## NATIONALS NEWS

### SOME STREAKS SNAPPED...

The Washington Nationals had their six-game winning streak and 10-game road winning streak snapped on Thursday night thanks to a 4-2 defeat at the hands of the Atlanta Braves.

- The Nationals are 6-1 on this 10-game road trip...Their best record on a 10-game road trip was April 18-27, 2017 when they went 9-1 (.900) against Atlanta (3-0), New York (3-0), and Colorado (3-1).

### ...BUT THIS ONE WASN'T

**Trea Turner** is in the midst of a career-best 12-game hitting streak...During the streak, he is hitting .283 (15-for-53) with four doubles, one homer, seven RBI, two walks, three stolen bases and six runs scored.

- On the season, Turner leads National League shortstops in on-base percentage (.359), runs scored (1st, 32), walks (30) and stolen bases (16).
- Turner leads National League shortstops in Wins Above Replacement (1.7) according to FanGraphs.com.

### LIKE DRAKE SAID

With 97 in hand, **Trea Turner** is approaching 100 career stolen bases...According to the *Elías Sports Bureau*, here is the list of quickest active players in terms of games (Turner: 254 games) to reach 100 stolen bases:

### ANT'S BAT

**Anthony Rendon** has hit safely in eight of his last 10 games dating to May 21, going 13-for-39 (.333) with six doubles, two homers, six RBI, four walks and four runs scored over this stretch...Rendon entered play on the 21st with a .247/.342/.433 slash line...He is now hitting .272/.355/.493.

### WINNING WAYS

Since April 29, the Nationals are 21-7 and have outscored their opponents, 123-74...The 21-7 (.750) record is the best in Major League Baseball during this stretch.

- Washington's 19 wins during the month of May were the most for any May in team history...The Nationals were one win shy of tying the club record for wins in a calendar month (20, June 2005).
- At 20-9 (.690), the Nationals own the best road record in Major League Baseball.

### START ME UP

Washington's starting rotation leads the National League in ERA (2.86), strikeouts (376), opp. AVG (.212), opp. OBP (.277), hits per 9.0 IP (6.95), WHIP (1.07)...The staff ranks second in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.69), opp. SLG (.358), and opp. OPS (.636).

- Since April 28, Nationals starters have allowed three earned runs or fewer in 28 of 30 starts...During this stretch, the Nationals starting staff owns the best ERA in Major League Baseball (2.27 ERA).

### RELIEVERS ARE PEOPLE, TOO

Over the last 10 games, **Henry Blanco's** bullpen has tossed 25.2 innings of relief, striking out 29 batters, walking just four and surrendering just two earned runs along the way (0.70 ERA)...Nationals relievers have inherited 17 runners during this stretch and have not allowed any to score.

- Washington's 0.70 bullpen ERA is the best in Major League Baseball since May 21.
- On the season, Washington relievers rank among National League 'pens in strikeout-to-walk ratio (2nd, 2.95), strikeouts per 9.0 IP (2nd, 9.73), and inherited runners scored percent (2nd, 18.8%).

### DINGERS OF THE DAY

The Nationals lead the National League with 72 home runs...**Bryce Harper** (1st, 18) and **Matt Adams** (16th, 12) rank in the top 10 in the National League...Harper's 18 home runs are tied for the most in Major League Baseball.

- Since joining the Nationals on May 13, **Mark Reynolds** ranks tied for second in the NL with six home runs.

### ALL HANDS ON DECK

The Nationals have used 41 players so far in 2018...That number does not include the players that have been on the active roster, but did not appear in a game (**Jefry Rodriguez**, **Jhonatan Solano**, **Austin Voth**)...The 41 players used are tied for second in Major League Baseball.

### June 1 (3-5 on this date)

2007 - **Dmitri Young** went 4-for-4 for a second straight night to match **Andre Dawson's** franchise mark for hits in consecutive plate appearances. **Ronnie Belliard's** RBI pinch-hit RBI single with one out in the 10th inning lifted the Nationals to a 4-3 home win over the Padres. **Cristian Guzman** also tallied four hits, including his 1,000th career hit, a fifth-inning single off Jake Peavy.

## OPPONENT

### ATLANTA BRAVES

**Dave Martinez** capped his 16-year Major League career with Atlanta in 2001, hitting .287 in 12 games...**Matt Adams** clubbed 19 home runs in 100 games for the Braves in 2017...The Braves made Nationals pitching coach **Derek Lilliquist** their first-round selection (6th overall) out of the University of Georgia in the 1987 Amateur Draft.

### THE SERIES

Since the start of 2016, the Nationals are 13-9 against the Braves in Atlanta.

