TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue their final homestand of the season with the third (1-1) of 4 games vs. the Texas Rangers...the Mariners opened the homestand losing 2-of-3 to the Oakland Athletics...went 6-4 on the final road trip of the season, going 3-1 at Los Angeles-AL, 2-1 at Houston and 1-2 at Texas... tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners won last night...are 8-7 in their last 15 games and 9-9 in their last 18... are 22-23 in their last 45 games since Aug. 9...are 32-42 in their last 74 games since July 4 after winning a season-high 8 straight games, spanning June 25 - July 3...the Mariners are 47-49 in their last 96 games since June 10...Seattle is 73-62 in its last 135 games (4/28-c) and 78-65 over its last 143 games (4/20-c)... Seattle is 24-27 during the day and 63-46 at night...Seattle is 43-36 at Safeco Field, 44-37 on the road.

- **Pitching In** - the Mariners are the only club in the Majors this season to have 5 pitchers make at least 25 starts each (**Mike Leake**, 31; **Marco Gonzales**, 29; **Félix Hernández**, 28; **James Paxton**, 27; **Wade LeBlanc**, 26)...four clubs (Cleveland, Colorado, Houston & Philadelphia) have 4 pitchers with 25+ starts each.
- **Ring 'Em Up** - the Mariners pitching staff has recorded 1,306 strikeouts this season, the 3rd-most in franchise history...trails only the Mariners clubs of 2016 (1,318) and 2014 (1,317).
- **Exist to Assist** - **Mitch Haniger** has 12 outfield assists this season, tied with Andrew Benintendi-BOS and Billy Hamilton-CIN for the Major League lead...each of Haniger's 12 outfield assists came as a right fielder, tops by any right fielder in the Majors...Haniger's 12 outfield assists are the most by a Mariners player since **Ichiro Suzuki** also had 12 outfield assists in 2004.
- **Four Score** - the Mariners are 64-19 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 23-54 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- **Get Through 8** - the Mariners are the only Major League club with a 1.000 winning percentage (75-0) when leading after 8 innings this season.
- **Division Rivals** - the Mariners are in the midst of playing their final 17 games (7-7) vs. AL West foes...Seattle is 39-35 (.527) vs. the AL West this season (10-9 vs. OAK, 10-9 vs. HOU, 11-8 vs. LAA and **8-9 vs. TEX**).

INNINGS EATERS...five Mariners pitchers have worked at least 150.0 innings this season...**Mike Leake** (185.2) leads the club, followed by **Marco Gonzales** (166.2), **Wade LeBlanc** (162.0), **Félix Hernández** (155.2) and **James Paxton** (154.1)...the Mariners are the only club in the Majors this season to have 5 pitchers work at least 150.0 innings...Cleveland, Colorado and Houston each have 4 pitchers with 150.0 IP.

RIBBIES...**Nelson Cruz** leads the Mariners and ranks T8th in the American League with 97 RBI this season...with 3 more RBI, Cruz would become only the 7th Mariners player in club history to record at least 3 seasons with at least 100 RBI...Cruz, who accomplished this feat in 2016 and 2017, would join Ken Griffey Jr. (7x; 1991-93 and 1999-99), Edgar Martinez (6x; 1995-98 and 2000-01), Álex Rodríguez (4x; 1996, 1998-2000), Bret Boone (3x; 2001-03), Jay Buhner (3x; 1995-97) and Raúl Ibañez (3x; 2006-08).

COMING IN HOT...**Mitch Haniger** has hit safely in 45 of his last 53 games, dating back to July 31...during that span, he's batting .326 (72x221) with 37 runs, 21 doubles, 2 triples, 8 home runs, 24 RBI, 2 HBP, 18 walks, a .379 on-base percentage and a .548 slugging percentage (.926 OPS)...among Major League leaders since July 31, Haniger ranks 3rd in hits, T3rd in doubles, T4th in extra-base hits (31), T11th in batting, T12th in runs, 15th in OPS...Mitch has hit safely in 14 of his last 16 games (9/11-c), batting .358 (24x67) with 14 runs scored, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home runs, 7 RBI and 5 walks.

