HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ Arizona is 6-1 in its last 7 games vs. San Diego.
- ♦ 13 of the D-backs last 14 games have been decided by 3 runs or fewer: 1 run - 8 times; 2 runs - 3 times; 3 runs - twice.
- ♦ **Zack Godley**, who is 5-1 in his last 10 starts, is 0.1 IP shy of matching a career high (155.0 in 2017) and needs 2 strikeouts to tie his career best (165 in 2017).
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is hitting .398 (35-for-88) with 7 doubles, 7 home runs, 18 RBI and a 1.181 OPS in his last 23 games.
- ♦ **David Peralta** is batting .514 (36-for-70)/.528 OBP/.871 SLG with 8 doubles, 5 homers and 14 RBI in his last 17 home games.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs lost the series finale @ Dodgers, 3-2.
- ♦ **Clay Buchholz** allowed 1 run in 5.0 innings...had a 19.0 inning scoreless streak snapped in the fifth inning.
- ♦ **Daniel Descalso** went 1-for-3 with a solo home run (12)...**Paul Goldschmidt** was 2-for-3 with a walk.

ROSTER MOVES

- ♦ Prior to tonight's game, the D-backs selected the contract of RHP **Yoan López** from Double-A Jackson and transferred INF **Jake Lamb** to the 60-day disabled list (left rotator cuff strain).
- ♦ The D-backs' 40-man roster remains at 40.

DOWN THE STRETCH WE GO

- ♦ The D-backs have 25 games remaining (15 home/10 away) and their opponents' combined .523 winning pct. is tied with the Rockies and higher than the Dodgers (.493) [source: ESPN.com].
 - 15 games vs. NL foes: 7 vs. Rockies (4 on road/3 @ home), 5 vs. Padres (3 on road/2 @ home), 3 vs. Dodgers (@ home).
 - 13 games against current first place teams: 4 vs. Braves (@ home), 3 vs. Astros (on road), 3 vs. Dodgers (@ home) and 3 vs. Cubs (@ home).

CLOSE CALLS

- ♦ 13 of the D-backs last 14 games have been decided by 3 runs or fewer: 1 run - 8 times; 2 runs - 3 times; 3 runs - twice.

FRIAR FACTS

- ♦ The D-backs need 2 wins to match their franchise record for most wins in a single season vs. Padres (12 in 2001, '02 and '14).

WALKING HIS WAY TO THE TOP OF THE ALL-TIME LIST

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** (646) is 4 walks shy of tying Luis Gonzalez's club record (650).
- ♦ Goldschmidt already owns the franchise record with 99 intentional walks (Gonzalez is second with 94).

WALKING HIS WAY TO THE TOP OF THE ALL-TIME LIST

- ♦ The D-backs' 3.51 ERA (482 ER in 1,235.0 IP) ranks second in the NL and third overall...only the Astros (3.13) and Dodgers (3.41) are better.
- ♦ Arizona's 3.51 is also currently the lowest single-season mark in club history:
 - **LOWEST SINGLE-SEASON ERA BY D-BACKS: 3.51 – 2018**; 3.66 – 2017; 3.77 – 1999; 3.80 – 2011; 3.84 – 2003.

GENTLEMEN START YOUR ENGINES

- ♦ Arizona's rotation has posted a 1.45 ERA (9 ER in 56.0 IP) and a .191 average over its last 9 games.
- ♦ Since July 22, D-backs starters lead the Majors with a 2.73 ERA (73 ER in 240.2 IP):
 - **BEST STARTERS ERA IN MLB SINCE JULY 22: 2.73 – D-backs**; 2.87 – Dodgers; 3.00 – Cardinals; 3.17 – Mets; 3.19 – Indians.

GODLEY AT A GLANCE

- ◆ Fourth season with the D-backs.
- ◆ Acquired from the Cubs on Dec. 9, 2014, with RHP Jeferson Mejia, for C Miguel Montero.

THINGS TO KNOW...

- ◆ Is 0.1 inning and 2 strikeouts shy of matching his best (155.0 IP/165 SO in 2017).
- ◆ His career-high 14 wins this season are tied for third most in the NL (also: Jhoulys Chacin and Jon Lester), trailing only Max Scherzer (16) and Aaron Nola (15).
- ◆ Is tied for the NL lead with 9 wins since June 10 (also: Chacin).
- ◆ Is 10-2 with a 1.87 ERA (19 ER in 91.2 IP) in 14 starts this season when lasting 6.0+ innings.

LAST START

- ◆ Earned the win on Aug. 29 @ Giants, allowing just 1 run on 2 hits in 7.2 IP, surpassing his win total from 2016-17 combined (13).
- ◆ 2 hits allowed matched his career low in starts of 7.0+ IP (also: June 28, 2017 vs. Cardinals and July 31, 2018 vs. Rangers).

VS. PADRES

- ◆ Is 3-3 with a 5.23 ERA (31 ER in 53.1 IP) in 13 career appearances (9 starts) vs. Padres.
- ◆ Is 2-0 with a 4.67 ERA (9 ER in 17.1 IP) in 4 appearances (3 starts) this season.
- ◆ Has allowed 4 earned runs or fewer in 8 career appearances (5 starts) @ Chase Field.

COMING UP ON SOME CAREER HIGHS

- ◆ Is 0.1 inning and 2 strikeouts shy of matching his best (155.0 IP/165 SO in 2017).

