HEART & HUSTLE—INF/OF Joey Wendle, the Rays recipient of the 2018 Heart and Hustle Award by the Major League Baseball Players Alumni Association (MLBPAA), will be honored prior to tonight's game in a pregame ceremony...the Heart and Hustle Award is the only award in MLB that is voted on by former players...alumni select one player from all 30teams based on the passion, desire and work ethic demonstrated both on and off the field...the final winner will be announced on November 8 at the 19th Annual Legends for Youth Dinner in New York City.

RAY MATTER-Last night the Rays won on a Willy Adames walk-off homer to snap a 3-game losing streak, and they avoided falling under .500 for the first time since the end of play on July 6 (43-44)...it was the fourth straight time they won a game to avoid falling under .500...the Rays are 1-3 in their last 4 games and the tie-breaking run has scored in the 9th inning or later in all four of these games...the Rays are 8-9 since the All-Star break and 9-12 in their last 21 games, going 5-1 over that 21game stretch against teams entering the series with a .500 record or better and 4-11 against teams entering the series with a record under .500.

- + The Rays are 7-6 in their last 13 home games after going 14-1 from June 11-July 11...this is the final series of a 9-game homestand against the Angels (3-0). White Sox (0-3) and Orioles (1-0)...the end of this series concludes a stretch of 15 of 19 games at home.
- The Rays are 18-18-0 in series play this season, including 11-7-0 in series play at home...they have swept eight series and been swept seven times-41.7 pct, of their series have resulted in a sweep.

DOME SWEET DOME—Last night the Rays won in walk-off fashion for the seventh time, tied with the Athletics and Blue Javs for most in the AL and tied for 4th in the majors behind the Cardinals (9), Brewers (8) and Giants (8)...the seven walk-off wins match their total from the previous two seasons combined, and are their most since a club-record-tying 13 walkoff wins in 2013...last night was the fourth time this season the Rays hit a walk-off home run, most in the AL and tied for 3rd in the majors behind the Cardinals (6) and Braves (5)...it's also their most since 2013 (4), and more than the previous four seasons (2014-17) combined (2).

FREE WILLY-At 22 years, 339 days, Willy Adames became the fifth player in franchise history to hit a walk-off home run before his 23rd birthday, joining Jake Bauers on June 24 vs. NYY, Evan Longoria in 2008, Delmon Young in 2007 and Carl Crawford (twice) in 2003...while Adames (22.339) and Bauers (22.261) have both hit walk-off homers for the Rays, only two other players in the majors this season have hit a walk-off home run before their 23rd birthday: ATL Ozzie Albies (21.169) on June 25 vs. CIN and NYY Gleyber Torres (21.144) on May 6 vs. CLE.

- The walk-off homer was the fourth in club history by a shortstop, following Ben Zobrist on Sep 7, 2012 vs. TEX, Reid Brignac on Sep 13, 2010 vs. NYY and Kevin Stocker on May 12, 1998 vs. CLE.
- + It was also the second time this season the Rays hit a walk-off home run from the No. 9 spot in the batting order, joining Daniel Robertson's pinch-hit, walk-off grand slam on July 22 vs. MIA... prior to this season, the Rays didn't have a walk-off homer from the No. 9 spot since Gabe Gross on June 1, 2008 vs. CWS.

GAME OF INCHES-Last night Michael Perez struck out in the 9th inning after coming within inches of his first career homer—the ball landed three seats over from Dan Johnson's game-tying, 9th-inning homer in "Game 162" on Sep 28, 2011 vs. NYY...he would have joined Bobby Smith on April 13, 1998 vs. MIN as the only players in franchise history to hit a walk-off for his first career homer...he also would have become the first player in the majors to hit a walk-off homer on his birthday since CWS Andruw Jones on April 23, 2010 vs. SEA, and he would have become the second player in major league history to have his first career homer go for a walk-off on his birthday, following CLE Carroll Hardy in 1958.

RAYS vs. ORIOLES—The Rays are 7-7 this season against the Orioles (3-1 at home, 4-6 at Oriole Park at Camden Yards)...the remaining 5 games in the season series are at home, as they host the Orioles again from Sep 7-9... the Rays were outscored, 84-51, and outhomered, 25-10, in the 10 games in Baltimore, and the 84 runs and 25 HR allowed were both their most all-time for a single season at a visiting venue...previous highs were 77 runs at Yankee Stadium in 2004 and 22 HR at Yankee Stadium in 2017.. for the record, the Rays have allowed 93 runs and 28 HR in the season

series—their highest marks against a single opponent in a season are 136 runs in 2002 vs. TOR and and 33 HR in 2003 vs. BOS and 2002 vs. TOR.

