### STREAKED

Last night's 10-7 loss snapped the Reds' season-high 6-game winning streak...was the longest active streak in the Major Leagues and the team's longest since a 6-game winning streak from 5/10-5/16, 2013...during the winning streak hit .272 (58-213) with 29 runs scored (4.83 r/g) and a 1.64 ERA (55ip, 10er), including a 2.27 ERA by Reds starters (23.1ip, 8er) and a 0.77 ERA by relievers (32.1ip, 2er).

### WHAT A RELIEF

Beginning 4/27, Reds relievers lead the Major Leagues in strikeouts (77) and rank second in bullpen ERA (2.78, 71.1ip, 22er) behind the Cubs (2.58, 59.1ip, 17er).

### EXTRA, EXTRA!

Tucker Barnhart has at least 1 extra-base hit in each of his last 6 apps, the longest active streak in the Major Leagues (11-23, .478, 4 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 6rbi, .870slg, .520obp)...is the longest extra-base hit streak by a Reds batter since Jay Bruce's 7-game streak from 6/20-6/26, 2014 and the longest by a Reds catcher since Devin Mesoraco's 6-game XBH streak from 6/18-6/24, 2014...Johnny Bench was the last Reds catcher to produce an extra-base hit in 7 consecutive apps (5/30-6/6, 1972).

### ROAD WARRIORS

This road trip began a stretch in which the Reds will play 5 straight road series and 16 straight road games in the Mountain and Pacific Time Zones...last year the Reds went 5-12 in 17 games and 1-3-1 in their 5 series in those western time zones (1-3 at SF, 0-3 at LAD, 0-3 at SD, 2-2 at Col, 2-1 at Ari).

**TONIGHT'S GAME:** Is Game 2 (0-1) of a 3-game series vs Devon Bridges' Giants and Game 6 (4-1) of a 7-game West Coast road trip that included the Reds' first series win vs LAD since September 2013, their first series win at Dodger Stadium since June 2011 and their first 4-game sweep of the Dodgers since August 1976...following this series and an off day, on Friday the Redlegs return to Great American Ball Park for 7 games vs the Cubs (4g) and Pirates (3g), including a day/night doubleheader on Saturday.

**SERIES NOTES:** Over the last 2 seasons the Reds have followed a 4-game winning streak vs SF with a 4-game losing streak vs SF...the 31 runs scored in the Reds' 13-3, 14-2 and 4-0 wins from 5/5-5/7 of last season at Great American Ball Park was their highest total for any 3-game series since they scored 32 runs from 8/19-8/21 vs Ari, 2005...beginning with the 2008 season the Reds are 40-28 vs SF (.588), the best winning percentage of any Giants opponent since then (minimum 50 games) and including 29-19 (.604) over the last 7 seasons...Reds vs Giants info is on media guide Page 330.

**WE LEAVE OUR HEARTS...:** Beginning 6/29/12, including that 2012 season's National League Division Series, the Redlegs have won 15 of the last 24 meetings at SF's AT&T Park...the Giants' 17-inning, 3-2 win here on 5/12/2016 was the Reds' longest game by inning since a 19-inning, 5-4 loss on 5/25/2011 at Phi and the second-longest game in the history of AT&T Park (5/29/2001, 1-0 Giants loss vs Diamondbacks in 18 innings).

**APRIL 19:** The Reds are 11-13 since 4/19, when they replaced manager Bryan Price and pitching coach Mack Jenkins...bench coach Jim Riggleman became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager Pat Kelly (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach Danny Darwin (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...later in the year, the team will conduct a thorough managerial search for a permanent replacement...Price went 279-387 (.419) in his 5 seasons as manager, including 3-15 this year.

