## MIAMI MARLINS (46-63) vs PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (59-48)

Thursday, August 2, 2018 – 7:05 EDT – Citizens Bank Park – Game 108 – Home 53

RHP Pablo Lopez (2-2, 5.34) vs RHP Nick Pivetta (6-9, 4.85)

- TUESDAY NIGHT'S ACTION:** The Phillies defeated the Boston Red Sox, 3-1, in a gut-check game at Fenway Park ... Starter Jake Arrieta (W, 9-6) put the Phils on his back and held Boston to just 1 run over 7.0 innings of work as he allowed 6 hits with 0 walks and 7 strikeouts ... Maikel Franco walekd twice, scoring both times and Carlos Santana provided an insurance run in the top of the 9<sup>th</sup> inning on an RBI single ... The Phils needed this one and split the series in front of 37,816.
- TRANSACTIONS:** Prior to tonight's game, LHP Adam Morgan was returned from the paternity list ... In addition, RHP Yacksel Rios was optioned to Lehigh Valley (AAA) and LHP Aaron Loup reported following his trade from TOR and will be available for tonight's game.
- CITIZENS BANK SPARK:** The Phillies have won eight of their last 10 games at home, 10 of their last 13 and are 34-18 (.654) at CBP this season ... They have the best home winning percentage and run differential (+40) in the NL and their winning percentage at home is third-best in baseball, trailing only the Red Sox (.717) and Yankees (.704).
- REMEMBER THE FIGHTINS:** Since starting the season 1-4, the Phillies are 14 games over .500 at 58-44 and are tied with the Dodgers for the 2<sup>nd</sup>-best winning percentage in the NL in that span (.569), trailing only the Cubs (.588) ... At 59-48 with a .551 winning percentage this season, the Phils currently sport a half-game game lead over the Atlanta Braves (57-47, .548) in National League East ... The Phillies have not made it to the postseason since 2011, the end of their five-year run of National League East championships.
- PROGRESS IN THE PROCESS:** Thus far, through 107 games, The Phils are 11 games above .500 at 59-48 and have scored 468 runs and allowed 445 (+23) ... Last season, through 107 games, they were 29 games under .500 at 39-68 and had scored 429 and allowed 516 (-87) ... The Phillies didn't notch their 59<sup>th</sup> win last season until September 18 ... This season, in nine games (8.4 % of their games played thus far) in which they have allowed 10 or more runs, the Phillies have been outscored 111-30 (-81) ... **However, in their 98 other games this year (91.6% of their season), Philadelphia has a +104 run differential, outscoring the opposition 438-334.**
- BELIEVE IT:** On May 29 at Dodger Stadium, facing LA closer Kenley Jansen, **Rhys Hoskins** fouled a ball off his face resulting in a fractured jaw ... Hoskins returned on June 9 and in 212 plate appearances since being activated off the DL, he is slashing .291/.382/.610 with 33 runs, 13 2B, 15 HR, 42 RBI and 26 walks ... **The only other player in the majors with as many walks and home runs as Hoskins since June 9, when he came off the DL, is STL's Matt Carpenter (19 HR, 33 BB).**
- EXTRA, EXTRA:** The Phillies have collected at least one extra-base hit in 103 consecutive games (since 4/4); it is the second-longest extra-base hit streak in franchise history (see chart to the right), shy of only a 129-game streak from 1929-30 ... It is the longest extra-base hit streak in the majors this season (next: DET, 67 G, 4/10-6/22).
- SERIESLY:** Over their last 15 series (6/12-current), the Phillies are 10-3-2 ... Philadelphia's three series losses in that span have come against the Yankees at Citizens Bank Park (1-2, 6/25-27), the Marlins in Miami (1-2, 7/13-15) and the Reds this past weekend in Cincinnati (1-3) ... Philadelphia's 10 series wins in that span have come against the Rockies, Brewers, Cardinals, Nationals (2x), Orioles (2x), Pirates, Padres and Dodgers.
- IT'S HITTING SEASON:** The Phillies have slugged 58 home runs in their last 42 games (6/14-current) which is third amongst all NL teams behind only the Dodgers (61) and Rockies (59) and ranks 5<sup>th</sup> in the majors.
- ALUMNI WEEKEND INFO:** The Phillies will honor the 2008 World Series Champions as part of Toyota Phillies Alumni Weekend, August 3-5 ... Festivities take place during the Phillies-Marlins series and feature 2008 World Champion photo opportunities, special first pitches and pregame tributes throughout the weekend ... Highlights include the retirement of Shane Victorino (Aug. 3), the induction ceremony of Roy Halladay and Pat Gillick into the Toyota Phillies Wall of Fame (Aug. 4), 2008 Phillies World Series Champions Luncheon (Aug. 4), a celebration of the 10th Anniversary of the 2008 World Champion Phillies (Aug. 5) and a 2008 World Champions' Home Run Derby at The Yard (Aug 4-5).
- FLAGS FLY FOREVER:** This weekend, the 2008 World Championship team will be celebrated as the Phillies honor the 10-year anniversary of that special team ... The following members of that team are scheduled to return: Mick Billmeyer, Coach (2004-13), RHP Joe Blanton (2008-12), INF Eric Bruntlett (2008-09), OF Pat Burrell (2000-08), RHP Clay Condrey (2006-09), Coach Roly deAramas (2008), INF Greg Dobbs (2007-10), Coach Rich Dubee (2005-13), RHP Chad Durbin (2008-10), LHP Scott Eyre (2008-09), INF Pedro Feliz (2008-09), GM Pat Gillick (2006-08), 1B Ryan Howard (2004-16), OF Geoff Jenkins (2008), RHP Kyle Kendrick (2007-14), RHP Brad Lidge (2008-11), Manager Charlie Manuel (2005-13), LHP Jamie Moyer (2006-10), RHP Brett Myers (2002-09), SS Jimmy Rollins (2000-14), LHP J.C. **LAST START:** 7/27 at CIN: L, 6.0 IP, 6 H, 5 R, 5 ER, 2 BB, 12 SO, 2 HR ... Pivetta vs DeSclafani ... The Phillies were led on offense by the top three spots in their order as Cesar Hernandez, Rhys Hoskins and Odubel Herrera combined to go 5-for-13 with 2 R, 4 RBI and 8 total bases.

