is 0-2 with a 6.55 ERA (8 ER/11.0 IP), eight strikeouts and a .261 (12-46) opponents average over his last two starts, but 5-2 with a 2.52 ERA (21 ER/74.2 IP), 57 strikeouts and a .171 (44-258) opponents average over his last 11 starts (nine quality).
- His 462 career strikeouts are the most by a White Sox pitcher in his first 82 career games ... is averaging 8.70 strikeouts per 9.0 IP (478.0 IP) lifetime ... has struck out 10-plus seven times in his career.
- Started the 2018 season on the disabled list to continue his rehabilitation from left shoulder surgery ... underwent arthroscopic surgery on his left shoulder on 9/27/17.
- Was selected in the first round (third overall) in the June 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of North Carolina State University ... was the highest pick by the Sox since taking outfielder Harold Baines first overall in 1977.
- Entered the 2014 draft rated by *Baseball America* as the No. 1 college prospect and the No. 3 prospect overall ... was rated by MLB.com as the No. 2 overall prospect.

LAST START

- Suffered his second straight loss on 9/7 vs. Los Angeles-AL, allowing four runs on six hits with one walk and four strikeouts over a season-low 4.2 IP.
- Allowed a three-run home run to Shohei Ohtani and a sacrifice fly to Justin Upton in the third inning.
- Departed with the White Sox trailing, 4-2, in the fifth inning ... threw 93 pitches (47 strikes) ... the Sox lost, 5-2.

ROAD WARRIOR LOS

- Is 3-0 with a 2.34 ERA (9 ER/34.2 IP), 26 strikeouts and a .152 (17-112) opponents average over his last five road starts (all quality) ... has allowed just two home runs during that span.
- Has gone 11-13 with a 3.68 ERA (98 ER/239.2) over 40 career appearances (38 starts) on the road ... opponents are hitting .249 (222-892) with 29 home runs lifetime.

QUALITY IS KEY

- Made nine consecutive quality starts, going 5-0 with a 1.84 ERA (13 ER/63.2 IP), 49 strikeouts and a .151 (32-212) opponents average ... the nine straight quality starts were the most by a Sox pitcher since he tossed 10 straight from 8/11/15-4/13/16.
- Six of his 12 starts last season were quality, including five straight from 7/30-8/21/17.
- Made 17 quality starts in 2016, going 9-3 with a 2.16 ERA (26 ER/108.1 IP) in those outings ... recorded 16 quality starts in 2015, the most among American League rookies and second-most among major-league rookies behind Cincinnati's Anthony DeSclafani (17).
- Recorded 10 consecutive quality starts from 8/11/15-4/13/16 ... went 6-3 with a 1.73 ERA (13 ER/67.2 IP), 61 strikeouts and a .202 (48-236) opponents average during that span.
- Is 26-10 with a 2.39 ERA (97 ER/364.2 IP) in 55 career starts when working at least 6.0 IP (49 QS).

LOCKDOWN ON LEFTIES

- Is limiting lefties to a .215 (86-400) average with eight home runs in his career ... right-handers are batting .254 (354-1,393) with 51 homers.
- Charlie Blackmon, Jackie Bradley Jr. (twice), Robinson Canó, Joey Gallo, David Ortiz, Corey Seager and Shohei Ohtani are the only lefties to homer off Rodón.

HE GONE!

- Is averaging 8.70 strikeouts per 9.0 IP (462 SO/478.0 IP) over his career, the fifth-best mark among American League lefties since 2015.
- Has recorded 10-plus strikeouts seven times in his career, including a career-high 11 on four occasions: 8/4/17 at Boston, 7/25/17 at the Cubs, 9/25/16 at Cleveland and 8/11/15 vs. Los Angeles-AL.

CARLOS ON THE MEND

- Made four rehab starts during his stint on the disabled list: one with Class A Kannapolis and three with Class AAA Charlotte ... received a no decision in his only start with Kannapolis on 5/19 vs. Hickory ... allowed one run on three hits with no walks and six strikeouts over 5.0 IP ... went 1-0 with a 1.42 ERA (2 ER/12.2 IP), five walks and 22 strikeouts over three starts with Charlotte ... opponents hit .222 (10-45).

2018 HIGHLIGHTS

- Tied his career high with his fifth straight win on 8/17 at New York-AL (2 ER/7.0 IP) ... recorded the victory on 8/22 vs. Minnesota (2 ER/6.0 IP) ... earned his fourth win of the season on 8/15 at Detroit (3 ER/8.0 IP) after recording his seventh straight quality start.
- Threw 8.0 scoreless IP in his sixth quality start on 8/10 vs. Cleveland ... allowed one unearned run over 6.0 IP on 8/4 at Tampa Bay ... went 7.0-plus IP for the third straight start on 7/29 vs. Toronto (ND; 2 ER/7.2 IP) ... struck out a season-high eight batters on 7/24 at Los Angeles-AL.
- Recorded a career-high 15.1 consecutive scoreless IP from 7/5-24 ... earned his second win of the season on 7/11 at St. Louis, allowing just three hits over 7.1 scoreless IP ... recorded his second quality start on 7/5 at Houston (ND; 2 ER/6.0 IP).
- Collected his first win of 2018 on 6/24 vs. Oakland, allowing two runs on seven hits over a career-high tying 8.0 IP ... allowed just two runs over 5.0 IP in his second start on 6/14 vs. Cleveland ... made his season debut on 6/9 at Boston, suffering the loss after allowing four runs (two earned) over 5.0 IP.

VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS

- Is scheduled to make his sixth career start and first this season against Kansas City ... is 2-2 with a 3.90 ERA (12 ER/27.2 IP) lifetime ... has gone 0-1 with a 7.00 ERA (7 ER/9.0 IP) over two career starts at Kauffman Stadium.
- Suffered the loss in his last start on 9/19/16 at the Royals, allowing six runs on eight hits over 4.0 IP.
- Is 2-1 with a 2.97 ERA (11 ER/33.1 IP), 25 strikeouts and a .167 (19-114) opponents average over five starts (three quality) against the American League Central this season.
