HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ The D-backs are 6-1 in their last 7 home games vs. Marlins and 13-6 in their last 19.
- ♦ With a win today, the D-backs would secure their first series sweep vs. Miami @ Chase Field since July 23-26, 2007 (4 games).
- ♦ Over the last 5 games since May 28, the D-backs rank among the Major League leaders in home runs (1st, 14), slugging pct. (1st, .583), RBI (T-3rd, 35), runs (4th, 36), on-base pct. (7th, .344) and average (10th, .276).
- ♦ **John Ryan Murphy** is tied for the NL lead in home runs by a catcher (8) with Francisco Cervelli/PIT and Yasmani Grandal/LAD, ahead of Kurt Suzuki/ATL (7).
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** has hit safely in 5 straight games, batting .316 (6-for-19)/.409 OBP/.632 SLG with 2 home runs and 4 RBI.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs earned a series victory vs. Marlins, winning 6-2.
- ♦ **Zack Greinke** (4-4) earned the win after allowing 1 run on 7 hits in 6.2 innings... **Yoshihisa Hirano** (0.1 IP), **Andrew Chafin** (0.2), and **Archie Bradley** (0.1) each logged scoreless outings.
- ♦ **David Peralta** homered for the second consecutive day and logged 2 RBI... **Paul Goldschmidt** hit a solo home run and scored twice, and **Ketel Marte** logged a RBI triple.

DRAFT TIME IS HERE AGAIN

- ♦ The 2018 MLB Draft begins tomorrow, and the D-backs will have 3 picks: Round 1 (No. 25), Competitive Balance A (No. 39) and Round 2 (No. 63).
- ♦ Day 1 of the Draft can be seen on MLB Network starting at 4:00 p.m. AZT tomorrow... fans can follow every pick of the draft on MLB.com.
- ♦ Rounds 3-10 will be Tuesday starting at 10:05 a.m. AZT, and rounds 11-40 will be Wednesday starting at 9:05 a.m.

LIFE IN THE 20'S

- ♦ The D-backs have had a first-round pick in the 20's on 5 occasions entering this season, with 4 of those picks eventually making the Major Leagues: Daniel Schlereth in 2008 (No. 26), Carlos Quentin in 2003 (29), Sergio Santos in 2002 (27) and Jason Bulger in 2001 (22).
- ♦ Notable players to be picked No. 25 overall in the draft: Matt Chapman (2014), Mike Trout (2009), Matt Garza (2005), Matt Cain (2002) and Chuck Knoblauch (1989).
- ♦ Since 2004, 11 of the 14 players drafted 25th overall have reached the Majors.

- ♦ **Shelby Miller** will make his second rehab appearance tomorrow for Double-A Jackson vs. Tennessee (Cubs)... Miller allowed 1 run on 4 hits with 8 strikeouts and 0 walks in his first rehab appearance on May 29 for Single-A Adv. Visalia.

DOUBLE THE FIRST NAMES, DOUBLE THE POP

- ♦ **John Ryan Murphy** is tied for the NL lead in home runs by a catcher (8) with Francisco Cervelli/PIT and Yasmani Grandal/LAD, ahead of Kurt Suzuki/ATL (7).
- ♦ In 15 starts this season, is batting .328 (20-for-61) with 4 doubles, 8 homers, 17 RBI and 3 walks
- ♦ Is averaging a home run every 9.88 at-bats (7 HR/75 AB), the highest rate in baseball (min. 75 PA), ahead of Mookie Betts/BOS (10.82), Mike Trout/LAA (10.95), Bryce Harper/WSH (11.22) and J.D. Martinez (11.32).
- ♦ Has recorded an extra-base hit (2 doubles, 5 home runs) and a RBI (10 total) in 6 consecutive starts... homered in 3 straight games overall and 4 in a row as a catcher, tying a club mark at that position (also: Jarrod Saltalamacchia, Sept. 8-16, 2013).

TRIPLE THE FUN

- ♦ The D-backs are tied for second in the Majors with the Cubs with 19 triples, trailing only the Pirates (20).
- ♦ **Ketel Marte** is tied for second in the NL with Javier Baez/CHC with 5 triples, trailing Chris Taylor/LAD (6)... his 5 triples through the first 57 games of the season are tied for second most in team history (6x; last: Stephen Drew in 2010), behind only Junior Spivey in 2002 (6).

NO NEED FOR MARIO

- ♦ **Yoshihisa Hirano** boasts a 12-game scoreless streak (10.1 IP) since May 6, allowing just 6 hits and 2 walks (1 intentional), 11 strikeouts and a .171 (6-for-35) opponent average.
- ♦ Right-handers are hitting .114 (5-for-44) since April 3.