**7-YEAR ITCH:** The 10-4 Reds victory on 4/23 vs Atl was the first for Jim Riggleman as his team's full-time manager since a 1-0 Nationals win vs the Mariners on 6/23/11...since 1900, he is 1 of 14 managers to work for at least 5 Major League teams (SD, Chc, Sea, Wsh, Cin)...Jimmy Dykes, John McNamara and Dick Williams each managed 6 teams...the others who managed 5 teams are Chuck Dressen, Bucky Harris, Rogers Hornsby, Davey Johnson, Billy Martin, Bill McKechnie, Jack McKeon, Lou Piniella, Jeff Torborg and Joe Torre.

**THE DRAFT:** The Reds will select fifth overall in the June 4 first-year player draft, then 47th (2nd round), 72nd (Competitive Balance Round B), 82nd (3rd round) and 109th (4th round)...the Tigers, Giants, Phillies and White Sox will pick first through fourth, respectively...Senior Director of Amateur Scouting Chris Buckley will be available in Great American Ball Park's Crosley Room following the Reds' final selection of the day...the draft will begin at 7:00 p.m. with the broadcast live on MLB Network...2018 Reds Hall of Fame inductee Adam Dunn will represent the organization at the draft...the draft will have 40 rounds...Rounds 3-10 will begin at 1:00 p.m. June 5...Rounds 11-40 will begin at noon June 6...the lists of Cin's 2017 draft picks and No. 1 draft picks are on media guide pages 216-217.

**REHABBING:** RHP Anthony DeSclafani (left oblique strain) and RHP Michael Lorenzen (right shoulder strain) yesterday began rehabilitation assignments for Class AA Pensacola...DeSclafani started and threw 3.0 perfect innings in the 4-1 Blue Wahoos loss at Biloxi (4k, 31 pitches, 24 strikes), followed by 2 sets of 15 pitches in the bullpen...Lorenzen threw a scoreless fourth inning (1h, 1k, 12 pitches, 8 strikes)...he is scheduled to throw another inning tomorrow...both have been on the Reds' disabled list all season.

**FRONT OFFICE NEWS:** Reds President of Baseball Operations Dick Williams on last week announced the promotion of Nick Krall to General Manager...Krall had been the club's Vice President, Assistant General Manager since November 2015...Williams will remain the club's President of Baseball Operations and will continue to oversee the organization's entire baseball operations department.

**IN A PINCH:** In his last 5 pinch-hit apps, Jesse Winker walked, singled (RBI), doubled, singled and singled...he is the first Reds batter to reach base safely in 5 consecutive pinch-hit apps since Todd Frazier did it from 4/20-5/2, 2012 and the first Reds batter to produce a hit in 4 straight pinch-hit apps since Brayan Pena from 7/8-8/9, 2014...Fred Lewis was the last Reds batter to reach base safely in 6 consecutive pinch-hit apps (6/13-7/2, 2011)...Rick Auerbach was the last Reds batter with hits in 5 straight pinch-hit apps (8/14-9/13, 1978)...courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

**PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Scooter Gennett has been named National League Player of the Week for the second time in his career...he is the second Reds player this season to receive the award (Joey Votto, 4/23-4/29)...in 5 apps last week Gennett hit .591 (13-22, 2 2b, 4hr, 10rbi), including a streak in which he homered in 4 consecutive games for the first time in his career...he led National League batters in hits, hitting and slugging percentage (1.227), tied for the NL lead in HR and total bases (27), ranked second in on-base percentage (.591), T3rd in runs scored (7) and extra-base hits (6) and fourth in RBI...since RBI became a statistic in 1920, he became the sixth player in franchise history to produce at least 1 HR and 4 RBI in 4 consecutive games, joining Devin Mesoraco (6/20-6/24, 2014), Jay Bruce (9/2-9/5, 2012), Eric Davis (9/3-9/6, 1984), Frank Robinson (7/22-7/24, 1961) and Ted Kluszewski (7/4-7/7, 1956)...Gennett received his first Player of the Week award following his 4-homer game on 6/6/17 vs StL.