SAVE ME...**Edwin Díaz** has recorded 56 of 58 (96.6%) of Seattle's team saves this season...his 96.6% of team saves is currently the highest mark ever by a closer since saves became an official stat in 1969 (min. 50 team saves)...he ranks ahead of John Smoltz-ATL in 2002 (96.5%, 55x57), Fernando Rodney-TB in 2012 (96.0%, 48x50), Rod Beck-SF in 1993 (96.0%, 48x50) and Eric Gagne-LAD in 2003 (94.8%, 55x58).

DOUBLING UP...this series features two of the top-5 all-time leaders in doubles by Dominican-born players...**Robinson Canó** ranks 5th with 534 career doubles while Rangers third baseman Adrián Beltré is 2nd with 634...Albert Pujols is the all-time leader with 639, followed by Beltré (634), David Ortiz (632), Manny Ramírez (547) and Canó (534)...since his debut in 2005, Canó has more doubles than any other Major League player, ahead of Miguel Cabrera (504) and Nick Markakis (474).

EXTRA! EXTRA!...**Kyle Seager** has collected 55+ XBH (35 2B, 1 3B, 22 HR) for the 7th consecutive time in his career...with 2 more extra base hits would record his 4th straight season with at least 60 extra-base hits...Edgar Martinez (8), Ken Griffey Jr. (8), Álex Rodríguez (5), Nelson Cruz (3, has 56 XBH in 2018), Bret Boone (3), Jay Buhner (3), Raul Ibañez (3) and Seager (3) are the only Mariners with 3+ seasons of at least 60 extra-base hits.

RING 'EM UP...**James Paxton** enters tonight's start with 199 strikeouts, 11th-most in the American League this season...with 1 more strikeout, Paxton will become the 6th Mariners pitcher in club history to record at least 200 strikeouts in a season and the first since **Félix Hernández** in 2014 (248 K)...when Paxton reaches this milestone, it will mark the 20th season of 200-or-more strikeouts by a Mariners pitcher in club history...Randy Johnson has the most 200-strikeout seasons in a Mariners uniform with 7, followed by Hernández (6), Mark Langston (4), Floyd Bannister (1) and Erik Hanson (1)...Paxton will join Johnson, Langston and Bannister as the only Mariners left-handers with 200-plus punchouts in a season (last: Randy Johnson, 213 K, 1998).

ALL ABOUT PAX...**James Paxton** is 1 strikeout shy of reaching the 200-strikeout plateau for the first time in his career...when he reaches the milestone, Paxton will become the 7th Canadian-born pitcher in Major League history with at least 200 strikeouts in a single season...the last Canuck with 200 punchouts in a season was the Cubs Ryan Dempster (Sechelt, British Columbia), who had 208 strikeouts in 2010...the only Canadian-born left-hander with 200 strikeouts in a season is Erik Bedard (Navan, Ontario), who tallied 221 strikeouts for the Orioles in 2007...when Paxton reaches this milestone, it will mark the 13th season of 200-or-more strikeouts by a Canadian-born pitcher in Major League history; Hall of Famer Ferguson Jenkins (Chatham, Ontario) had 6 such seasons, followed by Dempster with 2 and Bedard, Bob Emslie (Guelph, Ontario), Russ Ford (Brandon, Manitoba) and Kirk McCaskill (Kapusking, Ontario) with 1 apiece.

AS YOU KNOW...**Guillermo Heredia** is 1 of 4 qualifying Major League outfielders with a 1.000 fielding percentage (also: Jon Jay, KC-ARI, Josh Reddick, HOU and Mike Trout, LAA)...**AND AS YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**...Heredia has not committed an error in 291 total chances dating back to August 26, 2017...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...that if Heredia finishes the season with a 1.000 fielding percentage, he will join Franklin Gutiérrez (2010) as the only qualifying outfielders in club history to accomplish this feat in a single season?...**AND WHILE WE ARE ON THE SUBJECT OF STREAKS**...Heredia's 291 consecutive total chances without an error is currently the 5th-longest active streak in the Majors, trailing only Jon Jay (571 TC, 4/15/16-c), Mike Trout (522 TC, 4/7/17-c), Kevin Kiermaier (8/18/17-c) and Peter Bourjos (305 TC, 5/3/16-c).

ABOUT PAXTON...

