**RAY MATTER**—The Rays have lost three consecutive games on the heels of a 5-game winning streak...they haven't held a lead in any of these three games, playing 31 innings over that span...this losing streak has brought the Rays from a season-high 2 games over .500 to 28-29...the Rays have played 57 games this season and have been .500 or below at the conclusion of 53 of those games, and over .500 after only 4 games.

- + With last night's loss, the Rays dropped to 10-9 in series play this season, including 6-5 in road series...they fell to 9-5 in their last 14 series, compared to 1-4 in their first five series of the season.
- + The Rays are 6-4 over their last 10 games, 12-7 (.632) over their last 19 games (since May 14, tied for 3rd-best in the AL) and 24-16 (.600) over their last 40 games (since April 18, 5th-best in the AL).
- + The Rays have gone 8-5 against AL West opponents this season.

**THROUGH THE WRINGER**—This series began a stretch of 25 out of 28 games from June 1–July 1 against teams currently positioned to make the postseason, the only exception a 3-game series from June 11-13 vs. TOR... this includes 7 games apiece against the Mariners and Astros, who are tied for the AL West and/or second AL Wild Card, 7 games against the Yankees (0.5 GB in the AL East and lead the AL Wild Card) and 4 games against the Nationals (0.5 GB in the NL East and tied with the Cubs for the two NL Wild Card spots)...the Rays are 10-20 (.333) against teams currently .500 or better and 18-9 (.667) against teams currently below .500.

- + Today's game concludes a stretch of games on 13 straight days...the Rays are in the middle of a stretch of 40 games in 41 days from May 11–June 20 and they have gone 13-10 thus far.

**NO BROOMS ALLOWED**—Today the Rays are attempting to avoid being swept for the fifth time this season and for the third time in a series of 3 games or more...three times they were swept within the first 2½ weeks of the season: April 3-4 at NYY (0-2), April 5-8 at BOS (0-3) and April 13-15 vs. PHI (0-3), while most recently they were swept from May 8-9 vs. ATL (0-2)...the Rays have been swept by the Mariners six times in club history, including three times in the last three seasons (2015 at home, 2016-17 at Safeco Field)...while the Rays have been on the wrong end of a sweep four times this year, they have also swept three series...five other times the Rays have had a chance to sweep and lost the series finale.

**RAYS vs. MARINERS**—The Rays are 74-95 (.438) all-time against the Mariners (36-44 at home, 38-51 on the road)...the Rays haven't won at Safeco Field since June 7, 2015, the series finale between the two clubs that season...since May 9, 2016, the Rays have gone 0-8 at Safeco Field, the longest losing streak in club history here...in those 8 games, they have been outscored 52-22 (17-11 in 2016, 28-7 in 2017, 7-4 in 2018)...a loss today would give the Rays their first 9-game losing streak at any opposing ballpark since Sep 11, 2007–Sep 8, 2008, when they were 0-9 at Fenway Park.

- + Overall, the Rays are 1-8 in their last 9 games against the Mariners... they have lost the last four season series, going 9-19 (.321) since the start of 2014...they play a 4-game series next weekend at home.
- + Six players on the Rays active roster were once in the Mariners organization: INF **Brad Miller**, LH **Vidal Nuño**, RH **Chaz Roe**, OF **Mallex Smith**, C **Jesus Sucre** and LH **Ryan Yarbrough**...Smith and Yarbrough were acquired in the same trade for LH **Drew Smyly**.
- + Since the start of the 2015 offseason, the Rays and Mariners have made nine trades, including a four-player deal last Friday.

**FROM THE OTHER SIDE**—Today the Rays are facing **Félix Hernández**, who is 8-2 with a 1.94 ERA (120.2-IP, 26-ER) in 16 career starts against them...min. 100 IP, his 1.94 ERA against the Rays is 2nd all-time, behind NYY **Mariano Rivera** (1.69), and first among starting pitchers...the Rays have never beaten King Félix at Safeco Field—the Mariners are 11-0 in his starts against the Rays here, and he is 7-0 with a 1.67 ERA (81-IP, 15-ER)... on Aug 15, 2012, Félix pitched the third perfect game against the Rays, following OAK **Dallas Braden** in 2010 and CWS **Mark Buehrle** in 2009.

**ROAD RAYGE**—The Rays have lost three consecutive road games for the first time since May 1-12 at DET/BAL (0-4) and for the first time within the same road trip since April 3-8 at NYY/BOS (0-5)...this road losing streak follows a 9-1 stretch on the road spanning two trips from May 14-30.

- + The Rays have played a major-league-most 33 games on the road, ahead of the Rockies (32) and Giants (32)...by the conclusion of this trip, they will have played 36 road games and 24 home games...the

Rays are 17-16 on the road, including 17-11 since April 9, compared to 11-13 at home...the Rays and Angels are the only two AL teams with a winning record on the road and losing record at home.

- + This is the last of four straight 3-city road trips—the first time in club history the Rays have made four consecutive three-city trips... this is the Rays second consecutive West Coast trip, the first time they have visited the West Coast on back-to-back trips since July–August 2012, when they went 9-4 in those West Coast games.

