ROSTER NOTE: Prior to today's game, the Mets will activate RHP Noah Syndergaard from the 10-Day Disabled List...A corresponding roster move will be made prior to the game...Syndergaard has been on the DL since July 21, with Hand, Foot, and Mouth Disease.

METSCELLANEOUS: New York is 5-5 in its last 10 games...New York went 12-12 in July...The 12 wins last month were tied for the second-most among NL East teams with Miami, behind the Phillies, who had 15 victories in July...The Mets are 19-21 vs. the NL East...New York is 19-39 in its last 58 games.

ON THE ROAD: The Mets are 2-3 on their six-game road trip, which concludes today and 23-27 on the road this year...New York is 10-19 in its last 29 road games and 5-5 in its last 10.

NOTES ON LAST NIGHT: The Mets allowed 25 runs, the second-most in team history, behind the 26 runs allowed on June 11, 1985 at Philadelphia...The 21-run margin of defeat was the largest in franchise history, surpassing the 19-run margin (26-7) in the same game - June 11, 1985 at Philadelphia.

VS. WASHINGTON: The Mets have won six games vs. Washington this year with eight games remaining...New York won six games all of last year vs. the Nats and seven games in 2016...The Mets are 16-15 at Nationals Park since 2015, including a three-game sweep, April 5-8, earlier this year...The Mets have hit 39 home runs in their last 25 games at Nationals Park.

ONE YEAR AGO: Amed Rosario made his major league debut one year ago today in Colorado...Rosario went 1-4 in that game...He has 20 doubles, 10 triples, 37 RBI and 55 runs scored in 146 games since his debut...His 10 triples are tied for the third-most in the majors during that span.

JEFF McNEIL: Slugged his first major league home run last night...He is the first rookie to homer this year for the Mets...He has a .455 OBP in the majors...McNeil hit 19 combined homers in the minors this year between Binghamton (AA) and Las Vegas (AAA).

INTO THE BOOKS: Austin Jackson hit his first homer as a Met...He joined Jeff McNeil, as two of 425 different players who have gone deep in franchise history.

MICHAEL CONFORTO: Is 12-for-34 (.353) with three homers, three doubles and nine RBI, a .425 OBP and a .706 slugging percentage in 10 games since the All-Star break...Over his last 14 games, Conforto is hitting .326 (15-46) with four home runs, three doubles, 12 RBI, 12 runs scored and a .429 OBP...Conforto has a 14.8 percent walk-rate, the ninth-best in the majors.

JOSÉ BAUTISTA: His next home run will be his 340th career homer and tie him with Jack Clark for 98th on major league baseball's all-time list...Bautista is sixth among active players in home runs, behind Albert Pujols, Adrián Beltré, Miguel Cabrera, Edwin Encarnacion and Nelson Cruz.

1,000: Bautista has scored 999 runs during his career...He will be one of 10 active players with 1,000 runs scored.

METS-NATIONALS NOTES: The Mets have six wins already this year vs. Washington after winning six games all of last year.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73...The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



NOAH NOTES: Noah Syndergaard has not allowed more than three runs in each of his last 12 starts since surrendering four runs in his Opening Day start...He has allowed one earned run or less in three of his last four starts...Syndergaard reached his 500th strikeout in his last start on July 20 at Yankee Stadium, becoming the fastest to reach the mark in franchise history by innings pitched (437.1 innings)...Dwight Gooden is now second having reached 500 strikeouts in 445.1 innings...The Mets are 16-5 in their last 21 games when Syndergaard starts after a team loss.

SYN-SENTIONAL: Syndergaard's 2.89 ERA ranks eighth in the NL and his 0.60 homer per nine innings is sixth (min. 70 innings)...Among active pitchers with at least 70 starts, Noah Syndergaard's 2.89 ERA (141 earned runs/438.2 innings) trails only Clayton Kershaw's 2.37 ERA, Jacob deGrom (2.78) and Chris Sale (2.89 by percentage points).

NIMMO NOTES: Brandon Nimmo has a .432 on-base percentage in the second half, the 10th-highest mark in the NL...Nimmo has a career-high 13 homers, but has one home run in his last 34 games...Overall, he is 11th in the NL with a .380 on-base percentage and tied for fifth in the majors with six triples.

SETH LUGO: Has allowed eight runs in his last 38.1 innings in relief (1.88 ERA) dating to May 1...Lugo has 19 relief outings of more than 1.0 inning, the third-most in the NL.

TODD FRAZIER: Is expected to play for Brooklyn (A) of the New York-Penn League tonight vs. Tri-City...Frazier was 1-4 with a solo homer for the Cyclones yesterday...He played 9.0 innings at third base...Frazier is 2-8 with a double, homer and three RBI in three minor league rehabilitation games...Frazier has been on the DL since July 9 with a left rib cage muscle strain.

IN THE MINORS: Mark Vientos, the Mets second-round pick from last year, has hit five homers, has 13 RBI and is batting .394 (13-33) in his last nine games for Kingsport (R) of the Appalachian League...Vientos is hitting .270 with seven homers (tied for sixth in the league) and 29 RBI (fourth in the league) in 32 games for Kingsport.