- 29-year-old left-hander is making his 28th start of 2018, his 102nd career start & 13th career start against Texas tonight.
- Selected by Seattle in the 4th round of the 2010 MLB June Draft.
- Native of Ladner, BC...attended Delta Secondary School.
- Pitched for the University of Kentucky, 2007-09...was 11-5, 4.91 ERA (81 ER, 148.1 IP) and 168 K's in 55 G/24 GS.
- Originally selected by Toronto in the Supplemental 1st round (39th overall) in the 2009 MLB June Draft, but did not sign.
- Went 1-2 with a 4.08 ERA (8 ER, 17.2 IP) in 4 starts with Grand Prairie in the Independent League in 2010.
- Pitched for the World squad in the 2011 MLB Futures game... named to Midwest League All-Star team in 2011.
- Pitched 6th no-hitter in Mariners history on May 8, 2018 at Toronto.
- Is 8-9 with a 4.06 ERA (55 ER, 122.0 IP) in 23 career starts in Sept.

LAST OUTING... did not factor into the decision in his last start, a 3-7 Mariners loss to Oakland on Sept. 24...allowed 2 runs on 3 hits and no walks while striking out 5 batters over 4.0 innings...both runs scored as a result of a career-high-tying 2 home runs allowed.

CHASING 200... enters tonight's start with 199 strikeouts, 10th-most in the American League this season...with 1 more strikeout, will become the 6th Mariners pitcher in club history to record at least 200 strikeouts in a season and the 1st since Félix Hernández in 2014 (248 K)...when Paxton reaches this milestone, it will mark the 20th season of 200-or-more strikeouts by a Mariners pitcher in club history...Paxton will join Randy Johnson, Mark Langston and Floyd Bannister as the only Mariners left-handers with 200-plus punchouts in a season (last: Randy Johnson, 213 K, 1998).

HE'S FEELING BETTER... missed 2 starts while recovering from pneumonia, Sept. 7-Sept. 24.

LEADERBOARD... among Major League leaders with 150+ IP, ranks 5th in strikeouts-per-9.0-innings (11.60/199 K, 154.1 IP), 11th in K/BB (4.74/199 K, 42 BB) and T15th in strikeouts (199)...his 8 games with 10+ strikeouts are T4th-most in the AL (also: Gerrit Cole-HOU), trailing only Justin Verlander-HOU (12), Chris Sale-BOS (11) and Trevor Bauer-CLE (10).

THE RIGHT STUFF... has held right-handed hitters to a .199 batting average (95x478), while lefties have batted .330 (32x97) against Paxton this season...righties are slugging .364 against him this year, while lefties have posted a .505 slugging mark.

FOR THE RECORD BOOKS... Paxton's 603 career strikeouts are the most strikeouts as a Mariner in a pitcher's first 100 career games, ranking ahead of Félix Hernández (575), Mark Langston (555), Erik Hanson (534) and Randy Johnson (531 in 89 games with Seattle; struck out 51 batters in 11 appearances with Montreal prior to joining the Mariners).

HE'S BACK... activated from the 10-day disabled list on Sept. 1 after being placed on the DL on Aug. 14 with a left forearm contusion...previously spent time on the disabled list July 13-29 with lower back inflammation.

NO-NO... pitched the 6th no-hitter (5th by a single pitcher) in Mariners history in Toronto on May 8...issued 3 walks, struck out 7 batters and needed just 99 pitches to accomplish the feat...recorded his 1st career complete game and 1st career shutout.

- Is the 2nd Canadian-born pitcher in MLB history to throw a no-hitter, joining Dick Fowler, who tossed a no-no for the Philadelphia Athletics vs. the St. Louis Browns in the second game of a doubleheader on Sept. 9, 1945.
- Became the first American League pitcher to record a 16-strikeout game and a no-hitter in the same season since Nolan Ryan achieved both in the same game on May 1, 1991 vs. Toronto with the Texas Rangers...STATS, Inc.
- Marks 4th Mariners no-hitter since 2012, tied with SF for most during that span.
- Marks the 3rd no-hitter in the Majors this season (Sean Manaea-OAK, 4/21 vs. BOS; four pitchers-LAD, 5/4 at SD in Monterrey, Mexico).

KKKKKKKKKKKKKKKKKKKK... recorded a career-high 16 strikeouts across 7.0 scoreless innings on May 2 vs. OAK...Paxton's 16 strikeouts are tied for the most in a single game in the Majors this season (also: Gerrit Cole-HOU, 5/4 at ARI)...marks the most strikeouts by a Mariners pitcher since Randy Johnson struck out 19 on 8/8/97 vs. CWS...became the first pitcher in Mariners history to record at least 2 strikeouts in each of the first 7 innings of a start.

