RAY MATTER—Last night's 4-1 win over the Blue Jays was the first time the Rays never trailed in a game since their 6-0 win on May 30 at OAK... the Rays have won consecutive games for the first time since May 28-30 at OAK (3), and three of their last 4 games on the heels of an 8-game losing streak...they are 3-9 in their last 12 games but 15-13 in their last 28 games since May 14 and 27-22 in their last 49 games after a 4-13 start.

- + The Rays are in 3rd place in the AL East, 1.5 games up on the 4th-place Blue Jays...they have been tied or alone in 3rd place in the division for 25 of the last 26 days since May 18 after spending the previous 49 days from March 31–May 17 in 4th or 5th place.
- + This 3-9 stretch has seen the Rays go from a season-high 2 games over .500 (28-26) to 4 games under .500 (31-35)...during this 12-game span, the Rays have pitched to a 4.16 ERA (106-IP, 49-ER) but have hit .233 overall (93-for-400) and .222 with RISP (18-for-81).
- + The Rays are 20-9 (.690) against teams currently below .500 and 11-26 (.297) against teams .500 or better.

SEEKING SWEEP—With last night's win, the Rays improved to 10-7 in their last 17 series, compared to 1-4 in their first five...today they are attempting to finish their fourth sweep of the season, having swept series from April 20-22 vs. MIN (3-0), April 25-26 at BAL (2-0) and May 14-16 at KC (3-0)...their three sweeps already match their total from last year.

- + Five other times previously the Rays have had a chance to sweep and failed to do so: April 11 at CWS, April 29 at BOS, May 6 vs. TOR, May 20 at LAA and May 31 at OAK.

RAYS vs. BLUE JAYS—Today the Rays have a chance to sweep the Blue Jays for the first time since May 16-18, 2016 at TOR...they are attempting to sweep them at Tropicana Field for the first time since April 24-26, 2015...the Rays are 4-1 against the Blue Jays this season, all at home...they are 10-4 in their last 14 home games against them, dating back to April 7, 2017...the two clubs will meet 19 times this season (nine at Tropicana Field, 10 at Rogers Centre), but this is the last meeting before the All-Star break...they will play 13 times in the second half, including 10 times in September...the Rays went 9-10 last season, just their second losing season against the Blue Jays in the "Rays" era (8-11 in 2014)...they are 189-168 (.529) all-time against Toronto, their most wins against any opponent.

JUNE SWOON—The Rays are 3-8 (.273) since the start of June, 3rd-lowest winning pct. in the AL to the Royals (2-9) and Orioles (2-8)...they are batting .234/.285/.362 (86-for-367) this month and rank 8th, 12th and 11th in the AL in avg., OBP and SLG, respectively, while their 3.86 ERA (98-IP, 42-ER) ranks 9th...through the end of May, the Rays ranked 2nd in the AL in avg. (.261), 2nd in OBP (.333), 11th in SLG (.403) and 7th in ERA (3.97).

CLOSE SHAVES—The Rays are 9-17 (.346) in 1-run games this season—most losses in the majors and 2nd-most 1-run games in the majors to the Mariners (30)...the Rays have lost their last 5 games decided by 1 run, dating back to the start of June, and are 4-9 in their last 13 one-run games... the Rays are on pace for 42 one-run losses, which hasn't been reached since the 1971 Astros (43)...the club record for a single season is 30 (2015).

- + 39.4 pct. of the Rays games this season have been decided by 1 run, compared to 27.4 pct. of games in the majors (544 of 1,986).
- + The Rays have lost by 2 runs or more in 27.3 pct. of their games this season, while 72.7 pct. of games have been wins or 1-run losses.
- + Since 2016, the Rays are 43-68 (.387) in 1-run games, 2nd-worst winning pct. in the majors over that span to the Twins (.355).

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH—The Rays active roster currently includes nine rookies: five hitters and four pitchers...15 rookies have already appeared in a game for the Rays, most in the majors ahead of the Marlins (14) and Padres (14), and the closest AL team is the Angels (11)...the club record for rookies used in an entire season is 18 (2015)...only twice before have the Rays used even 12 rookies prior to the All-Star break: 2015 (16) and 1998 (12)...the average age of the Rays active roster is 27 years, 10 months.

- + Yesterday's starting lineup included 22-year-old **Willy Adames**, 22-year-old **Jake Bauers** and 23-year-old **Christian Arroyo**, the first time the Rays started three hitters age 23 or younger since July 9, 2008 at NYY, when the starting lineup included **Evan Longoria**, **Reid Brignac** and **Melvin Upton Jr.**

REDEFINING RELIEF—So far this season, Rays relievers have totaled:

- + **21 apps of at least 50 pitches**, most in the majors, ahead of BAL/DET/MIA (8 each), and their most for any season since 2005 (23)
- + **11 apps of at least 70 pitches**, most in the majors, ahead of the Marlins (5), and their most for any season in club history (2004, 7)
- + **41 apps of at least 2 IP**, 2nd-most in the majors (Padres, 45)
- + **22 apps of at least 3 IP**, most in the majors (Padres, 12)
- + **17 apps of at least 4 IP**, most in the majors (Marlins, 4)
- + Rays relievers lead the majors with 292.2 IP, 29.2 IP more than any other team (Padres, 263 IP) while Rays starters have covered 297.2 IP, fewest in the majors by 38 IP (Dodgers, 331.2 IP).

