THE TWINS: The Twins completed their 10-game, 11-day roadtrip with a record of 7-3, going 3-1 at Chicago-AL, 2-0 at St. Louis and 2-2 at Los Angeles-AL...tonight they will begin a nine-game, 10-day homestand with a make-up game vs. Seattle tonight, followed by two vs. St. Louis Tuesday and Wednesday, an off-day on Thursday, three vs. Milwaukee next weekend and three vs. Detroit next week May 21-23...the Twins have won seven of their last nine overall.

TWINS SUFFER ANOTHER WALK-OFF DEFEAT: The Twins lost to the Angels yesterday afternoon by a score of 2-1, suffering their major league-leading sixth walk-off defeat...Fernando Romero was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing one run on four hits in 5.0 innings pitched...Zach Duke was issued the loss, allowing a Zack Cozart RBI-single in the bottom of the ninth...the offense recorded seven hits and went 1-for-9 with runners in scoring position...their only run scored came on a Joe Mauer RBI-single in the seventh inning.

TWINS AND M'S: The Twins and Mariners are playing for the third time this season...tonight's game was originally scheduled for April 8 but was postponed due to expected snow and cold temps...these two teams split the first meeting as the Twins won game one 4-2 and lost the second game 11-4...Twins have gone 15-10 in their last 25 games against the Mariners, dating back to July of 2014.

☞ Eddie Rosario is hitting .333 (12-for-36) with three doubles, one triple, five home runs, 10 RBI and a 1.274 OPS in 10 career games vs. the M's...his OPS is his personal high vs. any AL team.

☞ Paul Molitor was the hitting coach for the Mariners in 2004.

☞ Twins hitting coach James Rowson was drafted by Seattle in the ninth round of the 1994 First-Year Player Draft...he played for the AZL Mariners in 1995 and Single-A Everett in 1996.

☞ Twins bullpen coach Eddie Guardado pitched in parts of three seasons for Seattle from 2004-06, going 5-8, 3.25 ERA (124.2 IP, 45 ER) with 59 saves in 127 games.

☞ Logan Morrison played two seasons for the Mariners from 2014-16, hitting .241 (191-for-793) with 35 doubles, 28 home runs and 92 RBI in 245 games.

SEATTLE'S BEST: Joe Mauer has hit safely in eight straight against Seattle and has reached safely in 18 straight against the Mariners, dating back to 2015...he is hitting .323 (101-for-313) with 26 doubles, nine home runs, 47 RBI, 54 runs scored and a .416 on-base percentage in 83 career games against the M's...his .323 average is third-best in baseball among actives, trailing only Jose Altuve (.324) and Salvador Perez (.324)...his .416 on-base percentage is best among actives...his OBP is his personal second-highest vs. any AL team (TB - .455).

SOME LEFT FOR THE LEFTIES: Twins batters are hitting .266 (69-for-259) with 21 doubles, eight home runs, 36 RBI, 27 walks and a .339 on-base percentage against left-handed pitching this season...in their last 10 games, they are hitting .341 (28-for-82) with a .421 on-base percentage.

☞ Max Kepler is hitting .357 (10-for-28) with four doubles, two home runs and a .419 on-base percentage against lefties this season... Joe Mauer is hitting .350 (7-for-20) with a .519 OBP against lefties...their batting averages among left-handed batters rank fourth and seventh in baseball respectively, third and fifth in the AL.

INSIDE THE ROADTRIP: The Twins went 7-3 on their last roadtrip...out-scoring opponents 52-34 and out-hitting them 89-74...Twins batters hit .342 (25-for-73) average with runners in scoring position...Twins pitchers posted a 3.16 ERA (91.0 IP, 32 ER) with 33 walks, 89 strikeouts and a .226 opponent batting average...the bullpen held opponents to a .189 average with 9.0 strikeouts-per-9.0 IP.

ROCKIN' ROBBIE: Since last Monday, Robbie Grossman is hitting .471 (8-for-17) with three doubles, four RBI and a .526 on-base percentage in six games...in his last 15 games, he is hitting .333 (16-for-48) with six doubles, one home run, eight RBI, five walks and a .382 on-base percentage.

STEADY EDDIE: Eddie Rosario is hitting .362 (25-for-69) with seven doubles, seven home runs, 17 RBI over last 16 games, since April 27...among all players in baseball in that span he ranks tied for second in home runs, fourth baseball in slugging percentage (.768), sixth in RBI, ninth in OPS (1.148).

LAST START: Odorizzi recorded his third win of the season in his last start, May 8 at St. Louis...went 5.0 innings and allowed just one run on two hits, while walking two and striking out three...this marked the fourth time this season he has allowed one-or-fewer runs to score...this season against the National League, Odorizzi boasts a 2-0 record and a 2.93 ERA (15.1 IP, 5 ER) in three starts.