**TONIGHT'S START:**

- **Striking:** Recorded his 5<sup>th</sup> career double-digit strikeout game in his last start, the last 2 of which have been 12 and 13 strikeouts, respectively, on 7/27 at CIN and 6/18 at STL ... **Ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> among NL starters in SO/9.0 IP (11.20) behind only Max Scherzer (12.11), is 4<sup>th</sup> in SO rate (29.0 %) and is 7<sup>th</sup> in the NL in strikeouts overall (134)** ... He has recorded at least 30 strikeouts in each month of the season so far ... Became 1 of 3 Phillies starters since 1998 to reach 100 strikeouts before 85.0 IP in a season ... His teammate Vince Velasquez also did so this season, and Curt Schilling did so in 1998
- **Right On:** Has held righties to a .229 batting average this season, limiting them to a .198 AVG (17-86) in his last 8 appearances (7 starts) ... Has struck out 78 RHH as opposed to 56 LHH ... RHH are slugging almost 100 points lower than LHH (.279 vs .373)
- **Tough 6:** Has a 7.24 ERA (22 ER, 27.1 IP) in his last 6 starts (since 6/24) after posting a 3.57 ERA (18 ER, 45.1 IP) in his previous 8 starts, 5/9-6/18
- **Curve:** Per MLBAM Statcast Data, has thrown his curveball 22.2 % of the time, 12<sup>th</sup>-most among the 60 pitchers to throw at least 1,750 total pitches this season ... **His 47 SO on the pitch are 8<sup>th</sup>-most**
- **vs NL East:** 9-6, 5.68 ERA (64 ER, 101.1 IP) in 22 games (21 starts)

**HOME:**

- **2018:** 4-5, 4.26 ERA (29 ER, 61.1 IP) in 12 games (11 starts)
- **Career:** 8-8, 4.81 ERA (67 ER, 125.1 IP) in 24 games (23 starts)

**2018 SEASON:**

- Made his first ML relief appearance, 7/1 vs WSH (W, 1.0 IP)
- Struck out a career-high 13 batters on 6/18 vs STL
- Had a streak of 16 straight starts allowing 6 or fewer hits, 9/18/17-6/7/18, becoming 1 of 4 Phillies since 1908 to do so
- Allowed just 1 run in 19.0 IP (0.47 ERA) over 3 starts, 5/16-27, including a 14.0-inning scoreless streak
- Became 3<sup>rd</sup> PHI pitcher since 2010 with 7.0 + IP, 2 or fewer hits and 11+ strikeouts in a game on 5/16 at BAL (others: Halladay's perfect game, 5/29/10 at FLA and Hamels' no-hitter, 7/25/15 at CHI)
- Matched up against the Braves and RHP Mike Foltynewicz 4 times in PHI's first 46 games, first time two ML starters have squared off 4 times in first 46 team games since 1959 (PHI's Robin Roberts & MIL's Lew Burdette) - Elias
- Had a career-best 4-game win streak come to an end on 4/28 vs ATL ... It was also the end of a string of 9 team wins in 9 straight Pivetta starts since 9/12/17, the longest such streak since PHI won 9 straight Cole Hamels starts in 2012
- His string of 8 straight starts allowing 5 hits or fewer from 9/18/17-4/22/18 was the longest by a Phillies starter since 1994 (David West, 10)
- Did not allow a home run in 41.2 consecutive IP over parts of 8 starts, 9/18/17 vs LAD to 4/22/18 vs PIT
- Struck out 9 batters and did not walk any on 4/11 vs CIN, becoming the first Phillies starter to do so since Vince Velasquez, 4/14/16 vs SD
- Had a career-best 18.0-inning scoreless streak (since 9/18/17) come to an end in the 3rd inning of his season debut, 3/31 at ATL

**2017 SEASON:**

- Among ML rookies, was 1st in SO/9.0 IP (9.47, min. 125.0 IP), 3rd in SO (140), 4th in starts (26) and 7th in innings (133.0)
- Was tied for the 9th-most SO in a season ever by a Phillies rookie and had the highest SO/9.0 IP and SO rate (24.0%) of any Phillies rookie ever to make at least 25 starts
- Had the most starts (26) in a single season by a Phillies rookie since 1990, when Pat Combs started 31
- Among all NL pitchers (min. 125.0 IP), ranked 4<sup>th</sup> in lowest % of pitches put in play (15.7), trailing ARI's Robbie Ray (13.7), WSH's Max Scherzer (14.3) and LAD's Rich Hill (14.7)

**CAREER:**

- Acquired by Philadelphia from WSH for RHP Jonathan Papelbon and cash, 7/28/15 ... Originally selected by WSH in the 4th round of the June 2013 draft ... Attended New Mexico Junior College
- Pitched for Canada in 2017 World Baseball Classic ... Was a member of the Canadian Junior National Team from 2009-12 ... Was the first Canadian-born starting pitcher to debut for the Phillies since 6/17/06 (Scott Mathieson vs TB)
