July 10, 2004: In a pregame ceremony, the Yankees dedicate a plaque to Charles Herbert "Red" Ruffing. A pitcher with the Yankees from 1930-46, Ruffing batted over .300 in eight seasons and still owns the club's most wins by a right-hander (231).

July 10, 2001: Derek Jeter hits his lone career All-Star HR, connecting off Jon Lieber in the AL's 4-1 win at Safeco Field.

July 10, 1999: In a 9-8 walkoff loss at the Mets, Derek Jeter bats cleanup for the only time in his career, going 0-for-4 with 1BB.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

July 11, 2010: Longtime Yankees PA announcer Bob Sheppard passes away at his home in Baldwin, Long Island, at age 99.

July 11, 1939: Yankee Stadium plays host to its first-ever All-Star Game as the 7th Midsummer Classic is held in the Bronx. The American League, led by 10 Yankees All-Stars, emerges with the 3-1 win. Joe DiMaggio goes 1-for-4 with a solo home run.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees will continue their four-game series at Baltimore tonight (1-1 so far)...are 3-2 on their 11-game road trip to finish the "first half"...won 2-of-3 at Toronto over the weekend...will finish the road trip with four games at Cleveland (Thurs.-Sun.)...went 4-2 on their recent six-game homestand, taking 2-of-3 vs. both Boston and Atlanta.

- ▶ At 59-30 (.663), have the Majors' second-best record behind Boston (63-29, .685).
- ▶ Are a season-high-tying 29G over .500 (also end of play on 7/8)...Sunday marked the first time they were 29G over .500 since finishing the 2011 season 32G over .500 (97-65)...reached 29G over .500 after 87 games, the second-earliest they reached the mark in the last 61 seasons (since 1958), going 42-13 to start the 1998 season.
- ▶ Are 2.5G behind Boston for first place in the AL East...have been in second place for eight straight days...the lead has changed hands 12 times since 5/7...the Yankees and Red Sox have held (at least a share of) the two best records in the Majors on 67 of the last 68 days (since the end of play on 5/3)...over that span, the teams have been separated by no more than 2.5G...trailed Boston by a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston was 17-2, the Yankees were 9-9; since then, Boston is 46-27, the Yankees are 50-21).
- ▶ Are 20-3-2 over their last 25 series (since 4/19), winning four straight and seven of their last eight...are 50-21 in their last 71G...are 43-6 (.878) when scoring first...are a Major League-best 38-5 (.884) when their starter tosses at least 6.0 innings.
- ▶ Are 23-16 vs. the AL East and 36-14 vs. all other divisions.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees split their doubleheader in Baltimore on Monday...are 1-4-5 over their last 10 doubleheaders since 2014.

- ▶ **IN GAME 1,** the Yankees fell to the Orioles, 5-4...**LHP CC Sabathia** (5.0IP, 7H, 5ER, 3BB, 4K, 2HR) started and took the loss...struck out Joey Rickard in fourth to record his 1,528th strikeout as a Yankee, surpassing Red Ruffing (1,527) for fourth place on the Yankees' all-time strikeout list...**DH Giancarlo Stanton** (2-for-4, 2R) hit a solo HR in the second inning...**RF Aaron Judge** (1-for-4, 1R) and **SS Didi Gregorius** (1-for-4) both hit RBI singles in the third...**1B Neil Walker** (1-for-3) hit an RBI single in the sixth...**RHP Jonathan Holder** (1.0IP, 1H, 1BB, 1K) and **RHP A.J. Cole** (2.0IP, 2H, 3K) combined for 3.0 scoreless innings of relief.
- ▶ **IN GAME 2,** the Yankees defeated the Orioles, 10-2...**RHP Luis Cessa** tossed 6.0 scoreless innings to earn the win, snapping his 13-start winless streak (8/31/16-6/27/18)...**Yankee batters** recorded a season-high 17H, their most since 9/10/17 at Texas (18H)...also recorded 9XBH (7 doubles, 2HR), one shy of their season high (10XBH on 5/21 at Texas)...**CF Brett Gardner** (4-for-6, 3R, 1 double, 1HR, 3RBI) hit a two-run HR in the fourth and tied his season high in hits...**C Austin Romine** (2-for-5, 2R, 1 double, 3RBI) hit a two-run HR in the eighth and tied his season high in RBI...**RHP Giovanny Gallegos** (3.0IP, 2H, 2ER, 2BB, 1HR) recorded his first career save, marking the Yankees' first save of at least 3.0IP since Bryan Mitchell on 6/30/17 at Houston.