WHIFF... recorded 49 strikeouts over his 5 starts from April 11 to May 2...is one of 5 Mariners pitchers in club history (done 65x) with at least 49 strikeouts over a span of 5 starts, the first since Félix Hernández also had 49 strikeouts over 5 starts, June 23 - July 14, 2012...Randy Johnson accomplished this feat 56 times while with the Mariners, followed by Mark Langston (4), Mike Moore (3), Hernández (1) and Paxton (1).

CAREER... is 41-26 with a 3.44 ERA (220 ER, 576.1 IP) with 608 strikeouts in 101 career starts...has spent 8 years in the Mariners organization, including parts of 6 Major League seasons, after being selected by Seattle in 4th round of the 2010 MLB Draft...made MLB debut on Sept. 7, 2013 vs. TB.

29-year-old left-hander is making his 3rd start of season today vs. Texas...did not factor into the decision in his last start, a 5-0 Mariners win at LAA on 9/14 (3.2,1,0,0,4... has made 19 relief appearances for the Mariners this season, going 2-0 with a 2.02 ERA (8 ER, 35.2 IP) with 11 walks and 19 strikeouts while holding opponents to a .238 average (31x130)...has not allowed a home run this season... CAREER: Is 17-22 with a 4.03 ERA (149 ER, 333.0 IP) with 274 strikeouts in 77 career appearances (53 starts)...as a starter, is 15-22 with a 4.22 ERA (137 ER, 292.1 IP)...has spent parts of 5 seasons with Seattle (2014-15, 2018-c) and Boston (2016-17)...originally signed with the Mariners as a minor league free agent on May 3, 2011...made MLB debut on April 3, 2014 at Oakland... vs. TEX: Is making his 8th career appearance (6th start) against Texas...is 2-2 with a 2.37 ERA (8 ER, 30.1 IP) in 7 career games (5 GS) vs. the Rangers...made 1 relief appearance vs. Texas on 9/21 (2.1,4,1,0,1,1).

ALL HANDS ON DECK...the Mariners have used a total of 53 different players this season...that's the 3rd-most players used in a single season in franchise history, trailing only the 61 players used in 2017 and the 54 used in 2016...Seattle has used 32 different pitchers (including 2 position players: **Andrew Romine**, 3 games, and Taylor Motter) this season; that's tied for second-most ever (1. 40 in 2017; T2. 32 in 2016)...all 38 players on the Mariners current active roster have already appeared in a game this season.

NEED TO GET TO 4...Seattle lost 2-0 vs. the Rangers on Thursday night...was the 77th time this season the Mariners had scored 3 or fewer runs in a game, and Seattle fell to 23-54 in those games...77 team games with 3 or fewer runs are T4th-most in the AL (also: KC and CWS), trailing only BAL (91), DET (81) and LAA (80) and ranks T8th in MLB...Seattle's 23 wins when scoring 3 or fewer is T1st in the Majors, with the Cubs (23-51) and ahead of the Giants (21-68), Rockies (21-42) and A's (21-40).

OUR LEADERS...Mariners leadoff hitters this season – **Dee Gordon** (99 games), **Mitch Haniger** (44 games), **Jean Segura** (14 games), **Guillermo Heredia** (2 games) and **Denard Span** (1 game) – have combined to hit .351 leading off a game this year, going 54-for-154 with 9 extra-base hits, including 2 home runs...the .351 average leads MLB.

IN THE BLACK...at 87-73, the Mariners have clinched a winning season...2018 is just the third time in franchise history that Seattle never took the field with a record under .500...the Mariners were exactly .500 3 times this year (at 1-1, 3-3 & 4-4) but never fell under .500...the only other seasons the Mariners have been .500 or better on every day of the season were 1996 and 2001.

FOR STARTERS...**Matt Festa** (1.0 IP on Sept. 19) was the 11th different starting pitcher used by the Mariners this season...the 11 starters used by the Mariners this season is tied (w/7 other teams) for 16th-most starters used this season...for Seattle, 5 guys (**Mike Leake**, **Marco Gonzales**, **Félix Hernández**, **James Paxton**, **Wade LeBlanc**) have combined for 142 starts, with each making at least 26, and **Erasmus Ramirez** has chipped in 10, with five other pitchers combining for 8 starts (Elias, 3; Bergman, 2; Festa, Miranda, Vincent, 1)...Seattle used a club-record tying 17 starters in 2017.