SYNDERGAARD AS THOR BOBBLE: This Saturday, the first 25,000 fans attending the Braves-Mets 7:10 p.m. will receive a Noah Syndergaard as Thor bobblehead presented by Marvel.

LAST TIME OUT: Defeated the Yankees for the first time in his career, July 20 in the Bronx...Pitched 5.0 innings, allowing one run, earned, on eight hits while fanning four and walking none in the Mets' 7-5 win...Was his fourth-straight victory, the second-longest streak of his career (won six-straight decisions from May 11-June 22, 2016)...Has fanned fewer than five batters in consecutive starts for the first time in his career (excluding outings of 2.0 innings or fewer last season after returning from a partial tear in his right lat)...Allowed one run for the third time in his last four starts...Fanned his 500th-career batter (Neil Walker in the fourth inning).

DL STINTS: Syndergaard contracted hand, foot and mouth disease and was placed on the 10-Day Disabled List for the second time this season on July 23 (retro to July 21)...He will be activated prior to today's game...In two starts since coming off the DL for the first time on July 13, Syndergaard is 2-0 with a 1.80 ERA (one earned run/10.0 innings).

VS. WASHINGTON: Snapped a four-game losing streak against the Nationals in his last start vs. the club on July 13...Has completed at least 7.0 innings in five of his 11-career starts against the club...Has not started a game at Nationals Park since April 30 of last season, a game he exited after throwing what was then the shortest start of his career (1.1 innings)...Was placed on the Disabled List for the first time in his career after that outing with a partial tear in his right lat...Has allowed one run in two of his four starts at Nationals Park...Allowed five runs in each of the other two outings.

ON THE ROAD: Syndergaard's start today is his sixth road start of the season...In five road starts this season, he is 2-0 with a 2.67 ERA (nine earned runs/30.1 innings)...The Mets have gone 17-8 (.680) in Syndergaard's last 25 away starts since starting 1-8 in his first nine career road starts...In those 25 starts, he is 12-4 with a 2.59 ERA (42 earned runs/145.2 innings) and 167 strikeouts...Has allowed one or no earned runs in nine of his previous 12 road starts and has surrendered more than two earned runs only five times in his last 25 starts on the road...In all, he is 12-9 in 34-career road starts with a 3.19 ERA (68 earned runs/192.0 innings).

HE'S AN AVENGER: The Mets 16-5 in their last 21 games when Syndergaard starts after a team loss (.762 win percentage)...In those 21 starts, Syndergaard is 10-3 with a 2.38 ERA (34 earned runs/128.1 innings) and 148 strikeouts.

RECENT SYNDERGAARD: Is undefeated in his last six starts, going 4-0 with a 2.65 ERA (10 earned runs/34.0 innings) during the unbeaten stretch...Has allowed three runs or fewer in each of his last 12 starts since surrendering four runs in his Opening Day win and has pitched at least 5.0 innings in his last 11 outings...Jacob deGrom (13) is the only pitcher in the majors with a longer active streak of starts of at least 5.0 innings with no more than three runs allowed...Is 5-1 with a 2.51 ERA (18 earned runs/64.2 innings) in his last 11 starts.

REACHED A MILESTONE: In his last start, Syndergaard fanned his 500th career batter...Became the fastest Mets pitcher to 500 strikeouts (by innings pitched) by reaching the mark in 437.1 innings...Passed Dwight Gooden, who fanned his first 500 batters in 445.1 innings...He is one of six Mets pitchers to have reached the mark before their 26th birthday (Syndergaard turns 26 on August 29), the others are: Dwight Gooden (1,391 strikeouts before turning 26), Tom Seaver (866), Sid Fernandez (765) Jon Matlack (747) and Gary Gentry (563).

IN ELITE COMPANY: Syndergaard is one of only four active major league hurlers with at least 70 career starts to sport a sub-3.00 ERA...His 2.89 career ERA (141 earned runs/438.2 innings) is tied with Chris Sale's identical mark for the third-best in the majors...Trails only Clayton Kershaw's 2.37 career ERA and staffmate Jacob deGrom's 2.78 career ERA...Ranks third in the NL in strikeout-to-walk ratio since 2015 (5.45 SO/BB), topped only by Kershaw (7.66) and Max Scherzer (5.68)...Is the only pitcher in modern MLB history (since 1900) to have a SO/BB ratio of 5.0 or greater in each of his first three seasons.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP JASON VARGAS (2-6, 8.36)

PREVIOUS START: Was left with a no-decision after throwing 4.1 innings and surrendering three runs, earned, on three hits with three walks and three strikeouts in the Mets' 5-4 setback at PNC Park on July 27...Allowed no more than three runs for the fourth time in his last five starts.

VS. ATLANTA: Has made two starts against the Braves this season, one at home and one on the road...In his last start against Atlanta, pitched 5.0 shutout innings, allowing just two hits and a walk (intentional) while fanning two on May 30 at SunTrust Park...In his May 3 outing against the club at Citi Field, allowed six runs, earned, on 11 hits in 4.2 innings.
