## PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (31-26) vs CHICAGO CUBS (33-23)

Tuesday, June 5, 2018 – Wrigley Field – 8:05 EDT – Game 58; Road 30

RHP Zach Eflin (1-2, 4.50) vs RHP Kyle Hendricks (4-4, 3.19)

- SUNDAY'S ACTION:** The Phillies fell to the San Francisco Giants, 6-1, at AT&T Park ... Starter Jake Arrieta (L, 5-3) went 6.0 innings and allowed 8 hits on 5 runs with no walks and 4 strikeouts ... Arrieta cruised through the first 5.0 innings before the Giants plated 5 runs in the 6<sup>th</sup> ... Arrieta provided the only Phils offense on the day with a solo home run in the 3<sup>rd</sup>.
- BOHM SWEET HOME:** Last night, the Phillies selected **Alec Bohm**, a 21-year-old third baseman from Wichita State University, in the first round (No. 3 overall) of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft ... Bohm, an Omaha, Neb., native, batted .339 (76-224) with 14 doubles, a triple, 16 home runs, 55 RBI, 39 walks, 57 runs, nine stolen bases, a .436 on-base percentage and a .625 slugging percentage during his junior season ... At the time Wichita State's season ended, the 6-foot-5, 220-pound Bohm led the American Athletic Conference in home runs, pacing the Shockers for the second straight year ... He also led the AAC in runs, tied for first in total bases (140) and finished in the top five in hits, RBI, on-base percentage and slugging percentage ... The right-handed-hitting Bohm was named a Baseball America Second-Team All-American, as well as a semifinalist for both the Dick Howser Trophy, given to the nation's college player of the year, and the Golden Spikes Award ... He leaves Wichita State with a career .317 average, 40 doubles, 33 home runs and 125 RBI in 166 games over three seasons ... Bohm's selection marks just the second time the Phillies have selected a third baseman with their first-round pick, and first time since 1998, when they took Phillies Wall of Famer Pat Burrell first overall from the University of Miami.
- CHI TOWN RAISED ME:** Tonight, **Jake Arrieta** makes his return to Wrigley Field for the first time with the Phillies after signing a multi-year contract on March 12 ... A member of the 2016 World Series champion Cubs, Arrieta won a Cy Young Award with Chicago in 2015 as he went 22-6 with a 1.77 ERA (45 ER, 229.0 IP) in 33 starts ... In nine postseason starts for Chicago, Arrieta went 5-3 with a 3.08 ERA, including both of his 2016 World Series starts where he went 2-0 with a 2.38 ERA ... In May, Arrieta made five starts for the Phillies and posted a 0.90 ERA (3 ER, 30.0 IP) while holding opponents to a .236/.296/.302 slash line in 116 plate appearances ... After posting a 0.90 ERA for the month, he became one of only seven pitchers in Phillies history to post a sub-1.00 ERA during a month in which they made at least five starts.
- MY KIND OF TOWN:** Since 2007, the Phillies are 19-17 (.528 win %) in 36 games at Wrigley Field ... That is the highest win percentage for any visiting Major League team with at least 10 games played on the North Side ... In fact, the Phillies are one of only four visiting teams with a record of .500 or better at Wrigley since 2007: Dodgers (20-19, .513), Reds (51-50, .505) and White Sox (16-16, .500) ... Philadelphia has a 5-4-2 series record in their 11 sets against the Cubs in that span as well as a +19 run differential in those 36 contests ... After winning 18 of 29 games against the Cubs at Wrigley from 2007-2015, the Phillies are just 1-7 at Wrigley since 2016.
- STAFF NOTES:** Over their last 26 games (5/5-current), the Phillies starting rotation has posted a 2.51 ERA (42 ER, 150.1 IP) and has struck out 168 of the 604 batters they have faced (28.2%) ... **Philadelphia's 2.51 ERA in that span is best in the majors (next: WSH, 2.52 ERA) and their 27.8 % strikeout rate ranks 2<sup>nd</sup>, trailing only the Nationals (28.2%)** ... The staff has allowed 3 ER or fewer in 22 of those 26 games and 2 ER or fewer in 20 of 26.
- THANK YOU FOR YOUR PATIENCE:** The Phils have seen a total of 8,616 pitches over 2,140 plate appearances this season and their 4.03 pitches per plate appearance lead rank 2<sup>nd</sup> in the NL (best: LAD, 4.04) and 4<sup>th</sup> in the majors (best: OAK, 4.05) ... Philadelphia has the 2<sup>nd</sup>-best walk rate in the majors at 10.0% (best: NYY, 10.3%) and rank 5<sup>th</sup> among all ML teams this season in walks (214) ... Philadelphia currently boasts three different players among the top 13 in walks this season in the majors: Cesar Hernandez (38, T-4<sup>th</sup>), Carlos Santana (37, T-9<sup>th</sup>) and Rhys Hoskins (34, T-13<sup>th</sup>) ... The Phillies have not had three players finish in the top 10 in walks since 1993 when Lenny Dykstra (2<sup>nd</sup>, 129 BB), Darren Daulton (5<sup>th</sup>, 117 BB) and John Kruk (8<sup>th</sup>, 111 BB) did so.
- YES SER!** Since making his major league debut on May 7, **Seranthony Dominguez** has tossed 13.2 scoreless innings over 11 appearances and has allowed only two singles and a hit by pitch ... In other words, he has faced 43 batters this season and has retired 40 of them, 15 by strikeout (34.9% SO rate) ... The Phillies are 10-1 in games which Dominguez has pitched ... His 13.2-inning scoreless streak to begin his career is the longest by a Phillies reliever since Todd Frohwirth began his career with 14.2 scoreless innings (1987-88), per *Elias*.
- EXTRA, EXTRA:** The Phillies have collected at least one extra-base hit in 53 consecutive games (since 4/4) and are one of just three teams in 2018 to have a streak of 50 or more straight games with an extra-base hit: Chicago Cubs – 56 straight games (3/29-current) & Texas Rangers – 50 straight games (4/3-5/27) ... This current stretch marks Philadelphia's longest extra-base hit streak since 2015-16, when they did so in 54 straight games (9/22/15-5/20/16).
- GO WEST, YOUNG MAN:** Tonight marks the eighth game of a 10-game, 11-day road trip that began at Dodger Stadium for four games (2-2, 5/28-31), continued with a three-game set against the Giants in San Francisco (0-3, 6/1-3), before concluding with this three-game series against the Cubs at Wrigley (6/5-7) ... Following this trip, the Phillies will head home where they will play 15 of their final 21 games of the month of June at Citizens Bank Park.
