HITTING THE ROAD: The Chicago Cubs tonight play the first of three games against the Atlanta Braves after going 5-2 in their seven-game, eight-day homestand against the Marlins (3-0), White Sox (2-1) and Braves (0-1) ... this is the first of a seven-game six-day trip to Atlanta (3 games) and Cincinnati (4 games starting Friday, including a split doubleheader on Saturday to make-up April 3's rain out).

© Chicago has dropped its last two contests after seeing a 15-game stretch from April 26-May 12 in which the team recorded a five-game winning streak (scoring 12 runs), a five-game losing streak (scoring 14 runs) and then another five-game winning streak (scoring 50 runs).

© This marks Chicago's second series at SunTrust Park since the ballpark opened last season, as the Cubs swept the Braves here in a three-game set, July 17-19 of last year.

© Chicago previously won its first three regular season games at a major league ballpark when the team won its first four contests at San Diego's Petco Park over the 2004-05 campaigns.

© SunTrust Park is the 10th road ballpark that the Cubs have played against the Braves franchise since their first season in Boston in 1876, the third ballpark in Atlanta ... the Cubs and Braves played in six different parks in Boston and one in Milwaukee.

TWO FROM 14,000: Since the franchise's inception in 1876, the Cubs have hit 13,998 home runs and are now just two away from exactly 14,000 blasts ... Ed Hartig notes that Brett Jackson hit the franchise's 13,000th homer on August 25, 2012 in Cubs regular season game number 20,375.

© The only two franchises with more regular season home runs than the Cubs are the Yankees (15,699) and the Giants (14,424).

BETTER AND BETTER: Including his two-run blast yesterday, Kris Bryant has homered in three of his last five games, in five of his last eight and in six of his last 11 overall ... on Wednesday, he hit his 100th career homer which is already a franchise mark for any player in his first four seasons as a Cub, surpassing Ernie Banks' 93 home runs from 1953-56.

© Bryant is the 22nd player in franchise history to reach 100 career homers ... just two other Cubs third basemen have reached triple digits in home runs: Ron Santo (337 homers) and Aramis Ramirez (239).

© In his first 34 games this season, Bryant has a .415 on-base percentage and a .586 slugging percentage, good for a 1.001 OPS ... those are ahead of the numbers he put up in his first 34 games of 2017 (.401 OBP, .547 SLG, .948 OPS) and well ahead of the numbers he posted in the first 34 games of his N.L. MVP 2016 season (.365 OBP, .486 SLG, .851 OPS).

THIS WEEK'S MATCHUP: The Braves and Cubs sit first and second among N.L. clubs in run differential (Atlanta, +57 and Chicago, +53), and the Braves lead the Senior Circuit with 219 runs scored and the Cubs sit second with 205.

THOUGHT HOME AND HOMES WERE FOR HOCKEY: The Cubs and Braves tonight start a three-game set at SunTrust Park after the teams yesterday played a make-up game at Wrigley Field ... this is the first time the Cubs play a N.L. opponent two-straight days with one game apiece at each other's parks since April 16-17, 1990 ... in that instance, the Cubs hosted the Mets on April 16 before starting a three-game set at Shea Stadium the following day ... thanks to Ed Hartig for his research assistance.

CURRENT EVENTS: Tonight begins a stretch of 14 of 19 games on the road with all 14 road contests in the Eastern Time Zone (following trip is at Pittsburgh and New York).

© Yesterday's contest vs. the Braves completed a stretch of 14 of 17 games at Wrigley Field dating to April 26 ... Chicago went 10-7 in that span.

© Thanks to yesterday's make-up game against Atlanta and Saturday's make-up game in Cincinnati, tonight is the fifth of 11 games in 10 days for the Cubs ... the team's next off day is May 21 and that's the first of three respite in just over two weeks for Chicago (off days also May 24 and June 4).

RUN PRODUCTION: The Cubs scored 58 runs in the just-completed seven-game homestand, including at least 11 runs in three of the first four games (42 runs total) ... prior to the homestand, the team had scored 27 runs in 11 games from April 25-May 6 (2.5 runs per game).

© The Cubs previously reached double-digits in runs in three of four games, April 15-18, 2004, vs. Pittsburgh (1 game) and Cincinnati (3 games).