**25 IN 20:** With a team-high 25 RBI in his first 20 apps, Eugenio Suárez tied the franchise record for most RBI by a player in his first 20 games of a season...he played in his 20th game on Tue vs NYM and produced 4 RBI to give him 25 on the season...George Crowe (1958), Vada Pinson (1962) and Ken Griffey Jr. (2006) each produced 25 RBI in his first 20 games of those respective seasons...courtesy Elias.

# Tonight's Pitcher - #30 Tyler Mahle, RHP

## RED HOTS

**Tyler Mahle's** last name rhymes with **RALLY**...at just **23 years old** is in his **second Major League season**...tonight is making his ninth start of the season, the 13th appearance and start of his **career**...will be his first career appearance vs the **Giants**...leads the Major Leagues in strikeouts among all pitchers **age 23 and younger**...his career-high **11 strikeouts on 4/24 vs Atl** are the most by a Reds pitcher this season...leads the staff with **4 quality starts**...in the 12-inning, 9-7 win on **4/24 vs Atl**, took a 5-0 lead and a no-hitter into the seventh before **Freddie Freeman** led off the inning with a solo HR...was the victim of a **blown save** when the Braves tied it at 7-7 with 4 runs in the ninth inning off **Amir Garrett** and **Raisel Iglesias**, including a second HR by **Freeman**, but the Reds won it on **Scouter Gennett's** 2-run, walkoff HR off **Max Fried**...pitched into the seventh inning for the first time in his career, then recorded 1 out in the seventh of his next start (4/29 at Min)...his third-inning single in the 5-0 loss on **4/8 at Pit** was the only Reds hit in **Jameson Taillon's** first career complete game...was the first **Reds pitcher** to record the team's only hit in a game hit since **Earl Yingling** did it on **9/19/1914 at Brooklyn Robins**...was 1 of 5 rookies on the **Opening Day roster** (**RHP Jackson Stephens**, **RHP Zack Weiss**, **OF Phillip Ervin**, **OF Jesse Winker**) and the only rookie to begin this season in the Reds' starting rotation...when he earned the 1-0 win in his season debut on 4/2 vs Cubs, at **23 years**, **185 days** was the youngest pitcher in the Major Leagues with a victory.

**Matt Harvey** tomorrow will make his second appearance for the Reds...will make his **fourth career** appearance and start vs the **Giants**, his first since **June 2015**, and his **third career** appearance at **AT&T Park**...in his Reds debut, Fri's 6-2 win at LAD, left with a 5-0 lead after allowing just 1 hit on a routine fly ball that dropped between **CF Billy Hamilton** and **RF Scott Schebler**, both of whom lost the ball in the lights...began the season with the **Mets** and went **0-2, 7.00 in 4 starts** and **4 relief apps** before he was **designated for assignment** on 5/5...on 5/8 was acquired by the Reds in exchange for **C Devin Mesoraco** and **cash**...from 2012-2018 for the **Mets** went **34-37, 3.66 in 104 starts** and **5 relief apps**.

- Has a season-high 7-game hitting streak, including 5 multi-hit games (13-27, .481, 4 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 6rbi, .815slg, .517obp).
- In his last 11 apps reached base safely 24 times via hit or walk (15-38, .395, 9bb).
- In 2017 became only the third catcher in Reds history to win a Rawlings Gold Glove Award for defensive excellence, joining Johnny Edwards (1963, 1964) and 10-time winner Johnny Bench (1968-1977).
- In 2017 established a new single-season franchise record for highest fielding percentage by a catcher (.999) and tied Brayan Pena's 2015 club mark for fewest errors in a season by a catcher (1e, 953tc).
- Last night's 2-run HR off Chris Stratton was the 300th hit of his career...is approaching 100 career runs (96).

