TWINS NOTES:

- **THE TWINS** dropped the second of three against the Angels...are now 2-4 against Los Angeles-AL this season and 0-2 at Target Field against the Halos...are now 5-10 against the AL West...fall to 11-8 against Los Angeles-AL since 2016...the Twins are now 5-8 on their current 11-game homestand and fall back below .500 at Target Field (16-17)...15 of their last 17 games have been decided by three or fewer runs, going 6-9 in those contests and are now 16-26 in games decided by two runs or fewer this year and 3-13 in one run games.
- **KYLE GIBSON** suffered his fourth loss of the season...went 7.0 innings and allowed just two runs on five hits, both of which came off home runs...the 118 pitches set a career-high...the 7.0 innings pitched tie a season-high, previously done one time on May 29 at Kansas City...has limited opponents to two-or-fewer runs eight times this season...marks just the second time this season he has allowed multiple home runs in a game, other May 18 at Milwaukee...Twins starting pitching has recorded three consecutive starts of 100+ pitches for the second time this season, other streak was May 20-22.
- **MAX KEPLER** (1-for-3) recorded a single in the bottom of the fourth inning...is now hitting .302 (19-for-63) against left handed pitchers after hitting .152 (19-for-125) in 2017.
- **EHIRE ADRIANZA** (1-for-3) hit a double in the fifth inning and has now reached base safely in seven of his last eight starts, hitting .321 (9-for-28) with two walks during that time...also has recorded a hit in six of last seven starts against the Angels, hitting .278 (5-for-18) in those games.
- **MIGUEL SANO** (2-for-4) doubled for the second consecutive game and ninth time this season...extended his hitting streak to 10 against the Angels, hitting .405 (17-for-42) with three doubles and seven RBI over that stretch.
- **EDDIE ROSARIO** (2-for-4) hit a single in the sixth inning...has now recorded a hit in eight of 10 games this homestand, hitting .385 (15-for-39)...since May 1, hitting .370 (56-for-151) with 12 doubles, 11 home runs, 31 RBI and 27 runs scored...his two singles marked his 25th multi-hit game, leading the team.

ANGELS NOTES:

- **THE ANGELS** extending their winning streak to six games and have now won seven of their last eight games...improve to 20-10 on the road this year...they are 8-12 in their last 20 games against the Twins...improve to 12-7 in one run games and 31-19 against right handed starters.
- **TYLER SKAGGS** earned his fifth win of the season...went 7.0 innings and did not allow a run on five hits...his eight strikeouts tied a season-high also done on April 29 vs. New York-AL...this was his second consecutive start not allowing a run...the 7.0 innings tied a season-high also done on April 23 at Houston...Angels starters have now held opponents to three or fewer runs in 32 of their last 37 starts.
- **ALBERT PUJOLS** (2-for-4) recorded his 623rd career home run, a solo shot in the sixth inning, and is now seven shy of tying Ken Griffey Jr. on baseball's all-time home run list...with this RBI he tied Stan Musial with 1,951 career-RBI for sixth on baseball's all-time list...with a single in the eighth this marked his 16th multi-hit game of the year and his 861st career multi-hit game second most in MLB since 2001 behind Ichiro Suzuki (909).

- **IAN KINSLER** (1-for-4) hit a solo home run in the third inning and is now hitting .356 (16-for-45) with six home runs and 11 RBI over his last 11 games...has recorded a home run in three consecutive games...has now recorded a hit in five of six games this season vs. Minnesota, hitting .364 (8-for-22) with two home runs against the Twins.
- **MIKE TROUT** (1-for-3) singled in the top of the first inning, is hitting .338 (25-for-74) in his last 21 games.