© Chicago has recorded eight games with at least 10 runs scored this season, the most such contests in the majors (Atlanta is second with six).

STARTING STUFF: After beginning the season with just seven quality starts and a 5.27 ERA (57 ER/97.1 IP) in the club's first 19 games, Cubs starting pitchers have gone 7-6 with nine quality starts and a 2.99 ERA (34 ER/102.1 IP) in the last 18 games ... Cubs starters have held the opponent to a .219 average (82-for-375) in the last 18 contests.

WILLY AT-BAT: Willson Contreras, who on Sunday turned 26, collected 26 total bases in a three-game stretch, Wednesday-Saturday, going 10-for-15 with three doubles, two triples, three homers, 11 RBI and five runs scored.

© Contreras on Friday set a career mark with seven RBI, going 4-for-5 with two homers (including a first-inning grand slam), two doubles and two runs scored in an 11-2 win over the White Sox ... he's just the fifth Cubs catcher since the RBI became an official stat in 1920 with at least seven RBI in a game, joining Ed Bailey (8 RBI, 7/22/65 vs. PHI), George Mitterwald (8 RBI, 4/17/74 vs. PIT), Barry Foote (8 RBI, 4/22/80 vs. STL) and Geovany Soto (7 RBI, 8/26/08 at PIT).

BÁEZ AT THE DISH: Javier Báez leads the N.L. and is tied for second in the majors with 36 RBI ... he ranks second in the N.L. in slugging percentage (.596), third in extra-base hits (23), tied for third in total bases (87) and tied for fifth in home runs (10).

FIRST THING FIRST: The Cubs scored five runs in Friday's first inning, plated four runs in the opening frame on Saturday and on Sunday scored two runs in the first inning vs. the White Sox ... the team's 34 runs in the first inning are its most in any frame this season, just eclipsing it's 31 runs in the seventh inning.

A FINE QUINTET: Five regular Cubs relievers have an ERA at 2.04 or better: Brian Duensing (0.68), Brandon Morrow (1.29), Pedro Strop (1.59), Steve Cishek (1.93) and Carl Edwards Jr. (2.04) ... the Cubs are the only big league team to boast that distinction, as no other club has more than four such relievers.

© Dating to last season, Brandon Morrow's 64.2-straight innings without allowing a homer is the longest active streak in the majors, while Steve Cishek ranks third with a streak of 45.2-straight homerless innings.

© Pedro Strop has 9.2 scoreless innings since April 21, holding the opponent to a .125 average and a .301 OPS ... he's averaged 12 pitches per inning.

Yu, expected to be activated from the D.L. for tonight's start, pitched 4.1 innings and allowed five earned runs and a career-high tying three home runs in an 11-2 loss to the Rockies, May 2 ... had eight strikeouts for the second-straight start, marking the 21st time in his career he has struck out eight or more batters in at least two consecutive starts.

Yu tonight is expected to make his seventh start of the season, and fourth on the road ... was placed on the 10-day disabled list May 7 (retroactive to May 4) with parainfluenza virus ... 14 of his 22 runs allowed this season have come in the fifth inning.

- Ⓢ Is averaging 11.57 K/9 since the beginning of April, which ranks fourth among N.L. starters with at least four starts ... leads all Cubs pitchers with 37 strikeouts.
- Ⓢ Made his Cubs debut, March 31 at Miami ... allowed a two-run homer in the first and three more runs in the fifth inning before departing.
- Ⓢ Tossed his first quality start of the season, April 7 at Milwaukee ... allowed just one run on two hits in 6.0 innings in the Cubs' 5-2 win.
- Ⓢ Turned in his second quality start of the season vs. Milwaukee on April 27 ... tied his longest start of the season ... marked the ninth start in his career in which he allowed three hits or fewer and no earned runs while striking out at least eight batters.

2017 Season

Yu made 31 starts between the Rangers and Dodgers, his most games started since a career-high 32 games in 2013 ... went a combined 10-12 with a 3.86 ERA (80 ER/186.2 IP) and 209 strikeouts, his third season with at least 200 strikeouts.