EXTRA, EXTRA: In Game 2 of Monday's doubleheader, **Yankees batters** recorded 9XBH (7 doubles, 2HR), one shy of their season high (10XBH on 5/21 at Texas)...their seven doubles were their most in a game since 7/5/16 at Chicago-AL...their 330 extra-base hits this season rank second in the Majors, trailing only Boston (342XBH).

- ▶ Are one of two teams this season (also Boston) that have at least three players with at least 40XBH (Judge-43, Stanton-41, Andújar-40)...marks only the third time in the last 82 seasons (since 1937) the Yankees have had at least three players record at least 40XBH in the team's first 89 games (also Matsui, Rodriguez and Sheffield in 2005; Maris, Mantle and Skowron in 1960) and just the sixth such time since 1908 (also three in 1926, three in 1928, four in 1936).
- ▶ **INF Miguel Andújar** has 42XBH (28 doubles, 2 triples, 12HR) in 83 career games, third-most in Yankees history through 83 games (Joe DiMaggio-58XBH; Bob Meusel-52).

#ASGIANCARLO: OF Giancarlo Stanton is one of five AL All-Star "Final Vote" candidates...fans can vote for him at yankees.com/vote...Stanton is the 10th Yankee to appear on the Final Vote ballot and is looking to join **OF Nick Swisher** (2010) and **OF Hideki Matsui** (2004) as winners...the other nominees: **SS Didi Gregorius** (2017), **OF Brett Gardner** (2015), **RHP David Robertson** (2013), **1B Jason Giambi** (2008), **SS Derek Jeter** and **Matsui** (2005), **Giambi** (2003).

- ▶ Is hitting .318/.390/.595 (55-for-173) with 29R, 13 doubles, 1 triple, 11HR, 25RBI and 18BB in 43 road games...owns the fifth-highest road OPS (.985) in the AL.
- ▶ Has hit .377 (23-for-61) with 11R, 5 doubles, 4HR, 10RBI and 7BB in 15G since 6/24...in 23G since 6/16, has hit .359/.422/.663 (33-for-92) with 14R, 7 doubles, 7HR and 16RBI, raising his season slash line from .240/.316/.469 to .272/.344/.520.

GARDY PARTY: LF Brett Gardner is hitting .409/.435/.818 (9-for-22) with 5R, 1 double, 1 triple, 2HR, 7RBI, 1BB and 1SB on the road trip (5G).

- ▶ Since the beginning of 2017, the Yankees are 21-3 when Gardner homers.
- ▶ Since 5/18, is hitting .312 (29-for-93) with 13R, 7 doubles, 2 triples, 3HR, 11RBI and 9BB in 22 road games.

ALL RISE: RF Aaron Judge is hitting .371/.516/.845 (36-for-97) with 36R, 7 doubles, 13HR, 31RBI and 28BB in 27 games vs. the Orioles since the beginning of 2017...owns a nine-game hitting streak vs. Baltimore (since 9/17/17).

- ▶ Is hitting .321/.439/.660 (17-for-53) with 14R, 6HR, 9RBI and 10BB in 13G since 6/25.
- ▶ Is tied for second in the Majors with 25HR.

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters have hit 19HR in their last nine games (since 7/1)...their Major League-leading 150HR this season are the second-most by a Major League team prior to the All-Star break, trailing the 1999 Seattle Mariners by 1HR (151HR).

- ▶ Are on pace to hit 273HR this season (MLB record is 264HR by Seattle in 1997).
- ▶ **Yankees batters** lead the Majors in SLG (.462), rank second in runs per game (5.17), OPS (.793) and XBH (330) and rank third in runs (460).

PEN PALS: According to FanGraphs, the Yankees bullpen has a Major League best 6.3WAR (next: San Diego-4.4)...their 9.2 WAR in 2017 was the second-highest by a bullpen in Major League history (Los Angeles-NL, 9.6 in 2003).

- ▶ **Yankees relievers** own a 2.69 ERA this season, the third-lowest bullpen ERA in the Majors (Arizona-2.47; Houston-2.66)...since 4/21, have posted a 2.19 ERA, the best in the Majors in that span (next: Arizona-2.57).
- ▶ Lead the Majors in strikeouts (409), opponent BA (.200), opponent SLG (.334) and rank second in opponent OBP (.274) and K/BB ratio (3.62).