- + The Rays have lost by 9+ runs three times against the O's, and their margin of defeat has been 9+ runs once in their other 99 games.
- 20.5 pct. of the Orioles wins this season have come vs. TB.

CLOSE SHAVES-The Rays are 21-26 (.447) in 1-run games this season, leading the majors in 1-run games (Mariners, 42) and 1-run losses (Mets/ Orioles, 21)...the Rays have played four consecutive 1-run games for the third time this season, following April 8-13 at BOS/CWS, vs. PHI (5) and April 29-May 2 at BOS/DET (4)—the longest streak in franchise history is six straight, Sep 12-18, 2010...the 47 1-run games are the most for a team through 113 games since the 2005 Nationals (47) and most for an AL team since the 1993 Royals (50)...41.6 pct. of Rays games have been decided by 1 run, compared to 27.7 pct. of games in the majors...46.4 pct. of their losses have come by 1 run, highest rate in the majors (Astros, 45.2 pct.).

- The Rays are on pace for 37 1-run losses, which hasn't been done by an AL club since the 1968 White Sox (44)...the club record for 1-run losses in a single season is 30 (2015)...42.3 pct. of their 1-run losses have come against the Red Sox (1-6) and Mariners (0-5).
- Since May 26, the Rays have played 34 games at home: 24 wins, 91-run losses, and 1 loss by 2 runs or more (July 24 vs. NYY, 4-0).

PITCHING PLANS—Tonight's game will be started by Ryne Stanek, the 29th time the Rays will use an opener and their 18th time using Stanek in that role...since the debut of the opener on May 19 at LAA. Rays pitching ranks 4th in the majors and 3rd in the AL with a 3.54 ERA-before that, their 4.43 ERA ranked 22nd in the majors and 9th in the AL.

- + The Rays announced in spring a season-opening rotation of **Chris** Archer (traded), Blake Snell, Nathan Eovaldi (traded) and Jake Faria. but they have used other starters in 55 of 113 games (48.7 pct.).
- The Rays have used an opener in 28 games, and they are 13-15 in these games...the openers have pitched to a 3.96 ERA (38.2-IP, 17-ER), including a 1.76 ERA (30.2-IP, 6-ER) in the last 20 games...the team has a 3.95 ERA (250.1-IP, 110-ER) in games started by openers.
- The Rays have employed a bullpen day in an additional 21 games this season, and are 11-10 when doing so...they have used a traditional starter in 64 games, and have gone 33-31 in those games.
- + For clarification, an opener is used to face 3-9 batters, depending on matchups, while a "bullpen day" starter tends to pitch deeper but generally no more than two times through the order.

REDEFINING RELIEF—So far this season, Rays relievers have totaled:

- + 39 apps of at least 50 pitches, most in the majors, ahead of the Marlins (14), and their most for any season in club history (2003, 29)
- 18 apps of at least 70 pitches, most in the majors, ahead of the Marlins (7), and their most for any season in club history (2004, 7)
- 98 apps of at least 2 IP, most in the majors (Padres, 75)
- 45 apps of at least 3 IP, most in the majors (Padres/Royals, 16)
- 28 apps of at least 4 IP, most in the majors (Marlins, 8)
- Rays relievers lead the majors with 544.2 IP, most in the majors by 103 IP (Padres) and most in the AL by 113.2 IP (Angels).

PITCHING POINTS—The Rays have a major-league-most 19 losses when yielding 3 runs or fewer, ahead of the Giants (16) and Pirates (16)...this is already the 4th-most in a single season in franchise history-the club record is 24 (2014)...they also have a major-league-most 11 losses when yielding 2 runs or fewer-no other team has more than 8 losses when doing so...this is the 2nd-most in franchise history behind 2012 (12).

- + Rays starters have gone 3 IP or fewer 42 times this season, most by a team since Baseball Reference data is available (1908), ahead of the 1949 St. Louis Browns (40)...their starters have gone 2 IP or fewer 33 times, most ever by a team ahead of the 1977 Mariners (27).
- No Rays starter has recorded a win since Nathan Eovaldi on July 8 at NYM...Rays starters are 0-6 in 24 games since then...the bullpen's 60 decisions are the most in the majors (Dodgers, 46).
- + 21 different pitchers have recorded a win for the Rays this season, most in the majors (Dodgers/Marlins, 20) and a single-season club record (20, 2017)...the Rays have used a major-league-most and club-record 15 different starting pitchers, as well as a club-record 31 different pitchers, 2nd-most in the majors to the Cubs (32).