### 2 ALEX BLANDINO, inf Road Trip: 5g, 1gs at SS, 1gs at 2B, 3-9, 1 2b, 2rbi

- Since a 1-for-17 start is hitting .320 (16-50, .393obp), including a career-high 7-game hitting streak from 4/20-4/29.
- Has made 17 starts (9gs at 3B, 7gs at 2B, 1gs at SS on Thu at LAD), most recently Sun at LAD (2B, 2-4, 1rbi, 2r).
- Fri at LAD played RF for the last out of the seventh inning, his first professional appearance in the outfield, then played SS in the eighth and ninth.
- On 4/10 at Phi made his Major League debut with a start at 3B (0-3).
- On 4/13 vs StL pinch hit and singled off Matt Bowman for his first Major League hit.
- On 4/20 at StL had his first career 2-hit game and first RBI (RBI-single off Bud Norris).
- On 5/1 vs Mil, entered the game in the eighth inning as a defensive replacement at 2B, then in the bottom of the frame hit his first career home run (solo off Jacob Barnes).
- Began the season at Class AAA Louisville, where he made 3 starts at 3B before he was promoted (0-8, 3r, 2bb, 2hbp, 1sb)...along with RHP Zack Weiss was recalled from Louisville on 4/9, when OF Scott Schebler and 3B Eugenio Suárez went on the 10-day disabled list.
- In March 2016 played for Team Nicaragua in the World Baseball Classic qualifier in Mexicali, Mexico...his father was born in Nicaragua.

### 17 TONY CRUZ, c Road Trip: 1gs, 1-5, 1 2b

- Made his 2 apps, both starts, on Wed vs NYM (0-4) and Sun at LAD (1-5, 1 2b).
- Was promoted from Louisville just prior to Tue night's game vs NYM, when C Devin Mesoraco was traded down the hall to the Mets in exchange for RHP Matt Harvey.
- Joined the Reds in time for Tue's game, then started behind the plate Wed afternoon.

### 23 ADAM DUVALL, lf Road Trip: 3gs in LF, 1g at 1B, 4-14, 3-run HR

- Has made 3 apps this season and 36 apps in his career at 1B...has made 23 career starts at that position, including 1 start at 1B this season (4/12 vs StL).
- Beginning with the 2016 season is 1 of only 4 Major League players to produce at least 76 doubles, 71 HR and 222 RBI (Nolan Arenado, Manny Machado, Justin Upton,).
- Is trying to join Hall of Famer Frank Robinson as the only players in Reds history to produce at least 70 extra-base hits in 3 straight seasons.
- In the ninth inning of Wed's 10-inning, 2-1 win vs NYM entered the game as a defensive replacement in LF, then led off the bottom of the 10th with his first career walkoff HR (off AJ Ramos).
- In 2016 was a National League All-Star and in each of the 2016 and 2017 seasons was a finalist for the Rawlings Gold Glove Award...in 2017, led all Major League outfielders with 15 assists, the most by a Reds outfielder since Pete Rose had 15 assists in 1973.
- Fri at LAD made his 400th career appearance...is approaching 200 career runs (191).

### 4 SCOOTER GENNETT, 2b Road Trip: 10-19, 1 2b, 2hr, 6rbi, .895slg, .526obp

- Last night went 0-for-5, snapping a 6-game hitting streak during which he hit .538 to raise his batting average 46 points from .283 to .329 (14-26, 3 2b, 4hr, 10rbi, 1.115slg, .556obp).
- Hit safely in 12 of his last 14 starts (25-62, .403, 5 2b, 6hr, 17rbi).
- Played in 40 of the Reds' 42 games, off only on 5/9 vs NYM and Sun at LA and including 35 starts...from 4/30-5/4 missed 4 starts with inflammation in his right shoulder but pinch hit in each game.
- In the 12-inning, 9-7 win on 4/24 vs Atl produced his third career 2-homer game (off Brandon McCarthy, Max Fried), his first career walkoff HR (2-run off Fried) and a successful suicide squeeze bunt...became the first Major League player to produce in a game a sac bunt and 2 HR, including a walkoff, since LAD's Hee-Seop Choi on 6/20/05 vs Min and the first Reds batter to do it since Reggie Sanders on 5/31/94 vs Montreal.
- Was born in Cincinnati and lived in nearby Lebanon until he was 9 years old, when his family moved to Sarasota.

