TWINS NOTES:

- **THE TWINS** scored five runs in the first inning, their most in the first this season...this was the most runs scored in the first by the Twins since August 20, 2017 at Arizona when they recorded nine runs...in the fifth inning the Twins allowed six runs, a season high (previously, 5, 4x, last 8th inning, 4/23 vs. NYY)...the 15 runs allowed was the most since May 31, 2017 vs. Houston when they allowed 17...20 hits allowed was most since May 14, 2015 at Detroit, also 20...tonight's game was 4:00, the longest nine inning game this season...this marks the ninth 4:00 hour nine inning game, last done two times last season.
- **PHIL HUGHES** made his second start of the season, going 3.2 innings and allowing four runs on five hits...has failed to make it out of the fourth inning in each of his two starts this season.
- **JOE MAUER** (0-for-2)walked three times in the game (first, second and fourth innings), entering the game Mauer ranked second among active players with 112 walks in interleague play, 13 shy of Albert Pujols in first (125)...27th game walking 3-plus times (career high).
- **MIGUEL SANO** (1-for-5) has hit in 15 of his last 19 games...has a .287 (33-for-115) average with 17 RBI in 29 career interleague games.
- **BRIAN DOZIER** (2-for-4) had a single in the first inning, extending his current home hitting streak to 14 straight, including the Puerto Rico series, batting .351 (20-for-57) in during that streak with six multi-hit games in that span...his double in the second was his fifth of the season...recorded two hits today, marking his seventh multi-hit game of the season, entering the day he was tied with Eduardo Escobar and Joe Mauer for most multi-hit games this season on the team.
- **EDDIE ROSARIO** (2-for-5) notched a double in the first inning, his seventh extra-base hit of the season...has a hit in nine of his last 11 games...recorded his third home run of the season in the ninth inning, a solo shot to right.
- **LOGAN MORRISON** (2-for-5) hit his second home run of the year, a two run shot in the first inning off of Castillo, scoring Rosario...this is his second home run since April 20, a span of 18 at-bats, after starting the season without hitting a home run in 44 at-bats...with a single in the third he recorded his first multi-hit game of the season.
- **RYAN PRESSLY** allowed a run to score in the fifth inning, snapping a 13.0 scoreless IP streak, the streak set his career-high.
- **DAVID HALE** made his first career appearance for the Twins in the sixth inning after being claimed off waivers yesterday from the New York Yankees, he allowed four runs and struck out two.

- **ROBBIE GROSSMAN** (3-for-4) reached base safely four times tonight, three hits and a walk...has now reached base safely his last seven of his last nine plate appearances.

CINCINNATI NOTES:

- **THE REDS** had two players (Votto and Gennett) record two hits in the fifth, this marked the first time since August 17, 2017 that two Reds players recorded two hits in the same inning...20 hits marked a season-high for the Reds...15 runs also marked a season-high for the Reds...the six runs scored in the fifth tied a season high, previously done on April 16 at Milwaukee.
- **JOSE PERAZA** (4-for-6) hit his first and second home runs of the season, a solo shot to left field off Hughes in the first and a solo shot off Hale in the ninth, marking his first career multi-home run game...tied his career-high in hits (4, 3x previously, last August 22, 2016 vs Los Angeles-NL) and career-high runs (3, 2x previously, last, August 22, 2016 vs. Los Angeles-NL).
- **EUGENIO SUAREZ** (4-for-6) recorded four hits, a career-high.
- **LUIS CASTILLO** made his sixth start of the season and left the game after facing two batters in the second, his 1.0 inning of work, marks the shortest start of his career, previously 4.0 IP (2x, last, September 1, 2017 at Pittsburgh).
- **JOEY VOTTO** (3-for-3) extending his on-base-streak to 12 games, a season high...also extended his season-high hitting streak to six, batting .391 (9-for-23)...his home run in the fifth inning extended his consecutive home run streak to four games, a career-high...was on base six times during the game, tying his career high, the other time being May 18, 2013 at Philadelphia, when he recorded four hits and walked twice.
- **ADAM DUVALL** (2-for-6) hit a double in the fourth inning, his sixth of the season, entering the game he was second on the team for doubles.
- **JESSE WINKER** (1-for-6) recorded a double in the top of the fourth inning, extending his hit streak to nine games, a career high and the longest by a Red this season, batting .400 (12-for-30) during the streak.
- **BILLY HAMILTON** (1-for-4) notched a triple in the fifth inning, his first of the season.
