TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 1** of a 3-game series vs **Nina Zimmerman's** first-place **Indians** and **Game 4** (1-2) of a 10-day, 9-game road trip heading into the **All-Star break** that included a **2-1 series loss** at Chi's **Wrigley Field** and features an upcoming weekend series at StL's **Busch Stadium** (off day, 3g)...the Cubs won Sat and Sun's games in their **final at-bat**, including a **game-ending walk** in the **10th inning** yesterday...the Redlegs will open up the championship season's second half on **Fri, 7/20** with a 10-game homestand vs the **Pirates** (3g), **Cardinals** (3g) and **Phillies** (4g).

SERIES NOTES: The Redlegs and Tribe split last season's **4-game series**... Cin won or tied **12** of the first **20 Ohio Cup** season series, including **9** of the **last 12**, but lost **2** of the **last 3** season series (1-5, 0-4, 2-2)...beginning in **2011**, the Indians have won **6** of the **last 7g** at **Progressive Field** and **15** of the **last 17 games** here...beginning in **2002** and with a minimum of 40 games played, Cin's **.317 winning percentage** at **Progressive Field** (13-28) is its lowest at any current road ballpark (17-34, **.333 at Phi**; 35-69, **.337 at StL**; 19-36, **.345 at Col**)...**Reds vs Indians** information is on media guide **Page 332**.

INTERLEAGUE NOTES: This season the Reds are **8-2 vs the American League** (2-1 at Min, 2-0 at KC, 2-0 vs Det, 2-1 vs WSox), including a **6-game winning streak vs the AL** from **4/29-7/2** that ranks as their **longest interleague winning streak**...their **2-1 series win** at Min's **Target Field** in April was their first interleague road series win of at least 3 games since a **3-0 series sweep** at Hou's **Minute Maid Park** in **September 2013**...between those series wins the Reds went **0-9 in interleague road series** of at least 3 games and **4-23 in games** in those series...the remaining interleague schedule includes home games vs the **Indians** (3g, 8/13-8/15) and **Royals** (2g, 9/25-9/26) and road games at Det's **Comerica Park** (2g, 8/1-8/2)...beginning in **1997** the Reds are **146-199 all-time vs the AL**, at **.423** the **second-lowest interleague winning percentage** of any Major League team (SD, 151-213, .415)...Cin hasn't produced a **winning record vs the American League** since **2013** (11-9)...in **5 seasons** since then are **31-59 vs AL** (.344)...**Reds vs AL opponents** information is on media guide **Page 332**.

APRIL 19: The Reds are **36-36** since **4/19**, when they replaced manager **Bryan Price** and pitching coach **Mack Jenkins**...bench coach **Jim Riggleman** became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager **Pat Kelly** (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach **Danny Darwin** (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...**Price** went **279-387 (.419)** in his 5 seasons as manager, including **3-15 this year**.

STREAKING: In their last 3 series vs **first-place teams**, played consecutively from **6/21-7/1**, the Redlegs went **4-0 vs Cubs**, **2-1 at Atl** and **2-2 vs Mil**...the Reds' **2-1 series loss** at Cubs completed yesterday snapped their **5-series unbeaten streak** (2-0 vs Det, 4-0 vs Chc, 2-1 at Atl, 2-2 vs Mil, 2-1 vs Cws), their longest since a **6-series winning streak** from **7/15-8/4, 2016**...in **fifth place** since the **fourth day of the season**, the Reds have pulled to within **2.5 games** of the fourth-place **Pirates**...at **15-11** (.577), the Redlegs had the best record in the NL Central Division in **June**.

ALL-STAR INFIELD: The Reds' infield produced **3 National League All-Stars** and collectively leads the Major Leagues in **hits** (411), **batting average** (.290) and **on-base percentage** (.371)...**All-Star 1B Joey Votto** leads the National League in on-base percentage while ranking T2nd in walks...**All-Star 2B Scooter Gennett** since **6/21** has led the league in **hitting**...**All-Star 3B Eugenio Suárez** leads the National League in **RBI** while ranking second in **slugging percentage**, third in **on-base percentage** and **hitting with RISP** (.382) and sixth in **batting average** and **HR**...**SS José Peraza** in his last 35 apps beginning 5/27 is hitting .328 with a .391 on-base percentage.

DOT...DOT...DOT: Reds prospects **RHP Hunter Greene** and **OF Taylor Trammell** are on the U.S. roster for the **SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game** (Sunday, 4:00et, MLB Network)...the Reds **trailed in 8** of their **last 12 victories**...yesterday's 10-inning, 6-5 loss at Cubs snapped a streak in which the Reds had won the **final game of 9 straight series**.

REHABBING: **RHP Homer Bailey** is 5 apps into a **rehabilitation assignment** at Louisville (5g, 4gs, 1-2, 5.84, 24.2ip, 30h, 16er, 4bb, 15k, 4hr, 1hbp)...he has been disabled since **6/2** with **right knee inflammation**...made his most recent appearance last night, in relief threw the sixth and seventh innings of the **Bats'** 6-1 win vs **Toledo** (2ip, 1h, 0r, 2bb, 1k, 42 pitches, 25 strikes).

