PREGAME FESTIVITIES

National Anthem: The national anthem will be performed by vocalist **Kristi Kurtz** and the colors will be presented by **United States Customs and Border Protection**.

RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers defeated the Reds, 2-1, in the series opener on Tuesday night at Comerica Park. Matthew Boyd started for Detroit and earned his sixth win of the season, throwing 8.0 scoreless innings and scattering four hits, while striking out seven. Shane Greene notched his 22nd save of 2018 after allowing a run on one hit with one strikeout in the ninth inning. Offensively, Niko Goodrum hit a solo home run, his 10th of the season, while Mike Gerber had a RBI double, his first Major League hit and RBI. The Tigers and Reds conclude their two-game series this afternoon. Following today's game and an off day on Thursday, Detroit hits the road for a six-game trip, which includes three games at Oakland (August 3-5) and three games at Los Angeles (AL) (August 6-8).

YEAH, BOYD: Matthew Boyd turned in his longest outing of the season last night vs. Cincinnati, tossing 8.0 shutout innings and allowing four hits with one walk and seven strikeouts. After posting a 9.78 ERA (23.0IP/25ER) in five starts from June 19-July 10, Boyd has compiled a 1.42 ERA (19.0IP/3ER) with a 0.89 WHIP and .197 (14x71) opponents batting average over his last three starts.

BE LIKE MIKE: Mike Gerber picked up his first Major League hit, double and RBI in the eighth inning of last night's game, driving in what became the game-winning run. Gerber, who is No. 26 on MLB Pipeline's Tigers top prospects list, made his Major League debut earlier this season on April 20 in the second game of the doubleheader vs. Kansas City.

RECAPING JULY: The Tigers finished the month of July with a 10-14 record. As a team, Detroit hit .221 (176x795) during the month, while the pitching staff compiled a 4.24 ERA (210.1IP/99ER) and 175 strikeouts. Individually, Niko Goodrum hit .286 (26x91) with 11 runs scored, nine doubles, one triple, three home runs and nine RBI in 23 games in July. On the mound, Mike Fiers started five games and went 2-1 with a 2.23 ERA (32.1IP/8ER) and 23 strikeouts, while Alex Wilson (0.93 ERA), Victor Alcantara (1.17 ERA) and Drew VerHagen (2.13 ERA) each posted strong months out of the bullpen.

CLOSE ENCOUNTERS: The Tigers played their 33rd one-run game of the season last night, improving to 17-16 in those contests with a 2-1 win. Detroit's 33 one-run games are the third-most in the American League (Tampa Bay, 43 and Seattle, 41). In addition to the 33 one-run games, the Tigers have also played 22 games that have been decided by two runs.

WALKING ON SUNSHINE: The Tigers today will play their Major League leading 53rd day game of the season (out of 109 games, 48.6%). Detroit has posted a 25-27 (.481) record in the day time this season, as opposed to 21-35 (.375) at night. The Tigers have lost 12 of their last 17 day games.

TIGERS AND REDS: The Tigers improved to 1-2 against the Reds this season after winning last night's series opener. The Reds lead the all-time series against Detroit, 13-12, and the Tigers are 6-3 against Cincinnati at Comerica Park. The two teams last met in 2015, when the Reds won three of the four meetings.

INTERLEAGUE INTRIGUE: The Tigers are 2-9 in Interleague play this season. Detroit has a 208-186 (.528) record vs. National League opponents since Interleague play began in 1997. Only eight other Major League teams have at least 200 wins in Interleague history (New York (AL), Boston, Los Angeles (AL), Oakland, Texas, Chicago (AL), Minnesota, Seattle). Over the last 13 seasons (since 2006), the Tigers are 137-100 (.578) in IL play, which ranks fourth among all ML teams over that stretch, trailing only Boston (158-78, .672), New York (AL) (143-100, .588) and Texas (137-99, .581).

AT COMERICA PARK: The Tigers are 2-2 on their current five-game homestand, which includes three games vs. Cleveland (1-2) and two games vs. Cincinnati (1-0). Detroit is 28-27 at Comerica Park this season, but has lost 10 of its last 15 home games. The Tigers are hitting .249 (462x1855) as a team at home, while the pitching staff has posted a 4.00 ERA (506.0IP/225ER).

ON DECK: The Tigers begin a six-game road trip on Friday night as they open a three-game series at Oakland. Detroit is 0-4 against the Athletics this season after being swept in a four-game series at Comerica Park from June 25-28. Dating back to last season, the Tigers have lost nine straight games to the A's, which is Detroit's longest losing streak against the franchise since dropping 10 consecutive games to the Philadelphia Athletics from May 19-June 28, 1931.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters today's game with a 46-62 (.426) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,114-1,101 (.503) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

ABOUT MIKE: Fiers will make his 21st start of the season this afternoon in the series finale vs. Cincinnati.

LAST TIME OUT: Fiers turned in his 10th quality start of the season on Friday vs. Cleveland, but did not factor into the decision after allowing three runs on five hits with two walks and four strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

VS. CINCINNATI: Fiers has faced the Reds nine times in his career, including seven times as a starter, posting a 3-4 record with a 2.72 ERA (43.0IP/13ER) and 35 strikeouts. He last pitched against the Reds on June 19, 2016 and earned the win after tossing 5.2 shutout innings with four hits allowed, one walk and five strikeouts.