HOME IS WHERE THE WINS ARE

- ◆ Is 6-3 with a 3.77 ERA (30 ER in 71.2 IP) in 12 home starts this season.
- ◆ Allowed 2 earned runs or fewer in 8 of his 12 starts.

GETTING SOME HELP

- ◆ Is averaging 5.24 runs of support in his starts this season (90 runs), the eighth-highest average in the NL behind John Lester (6.44), German Marquez (6.16), Sean Newcomb (5.90), Jon Gray (5.69), Miles Mikolas (5.60), Max Scherzer (5.45) and Kyle Hendricks (5.30).

PLAYER PROFILE

- ◆ As a senior at University of Tennessee, in 2013, he led the SEC in complete games (6) and innings (108.1) and has second in strikeouts (98).
- ◆ Nickname is the "Bull" because his teammates at Tennessee called him that due to his demeanor on the mound and his sprints on and off the field.
- ◆ Is an avid bass fisherman...has accidently sunk 2 boats.
- ◆ Roomed the majority of the 2017 with Andrew Chafin in his 42-foot RV.
- ◆ Was an alternate on the 2012 USA Baseball Collegiate National Team, appearing in 4 games.
- ◆ Married to Autumn.

18+ OUTS

- ◆ Is 10-2 with a 1.87 ERA (19 ER in 91.2 IP) in 14 starts this season when lasting 6.0+ innings.
- ◆ Is 23-6 with a 2.43 ERA (65 ER in 241.0 IP) in 37 career starts of 6.0+ innings (Arizona is 28-9).

GOOD 'OLE UNCLE CHARLIE

- ◆ Leads all Major League starters by throwing a curveball 40.6 pct. of the time ahead, ahead of Jose Berrios/MIN (30.0 pct.).
- ◆ Has a 40.61 pct. swing-and-miss rate on his curveball, the fourth-best mark in the Majors behind Charlie Morton/HOU (46.35 pct.), Andrew Heaney/LAA (42.70 pct.) and German Marquez/COL (42.45 pct.) [min. 500 pitches].
- ◆ Leads the Majors with 116 strikeouts with his curveball, ahead of Morton (109).

STAYING GROUNDED

- ◆ Has posted a 50.7 ground ball pct., the ninth-best mark in the NL [as a starter only].
- ◆ Since 2016, ranks seventh among all pitchers with a 2.38 ground ball-to-fly ball ratio (562/236) and ninth with a 53.2 ground ball pct.

RIGHT ON

- ◆ Is holding righties to a .229 average (43-for-188) in his last 18 games (17 starts).

GODLEY'S PLAN

- ◆ Is 13-3 when issuing 3 or fewer walks (19 starts), posting a 3.24 ERA (42 ER in 116.2 IP).
- ◆ Has limited batters to a .208 AVG (45-for-216) the first time through the lineup.

- ◆ **NL RANKINGS (RELIEVERS):** 3rd in SV (31), 6th in SO/9.0 IP (12.74), 9th in SV PCT. (83.8).
- ◆ Is the eighth D-back to record 30 saves (fourth different pitcher in last 5 years).
- ◆ Is 31-for-37 in save chances with a .205 opp. average (26-for-127) and 50 strikeouts.
- ◆ Right-handed hitters are batting .118 (6-for-51) over his last 28 games since June 6.
- ◆ First batters faced are hitting .114 (5-for-44), fourth in the NL.

#61 • SILVINO BRACHO • R/R

LAD Series: 0 ER/0.0 IP

- ◆ Recalled from Triple-A Reno on Sept. 1 (in ninth stint with D-backs in 2018)...in 22 games for Reno, was 2-2 with 8 saves, a 4.46 ERA and 52 strikeouts.
- ◆ Made 10 hitless appearances from May 1-June 10 (7.2 IP; 29 BF).

LAD Series: 0-2 SV, 3 ER/0.1 IP, K

- ◆ **NL RANKINGS (RELIEVERS):** T-1st in HLD (31), T-3rd in G (66).
- ◆ His 66 appearances are a career high (previous high was 63 in 2017).
- ◆ Needs 4 holds to tie Brandon Lyon's club record (35 in 2007).
- ◆ Lefties are hitting .115 (7-for-61) over his last 37 games since May 23.
- ◆ 26 first-half holds were the most by a Major League pitcher since 1969.

- ◆ **NL RANKINGS (RELIEVERS):** 2nd in G (67), 6th in ERA (2.00).
- ◆ Lefties are 9-for-50 (.180) with 16 strikeouts since June 2.
- ◆ Has a 74-game homerless streak, the longest active streak in the Majors and the second longest streak in team history (95 by Brad Ziegler from 2011-12).

#41 • JAKE DIEKMAN • L/L (DEEK-man)

- ◆ 8 of his last 9 appearances have been scoreless (1.59 ERA; 1 ER in 5.2 IP).
- ◆ Has held lefties to just 4 hits in their last 22 at-bats (.182; 1 BB, 1 HBP, 7 K).
- ◆ Acquired on July 31 from the Rangers for RHP Wei-Chieh Huang and a PTBN.

- ◆ **NL RANKINGS (RELIEVERS):** T-1st in HLD (31), 6th in G (65), 9th in ERA (2.02).
- ◆ Leads all rookie relievers with a 2.02 ERA, ahead of Reyes Moronta/SF (2.08).
- ◆ Owns a 0.77 ERA (1 ER in 11.2 IP) in his last 14 games.