- Ⓢ Limited righties to a .194 average, the seventh-lowest mark in the majors ... overall held opponents to a .228 average, the 13th-best mark in the majors.
- Ⓢ Acquired by the Dodgers at the July 31 trade deadline in a four-player trade with the Texas Rangers ... went 4-3 in nine starts with Los Angeles, posting a 3.44 ERA (19 ER/49.2 IP) and struck out 61 batters against 13 walks ... held hitters to a .235 average and posted a 1.15 WHIP.
- Ⓢ In 15 starts on the road, he went 6-4 with a 2.44 ERA (25 ER/92.1 IP) and struck out 105 batters against just 28 walks.
- Ⓢ Selected to the A.L. All-Star team for the fourth time in his career.
- Ⓢ Went 2-2 with a 6.14 ERA (10 ER/14.2 IP) in four postseason starts ... was 2-0 with a 1.59 ERA (2 ER/11.1 IP) in his first two postseason outings, including collecting the win in NLCS Game Three at Wrigley Field (6.1 IP, 6 H, 1 ER) ... however, he allowed eight earned runs in 3.1 IP in two World Series starts.

Career Notes

- A four-time All-Star, Yu signed a six-year contract with the Cubs in February of this year ... is the eighth Japanese-born player in Cubs history, and the fifth pitcher.
- Ⓢ Ranked among A.L. Cy Young Award vote-getters in both 2012 (ninth) and 2013 (second) ... was named Rangers Pitcher of the Year in 2013 and 2014.
- Ⓢ From 2012-17, he ranked first among all pitchers in strikeouts per nine innings (11.04) ... ranked fourth in hits allowed per nine innings (7.29) and opponents batting average (.219) during that span.
- Ⓢ Set a major league record with 812 strikeouts in his first 100-career starts ... also became the fastest pitcher to 1,000 strikeouts by games pitched (128 games).
- Ⓢ Missed the entire 2015 season and the beginning of 2016 after undergoing Tommy John Surgery in March of 2015 ... surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews.
- Ⓢ Had a seven-year career with the Hokkaido Nippon-Ham Fighters of the Japanese Pacific League in Nippon Professional Baseball (NPB) from 2005-11 ... was a two-time Pacific League Most Valuable Player (2007, 2009).

Tyler makes his eighth start of the season and his sixth career start against the Braves on Wednesday ... last time out, Tyler got the win in a Cubs 11-2 victory against the White Sox on May 11, 2018 ... went 5.0 innings while allowing two runs on three hits with five walks and five strikeouts ... he has allowed two or fewer earned runs in six of his seven starts.

- Ⓢ Tyler is 2-2 in seven career outings (five starts) against the Braves ... has a 5.60 ERA (17 ER/27.1 IP) against Atlanta.
- Ⓢ In 2017, Tyler made 25 starts and eight relief outings with the Rockies, going a combined 8-15 with a complete game shutout and a 4.69 ERA (77 ER/147.2 IP) ... posted a 3.49 ERA (30 ER/77.1 IP) on the road compared to a 6.01 ER (47 ER/70.1 IP) at home.
- Ⓢ Tyler signed a three-year major league contract with the Cubs, December 7, 2017 ... has pitched in seven seasons with the Los Angeles Angels (2011) and Colorado Rockies (2012-14, 2016-17) and Cubs (2018-) ... ranks second among qualified National League starting pitchers in road ERA since the start of 2016 with a 2.50 mark (47 ER/169.1 IP).

Tommy has hit safely in his last five games, including yesterday in which he led off and was 1-for-4 with a run ... Friday, delivered a ninth-inning RBI pinch-single ... is 8-for-18 with three walks and six RBI as a pinch-hitter, the most hits as a PH in the majors and tied for the most RBI ... hit a two-run pinch-hit single April 28 ... went 2-for-3 with two runs and a RBI April 22 ... on Opening Day hit a two-run pinch-double with two outs in the seventh ... was on the Cubs Opening Day roster for the fourth-straight season, one of only two Cubs position players to accomplish that feat (also, Rizzo) ... posted a .288 average (36-for-125) and .389 OBP in 73 games with the Cubs last season ... had a .488 OBP as a pinch-hitter in 2017, reaching base in 21-of-44 pinch-hit plate appearances ... was an eighth round selection of the Braves in the 2011 MLB Draft.