- ♦ Arizona is 4-2 against the Giants this season, including 2-1 @ AT&T Park (April 9-11).
- ♦ D-backs pitching staff has posted a 2.15 ERA (13 ER in 54.1 IP) with 61 strikeouts, 18 walks and .182 opponents average vs. Giants this season... Arizona's starters have gone 3-0 with a 2.08 ERA (9 ER in 39.0 IP) and .170 opponent average.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is a career .316 (71-for-225)/.412 OBP/.564 SLG hitter with 17 doubles, 11 home runs and 46 RBI in 62 games @ AT&T Park... **Jake Lamb** hits .315 (28-for-89)/.430 OBP/.562 SLG with 7 doubles, 3 homers and 10 RBI @ Giants.

KOCH AT A GLANCE

- ◆ Koch is in his third full season in the D-backs' organization after being acquired from the Mets on Aug. 29, 2015 with RHP Miller Diaz for RHP Addison Reed.
- ◆ Entered 2017 rated by *Baseball America* as possessing the Best Control in the D-backs' system...also rated by MLB.com as Arizona's No. 17 prospect.
- ◆ Selected by the Mets in the third round of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft from the University of Louisville.

WHAT TO KNOW

- ◆ Making his first career start vs. Marlins.
- ◆ Is looking to win consecutive starts for the first time in his career.

LAST START

- ◆ Earned his third win of the season on May 28, allowing 5 run on 11 hits in 5.0 innings.
- ◆ First D-back to earn the win with 10+ hits allowed and no strikeouts...was the first NL pitcher to do so since Gerrit Cole/PIT on May 20, 2016 vs. Rockies.

VS. MARLINS

- ◆ Making his first career appearance vs. Marlins.

VS. NL EAST

- ◆ Is 1-1 with a 3.32 ERA in 3 career starts vs. NL East opponents (7 ER in 19.0 IP).
- ◆ Has allowed 3 runs or fewer in each start, limiting the opposition to a .206 average.

DAY DATA

- ◆ Is 4-1 in 7 career appearances (5 starts) in day games.

ALL ABOUT THAT (RUNNERS ON) BASE

- ◆ Ranks 15th in the NL with a .192 opponent average with runners on base.

LOVIN' LEFTIES

- ◆ Left-handers are hitting .188 (18-for-96) in 2018, the second-best opponent average and third-best opponent OBP in the NL [min. 100 BF], and .179 (22-for-123) in his career.

DUDE THROWS STRIKES

- ◆ Has posted a 64.3 strike percentage (980 pitches/630 strikes) and issued just 18 walks in 66.0 IP in his career.
- ◆ Averages just 3.67 pitches per plate appearance, lowest among D-backs starters and ninth lowest in the NL.

PLAYER PROFILE

- ◆ Last name pronounced: "COOK"
- ◆ Attended the University of Louisville...named to the 2010 All-NCAA Regional Team.
- ◆ Pitched for Chatham in the Cape Cod League and was named to the 2011 All-Star Team.
- ◆ Is a 2009 graduate of Washington (Iowa) High School in Cherokee, Iowa...was a 2-time All-State selection in baseball and track...holds the school record in the high jump...also played basketball and football.
- ◆ Was the student council president, class president and member of the National Honor Society in high school.
- ◆ Selected by Boston in the 37th round of the 2009 First-Year Player Draft but did not sign.

FIRST TIME THROUGH THE LINEUP

- ◆ In 17 career games, has limited the opposition to a .191 AVG (21-for-121)/.258 OBP/.391 SLG the first time through the order.
- ◆ This season, has limited the opponents to a .208 AVG (15-for-78)/.260 OBP/.431 SLG the first time through the order.

CY WHAT?!

- ◆ Matched up against 3 different former Cy Young Award winning pitcher in 3 straight outings from May 1-11 (Clayton Kershaw on May 1; Justin Verlander on May 6; Max Scherzer on May 11), the first pitcher in team history to go through such a stretch...Scherzer (2009) and Brandon Webb (2008) each also had stretches of facing 3 straight Cy Young Award winners, but with repeats included [source: STATS LLC].
- ◆ Was the sixth NL pitcher since 2010 to have 3 straight starts against 3 different Cy Young Award winners, joining Luis Perdomo in 2017, Jimmy Nelson in 2014 (4 straight), Travis Wood in 2012, Tim Hudson in 2011 and Tim Stauffer from 2010-11.