UP NEXT: YANKEES—The Rays have lost three consecutive season series to the Yankees, and are 0-2 against them this season after going 7-12 last season: 4-2 at Tropicana Field, 1-2 at Citi Field and 2-8 at Yankee Stadium...the games at Citi Field were home games relocated from St. Petersburg due to the arrival of Hurricane Irma in Florida...the two clubs will meet 19 times this season (nine at Yankee Stadium, 10 at Tropicana Field), and tomorrow's game will be the first of 7 games against each other in an 10-game and 11-day span, as the Rays host the Yankees from June 22-24... the Rays are 1-5 in 6 games against the Yankees since Sep 13, 2017, 3-10 in 13 games since May 21, 2017 and 22-37 since the start of the 2015 season.

- + Tomorrow's game will be broadcast on Fox Sports 1, with **Michael Kay** and **Brian Anderson** on the call...this will be the first of three nationally televised games for the Rays this season.

HOUSE OF HORRORS—The Rays are 8-25 (.242) at Yankee Stadium dating back to Sep 10, 2014, having been outscored 168-124 over that span... the Rays have lost 11 consecutive series there, the longest streak ever by any team in the current building...the Rays will enter tomorrow's game having lost 10 straight series openers at Yankee Stadium.

ALL-STAR WORTHY—Wilson Ramos trails NYY Gary Sánchez by 15,311 votes as of yesterday's first AL All-Star Game balloting, the tightest race among any position...Ramos leads AL catchers with 58 hits, 11 more than 2nd-place OAK **Jonathan Lucroy** (47)—and 20 more than 9th-place Sánchez...Ramos and Sánchez are the only two AL catchers who qualify for the batting title, and Ramos is batting .284 to Sánchez's .190...Ramos ranks in the top five among AL catchers with 8 HR, 32 RBI and 17 XBH.

- + Ramos is on pace for 20 HR and 79 RBI, which would be the 2nd-highest totals of his career (22 HR, 80 RBI in 2016 with the Nationals)...these are on pace to set franchise records for a catcher, currently held by **John Flaherty** with 14 HR and 71 RBI in 1999.

SCORING CHANGE—Upon further review, official scorer **Bill Mathews** and the Elias Sports Bureau have made a scoring change to last night's game...it was discovered postgame that a balk was called on **Jaime Garcia's** 1st-inning pickoff attempt of **Jake Bauers**, meaning the runner was awarded second base and advanced to third on the throwing error...Bauers, therefore, is not credited with his first career stolen base.

MEDICAL MATTERS—Yesterday **Kevin Kiermaier** (torn ligament in right thumb) began a rehab assignment with Class-A Charlotte and went 2-for-4, both singles, with 1 BB at Dunedin (Blue Jays)...tonight at Dunedin, Kiermaier and **Adeiny Hechavarria** (right hamstring strain) will both play their second rehab game for the Stone Crabs, with Kiermaier batting leadoff and playing 6 innings in center field and Hechavarria batting second and playing the entire game at shortstop...Kiermaier has been on the disabled list since April 16, and the Rays have gone 28-23 (.549) in his absence, compared to 29-32 in 2017 and 14-34 in 2016.

SIGNING UPDATE—Yesterday the Rays signed LH **Matthew Liberatore**, the No. 16 overall pick from the 2018 June Draft...he went 8-1 with a 0.93 ERA (60.1-IP, 8-ER) and 104 SO as a senior at Mountain Ridge (Ariz.) High School and was Arizona's Gatorade Baseball Player of the Year...he was ranked as the No. 2 overall player in this year's draft by *Baseball America* and was ranked No. 3 by ESPN's Keith Law and No. 4 by MLB.com.

- + The Rays have signed 26 of their 43 selections from the draft, including nine of their 13 picks within the first 10 rounds...see the Draft Rundown sheet in the back of the press box for a full list.

LAST OUTING—On Fri vs. SEA, made his first career start in the majors and finished with a career-high 5 SO...retired his first 6 BF on 15 pitches in the 1st inning and 15 pitches in the 2nd, but allowed a walk, single and **Dan Vogelbach** RBI single to start the 3rd, got a final strikeout and was replaced by **Matt Andriese**, who allowed 1 IR to score...his line: 2.1 IP, 2 H, 2 R/ER, 1 BB, 5 SO, 48 pit, 33 str.

ARIAL VIEW—Is making his 24th app (2nd start) in the majors spanning four seasons (2012-13 with Rangers, 2017 with Dodgers, 2018 with Dodgers/A's/Rays)...he has made 105 minor league starts, and last season excelled as a starter with Triple-A Oklahoma City, earning Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Year honors as he went 10-8 with a 3.48 ERA (134.1-IP, 51-ER) in 25 starts...he ranked among PCL leaders in strikeouts (178, 1st), wins (10, tied for 2nd), WHIP (1.11, 1st), opp avg. (.222, 1st) and SO/9 IP ratio (11.93, 1st)...he was also named a midseason PCL All-Star, started the Triple-A All-Star Game and took home PCL Pitcher of the Week honors twice.