**UP NEXT: NATIONALS**—The Rays are 13-12 all-time against the franchise (8-5 vs. Nationals, 5-7 vs. Expos)...the Rays are 4-4 all-time in the nation's capital: 3-2 at Nationals Park and 1-2 at RFK Stadium...this series will be the first meetings between the clubs since June 15-18, 2015, when the Rays went 1-1 at home and 2-0 on the road...the two teams will meet four times this season, as the Nationals visit St. Pete from June 25-26.

- + This is the first time in club history the Rays are visiting Washington state and Washington, D.C. on the same road trip...they are the first team to do that since the Angels last Aug 10-16.
- + **Wilson Ramos** is the only current Ray to have previously played for the Nationals...he will be facing the Nationals for the first time since signing with the Rays as a free agent on Dec 12, 2016.
- + **Chris Archer** made his major league debut at Nationals Park on June 20, 2012, a 3-2 loss against **Stephen Strasburg**.

**INTERLEAGUE INTRIGUE**—Tuesday is the Rays sixth of 20 interleague games this season...they are 0-5 so far, all at home, their longest losing streak in interleague play since April 13–June 10, 2014 (6)...this is the third time in franchise history the Rays have started the season winless through at least 5 games in interleague play, following 1999 (0-7) and 2005 (0-8)...the Rays went 11-9 in interleague play last season and have only one losing interleague record in 10 seasons of the "Rays" era (7-11 in 2010)...they are 110-85 (.564) since 2008—5th-best in the majors—and 184-189 all-time...the NL is 47-34 (.580) in interleague play this season, but the AL has won each of the last 14 season series.

**COMMON BOND**—Five former Rays players have gone on to manage major league teams and three of those were hired this past offseason... among them are Rays Manager **Kevin Cash** (played for Rays in 2005) and Nationals skipper **Dave Martinez** (1998-2000), who was on the Rays coaching staff from 2007-14...the others are former White Sox/Marlins Manager **Ozzie Guillén** (2000), Mets skipper **Mickey Callaway** (1999, 2001) and Phillies Manager **Gabe Kapler** (2009-10).

**BUFFALO ON THE LOOSE**—**Wilson Ramos** leads major league catchers with 53 hits...he has been the cleanup hitter for his last 19 games played, and a total of 24 games this season...he has hit cleanup as the starting catcher in 20 games...prior to this season, the Rays had started a catcher at cleanup only 16 times in franchise history.

**ON THE CLOCK**—Major League Baseball's 2018 First-Year Player Draft begins tomorrow at 7 p.m. ET with Round 1, Competitive Balance Round A, Round 2 and Competitive Balance Round B, while Rounds 3-10 are Tuesday and Rounds 11-40 are Wednesday...78 selections will be made on the first day, and the Rays hold five of them (Nos. 16, 31, 32, 56, 71), tied with the Royals for most in the majors...No. 31 is a compensation pick for **Alex Cobb**, who left as a free agent, and No. 32 for unsigned 2017 selection **Drew Rasmussen**...the Rays hold six of the first 92 picks overall.

- + The Rays will be represented at MLB Network's Studio 42 by administrator, baseball operations **Sandy Dengler** and area supervisor **Lou Wieben**...Dengler, who joined the Rays in December 1997 and is in her 41st season in professional baseball, will be the first-ever female club representative at the draft.

**THIS DATE IN RAYS HISTORY**—On June 3, 2003, Cubs slugger **Sammy Sosa** is ejected in the 1st inning at Wrigley Field when cork is discovered in his shattered bat after he grounds out against **Geremi González**...the Rays lose the game, 3-2, when the Cubs score the winning run on a wild pitch by **Al Levine** in the 9th inning.

**LAST START**—On Tues at OAK, yielded 2 hits, both off the bat of **Jed Lowrie**, including an RBI double in the 3rd inning, his only run allowed (unearned)...was his second consecutive start without allowing an *earned* run, third time in his career doing that in back-to-back starts...threw 43 pitches in his first 2 IP, compared to 54 pitches in 3.2 IP after that...his line: W, 5.2 IP, 2 H, 1 R/O ER, 2 BB, 7 SO, 97 pit, 62 str.

**LOCAL PRODUCT**—Will be making his first career start at Safeco Field...is 1-1 with a 0.87 ERA (10.1-IP, 5-R/1-ER) in 2 career starts against the Mariners, both at Tropicana Field...was born in Seattle and raised in the area, graduating from Shorewood High School...he has volunteered to help coach the basketball team at his alma mater during each of the last two winters...Blake uses his experiences in baseball to help players with issues related to self-confidence...his father, **Dave Snell**, is in his fourth year as head baseball coach at Shoreline (Wash.) Community College...Dave pitched six minor league seasons with the Royals and Mariners systems from 1983-88.

+ Blake has a chocolate lab named **Junior**...he told media yesterday that he grew up watching almost every Mariners game with his father, and attended games at the Kingdome and Safeco Field...he is still a big fan of the University of Washington Huskies and Seattle Seahawks...he attended a handful of games over the offseason and never misses the rest on television.

