HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ The D-backs are 5-2 in their last 7 games.
- ♦ The D-backs are 4-3 in their last 7 games at AT&T Park.
- ♦ Among all teams since May 28, the D-backs rank in home runs (1st, 15), slugging pct. (2nd, .520), OPS (T-2nd, .859), runs (5th, 45), walks (T-5th, 28) and on-base pct. (T-9th, .339).
- ♦ **Patrick Corbin**, in 5 road starts (2 quality), has allowed 1 run twice, 2 runs once and 3 runs twice...overall, is 1-0 with a 3.07 ERA (10 ER in 29.1 IP), .217 opponent average (23-for-106) and 36 strikeouts (11.05 strikeouts per 9.0 innings).
 - Threw his first career shutout (1 H, 1 BB, 8 K) in a 1-0 win @ Giants on April 17...held the Giants hitless for the first 7.2 innings (Brandon Belt check-swing, infield single).
- ♦ **David Peralta** has homered in 3 of his last 4 games, including a career-best 3 straight games from June 1-3.
- ♦ **John Ryan Murphy's** 8 home runs as a catcher are tied for second in the NL with Francisco Cervelli/PIT behind Yasmani Grandal/LAD (9) and ahead of Kurt Suzuki/ATL (7).
- ♦ **Ketel Marte**, in his last 7 games, is batting .391 (9-for-23)/.417 OBP/1.417 OPS with 4 doubles, 2 triples, 2 homers, 8 RBI and 1 walk.
- ♦ **Jarrod Dyson**, in his last 6 games, is hitting .350 (7-for-20)/.458 OBP with 4 walks.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs lost @ Giants, 10-3.
- ♦ **Ketel Marte** went 1-for-4 with a 2-run double.
- ♦ **Jake Lamb** and **Paul Goldschmidt** were 1-for-3 with a RBI.
- ♦ **Zack Godley** (5-5) suffered the loss (7 ER in 3.1 IP).

ROSTER MOVES

- ♦ The D-backs recalled RHP **Silvino Bracho** from Triple-A Reno... following last night's game, RHP **Jake Barrett** was optioned to Reno.
- ♦ Bracho has an active 7.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to the sixth inning of his season debut on April 15, including a current 6.1-inning hitless stretch...has held right-handed hitters to a .063 average (1-for-16) with 8 strikeouts, including hitless in their last 14 at-bats.

- Matt McLain (Round 1, Pick 25) | Infielder | B/T: R/R | Age: 18 (8/6/99) | 5-10, 175 | Beckman (Calif.) High School**
 - In 26 games as a senior at Beckman High School in 2018, he hit .369 (31-for-84)/.461 OBP/.595 SLG with 6 doubles, 2 triples, 3 homers, 14 RBI and 16 walks, playing primarily as a shortstop.
 - First-Team All-Pacific Coast League all 4 years and 2-time conference Player of the Year (2015, '18).
- Jake McCarthy (Competitive Balance A, Pick 39) | Outfielder | B/T: L/L | Age: 20 (7/30/97) | 6-3, 195 | Univ. of Virginia**
 - In his junior season with Cavaliers, hit .329 (27-for-82)/.414 OBP/.415 SLG with 7 doubles, 12 RBI, 9 stolen bases and 10 walks in 20 games...suffered a fractured left wrist on March 6.
 - Entered 2018 as a unanimous preseason All-American, and was on the Golden Spikes Award watch list, annually bestowed on the country's top amateur baseball player by USA Baseball.
 - As a sophomore in 2017, played in all 59 games for Virginia, hitting .338 (80-for-237)/.425 OBP/.506 SLG with 11 doubles, 7 triples, 5 home runs, 36 RBI, 27 stolen bases and 26 walks... ranked first in the ACC in stolen bases and triples.
 - His brother, Joe, who also played at the University of Virginia, plays in the Tampa Bay Rays' system. His father, Joe, was a first-round selection by the Tigers in 1980.

 - Rawlins-Perfect Game 2018 First-Team All-American and 2-time Underclass Team (2017 First-Team, 2016 Second-Team).
 - Hit .420 (55-for-131)/.503 OBP/.763 SLG with 7 doubles, 4 triples, 10 home runs, 43 RBI, 14 stolen bases and 58 runs scored in 38 games with Mount Carmel High School as a senior in 2018.
 - Gatorade's 2017 Illinois High School Baseball Player of the Year as a junior, batting .470 with 11 home runs and 43 RBI.
 - Hit .361 as the leadoff hitter on USA Baseball's 18U gold-medal winning National Team in the 2017 World Cup.

CORBIN AT A GLANCE

- Sixth season with the D-backs.
Named NL Player of the Week for April 16-22 after going 2-0 with a 1.20 ERA, 2 walks, 19 strikeouts and a 0.33 WHIP in 2 starts.
Selected to the 2013 NL All-Star Team and was a finalist for the 2013 Rawlings Gold Glove Award.
Acquired on July 25, 2010 with LHP Joe Saunders, LHP Tyler Skaggs and RHP Rafael Rodriguez from Los Angeles Angels for RHP Dan Haren...selected by Angels in second round of 2009 First-Year Player Draft.

WHAT TO KNOW...

- Is 4-1 with a 2.44 ERA (16 ER in 59.0 IP) in his last 10 road games (9 starts) dating back to 2017.
Is 2-0 with a 1.27 ERA (3 ER in 21.1 IP) in his last 3 starts vs. Giants.
Has not won @ AT&T Park since Sept. 19, 2015.
Threw a 1-hit shutout on April 17 vs. Giants... began the game with 7.2 hitless innings before surrendering a check-swing, infield single to Brandon Belt.

LAST START

- Suffered the loss on May 30 vs. Reds, allowing a season high in runs (6) and hits (8).
Notched his ninth career game with 10+ strikeouts (10) and third of the season.
Surrendered a grand slam to Adam Duvall in the fourth inning with the D-backs leading, 4-0.

SOUTHPAW SHOWDOWN

- Is starting opposite Madison Bumgarner for the third time in his career (first @ AT&T Park).
Corbin is 1-1 with a 2.25 ERA (3 ER in 12.0 IP) in the matchups, while Bumgarner is 1-1 with a 4.09 ERA (5 ER in 11.0 IP) [May 11, 2012 @ Chase Field & July 19, 2015 @ Chase Field].

VS. GIANTS

- Is 6-7 with a 3.16 ERA (42 ER in 119.2 IP) in 21 games (19 starts) in his career.
Has gone 1-4 with a 4.66 ERA (24 ER in 46.1 IP) in 8 starts @ AT&T Park.
Threw a 1-hit shutout on April 17 vs. Giants, his first career shutout and fourth complete game...began the game with 7.2 hitless innings before surrendering a check-swing, infield single to Brandon Belt.
