RAY MATTER—The Rays 4-game losing streak is their longest since Aug 16-19, 2017 at TOR, vs. SEA (4) and is tied for the longest active streak in the majors with the Orioles...the Rays are 1-4 or worse through 5 games for the fourth time in club history (1-4 in 2003 and 2001, 0-5 in 2011).

- + Yesterday the Rays allowed 11 runs, more than their first 4 games combined (10)...the 11 runs were their most ever allowed in the first road game of the season (10, April 5, 1999 at BAL)...the pitching staff recorded 14 SO, the first time they ever reached double-digits in a road opener...previous high was 8 SO in 2000 at MIN.
- + Yesterday's game was just the second time in franchise history Rays pitchers recorded at least 14 SO and allowed 11 runs or more...they also did it on Sep 6, 1999 vs. MIN (14-SO, 13-R).
- + Today the Rays are attempting to avoid their first 5-game losing streak since July 19-24, 2017 at OAK, vs. TEX, vs. BAL and their third 1-5 start in club history (1-5 in 2001, 0-6 in 2011).

COLD SNAP—According to weather.com, today's 59°F high is the only day on this 3-city road trip forecasted for highs above 50°F...yesterday's game was the coldest first pitch (40°F) for a Rays game since April 26, 2014 at CWS (39°F), a 4-0 win...prior to yesterday, **Chris Archer** (who wore short sleeves) had never pitched in a colder temperature than 48°F in the majors (April 20, 2016 at BOS)...the Rays are 24-34 all-time in games with a first pitch at 50°F or colder and 6-4 at 40°F or colder.

vs. NEW YORK—The Rays are 0-1 against the Yankees after going 7-12 against them last season: 4-2 at Tropicana Field, 1-2 at Citi Field and 2-8 at Yankee Stadium...the games at Citi Field were home games relocated from St. Petersburg due to the arrival of Hurricane Irma in Florida...the Rays have lost three consecutive season series to the Yankees...the Rays are 8-24 (.250) at Yankee Stadium dating back to Sep 10, 2014, having been outscored 161-122 over that span...a win today would snap a streak of 10 consecutive series losses here, the longest streak ever by any team in the current building...yesterday's loss marked the 10th straight time the Rays lost the series opener at Yankee Stadium.

EARLY TEST—Today is the second game of an 8-game, 10-day road trip to New York (0-1), Boston and Chicago...this is the third year in a row the Rays have had an April trip to New York and Boston...they went 1-6 last year from April 10-17 (0-3 at New York, 1-3 at Boston) and went 3-3 in 2016 (2-1 at Boston, 1-2 at New York)...the Rays first 9 games of the season are against the Red Sox (7) and Yankees (2), the AL East's two postseason representatives in 2017...from April 9-June 13, only four of the club's 19 series are against teams that finished last season at .500 or better.

- + In addition to Monday's postponement, the Rays have seven off days scheduled through the first 43 days of the season (through May 10)...the Rays are off again on Friday in Boston, which will be the second scheduled Friday off day in club history (April 2, 2004)...in 2004, the Rays played 2 games in Tokyo against the Yankees to open the regular season (Tues.-Wed.), were off Thurs.-Fri., played a spring game on Sat., April 3 and resumed regular season play on Tues., April 6 at home against the Yankees.

CLOSE SHAVES—The Rays and Dodgers are the only teams in the majors with three 1-run losses...this season was the first time in franchise history the first 3 losses of a season were by 1-run margins...since 2016, the Rays are 34-54 (.386) in 1-run games, 2nd-worst winning pct. in the majors to Minnesota (30-49, .380)...yesterday's 11-4 loss was the Rays highest margin of defeat since a 13-6, 15-inning loss on Sep 15, 2017 vs. BOS.

- + The Rays are 0-3 when yielding 3 runs or fewer and are the only team in the majors with 3 losses when doing so...the Tigers, Cubs and Dodgers all have 2 losses when allowing 3 runs or fewer.

UP NEXT: BOSTON—Tomorrow will be the fifth of 19 meetings between the Rays and Red Sox (10 in St. Petersburg, 9 in Boston)...the two clubs will meet 10 times before the end of April, but do not face each other in June, July or September...the Rays are 1-3 so far, and all three defeats have been by 1-run margins...21 of the last 32 games between the clubs have been decided by 2 runs or fewer, with the Rays going 8-13 in those 21 games...the Rays went 8-11 against the Red Sox last season (4-5 at home, 4-6 on the road)...after going 7-12 in 2016, they have lost consecutive season series to the Red Sox for the first time since 2006-07.

POMP & CIRCUMSTANCE—Tomorrow will be the third home opener involving the Rays this season...they won at home on Opening Day, 6-4, and lost, 11-4, in the Bronx...the Rays were part of three home openers once previously: in 1999, they opened against the Orioles at Camden Yards on Opening Day (lost 10-7), April 9 at home (lost 4-1) and the Blue Jays at the SkyDome on April 12 (lost 7-1)...this will be the fourth time that Tampa Bay has played in the Red Sox home opener, having lost 11-4 on April 6, 2001, 5-3 on April 7, 2009 and 12-2 on April 13, 2012.