SLAMMING: The Reds lead the Major Leagues with **9 grand slams**, tying the **2002 franchise single-season record** and including a streak of **6 slams** over a **17-game span** from **6/13-7/1**...the **1996 Expos**, **1997 Braves** and **2006 Mets** are the only other teams in **Major League history** to produce at least **6 grand slams** over a **17-day span**...the **9 grand slams** tie the **2010 Yankees** for most ever prior to the **All-Star break**...the National League record for grand slams in a season is **12** (1997 Braves, 2000 Cardinals), while the Major League record is **14** (2000 Athletics, 2006 Indians)...the Reds hit **5 in June**, a new club record for **grand slams** in a **calendar month**...the Reds' **9 grand slams** were hit by **Adam Duvall** (2), **Scooter Gennett**, **Eugenio Suárez**, **Joey Votto**, **Jesse Winker**, pitcher **Anthony DeSclafani**, **Michael Lorenzen** (pinch-hit) and **José Peraza**...on **6/23 vs Chi** (off **Brian Duensing**), **DeSclafani** became only the fourth pitcher in Reds history to hit a **grand slam** (**Bob Purkey** 1959, **Al Hollingsworth** 1936, **Ice Box Chamberlain** 1892)...**Lorenzen** on 6/30 off Mil's **Jacob Barnes** became the first pitcher to produce a pinch-hit slam since **Tommy Byrne** of the WSox on **5/16/1953 at NYY**.

RUTHIAN: As a pinch hitter, pitcher **Michael Lorenzen** is **3-for-6** this season (2hr, 5rbi) and **4-for-13** with **3 HR** in his career (4/6/17 off Phi's **Adam Morgan**, 6/24/18 off Chi's **Mike Montgomery**, grand slam on 6/30/18 off Mil's **Jacob Barnes**)...5 times in his career **Lorenzen** has come off the bench to homer, as a reliever or as a pinch hitter...all other active Major League pitchers combine for just 2 such games...over **5 consecutive plate apps** from **6/7-6/30**, he **singled, homered** (pinch hit), **walked, homered and homered** (pinch-hit grand slam)...he became the first Major League pitcher to homer in **3 consecutive at bats** since Col's **Mike Hampton** in **2001**...his **3 HR** are the most by a Reds batter whose primary position is pitcher since **Micah Owings** had **3 homers** in 2009...on 6/7 vs Col **Lorenzen** pinch hit and produced a 116.5-mile-per-hour single off **Tyler Anderson**, the hardest-hit ball in the Statcast era by any **Reds batter** or by any **Major League pitcher**...information courtesy **Elias Sports Bureau** and **Stats**.

Tonight's Pitcher - #28 Anthony DeSclafani, RHP

RED HOTS

Anthony DeSclafani's last name is pronounced DEE-sclafani...tonight is making his seventh start of the season...will be his third career appearance vs the **Indians** and his second appearance of the season vs an **American League** team...in **7 career starts vs the AL** is **1-2, 5.18** (40ip, 23er)...in his **last 5 starts** this season is **3-0, 4.71** (28.2ip, 15er)...his **3-game winning streak** ties **Luis Castillo's**, **Tyler Mahle's** and **Matt Harvey's** for the longest by a Reds pitcher this season...in the 11-2 win on **6/23 vs Cubs** hit a grand slam (off **Brian Duensing**), the first home run of his career and only the fourth grand slam by a Reds pitcher (**Bob Purkey** on 8/1/59 vs Cubs, **Al Hollingsworth** on 5/28/1936 at Cubs, **Ice Box Chamberlain** on 4/30/1892 vs Wsh)...in the **9-6 loss on 6/5 vs Col** made his first appearance for the Reds since a **2-1 win on 9/28/16 at StL**...between his **September 2016** and **June 2018 apps**, **17 pitchers** made starts for the Reds...began the **2018 season** on the 60-day disabled list while recovering from a **left oblique strain** suffered in his third spring training appearance...before he was reinstated the day of his **6/5 start vs Col**, from **5/14-5/30** made **4 rehabilitation starts** for Class AA Pensacola and Class AAA Louisville (**0-3, 4.66**)...spent the entire **2017 season** on the disabled list with a **sprained ulnar collateral ligament** in his **right elbow**.

Sal Romano at just **24 years old** is in his **second Major League season**...tomorrow will make his 19th start of the season and his **35th Major League** appearance and start...will be his first career appearance vs the **Indians**, his fifth start of the season vs an **American League** team (**2-1, 2.55**, 24.2ip, 7er) and his **sixth career start vs the AL** (**2-2, 3.77**, 28.2ip, 12er)...from **6/12-6/24** produced a career-high **14.2-inning scoreless streak**...in the 10-inning, 5-1 win on **6/12 at KC** threw **8.0 innings**, tying his career high and the most by a Reds pitcher this season.

- On 6/27 at Atl and 6/28 vs Mil homered in consecutive games for the first time in his career, and in the 8-2 win on 7/1 vs Mil produced his first career grand slam (off Aaron Wilkerson)...was the ninth grand slam by a Reds batter this season, tying the 2002 club record.

