ROSTER NOTE: The Mets designated RHP Matt Harvey for assignment today...A corresponding roster move will be made prior to tonight's game.

METSCELLANEOUS: New York's .567 winning percentage is the fifth-best in the National League...The Mets have lost four consecutive games for the first time this season...The Mets are 7-8 at home...After winning each of its first five series of the season, New York has lost four of its last five series.

FIRST INNING: The Mets have allowed 29 first-inning runs this season, tied for the third-most in the majors...New York has been outscored 11-2 in the opening frame in the four games on this homestand...New York allowed four first-inning runs over its first 14 games.

STREAKS VS. ROCKIES: New York won 11 straight games vs. Colorado from May 4, 2014-August 23, 2015...The Rockies won the first six games between the two clubs in 2016 before the Mets won the season finale...Mets went 3-3 vs. the Rockies last year.

20 RBI: The Mets are one of three teams in the National League with three players with 20 or more RBI...Yoenis Céspedes has 26 while Todd Frazier and Asdrúbal Cabrera both have 20 RBI...The Rockies and the Braves are the other two clubs.

YO!: Yoenis Céspedes is tied for second in the NL and tied for seventh in the majors with 26 RBI...He has 14 RBI in his last 15 games...He is tied for sixth in the NL with seven homers...Céspedes is hitting .310 (18-58) with .359 OBP with three doubles, four home runs and 14 RBI in his last 15 games...He has reached base safely in his last 10 games (.425 OBP).

CÉSPEDES VS. ROX: Céspedes has six home runs and 15 RBI while slashing at .299/.349/.610 in 20 career games vs. Colorado.

ASDRÚBAL CABRERA: Is second in the National League and ninth in the majors with a .330 batting average, ninth in the NL with a .591 slugging percentage, is fifth in the NL with 17 extra-base hits, tied for seventh with 22 runs scored and tied for 10th in the majors with 10 doubles...He tied his season-high with three RBI last night (also: April 27 at San Diego)...Cabrera is tied for 13th in the NL with 20 RBI...He has 15 RBI in his last 15 games...Cabrera is hitting .344 (21-61) with six doubles, three homers, 15 RBI and 10 runs scored over his last 15 games.

CABRERA DINGERS: Cabrera hit his sixth home run of the year last night (29th game)...He did not hit his sixth home run until June 12 last season (49th game)...Cabrera is tied for 15th in the NL in homers.

TODD FRAZIER: Is 17th in the NL with a .386 on-base percentage and tied for 11th with 20 walks...He hit his fifth home run of the season last night...Frazier has eight home runs and 19 RBI in his last 23 games against Colorado.

FRAZIER IN CITI: In his last 11 home games, Todd Frazier is 14-39 (.359) with two doubles, three home runs and 11 RBI.

ROCKIES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 64-35 vs. Colorado at home...The .646 winning percentage is the best vs. any team (min. 15 games) in team history.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



BRANDON NIMMO: Leads the majors with a .471 on-base percentage (min. 30 at-bats)...Nimmo is batting .289 (11-38)... Nimmo had the fourth-best on-base percentage (.379) among major league rookies in 2017 and a 15.3% walk rate, which was tied for the 10th-highest among all players with 200 or more plate appearances.

JAY BRUCE: Made his 14th career start and 16th appearance at first base last night...Bruce is batting .308 (12-39) with one triple, one home run and five RBI over his last 10 games.

BRUCE VS. ROCKIES: Jay Bruce has hit safely in 19 of his last 22 games vs. the Rockies dating to August 17, 2014...Is hitting .333 (32-96) in that time with nine doubles, two triples, eight homers, 23 RBI and 16 runs scored.

ADRIÁN GONZÁLEZ: Has 16 RBI in his last 16 games...Gonzalez is 6-for-his-last-19 (.316) with one home run and five RBI...He is seven RBI shy for 1,200 for his career.

STRIKEOUTS: The Mets rank fifth in the NL and ninth in the majors with 295 strikeouts...New York is ninth in the majors with a 3.11 strikeout-to-walk rate.

JEURYS FAMILIA: Ranks fourth in the majors with nine saves...He has 109 saves since 2015, tied for the third-most in the majors... Familia has held righthanders to a .132 (5-38) batting average.

JERRY BLEVINS: Has stranded 11 inherited runners this season, tied for the fourth-most in the majors this year...Since 2016, Blevins has stranded 94 inherited runners the most in the majors...The first 15,000 fans tomorrow will receive a pair of Jerry Blevins baseball socks.

IN THE FIELD: The Mets have a .985 fielding percentage, the fifth-best mark in the National League.

IN THE MINORS: St. Lucie shortstop Andres Gimenez has hit in seven straight games going (8-24, .333)...The 19-year-old is hitting .277 (26-94) with five doubles, one triple, two home runs, 10 RBI and a .340 on-base percentage in 26 games...Gimenez is the third-youngest player in the Florida State League.