THE ROTATION...**Mike Leake** (31 GS), **Marco Gonzales** (29 GS), **Félix Hernández** (28 GS), **James Paxton** (27 GS) and **Wade LeBlanc** (27 GS) have all made 25+ starts this season...the Mariners are the only club in the Majors this season to have 5 pitchers make 25+ starts apiece...2018 is just the fourth time in Seattle franchise history that the club has had five pitchers make at least 25 starts...this year joins 2006 (**Hernández**, Meche, Moyer, Piñeiro & Washburn), 2003 (Franklin, Garcia, Meche, Moyer & Pineiro) and 1991 (DeLucia, Hanson, Holman, R. Johnson & Krueger).

DON'T WALK...Mariners pitchers did not walk a Padres batter Sept. 11, marking the 22nd game this season in which Seattle hurlers did not issue a free pass...the Mariners 22 games issuing 0 walks are tops in the American League and 2nd-most in the Majors this season...they trail only the Dodgers (28), while ranking ahead of Washington (16), Oakland (15) and San Diego (14)...the 22 games with 0 walks issued by Mariners pitchers are the most in single-season club history, surpassing the previous mark of 17 such games set by the 2002 Mariners.

GOOD TO BE HOME...**Nelson Cruz** has hit 21 home runs at Safeco Field this season, which is tied for the most all-time at Safeco Field, along with Richie Sexson's 21 home runs at Safeco Field in 2005...Cruz, who hit 19 home runs at Safeco Field in 2017, is joined by Bret Boone (2001) and Edgar Martinez (2000) as the only other players to hit 19 home runs at Safeco Field in a single season...overall this season, Cruz's 21 home runs at home are 5th-most in the American League, trailing only J.D. Martinez-BOS (25), Khris Davis-OAK (23), Joey Gallo-TEX (23) and Justin Upton-LAA (22).

40/100...**Nelson Cruz** has 37 home runs and 97 RBI this season in 160 team games; that puts him on pace for 38 home runs and 98 RBI...Cruz is the only player in baseball to have averaged more than 40 homers and 100 RBI over the past five seasons...since the start of the 2014 campaign, Cruz leads the Majors with 203 home runs (40.6 per year) and is 3rd (trailing Nolan Arenado, 559, & Edwin Encarnación, 549) with 522 RBI (104.0 per year)...he had at least 39 homers and 93 RBI in every season from 2014-2017.

HOME AWAY FROM HOME...the Mariners finished their road slate at 44-37 (.543), and are currently tied for the 7th-most road wins in the Majors...the Mariners are tied with Chicago-NL (44-37), Colorado (44-37), Milwaukee (44-37) and St. Louis (44-35), while trailing Houston (55-23), Boston (51-30), Atlanta (47-32), Oakland (46-33), New York-AL (46-33) and Los Angeles-NL (45-34)...in Mariners club history, the 2018 club is also tied for the 5th-most road wins in a single season (also: 2000, 44-37/.543), trailing 2001 (59-22/.728), 2014 (46-35/.568), 2002 (45-36/.556) and 1997 (45-36/.556).

HOME ON THE ROAD...Seattle finished its road schedule at 44-37 (see above)...Mariners have had a winning road record just 9 times in franchise history, last turning the trick in 2016 (also: 2014, 2003, 2002, 2001, 2000, 1997, 1996).

MR. CONSISTENT...**Mike Leake** has made 31 starts this season, his 7th consecutive season of 30 or more starts...Leake is just the second pitcher in the live ball era with at least 7 straight seasons of 30+ starts and 50 or fewer walks...Leake enters play tonight with 34 walks this year...only Greg Maddux (13 straight, 1996-2008) had more than 7 consecutive 30+ GS/50 or fewer walk seasons...Roy Halladay (2006-11) and Fritz Peterson (1969-74) each had 6 such seasons.

THE OCHO...**Edwin Díaz** had 8 saves vs. both Oakland and Houston this season; that matches the Mariners club record for most saves by a Mariners pitcher vs. any single opponent in a single season...Fernando Rodney (8 vs. OAK in 2014) is the only other Mariners pitcher to record 8 saves vs. 1 opponent in a single season...the AL record is 10, shared by Neftalí Feliz-TEX vs. LAA (2010), Mariano Rivera-NYY vs. BAL (2004) and José Valverde-DET vs. KC (2011).