### 6 BILLY HAMILTON, cf Road Trip: 5-16, 1 3b, 1rbi, 3sb

- Hit safely in 10 of his last 13 apps, raising his batting average from .169 (13-42, .310, 2 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 3rbi, 3sb, .383obp).
- Has made 9 starts batting leadoff, a team-high 24 starts batting ninth and 2 starts batting eighth...has made 14 straight starts batting ninth since he led off on 4/26 vs Atl.
- 6 times this season walked twice, tying his single-game career high...has 24 career 2-walk games, including 6 last season.
- In Sun's 5-3 win at LA recorded 3 steals in a game for the 18th time in his career.
- Since his debut on 9/3/13 leads all Major League players in steals with 251, sixth on the Reds' all-time list since 1898...Reds Hall of Famer Eric Davis is fifth at 270.
- If he reaches 60 stolen bases in 2018 will become the first player in Major League history to steal at least 10 bases in each of his first 6 seasons while establishing a career high in each of those 6 years...is tied with Jose Reyes, Cesar Cedeño and Bert Campaneris as the only players to do it in 5 straight years.

### 12 ROSELL HERRERA, inf/of Road Trip: 2g as PH, 0-2

- Name is pronounced row-SELL her-RARE-uh.
- Made 6 of his 9 apps as a pinch hitter (0-6), including each of his last 4 apps (0-4).
- On 5/1 vs Mil made his only start, played 2B...in his first plate appearance singled off Chase Anderson for his only career hit.
- Was promoted from Louisville on 4/26, when 3B Eugenio Suarez came off the 10-day disabled list and OF Phillip Ervin and IF Cliff Pennington were optioned to Louisville.

- In the eighth inning of the 7-4 loss on 4/26 vs Atl made his Major League debut, pinch hit vs Shane Carle and grounded out (4-3)...became the fourth Reds player to make his Major League debut this season (IF Alex Blandino, RHP Zack Weiss, RHP Tanner Rainey).

- Started at SS in 40 of the Reds' 42 games and has appeared in 41 games.
- In the batting order hit first (6gs, last on Sun at LAD), second (26gs), seventh (6gs) and eighth (2gs, 4/1 vs Wsh, 4/7 at Pit).
- Made his first professional apps in right field in the eighth and ninth innings of Fri's 6-2 win at LAD...does have Major League experience in CF (16g) and LF (8g).
- Received consideration for the National League Player of the Week Award for 4/23-4/29, won by teammate Joey Votto...in 7g that week hit .441 with 2 HR and 5 RBI (.618slg, .457obp).

### 43 SCOTT SCHEBLER, of Road Trip: 4-17, 1 2b, 2hr, 4rbi

- Last night fell a triple shy of becoming the sixth Reds batter to hit for the cycle...Eric Davis was the last Reds batter to do it (6/2/89 vs SD).

- In 23 apps since he came off the disabled list on 4/20 is hitting .253 (20-79, 4 2b, 4hr, 15rbi).
- From 4/9-4/19 missed 10 games (1-9) while on the 10-day disabled list with a right ulnar nerve contusion...suffered the injury in the third game of the season, when he was hit on the right elbow by a Sean Doolittle pitch.
- On 4/23 vs Atl made his sixth career start batting leadoff, just his second the last 2 seasons in that spot in the order...in 2017, made his only start batting leadoff on 9/21/17 vs StL.
- Has made 14 starts in RF, 6 starts in CF and 1 start at DH.
- Made his third straight Opening Day roster.