LAST START: Today marks Matz' first start in 10 days, his longest-ever layoff between in-season starts without spending time on the Disabled List, after he was pushed back in the rotation due to back stiffness...Took the loss last time out, April 25 at St. Louis...The southpaw pitched 3.1 innings, giving up a career-high-tying seven runs, three earned, on five hits with two walk and three strikeouts in the outing...Fell to 0-2 against the Cardinals this season (the Mets have won each of his other three starts against the rest of the league).

VS. COLORADO: Matz will make his fourth-career start vs. Colorado tonight...In his three previous starts vs. the Rockies, the lefty is 0-2 with a 9.00 ERA (12 earned runs/12.0 innings)...Matz' shortest-career outing came in his last home start vs. the Rockies, August 1 of last season...Pitched 1.0 inning in that start, giving up a career-high-tying seven runs, earned, on nine hits...His 9.00 ERA vs. Colorado is his highest against any single opponent he's faced in his career.

MAY FLOWERS: Matz will be making his sixth-career start in the month of May, and first since 2016...In five-career May starts, Matz is a perfect 4-0 with a 1.31 ERA (five earned runs/34.1 innings)...Opponents have managed 21 hits in 122 at-bats vs. Matz in May (.172)...His 7.75 K/BB (31 strikeouts/four walks) ratio is the best out of any month in his career, as is his 0.73 WHIP.

STRIKING OUT THE COMPETITION: Through his first five starts of the 2018 season, Matz owns a 10.80 K/9 ratio (26 strikeouts/21.2 innings), which would be the highest season total of his career...The southpaw has also struck out 27.4 percent of the batters he's faced so far this season.

SETTLING IN: In Matz' career, he has a 6.07 ERA (31 earned runs/46.0 innings) in the first inning...From the second inning onward, his career ERA is 3.64 (85 earned runs/210.1 innings).

VS. NL WEST: Since beginning his career with seven-straight quality starts against NL West clubs (posted a 4-1 record and 1.87 ERA in that stretch), Matz is 0-3 with a 13.19 ERA (21 earned runs/14.1 innings) in his last four outings against the NL West.

2017: Went 2-7 with a 6.08 ERA (45 earned runs/66.2 innings) in 13 starts for the Mets last season..Began the season on the 10-Day DL with left elbow inflammation and didn't make his season debut until June 10 at Atlanta...Went 2-1 with a 2.12 ERA (eight earned runs/34.0 innings) in his first five starts of the season before going 0-6 with a 10.19 ERA (37 earned runs/32.2 innings) over his final eight starts of the season...Ended the season on the DL after undergoing surgery to decompress and reposition the ulnar nerve in his left elbow on August 23.

MATZ' CAREER SNAPSHOT

- » A second-round selection in the 2009 First-Year Player Draft, Matz is in his ninth season in the Mets organization.
- » In 2013, struck out 121 in 106.1 innings for Savannah (A) of the South Atlantic League...Helped lead the Sand Gnats to the SAL Championship by going 2-0 with 12.2 scoreless innings and 17 strikeouts during the postseason.
- » Named the Sterling Organizational Pitcher of the Year in 2014 after finishing 10-9 with a 2.24 ERA (35 earned runs/140.2 innings) and 131 strikeouts in 24 games, all starts, over two levels.
- » Made his major league debut on June 28, 2015 vs. Cincinnati...Tossed 7.2 innings, allowed two runs and earned the win...Also went 3-3 with four RBI in his major league debut.
- » Became the first Mets pitcher born in New York to start a playoff game for the Mets (Game 4, 2015 NLDS vs. Los Angeles).
- » Won nine games in 2016, tied for fourth-most by a rookie lefty in team history.
- » Named the NL Rookie of the Month for May, 2016 after going 4-0 with a 1.31 ERA in five starts.
- » Started the Mets' 2015 NLCS-clinching Game 4 win at Wrigley Field... pitched 4.2 innings, allowed one run and struck out four.
- » Appeared in six regular season major league games prior to starting Game 4 of the World Series...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, that is tied for the fewest career regular season games at the time a pitcher made his first career World Series start.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP NOAH SYNDERGAARD (2-1, 3.10 ERA)

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered his first loss of the season on May 1 at home against Atlanta...Syndergaard pitched 6.0 innings, giving up three runs, earned, on a career-high-tying 10 hits with one walk and a season-low three strikeouts...All three runs came in the first inning.

SYN-CITI: Syndergaard will toe the rubber at Citi Field for his fifth home start of the season and second of this homestand...Is 1-1 with a 3.80 ERA (nine earned runs/21.1 innings) in four home starts this season with 31 punchouts and only four walks...The Mets are 3-1 in those four starts...Has surrendered three or fewer earned runs in 22 of his last 25 starts at Citi Field.