ROTATION TRANSLATION—Prior to the injury to **Nathan Eovaldi**, the Rays planned to open the season with four regular members of the starting rotation and a bullpen day as needed in place of a fifth starter...the Rays pitching staff currently has three starting pitchers and a nine-man bullpen, including five long relievers...the Rays would have started **Austin Pruitt** in Monday's game at NYY, which was postponed...the "bullpen day" will return in tomorrow's game at Boston.

REDEFINING RELIEF—Through 5 games this season, a Rays reliever has thrown at least 50 pitches three times...this does not include the 57 pitches thrown by **Andrew Kittredge** in his start on Sat vs. BOS...no other team has done that more than once, and the 29 other teams have combined to do it seven times...Rays relievers have totaled 5 apps of at least 2 IP or more, tied with the Brewers and Marlins for most in the majors, as well as a major-league-most 2 apps of at least 4 IP...Rays relievers have factored into the decision in four of the team's 5 games.

- + **Alex Colomé's** next save will be the 86th of his career to tie **Fernando Rodney** for 2nd in franchise history...the club's all-time leader is **Roberto Hernández** (101).

SPAN THE MAN—In the 6th inning of yesterday's game, **Denard Span** delivered a game-tying, 2-run double...Span has 2 PA with the bases loaded this season: a go-ahead, 3-run triple on Opening Day vs. BOS and yesterday's double...he has totaled 5 RBI in these 2 AB—38.5 pct. of the team's season total...his double marked the first time a franchise history that a pinch-hitter recorded a game-tying hit at Yankee Stadium.

ABOUT THE OFFENSE—The Rays offense has totaled 13 runs, 2nd-fewest in club history through 4 games to 2011 (7)...the offense has been held scoreless in 38 of their 44 trips to the plate this season...the 13 runs are tied for 5th-fewest in the majors, while their .195 avg. (31-for-159) is 4th-lowest and .277 SLG is the lowest in the majors.

FROM THE OTHER SIDE—In yesterday's game, **Didi Gregorius** became the sixth opposing player and fourth Yankee to hit 2 HR, both with at least 2 runners on base, against the Rays...he joined DET **Victor Martinez** on July 1, 2016, NYY **Alex Rodríguez** on Oct 4, 2009, NYY **Gary Sheffield** on June 21, 2005 NYY **Jorge Posada** on March 31, 2004 and ANA **Garrett Anderson** on Sep 5, 2002...his 8 RBI tied BOS **Nomar Garciaparra** on July 23, 2008 (G1) at Fenway Park for the most ever against the Rays.

- + **Giancarlo Stanton's** 5 SO tied the most ever against the Rays, joining HOU **Hank Conger** on Aug 19, 2015, NYY **Andy Phillips** on May 2, 2005 and CLE **Jim Thome** on April 9, 2000.
- + Through the first 5 games of the season, opposing starting pitchers have a 0.93 ERA (29-IP, 3-ER) against the Rays...the Rays haven't scored more than 1 run against an opposing starter.

LA PANTERA—Shortstop **Adeiny Hechavarria** has not committed an error since last July 30 at NYY, a streak of 56 games and 196 chances without an error...it is the longest streak by games and 3rd-longest by chances for a shortstop in club history...since last Aug 1, he is the only shortstop in the majors to appear in at least 20 games without committing an error...since being acquired by the Rays on June 26, 2017, he has a .987 fielding pct. in 82 games (79 starts)...prior to his arrival last season, Rays shortstops ranked 14th of 15 AL teams with a .959 fielding pct.

LAST START—On Fri vs. BOS, did not allow a run in 5.2 IP, extending his overall scoreless streak to 12.2 IP and scoreless streak at Tropicana Field to 23.2 IP...it was the eighth scoreless start of his career and the third time he did not factor in the decision in a scoreless start...he became the second Ray to deliver a scoreless start within the team's first 2 games of the season, joining **Steve Trachsel** on Opening Day in 2000 at MIN...it also marked the second time in his career he was the starting pitcher in a 1-0 loss (also Sep 28, 2016 at CWS, a scoreless rain-shortened start of 2.2 IP)...his line: ND, 5.2 IP, 3 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 2 SO, 84 pit, 49 str.

LIGHTS OUT—Dating back to Oct 1, 2017 vs. BAL, has delivered back-to-back scoreless starts for the second time in his career (also Sep 22-28, 2016 vs. NYY, at CWS)...his scoreless streak of 12.2 IP is the 4th-longest active streak among starting pitchers, behind LAD **Rich Hill** (18.0), TB/MIN **Jake Odorizzi** (15.0) and WAS **Max Scherzer** (14.1)...four times in club history a pitcher has delivered three consecutive scoreless starts (last Odorizzi, July 22-Aug 3, 2016)...since his Aug 8 recall last season, he has made 11 starts and hasn't allowed an earned run in five of them...is 5-1 with a 2.59 ERA (62.2-IP, 18-ER) and .194 opp avg. (43-for-222) over that stretch.

vs. YANKEES—Is 2-2 with a 3.71 ERA (34-IP, 14-ER) in 8 starts against the Yankees...has yielded 3 runs or fewer in 7 of those 8 starts, and 2 runs or fewer in 5 starts...his longest career start against the Yankees is 5.1 IP, 2x-last July 29, 2017 at NYY...is 0-2 with a 5.30 ERA (18.2-IP, 11-ER) in 5 starts at Yankee Stadium, including his major league debut here on April 23, 2016...in the Bronx, has made starts of 5 IP, 2.2 IP, 4.2 IP, 5.1 IP and 1 IP...last faced them on Sep 26, 2017 at NYY, going only 1 IP plus 6 BF.