43 SCOTT SCHEBLER, of

Last 25 Reds Games: .241 (19-79), 3hr, 9rbi

- In his last 31 apps beginning 5/30 is hitting .314, raising his season BA from .237 (37-118, 10 2b, 6hr, 15rbi).
- The lefthanded batter ranks seventh in the National League in hitting vs LHP (.333, 24-72, 3 2b, 2hr, 4rbi, .385obp, .458slg).
- Hit .320 through April (3hr, 11rbi), .200 in May (3hr, 9rbi), .330 in June (4hr, 11rbi, .560slg, .392obp) and .217 so far in July (5-23, 1hr, 2rbi).
- Has made 25 career starts batting leadoff, including 20 times this year (26-87, .299)...in his 25 career starts batting leadoff hit .303 (33-109), including .305 (32-105) in his 24 starts batting leadoff for the Reds...his career on-base percentage while batting first is .359.
- Has made a team-high 45 starts in RF, 14 starts in CF and 1 start at DH.
- From 4/9-4/19 missed 10 games (1-9) while on the 10-day disabled list with a right ulnar nerve contusion...suffered the injury in the third game of the season, when he was hit on the right elbow by a Sean Doolittle pitch.

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf

Last 25 Reds Games: .348 (32-92), 7hr, 21rbi

- First name is pronounced Ay-you-hay-nee-oh...accent mark on the "a" in Suárez.
- Was voted by his peers to his first All-Star team.
- Despite missing 16 games in April with a fractured right thumb leads the National League lead in RBI...no Reds batter has led the NL in RBI since Dave Parker drove in 125 runs in 1985...the list of Reds batters who led the NL in RBI is on page 397.
- Among the National League leaders also ranks second in slugging percentage, third in on-base percentage and hitting with RISP (.382) and sixth in batting average and HR.
- In his last 162 apps beginning 6/19/17 is hitting .279 with 26 doubles, 2 triples, 34 HR and 112 RBI (.510slg, .384obp, .894ops).
- Has an 11-game hitting streak (16-42, .381, 3 2b, 3hr, 10rbi), the longest active hitting streak in the Major Leagues...his career-high 13-game hitting streak from 6/8-6/23 was the longest by a Reds batter this season and when snapped the longest active streak in the Major Leagues.
- In his last 42 apps beginning 5/22 is hitting .344, raising his season BA from .274 (55-160, 6 2b, 1 3b, 12hr, 36rbi, .619slg, .439obp, 1.058ops).
- Has homered in consecutive apps for the third time this season and for the 11th time in his career...never has homered in 3 straight games.
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b

Last 25 Reds Games: .244 (21-86), 2hr, 17rbi

- Was voted by his peers to his sixth All-Star team, the most All-Star apps ever by a player born in Canada (Larry Walker, 5).
- Leads the National League in on-base percentage while ranking T2nd in walks...is trying to lead the NL in walks for the sixth time, in on-base percentage for the seventh time and in both categories in the same season for the fifth time.
- Reached base safely in 77 of his 89 apps, including an active streak of 5 games...his season-high 20-game on-base streak was snapped on 6/13 at KC (0-4).
- Scored at least 1 run in each of his last 5 apps (6r).
- Through his third plate appearance on 6/6 was hitting .311 (68-219), his highest batting average since he was 3-for-9 (.333) in the third game of the season.
- In the Reds' 89 games has made 88 apps and 86 starts...missed his 3 starts on 4/12 vs StL, 5/15 at SF and 5/24 vs Pit...missed his only full game on 4/12 vs StL, snapping at 202 games his streaks of consecutive games played and consecutive games started...prior to that 4/12 day off, had appeared in and started every Reds game since he was given the day off at StL on 9/2/16, when Ivan De Jesus Jr. played 1B...during his 202-games started streak played 1,733.1 of the Reds' 1,782.1 innings in the field (97%)...was the longest games started streak by a Reds player since Pete Rose started 370 consecutive games from 1973-1976.
- From 4/23-4/29 was the NL Player of the Week, his fifth career weekly award.

33 JESSE WINKER, of

Last 25 Reds Games: .299 (20-67), 3hr, 18rbi

- Among the National League leaders ranks 10th in on-base percentage and seventh in hitting with RISP (.350)...leads NL rookies in walks while ranking second in hits, on-base percentage and multi-hit games (19).
- Has a 4-game hitting streak, including a pair of 2-hit games (6-14, .429, 2 2b, 3rbi).
- In his last 17 apps beginning 6/20 is hitting .391 (18-46, 2 2b, 3hr, 17rbi, 12bb, .630slg, .517obp, 1.147ops).
- Hit .305 through April (0hr, 9rbi, .414obp), .174 in May (1hr, 3rbi), .308 in June (5hr, 20rbi, .432obp) and .412 so far in July (7-17, 4rbi, .529slg, .474obp, 1.003ops)...among National League leaders in June ranked third in on-base percentage, T9th in RBI and 20th in hitting.
- Has made 37 starts in RF, 26 starts in LF and 1 start at DH...leads the team with 35 starts batting leadoff...on 4/12 vs StL, with Votto off, made his only career start batting third in the order.