AT COMERICA PARK: Fiers has made 13 career starts at Comerica Park, compiling a 5-2 record with a 2.64 ERA (78.1IP/23ER) and 61 strikeouts. In 11 home starts this season, Fiers is 5-2 with a 2.85 ERA (66.1IP/21ER) and 52 strikeouts.

INTERLEAGUE ACTION: Fiers has pitched in 18 games, including 16 as a starter, in his career in Interleague play, compiling a 5-5 record with a 3.24 ERA (97.1IP/35ER) and 86 strikeouts. Fiers, who will be making his first Interleague start of the season today, started four games vs. National League opponents last season, going 1-2 with a 5.23 ERA (20.2IP/12ER) and 21 strikeouts.

RECORD IN AUGUST: Fiers has made 28 appearances, including 27 starts, in his career during the month of August, compiling a 13-9 record with a 4.06 ERA (168.2IP/76ER) and 167 strikeouts. In six August starts last season, Fiers went 1-4 with a 7.44 ERA (32.2IP/27ER) and 26 strikeouts.

RECAPPIING FIERS' JULY: Fiers made five starts during July, posting a 2-1 record with a 2.23 ERA (32.1IP/8ER) and 23 strikeouts. He ranked seventh in the American League with 32.1 innings pitched and a 2.23 ERA during July, while he was eighth with a 1.11 WHIP and 10th with a .232 (29x125) opponents batting average.

AMONG THE AL LEADERS: Fiers currently ranks seventh in the American League with 2.00 walks per nine innings.

IMPRESSIVE STRETCH: Fiers has allowed three runs-or-less in 10 of his last 11 starts, dating back to May 30. During the stretch, Fiers has posted a 3-3 record with a 2.65 ERA (68.0IP/20ER) and 54 strikeouts. Among American League pitchers during that time period, Fiers ranks third in ERA, while he is seventh in innings pitched.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Fiers has limited lefthanded batters to a .251 (389x1547) batting average in his career, while righties have hit .257 (437x1701) against him. In 20 starts this season, lefties are hitting .256 (58x227), while righthanded batters are hitting .260 (61x235).

TIGERS PITCHER OF THE MONTH FOR JUNE: Fiers was named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for June after posting a 1-2 record with a 3.30 ERA (30.0IP/11ER) and 27 strikeouts. He limited opponents to a .239 (28x117) batting average during the month.

STRONG TIGERS DEBUT: Fiers made his Tigers debut on April 8 at Chicago (AL) and earned the win, throwing 6.0 shutout innings with three hits allowed, one walk and six strikeouts. According to STATS, LLC, Fiers became the third pitcher in club history to throw 6.0-or-more innings, allow zero runs and strike out six-or-more batters in his Tigers debut, joining Alex Main and Joe Niekro.

TOSSING A NO-NO: Fiers threw a no-hitter as a member of the Houston Astros on August 21, 2015 vs. Los Angeles (NL). It marked the 11th no-hitter in Astros history, the 10th individual no-hitter and the first no-hitter in Minute Maid Park history. Following the performance, Fiers was named American League Pitcher of the Week.

PILING UP THE PUNCHOUTS: From 2011-15, Fiers ranked ninth among all Major League pitchers (min. 400.0 innings) with 9.09 strikeouts per nine innings, trailing only Yu Darvish, Stephen Strasburg, Chris Sale, Max Scherzer, Clayton Kershaw, Corey Kluber, Matt Harvey and Francisco Liriano. Fiers has recorded eight double-digit strikeout games in his career, with his last coming on July 16, 2017 vs. Minnesota, when he struck out 11.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Fiers was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on December 8, 2017. He was originally drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 22nd round of the June 2009 MLB First-Year Player Draft. He was acquired by the Astros along with Carlos Gomez and slot number 76 in the 2015-16 international pool in exchange for Josh Hader, Adrian Houser, Brett Phillips and Domingo Santana on July 30, 2015. Fiers played his college baseball at Nova Southeastern University, where he led the nation with 145 strikeouts in 108.2 innings as a senior in 2009. He was inducted into the Nova Southeastern University Athletics Hall of Fame in November, 2017.

ABOUT BLAINE: Hardy will make his 21st appearance and 11th start of the season on Friday night in the series opener at Oakland.

LAST TIME OUT: Hardy earned his fourth win of the season on Saturday vs. Cleveland, allowing one run on four hits with two walks and one strikeout in 5.0 innings.

VS. OAKLAND/AT OAKLAND COLISEUM: Hardy has made 11 appearances, including one start, in his career against the Athletics, posting a 1-0 record with a 3.14 ERA (14.1IP/5ER) and 12 strikeouts. He started against Oakland earlier this season on June 26 and received a no decision after giving up six runs, three earned, on six hits with three walks and four strikeouts in 4.0 innings. In four career relief outings at Oakland Coliseum, Hardy has a 0-0 record with a 3.00 ERA (3.0IP/1ER) and one strikeout.

FOR STARTERS: Hardy has allowed three runs-or-less in seven of his 10 starts this season. As a starter, Hardy has posted a 4-2 record with a 4.01 ERA (51.2IP/23ER) and 34 strikeouts.