## DAVE MARTINEZ

Nationals manager **Dave Martinez** was named the seventh field manager in Nationals history on Oct. 30, 2017. He joined the Nationals for what will be his 30th season in professional baseball. A 16-year Major League outfielder, Martinez has been a Major League coach for the last 10 seasons, serving as Cubs manager **Joe Maddon's** bench coach and right-hand man in Chicago (2015-17) as well as Tampa Bay (2008-14). This is the first Major League managerial assignment of Martinez's career.

## #37 - STEPHEN STRASBURG - RHP

Tall, powerful right-handed pitcher is a three-time All-Star who is Washington's all-time (2005-present) leader in wins (89) and strikeouts (1,363)... On May 10, 2016, he inked a seven-year contract extension that will keep him with the Nationals through the 2023 season.

**AGAINST THE BRAVES:** Faces Atlanta for the second time this season...Spun 8.0 scoreless innings on April 10 at Nationals Park...Struck out eight while issuing two walks in Washington's 4-1 win...Is 5-0 with a 1.34 ERA (5 ER/33.2 IP) in his last five starts in Atlanta...Has not allowed a home run to the Braves in Atlanta since Aug. 8, 2014.

**LAST START:** Earned his sixth win of the season, tossing 5.0 scoreless innings in Washington's 5-2 win at Miami...Struck out eight batters and issued just two walks.

### 2018 NOTES

- Ranks third in the National League (T6th in MLB) with a 1.97 road ERA (7 ER/32.0 IP).
- Ranks among National League pitchers in wins (T3rd, 6), strikeouts (4th, 83), WHIP (8th, 1.06), opp. AVG (9th, .216), hits allowed per 9.0 IP (9th, 7.13), opp. OBP (9th, .276), and strikeout-to-walk ratio (10th, 4.37).
- Along with teammates **Gio Gonzalez** (2nd, .113) and **Max Scherzer** (3rd, .148), he ranks in the top 10 in the NL in opp. AVG with runners in scoring position (6th, .191)...Opposing batters are 9-for-44 with one triple, one homer and 14 RBI with runners in scoring position.
- Since Aug. 19, 2017, he ranks third in Major League Baseball with a 2.15 ERA among pitchers with at least 15 starts...Among National League pitchers during this stretch, he leads in ERA (2.15), and ranks in opp. OBP (2nd, .254), strikeouts (2nd, 146), opp. SLG (2nd, .313), opp. AVG (2nd, .197), strikeout-to-walk ratio (2nd, 5.03), and strikeouts per 9.0 IP (4th, 10.46).
- Fanned a season-high 11 batters on May 2 vs. Pittsburgh...Allowed two earned runs on seven hits in 7.0 innings of work.
- Allowed just three hits while striking out eight batters and walking two in 8.0 shutout innings on April 10 vs. ATL...It was his longest outing since Sept. 10, 2017 at PHI (8.0 IP)...Earned his second win as Washington topped Atlanta, 4-1
- Opened his 2018 season by tossing 6.1 innings while allowing one earned run as Washington topped Cincinnati, 13-7, on March 31...The lone earned run came via fourth inning home run by **Scott Schebler**.

### 2017 NOTES

- Put together a strong first half of the season en route to being named an All-Star for the third time in his career.
- Was a finalist for the National League Cy Young Award...Capped 2017 being named National League Pitcher of the Month in September.
- Also ranked in NL in HR/9.0 IP (1st, 0.67), opp. SLG (1st, .317), opp. OPS (2nd, .581), WHIP (3rd, 1.02), opp. OBP (3rd, .265), & opp. AVG (3rd, .204).
- Coupled with Max Scherzer (2nd, 2.51) and Gio Gonzalez (5th, 2.96), Strasburg (3rd, 2.52), helped the Nationals become the first team with three starting pitchers ranking in the top five in the NL in ERA in 21 years (since the 1996 Atlanta Braves), according to the *Elias Sports Bureau*.
- On May 27 at San Diego, he struck out a career-high 15 batters in 7.0 shutout innings.
- On Aug. 19 at San Diego, he returned from a three-week stint on the disabled list...He went 5-1 with a 0.84 ERA (5 ER/53.2 IP) in his final eight starts of the regular season following reinstatement...He racked up 63 strikeouts, allowed just 10 walks and surrendered only one home run.

### CAREER NOTES

- Is 85-46 with a 3.08 ERA in 183 starts since Sept. 6, 2011, his return from 2010 Tommy John Surgery.
- When starting, Washington is 123-72 (.631) since his debut...Since the start of 2016, the Nationals are 47-16 (.746) when he starts.
- Since 2012, he ranks in strikeouts per 9.0 IP (4th, 10.46), opp. SLG (5th, .352), opp. AVG (6th, .223), strikeouts (6th, 1,255), opp. OBP (8th, .280), strikeout-to-walk ratio (9th, 4.43), and ERA (9th, 3.12).