SIR DIDI: SS Didi Gregorius has reached base safely in his last 24 games vs. the Orioles (since 10/2/16), hitting .389/.444/.684 (37-for-95) with 22R, 10 doubles, 6HR, 24RBI, 9BB and 4SB in that span...has recorded a hit in 23 of those 24 games.

FAN FAVORITES: The Yankees lead the Majors in average road attendance at 34,310 per gate...no other AL team is averaging more than 31,000 per road gate.

- ▶ Through 46 home games, the Yankees lead the AL in total home attendance (1,967,619) and average attendance per home gate (42,774), trailing only the Dodgers in both categories (2,275,826 total; 46,445 per gate).

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: On Sunday, **LHP Aroldis Chapman** (fifth All-Star nod), **OF Aaron Judge** (second), **RHP Luis Severino** (second) and **INF Gleyber Torres** (first) were named to the AL All-Star team...Judge was elected by the fan vote, while Chapman, Torres and Severino were elected via the Player Ballot...the Yankees have at least four All-Stars for the second straight year (five in 2017).

- Was 0-for-1 in Monday's Game 2 win at Baltimore, pinch running in the eighth and remaining in game at SS...was 1-for-3 with 1R in Monday's Game 1 loss at Baltimore before being removed for PH (Gardner) in the ninth... **on road trip** is 1-for-4 with 2R in 4G/1GS at 2B...was recalled from Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on Friday...is his second stint with the Yankees this season (also 3/29-4/22).
- In 64 games with Scranton/WB, hit .271 (72-for-266) with 34R, 16 doubles, 3 triples, 18RBI and 23BB.
- Made his first career Opening Day roster...at age 23y, 126d, became the youngest player on the Yankees' Opening Day roster and the youngest position player to make a Yankees O.D. roster since Melky Cabrera in 2007 (age 22y, 234d).
- Made his Major League debut with the Yankees in 2017, hitting .155 (9-for-58) in 30G...spent most of the season with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, batting .310/.382/.460 (105-for-339) with 68R, 22 doubles, 4 triples, 7HR, 31RBI and 265B (in 31 chances), appearing at 2B, SS, 3B, LF, CF and RF...won the IL's batting title and was named to the IL Postseason All-Star Team.

- Is one of eight Yankees in the Wild Card Era to start at 1B, 2B and 3B in the same season, joining Luis Sojo (1998, 2000-01), Clay Bellinger (2000), Miguel Cairo (2006-07), Wilson Betemit (2007-08), Cody Ransom (2008-09), David Adams (2013) and Mark Reynolds (2013)—credit: YES Network.
- Was signed by the Yankees to a one-year contract on 3/12/18...was one of five hitters to reach double digits in homers in the NL each season from 2010-17.
- Has played for the Pirates (2009-15), Mets ('16-17), Brewers ('17) and Yankees ('18).

- Leads AL relievers (second in MLB) with a 15.83 K/9.0IP ratio (68K, 38.2IP)...ranks third among relievers (second in AL) with 68K.
- Over his last 18G, has allowed just 3H with 30K (17.2IP, 11BB, 2HP)...his 18-appearance scoreless stretch is tied for the longest of his career (also 18G from 7/8-8/18/15, 20.1IP)...the last longer streak of scoreless appearances by a Yankee was David Robertson's 21-game streak from 6/19-8/9/13 (20.1IP)... his 17.2-inning scoreless inning streak is the second-longest active streak in the Majors (San Francisco's Tony Watson-19.0IP).
- Made his 37th appearance of the season in Saturday's win at Toronto, tossing a perfect eighth (1.0IP, 2K)...in Wednesday's win vs. Atlanta, tossed a scoreless eighth (1.0IP, 1H, 2K)...in 7/2 loss vs. Atlanta, tossed a scoreless 10th (1.0IP, 1H, 1BB, 1K, 1WP)...allowed a leadoff single to Camargo, snapping an 0-for-29 streak against opposing batters (Since Devon Travis' single on 6/6 at Toronto)...also ended stretches of 1-for-45 (since 5/23) and 2-for-63 (since 5/10).

