## HERE'S THE STORY...

- ♦ The D-backs' 6-2 start matches the best 8-game start in franchise history (also: 2000, '07, '08 '17)...they have started 7-2 in 3 seasons ('07, '08, '17).
- ♦ A win today would give the D-backs 3 consecutive series wins to start the season for the first time in club history.
- ♦ A win would give the D-backs just their second series win in new Busch Stadium since it opened in 2006 (also: 2016)...Arizona is 1-8-3 in series all-time @ Busch Stadium.
- ♦ **Torey Lovullo** has 99 career managerial wins, and is looking to become the fastest manager in D-backs history to 100 wins.
- ♦ **Taijuan Walker's** 2.85 ERA (15 ER in 47.1 IP) since Aug. 21, 2017 ranks seventh in the NL [min. 40.0 IP].

## YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs lost @ Cardinals, 5-3, and snapped their 4-game winning streak.
- ♦ **A.J. Pollock** went 2-for-3 with a double and a RBI...**Chris Owings** was 1-for-4 with 2 RBI, and extended his hitting streak to 7 games (.417; 10-for-24).
- ♦ **Zack Greinke** struck out 5 and allowed 5 runs in 5.0 innings pitched...**Matt Koch** and **Fernando Salas** combined to toss 3.0 scoreless frames.

## TODAY'S TRANSACTIONS

- ♦ Prior to today's game, the D-backs recalled INF/OF **Christian Walker** from Triple-A Reno...he will be active for today's game.
- ♦ Following yesterday's game, Arizona optioned RHP **Matt Koch** to Reno.

## BABY, IT'S COLD OUTSIDE

- ♦ Yesterday's first pitch temperature of 37 degrees was the coldest in Cardinals history at home, and tied for the coldest starting temperature in D-backs history (also: April 12, 2004 @ Rockies).
- ♦ Arizona is 1-4 all-time in games with first pitch temperature of 40 degrees or lower, with the lone win coming on April 23, 2014 @ Cubs (7-5).

## FAST START

- ♦ Arizona's 6-2 (.750) record is tied for the best 8-game start in team history (also: 2000, '07, '08 '17), and is tied with the Pirates for the second best record in the NL behind the Mets (.857; 6-1).

- ♦ **Torey Lovullo** has 99 career wins in 170 regular season games as a Major League manager, and is looking to be the fastest active manager to reach 100 wins [source: Elias]:

## ROAD WARRIORS

- ♦ Over their last 21 road games since Aug. 21, 2017, the D-backs are 14-7 (.667), the best winning pct. in the NL and tied for third-best in baseball with the Astros, behind only the Indians (.783; 18-5) and Red Sox (.731; 19-7).
- ♦ In that time, Arizona's starting pitching has gone 10-6 with a 2.86 ERA (37 ER in 116.1 IP), 131 strikeouts and 48 walks.

The bobblehead will commemorate Bradley's triple in the 2017 National League Wild Card Game and will feature audio clips from D-backs radio broadcasters Greg Schulte and Tom Candiotti.

## BATMEN

- ♦ **Chris Owings** ranks fourth in the NL with a .400 average, eighth with a .464 on-base pct. and 12th with a 1.064 OPS.
- ♦ **A.J. Pollock** is tied with Eric Hosmer for the NL lead with 6 doubles, and is tied for second in the Majors with Dixon Machado/DET, behind Xander Bogaerts/BOS (7).
- ♦ **Nick Ahmed** is tied for eighth in the NL with 7 RBI.

## ALL ABOUT THAT BASE

- ♦ The D-backs are tied with the Yankees for the Major League lead with 43 walks, ahead of the Nationals (42) and A's (40).
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** ranks third in the Majors with 10 walks, trailing Freddie Freeman/ATL (12) and Bryce Harper/WSH (11).

## START ME UP

- ♦ Arizona's starters have combined to go 5-1 with a 3.66 ERA (19 ER in 46.2 IP), tied for the most wins (also: Pirates and Red Sox) in the Majors.
- ♦ Over the last 5 games, D-backs starting pitchers have gone 3-1 with a 2.75 ERA (11 ER in 36.0 IP), 42 strikeouts, 9 walks and a .220 opponents average, allowing 1 or fewer runs 4 times.

## BULLY-PEN

- ♦ D-backs relievers have posted a 1.78 ERA (6 ER in 30.1 IP) in 8 games and have held the opposition scoreless in 4 consecutive outings (9.2 IP).

## EARLY BIRD GETS THE WORM

- ♦ Arizona has scored 11 runs in the first inning, the third most in the Majors, behind Washington (12) and Atlanta (12).
- ♦ The D-backs have 6 extra-base hits in the opening frame, tied for third most in the Majors with the Rockies, trailing only the Braves (8) and Pirates (7).