- + Will be making his 2nd career app (1st start) against the Blue Jays...on May 20 at TOR, entered with a 9-0 lead to pitch the 9th inning and retired his first 2 BF, then allowed a walk and 2-run homer to **Yangervis Solarte**...it was his last app before being designated for assignment by the A's.

WEARING ALL CAPS—Acquired by the Rays from the A's on May 25 for minor league righthander **Peter Bayer**...he made the Dodgers Opening Day roster, but has designated for assignment by the Dodgers (April 23) and A's (May 23).

THE ELEPHANT IN THE ROOM—Despite only 15 apps (1 start), he has allowed 11 HR, all out of the bullpen, most in the majors among relievers ahead of BAL **Pedro Araujo** (9)...22 of his 27 runs allowed have scored via the home run (7 solo, one 2-run, two 3-run)...since joining the Rays, he has crafted a 3.24 ERA (8.1-IP, 3-ER) in 5 apps (1 start), holding opponents to .167/.286/.267 (5-for-30) with 1 HR, a solo shot by SEA **Ryon Healy**...prior to this, he made 10 apps between the Dodgers (6) and Athletics (4) and yielded at least 1 run in eight of those 10 apps, pitching to a 12.71 ERA (17-IP, 24-ER) while opponents hit .388/.424/.800 (31-for-80) with 10 HR.

MIX & MATCH—Is one of 13 different starting pitchers used by the Rays so far this season, most in the majors ahead of the Dodgers (11) and Athletics (11)...this is the fifth time the Rays have used 13 different starting pitchers for an *entire season*, following 2004 (14), 2003 (14), 2000 (13) and 1999 (13)...the Rays used eight starters all of last season—in fact, the 13 starters this season is only one shy of the previous three seasons combined (14 from 2015-17).

- + The Rays have already used 25 different pitchers, tied with the Dodgers for most in the majors, including position players **Daniel Robertson** and **Johnny Field**...this is already tied for 3rd-most for an entire season in club history, behind 2017 (30) and 2015 (27).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LH BLAKE SNELL (8-3, 2.30 ERA)

LAST START—On Sat vs. SEA, pitched for a second consecutive start against his childhood idol, **Félix Hernández**...allowed an unearned run on an RBI groundout in the 1st inning and a solo homer to **Nelson Cruz** in the 5th inning...the homer snapped his streak at 23.1 IP without allowing an *earned* run, since the 6th inning on May 18 at LAA...yielded 7 hits, his most since Sep 6, 2017 vs. MIN (7)...his 1 SO matched a career low (4th time, last Sep 26, 2017 at NYY, 1 IP)...hit **Jean Segura** in the 2nd inning, the first hit batter of his career (57th start and 1,256th batter faced)...his line: W, 6 IP, 7 H, 2 R/1 ER, 2 BB, 1 SO, 1 HR, 1 HBP, 95 pit, 60 str.

CANT TOUCH THIS—Is 3-0 with a 0.38 ERA (23.2-IP, 3-R/1-ER) over his last 4 starts...has won four consecutive decisions, dating back to May 18 at LAA, matching the longest winning streak of his career (3rd time)...his 8 wins in 14 starts are already a career high, as he recorded 5 wins in 24 starts last season and 6 wins in 19 starts in 2016.

WHEN HE'S ON—Has yielded 2 runs or fewer in 12 starts this season, tied with WAS **Max Scherzer** and HOU **Justin Verlander** (12) for most in

the majors...has allowed 1 run or fewer in 8 starts this season, tied for 4th in the majors behind Verlander (9), ATL **Mike Foltynewicz** (9) and NYM **Jacob deGrom** (9)...his 12 starts of 2 runs or fewer and 8 starts of 1 run or fewer are both already the most for a single season in his career...four times this season he has allowed 2 runs or fewer and not gotten the win, and three times he has allowed 1 run or fewer without the win.

vs. NEW YORK—Has made 9 starts against the Yankees, his most frequent opponent (Red Sox, 7)...is 2-3 with a 4.58 ERA (37.1-IP, 19-ER) in 9 starts and 0-3 with a 6.55 ERA (22-IP, 16-ER) in 6 starts at Yankee Stadium, including his major league debut on April 23, 2016...has yielded 4 runs or more in each of his last 2 starts against the Yankees, compared to 3 runs or fewer in his first 7 starts...his longest career start against the Yankees is 5.1 IP, 2x-last July 29, 2017 at NYY, and in the Bronx, has made starts of 5 IP, 2.2 IP, 4.2 IP, 5.1 IP, 1 IP and 3.1 IP...has faced them once this season, on April 4 at NYY (L, 3.1-IP, 5-ER), and yielded homers to **Giancarlo Stanton** (1st inning) and **Gary Sánchez** (3rd inning)...threw 90 pitches in 3.1 IP.

#16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.

- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