- With 100K in 2017, 126K in 2016, 131K in 2015 and 135K in 2014, is one of five pitchers ever with at least 100K in relief in at least four straight seasons: Dick Radatz (4x, 1962-65 w/ Boston), Duane Ward (4x, 1989-92 w/ Toronto), Aroldis Chapman (4x, 2012-15 w/ Cincinnati) and Rob Dibble (4x, 1989-92 w/ Cincinnati).
- Was selected by the Yankees in the eighth round of the 2006 First-Year Player Draft.

- Ranks second in the AL (third in MLB) with a 15.63 K/9.0IP ratio (66K, 38.0IP)...is fourth among relievers (third in AL) with 66K.
- Was named via the Player Ballot to his fifth career All-Star team (also 2012-15) and first as a member of the AL.
- Made his 39th appearance of the season in Saturday's win at Toronto, striking out only batter faced to start the ninth before being removed with discomf in his left knee...made third appearance in as many days in 7/3 win vs. Atlanta, tossing a perfect ninth inning to record his 24th save of the season (1.0IP, 2K)...in 7/2 loss vs. Atlanta, struck out the side in a perfect ninth (1.0IP, 3K)...threw his fastest pitch of the season at 104.4 mph to Acuña (Statcast).
- Had 11 saves in 12 appearances in June (11.2IP, 4H, 1ER, 4BB, 19K, 1HP, 1HR), tied for third-most saves in a calendar month in Yankees history, trailing only John Wetteland (15 in June 1996) and Sparky Lyle (12 in June 1973).

- Has tossed at least 2.0 innings in six of his nine appearances with the Yankees... has allowed just 1ER in 16.2IP with the club.
- Made ninth appearance with the Yankees in Monday's Game 1 loss at Baltimore, tossing 2.0 scoreless innings (2H, 3K)...on 7/3 vs. Atlanta, tossed 1.2 scoreless innings to earn his second win with the Yankees and third of the season (1H, 4K)...was his first appearance since closing out the game with 2.0 perfect innings (3K) in 6/19 win vs. Seattle.
- Was acquired by the Yankees from Washington in exchange for cash considerations on 4/23...made two starts with the Nationals, going 0-1 with a 12.00 ERA (9.0IP, 12ER)...moved to the bullpen and made two relief appearances, going 1-0 and allowing 3ER in 1.1IP...was designated for assignment on 4/20.
- Was originally selected by Washington in the fourth round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft...was traded to Oakland on 12/23/11, before being reacquired by Washington as part of a three-team trade (also Seattle) on 1/16/13.

- Made his 34th appearance of the season on Sunday at Toronto, tossing a perfect ninth for his fifth win (1.0IP, 1K)...in Wednesday's win vs. Atlanta, tossed a scoreless seventh (1.0IP, 2H)...in 7/2 loss vs. Atlanta, tossed 2.0 perfect innings (1K).
- With Dellin Betances (103K in relief) in 2017, became the second pair of Yankees to each have at least 100K in relief in the same season (also Betances/Miller in 2015).
- Was acquired by the Yankees from Detroit with RHP Luis Cessa in exchange for LHP Justin Wilson on 12/9/15.

- Has a 0.53 ERA (33.2IP, 5R/2ER) since being recalled on 4/21, holding opponents without an earned run in 26 of 28 appearances.
- Made his 31st appearance of the season in Monday's Game 1 loss at Baltimore, allowing 1H in 1.0IP (1BB, 1K)...in Saturday's win at Toronto, allowed 2H and 1ER in 1.0IP...in Wednesday's win vs. Atlanta, closed out the game with a scoreless ninth (1.0IP, 1H)...in 7/2 loss vs. Atlanta, tossed 2.0 scoreless innings (2H, 1K)...in 6/30 loss vs. Boston, allowed 1ER in 1.0IP (2H) to snap his career-long 10.2-inning scoreless streak (from 6/8-27)...marked his first earned run allowed since 4/6 vs. Baltimore (a span of 23 appearances).
- Did not allow an earned run over 23 relief appearances from 4/21-6/27, the AL's longest such streak this season, and tied for second-longest in the Majors (Arizona's Yoshihisa Hirano-26, Milwaukee's Jeremy Jeffress-23)...was the second-longest streak by a Yankee since 2012 (Betances, 27G from 9/23/14-6/2/15)...retired 83-of-97 batters over the span (27.2IP, 10H, 3R/0ER, 3BB/1BB, 26K).
- Is in his second stint with the Yankees this season (3/29-4/6, 4/21-present).