## ON-DECK: SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS

- ♦ The D-backs went 12-7 vs. the Giants in 2017, including 4-5 at AT&T Park.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is a .274 career hitter with 24 doubles, 18 home runs and 69 RBI vs. San Francisco...hits .310 with 16 doubles, 9 home runs and 41 RBI @ AT&T Park.
- ♦ **Robbie Ray** is 3-1 with a 1.46 ERA (4 ER in 24.2 IP) in 4 career starts @ Giants.

## TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP ZACK GODLEY (1-0, 1.29)

- ♦ Earned the win in his first outing on April 3 vs. Dodgers (1 ER in 7.0 IP).
- ♦ Is 1-1 with a 7.84 ERA (9 ER in 10.1 IP), 11 strikeouts and 6 walks in 4 career games (2 starts) vs. Giants...will be making his first career start @ AT&T Park.

- ◆ Is in his second season with the D-backs after being acquired from the Mariners with INF Ketel Marte for INF Jean Segura, OF Mitch Haniger and LHP Zac Curtis on Nov. 23, 2016.
- ◆ Named a Top 20 prospect by *Baseball America* 3 times (No. 20 in 2012, 18 in '13 and 11 in '14).
- ◆ Tabbed the No. 1 prospect in the Mariners' system by *Baseball America* twice (2012, '14).
- ◆ Played in MLB All-Star Futures Game in 2012-13.
- ◆ 2012-13 Southern League midseason All-Star.
- ◆ Mariners first-round pick (No. 43) in 2010 draft.

- ◆ Is 2-1 with a 2.05 ERA (6 ER in 26.1 IP) in his last 5 road starts dating back to 2017.
- ◆ Will make his second start @ Busch Stadium.
- ◆ Looking for his first career win vs. NL Central (0-4 in 5 starts).

- ◆ Did not factor in the decision on April 2 vs. Dodgers, allowing 3 runs in 5.0 innings.
- ◆ All 3 of his runs came in the first inning.
- ◆ The D-backs won 8-7 in 15 innings in the longest game in Chase Field history (5:45).

- ◆ Will be making his third career start vs. St. Louis.
- ◆ Went 0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (6 ER in 12.0 IP) and a .233 average against.

- ◆ Loves tattoos...he dedicates the art on his left arm to his family and his right arm to his interests... he wanted to get a tattoo of flames when he threw 100 mph, so when he hit 100 mph in 2011, he got it done.

- ◆ Had a career-best 3.49 ERA while his .247 opponent average matched his career low (also: 2016)...his 146 strikeouts were the second-most of his career (157 in 2015) as were his 157.1 innings (169.2 in 2015).
- ◆ Limited lefties to a .230 average (66-for-287).
- ◆ Among NL pitchers at the plate, he tied for second in average (.231) and tied for fourth in hits (12) and on-base percentage (.245).
- ◆ Was on the Paternity Leave List from July 20-23 after he and his wife welcomed their first child.

**STL Series:** 1-1 SV, 0 ER/1.0 IP, K

- ◆ Has an 11-game scoreless streak (11.0 IP) dating back to Sept. 9, 2017.
- ◆ Save on March 30 vs. Rockies was his first since Oct. 1, 2015.
- ◆ Named the D-backs closer by manager Torey Lovullo on March 27.
- ◆ Limited to 30 games in 2017 due to a strained right flexor muscle, going 4-4 with a 3.38 ERA and 40 strikeouts (12.27 SO/9.0 IP).
- ◆ Was a 2015 American League All-Star and led the league in saves (41).
- ◆ Acquired from the Rays on Nov. 30, 2017 for RHP Curtis Taylor.

**#25 • ARCHIE BRADLEY • R/R**

**STL Series:** HLD, 0 ER/0.1 IP, K

- ◆ Since last season, has held NL Central opponents scoreless in 13 of 14 outings (0.61 ERA, 1 ER in 14.2 IP) with .120 opponent average (6 H, 2 BB) and 13 strikeouts.
- ◆ Went 3-3 with 1 save, a 1.73 ERA, 79 strikeouts, 21 walks and a .207 opponents average in 63 games in 2017, his first season as a reliever...ranked among NL relievers in holds (T-2nd, 25), ERA (5th), WHIP (11th, 1.04) and strikeouts (T-11th).
- ◆ Set the single-season, club reliever record in ERA.
- ◆ Recorded the fifth triple by a pitcher (first by a reliever) in Postseason history in the 2017 Wild Card Game vs. Rockies.

**STL Series:** HLD, 0 ER/0.2 IP, K

- ◆ His 9-game scoreless streak (5.1 IP) dating back to 2017 ended on April 2 vs. Dodgers.
- ◆ In 2017, posted career highs in appearances (71) and strikeouts (61), going 1-0 with a 3.51 ERA and .246 opponents average...his 71 appearances were the second most by a D-backs lefty reliever all time (Randy Choate, 74 in 2004).