OVERVIEW—Enters his third major league season, having been on the active roster for three stints in 2017 and two stints in 2016...selected as the No. 2 starter on March 15 by Manager **Kevin Cash**, up from No. 4 in last year's season-opening rotation...was 0-0 with a 3.12 ERA (17.1-IP, 6-ER) and 27 SO in 5 starts this spring, a 14.02 SO/9 IP ratio...logged 17 SO in his final 2 starts spanning 10.1 IP, and stretched out to 97 pitches in his last spring start...also pitched in an intrasquad game on March 12.

TOUGH ON LEFTIES—Has never allowed a homer to a left-handed hitter in his career (169 BF), and hasn't allowed an extra-base hit to a lefty over his last 10 starts, dating back to the end of 2017 (32 BF)...since 2016, only one other pitcher in the majors has faced as many lefties without yielding a home run: SF **Ty Blach** (232 BF)...in 2017, Snell held lefties to .182/.267/.227 (12-for-66) while righties hit .243/.325/.416 (101-for-416) with 15 HR.

WHERE HE LEFT OFF—In the 2017 season finale on Oct 1 vs. BAL, he totaled 7 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 0 BB and 13 SO in a 6-0 win...the 13 SO were a career high and most by a Rays lefty since **David Price** (13) on Sep 25, 2012 at BOS...it was only the third time in Rays history a pitcher recorded at least 13 SO without allowing a run, joining Price (14) on Aug 28, 2011 at TOR and **James Shields** (13) on May 22, 2011 at FLA.

PRICE-TRADAMUS?—In May 2017, while Snell was struggling through a rough beginning to his season, **David Price** told the *Tampa Bay Times*: "[Snell's] stuff is better than my stuff at his age; I like his stuff way more. He'll get through it. ... It takes some time. This game ain't easy, especially at that age. There's a small number of guys that come up at that age, especially in this division, and be really good at the beginning. It takes time."

+ In his final 10 starts last season after his Aug 8 recall, Snell went 5-1 with a 2.84 ERA (57-IP, 18-ER)...during that span, he ranked 6th in the AL in ERA and 4th with a .197 opp avg.

NO BRUISES INFLICTED—Has never hit a batter in 44 career starts, the longest streak by a Rays starter at any point in franchise history, passing **James Shields** (38) in 2009-10...min. 20 starts, only one other pitcher since the start of 2016 season has not hit a batter: ARI **Zack Greinke** (59 starts).

TURN OF FORTUNE—Compiled both the longest winless streak (15 starts, April 6-Aug 10) and unbeaten streak (10 starts, July 29-Sep 20) by a Rays starter in 2017...the 15-start winless streak was the longest by any pitcher to begin a season since MIL **Marco Estrada** (15) in 2012, and tied **Tanyon Sturtze** in 2002 for the longest in club history to begin a season...it extended to 16 starts including his final start of 2016, one shy of the club record.

+ Averaged 2.70 BB/9 IP over his last 13 starts beginning July 24, compared to 5.95 BB/9 IP in 11 starts prior to that.

- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).

- + Hit .327/.377/.327 (16-for-49) with 6 RBI in 16 games during spring training, including 9 hits in his last 19 AB...all 16 hits were singles.

- + Yesterday at NYY, robbed Tyler Wade of a potential go-ahead homer in the 6th inning...is tied with STL Tommy Pham and SD José Pirela for the major league lead with 2 outfield assists...has started all 5 games in right field after entering the season with 30 career games (20 starts) there.
- + Both hits this season have gone for extra bases, coming in the same game on Sat vs. BOS...homered as a right fielder for the third time in his career.
- + Made his 11th Opening Day roster and start, first in right field...signed by the Rays as a free agent on March 3; hit 3 HR during spring training.
- + Since the start of 2013, no other player can match his combination of 90 HR and 122 SB...is one of seven actives with at least 100 HR and 200 SB in his career, according to Baseball Reference, joining Jacoby Ellsbury, Ian Kinsler, Brandon Phillips, Hanley Ramírez, José Reyes and Ichiro Suzuki.

- + Has started all 5 games at shortstop...made his sixth Opening Day roster, all starts at shortstop...logged an RBI single on Opening Day vs. BOS, capping a 6-run 8th inning for the Rays...was the first Rays shortstop with a multi-hit game on Opening Day since Jason Bartlett in 2010.
- + Hit .326 (15-for-46) with 2 HR and 6 RBI in spring training...totaled a career-high 8 HR last season, including 6 HR in 39 games from Aug 15 on.