**WHEN HE'S ON**—Has yielded 2 runs or fewer in 10 starts this season, tied with NYM **Jacob deGrom**, PHI **Aaron Nola** and WAS **Max Scherzer** for 2nd in the majors behind HOU **Justin Verlander** (12)...was the first Ray to ever do that 10 times within the team's first 53 games...has allowed 1 run or fewer in 7 starts this season, tied with Nola for 4th in the majors behind deGrom (9), Verlander (9) and ATL **Mike Foltynewicz** (8)...three times this season he has allowed 2 runs or fewer and not gotten the win, and twice this season he has allowed 1 run or fewer without the win.

+ Has an active streak of 13.2 IP without allowing an *earned* run...never in his career has he made three consecutive starts without allowing an earned run, and no Ray has done this since **Jake Odorizzi** from July 22-Aug 3, 2016.

**THE WIN COLUMN**—Has won three consecutive starts, one shy of matching the longest winning streak of his career...his 7 wins are tied for 3rd in the AL, one shy of CLE **Corey Kluber** (8) and NYY **Luis Severino** (8), and his 4 wins on the road are tied for 3rd in the AL behind HOU **Justin Verlander** (5) and NYY **Masahiro Tanaka** (5)...his 7 wins in 12 starts are already a career high, as he recorded 5 wins in 24 starts last season and 6 wins in 19 starts in 2016...a win today would make him the fourth Ray with 8 wins through the first 58 games of the season, following **Matt Moore** (2013), **David Price** (2012, 2010) and **Rolando Arrojo** (1998).

**WHERE HE LEFT OFF**—In 22 starts since his Aug 8 recall last season, he is 12-4 with a 2.69 ERA (127.1-IP, 38-ER) and .191 opp avg. (87-for-455)...min. 100 IP, his ERA over this span ranks 6th in the AL...has yielded 2 runs or fewer in 17 of these 22 starts, 1 run or fewer in 13 starts and hasn't allowed an *earned* run in 7 starts...is 6-1 with a 1.46 ERA (67.2-IP, 11-ER) in 11 starts at home over this span and 6-3 with a 4.07 ERA (59.2-IP, 27-ER) in 11 starts on the road.

**LEADERBOARDS**—Ranks among AL leaders in starts (12, tied for 4th), wins (7, tied for 3rd), ERA (2.56, 6th), hits per 9 IP (6.01, 3rd), opp avg. (.187, 3rd), WHIP (1.00, 9th), and pct. of swings that miss (30.1, 3rd)...is averaging a career-high 95.3 mph on his fastball, 10th in the majors and 2nd among major league left-handed starters behind SEA **James Paxton** (95.5)...12.8 pct. of his total pitches are swings and misses, 3rd among AL lefties.

**HOME vs. ROAD**—Is 4-2 with a 3.92 ERA (39-IP, 17-ER) on the road this season and 7-10 with a 4.37 ERA (142-IP, 69-ER) in 29 starts on the road in his career...in comparison, his 0.86 ERA (31.1-IP, 3-ER) at home leads the AL and ranks 2nd in the majors behind PHI **Jake Arrieta** (0.84)...has allowed 1 run or fewer in eight consecutive starts at home since last Sep 12, longest such streak in franchise history, passing **Scott Kazmir** (6) from Sep 27, 2007-June 17, 2008...has only allowed 3 runs in his last 49.1 IP at Tropicana Field dating back to the end of last season.

**NO BRUISES INFLICTED**—Has never hit a batter in 55 career starts, the longest streak by any starter to begin his career (no relief apps over that stretch) since Baseball Reference data is available (1908)...it is the longest streak by a Rays starter at any point in franchise history, passing **James Shields** (38) in 2009-10...it is also the longest active streak in the majors, ahead of LAD **Clayton Kershaw** (44).

## TUESDAY'S STARTER: RH NATHAN EOVALDI (1-0, 0.00 ERA)

**LAST START**—On Wed at OAK, his only baserunner allowed in 6 IP was a 1st-inning, 1-out walk, and after that he retired his next 17 BF...appeared in his first major league game since Aug 10, 2016 at BOS (with NYY), going 657 days in between...did not allow a hit in 6 IP, matching the longest no-hit bid of his career (April 25, 2016 at TEX)...only one other time has a Rays pitcher finished an outing having gone at least 6 IP without allowing a hit: **Matt Garza's** no-hitter on July 26, 2010 vs. DET (9 IP)...it was the

sixth time in the majors this season that a pitcher was removed with a no-hitter in tact through at least 6 IP (last NYY **Domingo German** on May 6 vs. CLE)...his line: W, 6 IP, 0 H, 0 R, 1 BB, 4 SO, 70 pit, 46 str.

vs. **WASHINGTON**—Is 2-4 with a 5.12 ERA (51-IP, 29-ER) in 9 career starts against the Nationals, and last faced them on June 10, 2015 at home (with NYY; ND, 7-IP, 3-ER)...is 1-2 with a 4.18 ERA in 4 starts at Nationals Park.

## #16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

+ Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.  
 + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.  
 + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

+ Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.  
 + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