AGAINST SEATTLE: This will be Odorizzi's seventh start against the Mariners, going 1-3 with a 4.97 ERA (29.0 IP, 16 ER) over his previous six starts...his most recent start was August 19, 2017 when he suffered the loss after lasting just 3.2 innings and surrendering seven runs on eight hits, walking five and striking out two while allowing two home runs...Odorizzi's lone win came on May 14, 2014, his first start against the Mariners, went 6.0 shut out-innings and allowed just one hit and struck out seven...currently has a three game-losing streak against Seattle, stemming back to May 25, 2015.

ON THE FIRST PITCH: Through his first eight starts this season, Odorizzi has allowed a .500 (9-for-18) average on the first pitch against a batter...on the 0-0 count, four of the seven hits have been home runs and two have been doubles...of pitchers who have faced at least 10 batters he ranks tied-fifth highest in the AL and tied-11th in MLB on an 0-0 count.

- On the contrary, when Odorizzi gets two strikes on a batter he is holding hitters to a .167 (15-for-90) average.

QUALITY NOT QUANTITY: Over his eight starts this season, Odorizzi has averaged just over 5.0 innings/start...of starters with at least eight starts, his 42.1 innings ranks tied for 11th-fewest innings...his 18.2 pitches/inning ranks sixth highest in MLB and fifth highest in the AL...he averages 4.34 pitches/batter faced which is third most in MLB and the AL...though his starts have been on the short side, his 18 earned runs allowed ranks 16th fewest in the American League among pitchers who have started at least eight games.

PROBLEMS WITH THE LONG BALL: Last season Odorizzi gave up 30 homers in 143.1 IP...in his 28 starts he had only five outings where he did not give up at least one home run...his 1.88 HR/9.0 IP ranked fourth highest in the AL and sixth in MLB...of the 30 HR, 15 were solo shots, eight were two-run shot five three-run homers, and two grand-slams...had five multi-homer games, four of which were at home (Tropicana Field)...he was slightly better on the road than at home last season, giving up 11 homers on the road as compared to 19 at home.

- Has surrendered nine home runs this season, tied for ninth most in the AL.

STILL NEED HELP: In Odorizzi's eight starts in 2018, the Twins offense has supplied 19 total runs, good for a run support average of 4.04 runs per game...his run support average is lowest on the team among starters with at-least three starts.

A BRIGHT START: Odorizzi pitched in his first career Opening Day start and first career start for the Twins...he went 6.0 innings and allowed just two hits, while not allowing a run and striking out seven...only five other times in his career has he notched seven or more strikeouts while not allowing a run in 6.0-plus innings, the first since April 8, 2015 vs. Baltimore...he became the eighth different pitcher to start Opening Day for the Twins in the last 12 seasons.

2017 RECAP:

- In his fourth full professional season, Odorizzi started 28 games and tossed 143.1 innings...with a 10-8 record, this marked his third season of a .500 or better record
- His 7.97 K/9.0 IP ranked T-2nd best in his career (other, 2015 and best, 2014 with 9.32).
- On September 23, Odorizzi recorded nine strikeouts, a season high, while allowing just one run on three hits in 6.0 innings
- Odorizzi held right-handed batters to a .228 average and lefties to a .210 average against

FLY AWAY: In 2017 Odorizzi ranked fourth among all major league pitchers in Fly Ball Percentage (min. 140.0 IP) with a rate of 47.3%...he trailed Ariel Miranda of Seattle (52.2%), Marco Estrada of Toronto (50.3%), and Ian Kennedy of Kansas City (47.7%)...since 2014 Odorizzi has ranked in the top-10 in fly ball percentage every season: 2014 (2nd, 48.7%), 2015 (10th, 40.6%), and 2016 (9th, 44.4%).

HARD TO HIT IN 2017: Odorizzi started 12 games in 2017 where he allowed three-or-fewer hits, including a span of five games from September 5-29 where he allowed three-or-fewer hits in each game...this streak ties for the longest of any starter in baseball, last season...since the start of 2016, he has made 19 starts allowing three-or-fewer hits, most in the AL over that span.

- Selected by Milwaukee in the first round (32nd overall) of 2008 First-Year Player Draft, traded to Kansas City in 2010, then in 2012 traded to Tampa Bay where he remained until his trade to Minnesota on February 17, 2018.
- 2017 marked his fourth straight year of at least 28 starts.
- On May 29, 2016 vs. New York-AL, retired his first 16 batters-faced, tied for the 3rd-longest perfect game bid in Rays history.
- Established career-highs in 2016 for starts (33) and innings pitched (187.2).
- In 2016 allowed 2 ER or fewer in 13 of his no-decisions, a mark reached by only one other pitcher since 1913.
- Earned his first major league win in his season debut on April 4, 2014 vs. Texas.