### 7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf Road Trip: 4-21, 1hr, 3rbi

- First name is pronounced Ay-you-hay-nee-oh...accent mark on the "a" in Suárez.
- In 18 apps since he came off the disabled list on 4/26 is hitting .282, including 6 multi-hit games (20-71, 5 2b, 4hr, 21rbi, .521slg, .338obp).
- Hit safely in 6 of his last 8 apps (10-33, .303, 2 2b, 2hr, 8rbi).
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when in the fourth inning he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- In the 14-3 loss on 4/6 vs Pit started at 3B but moved to SS in the eighth inning...was his only game at SS since 8/20/17, when he made his only appearance of last season at that position...in his career has made 181 apps and 167 starts at SS.
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.

### 19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b Road Trip: 7-17 (.412), 1hr, 3rbi, 4bb, 4r, 1sb

- Left last night's game in the middle of the fourth inning with lower back tightness.
- Has started and appeared in 41 of the Reds' 42 games...did not play on 4/12 vs StL, snapping at 202 games his streaks of consecutive games played and consecutive games started...prior to that 4/12 day off, had appeared in and started every Reds game since he was given the day off at StL on 9/2/16, when Ivan De Jesus Jr. played 1B...during his 202-games started streak played 1,733.1 of the Reds' 1,782.1 innings in the field (97%)...was the longest games started streak by a Reds player since Pete Rose started 370 consecutive games from 1973-1976.
- Beginning 5/17/15 has reached base safely in each of last 18 apps vs the Giants (20-64, .313, 6 2b, 2hr, 10rbi, .500slg, .439obp)...has a 9-game hitting streak at AT&T Park (14-37, .378, 3 2b, 1hr, 4rbi, .541slg, .429obp).
- Has a 6-game hitting streak, tying his season high (8-21, .381, 1hr, 4rbi, 4bb, 4r, 1sb, .524slg, .480obp).
- Beginning 4/15 has reached base safely in 27 of his last 28 apps (30-96, .313, 5 2b, 6hr, 19rbi, .552slg, .472obp), including a season-high 16-game on-base streak from 4/15-5/1...his active on-base streak is 11 games (15-40, .375, 3 2b, 2hr, 8rbi, .600slg, .468obp).
- From 4/24-4/27 vs the Braves and Twins homered in 4 consecutive apps, a career high and 1 shy of the franchise record.
- In the first inning on 4/16 at Mil singled off Brent Suter for his 1,600th career hit.
- In the first inning on 4/17 at Mil recorded his 1,000th career walk (off Junior Guerra)...is donating to the National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum in Cooperstown the batting helmet he wore for his 1,000th walk.
- Reached 1,000 walks in 1,446 apps, the fourth-fewest games to 1,000 walks in National League history.
- Pete Rose (1,210) is the only other player in Reds history with at least 1,000 walks... Miguel Cabrera and Albert Pujols are the only other active players in the Major Leagues with at least 1,600 hits and 1,000 walks.
- From 4/23-4/29 was the NL Player of the Week, his fifth career weekly award.
- Is approaching 1,500 career apps (1,471).

### 33 JESSE WINKER, of Road Trip: 2gs in LF, 2gs in RF, 5-17, 2 2b, 1rbi

- Leads National League rookies in multi-hit games (tied), walks, on-base percentage and outfield assists (3).
- In 23 apps beginning 4/18 is hitting .284 (23-81), including a career-high 9-game hitting streak from 4/18-4/27 that ranks as the longest by a Reds batter this season.
- From 4/10-5/6 reached base safely in 22 consecutive apps (21-71, .296, .386obp), the longest on-base streak by a Reds batter this season and when snapped the second-longest active on-base streak in the Major Leagues (Phi's Odubell Herrera, 35g).
- In his last 5 pinch-hit apps walked, singled (RBI), doubled, singled and singled.
- Has made 20 starts in RF, 9 starts in LF and 1 start at DH...leads the team with 25 starts batting leadoff...on 4/12 vs StL, with Votto off, made his first career start batting third in the order.
- Made his first Opening Day roster...was 1 of 5 rookies on the Opening Day roster (RHP Tyler Mahle, RHP Jackson Stephens, RHP Zack Weiss, OF Phillip Ervin).
- Was the Reds' Opening Day starter in LF...batted leadoff.