LAST OUTING—On Fri vs. CWS, struck out all 5 BF in his 17th start, becoming the first starter since Baseball Reference data is available (1908) to go longer than 1 IP and strike out every batter faced...previous long was 1 IP by Sergio Romo on May 19 at LAA and BOS Ernie Shore on Oct 6, 1915 at NYY (G1)...his 5 SO tied a career high (2nd time, also June 10, 2017 (G2) vs. OAK)...his line: ND, 1.2 IP, 5 SO, 23 pit, 16 str.

HARD TO HIT-Min. 30 IP, ranks 6th in the AL with a .162 opp avg. (25-for-154)... since the start of June, is 0-2 with a 1.59 ERA (34-IP, 6-ER) in 27 apps (15 starts), 7thbest ERA in the AL over that stretch (min. 25 IP)...has pitched to a 1.80 ERA (40-IP, 8-ER) in 32 apps (17 starts) since May 22 to lower his season ERA from 7.36 to 2.27.

+ Min. 15 IP. his 0.39 ERA (23-IP. 1-ER) at home is best in the majors, ahead of OAK Lou Trivino (0.71)...his only run allowed here came in relief on July 9 vs. DET...hasn't allowed a run in 11 starts spanning 15 IP at Tropicana Field.

A NEW LOOK—Will be making his 18th start, but starting on 4 days' rest for only the third time, following July 21 vs. MIA (5 days' rest) and June 28 vs. HOU (4)...all 17 $\,$ starts have come since May 26 vs. BAL, three more than any other pitcher in the majors over that span...this will be the 29th time the Rays will use an opener, all since May 19 at LAA...he is 0-2 with a 2.13 ERA (25.1-IP. 6-ER) in his 17 starts, while other Rays openers have combined for a 7.43 ERA (13.1-IP. 11-ER) in 11 starts.

- Fourteen of his 17 starts this season have been scoreless...hasn't gone more than 2 IP or thrown more than 40 pitches (as a starter or reliever).
- Has pitched to a 0.00 ERA (17-IP, 0-ER) in the 1st inning.

THE LONG BALL—All 4 HR allowed this season have come on the road, including a grand slam by Manny Machado on May 11 at BAL and 2-run homer by Mike Trout on May 19 at LAA...hasn't allowed a home run at Tropicana Field since Aug 5, 2017 vs. MIL (Hernán Pérez)...has yielded 2 HR in his last 32 apps (17 starts) spanning 40 IP, compared to 8 HR in his first 23 IP in the majors spanning two seasons.

BRINGING THE HEAT—His avg. fastball velocity this season is 98.0 mph, according to StatCast, and his max velocity is 100.5 mph in his start on May 26 vs. BAL...last season he averaged 98.1 mph on his fastball, and he made 14 pitches of 100 mph or

more, the most by a Ray since Fernando Rodney (23) in 2013...entered the season ranked by Baseball America as the Best Fastball in the organization.

QUIRKS OF THE OPENER—He has made 5 starts without allowing a hit, most for any pitcher within a single season since Baseball Reference data is

available (1908)...according to Stats LLC, his 10 scoreless starts before the All-Star break were a major league record, passing STL Adam Wainright (9) in 2014 and LAD Sandy Koufax (9) in 1963...from June 7-July 10, made nine consecutive scoreless starts to set a major league record—though he totaled 13.2 IP over this span—passing LAD Zack Greinke (6, 43.2 IP), LAD Orel Hershiser (6, 55 IP) and LAD Don Drysdale (6, 54 IP).

+ From the other side, is winless in all 17 starts, matching Jason Hammel in 2006-07 for the longest winless streak in club history.

MAKING THE LEAP—Recalled on May 19 for his second stint with the Rays this season (also May 5-12)...started the season with Triple-A Durham, with a 1.86 ERA (9.2-IP, 2-ER) in 10 apps for the Bulls...over the last two minor league seasons, he has a 1.33 ERA (54.1-IP, 8-ER) with 77 SO and .210 opp avg.

MIX & MATCH—Is one of 15 different starting pitchers used by the Rays this season, most in the majors ahead of the Angels/Athletics/Mets (12)...this is a club record for an entire season, passing 2004 (14) and 2003 (14)...the Rays used eight starting pitchers all of last season—in fact, the 15 starters this season are more than the team's total from the previous three seasons combined (14, 2015-17)...the Rays have used 31 different pitchers this season, 2ndmost in the majors behind the Cubs (32)...this is also a club record for an entire season, passing 2017 (30).

ELITE COMPANY—Named after Hall of Famer Ryne Sandberg despite being born into a family of Cardinals fans...last season, became the third "Ryne" in major league history, following Sandberg and All-Star pitcher Ryne Duren...his manager in Durham was Sandberg's nephew, Jared Sandberg.
