MIAMI MARLINS (46-65) vs PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (61-48)

Saturday, August 4, 2018 – 7:05 EDT – Citizens Bank Park – Game 110 – Home 55
RHP Jose Urena (3-10, 4.40) vs RHP Zach Eflin (7-3, 3.64)

- **LAST NIGHT'S ACTION:** The Phillies defeated the Miami Marlins, 5-1, on Shane Victorino night at Citizens Bank Park ... Starter Vince Velasquez (W, 8-8) continued his run of brilliance as he tossed 6.1 scoreless innings and allowed only 2 hits with 1 walk and 7 strikeouts ... Rhys Hoskins (2-4, RBI), Nick Williams (2-4, R), Jorge Alfaro (2-3, R, RBI, BB) and Roman Quinn (1-1, 2 RBI) led the Phils offensively ... Victor Arano (0.2 IP) and Seranthony Dominguez (SV, 1.1 IP) excelled in relief.
- **RHYS AT 150:** Last night marked the 150th game of Rhys Hoskins' young career ... His .938 career OPS (648 plate appearances) is the second-best mark among all Phillies players dating to 1900, through the first 150 games of a career, trailing only Hall-of-Famer **Chuck Klein** (1.041 OPS) ... Among all players, through their first 150 games with the Phillies, Hoskins has the fourth-best OPS since 1900, trailing only **Lefty O'Doul** (1.080), **Klein** and Hall-of-Famer **Jim Thome** (.956) ... Among all major league players who have made their debut since the year 2000, Hoskins has the eighth-best OPS through 150 games to begin a career (see chart below) ... Hoskins, 25, crushed his 40th career home run in his 149th career game on Thursday night, becoming the 2nd-fastest Phillies player to 40 career home runs (fastest: Klein, 148 G) ... Finally, On May 29 at Dodger Stadium, facing LA closer Kenley Jansen, Hoskins fouled a ball off his face resulting in a fractured jaw ... Hoskins returned on June 9 and in 220 plate appearances since being activated off the DL, he is slashing .302/.391/.630 with 34 runs, 14 2B, 16 HR, 44 RBI and 27 walks ... The only other player in the majors with as many walks and home runs as Hoskins since June 9, when he came off the DL, is STL's Matt Carpenter (20 HR, 35 BB).

- **MAIK ON A MISSION:** Since he resumed a full-time role at third base on June 17, **Maikel Franco** has hit .328 with a .374 OBP and .606 SLG over 147 plate appearances and 39 games ... Franco, with 18 home runs on the season, has struck out a mere 49 times ... Among 52 players in the majors with 18 or more home runs this season, Franco's 49 strikeouts are the fewest ... For context, **Jose Ramirez** and **Mookie Betts** are next on the list with 54 each.
- **CITIZENS BANK SPARK:** The Phillies have won 10 of their last 12 games at home, 12 of their last 15 and are 36-18 (.667) at CBP this season ... They have the best home winning percentage in the National League and their win percentage at home is third-best in baseball, trailing only the Red Sox (.727) and Yankees (.704).
- **REMEMBER THE FIGHTINS:** Since starting the season 1-4, the Phillies are 16 games over .500 at 60-44 and have the second-best winning percentage in the NL in that span (.577), trailing only the Cubs (.587) ... At 61-48 with a .560 winning percentage this season, the Phils currently sport a half-game game lead over the Atlanta Braves (59-47, .557) in National League East
- **PROGRESS IN THE PROCESS:** Thus far, through 109 games, the Phils are 13 games above .500 at 61-48 and have scored 478 runs and allowed 448 (+30) ... Last season, through 109 games, they were 29 games under .500 at 40-69 and had scored 437 and allowed 526 (-89) ... **The Phillies didn't notch their 61st win last season until September 20** ... This season, in nine games (8.3 % of their games played thus far) in which they have allowed 10 or more runs, the Phillies have been outscored 111-30 (-81) ... **However, in their 100 other games this year (91.7% of their season), Philadelphia has a +111 run differential, outscoring the opposition 448-337.**
- **SERIESLY:** Over their last 15 series (6/12-current), the Phillies are 10-3-2 ... Philadelphia's three series losses in that span have come against the Yankees at Citizens Bank Park (1-2, 6/25-27), the Marlins in Miami (1-2, 7/13-15) and the Reds this past weekend in Cincinnati (1-3) ... Philadelphia's 10 series wins in that span have come against the Rockies, Brewers, Cardinals, Nationals (2x), Orioles (2x), Pirates, Padres and Dodgers.
- **A CALL TO THE WALL:** Tonight, the Phillies will induct Hall-of-Famer **Pat Gillick** and **Roy Halladay** onto their Wall-of-Fame ... Gillick, the architect and general manager of the 2008 World Championship team, served in that role from 2006-08 ... After fulfilling his three-year contract as GM, Gillick transitioned into the role of senior advisor to the president & general manager in November of 2008, a position he held until being named interim president ... Gillick spent the 2015 season as the team president, holding that position from January 28 through October 14 after being named interim president on August 28, 2014 ... He is currently in his 13th year with the Phillies ... Halladay, who died tragically in November of 2017, is one of only four Phillies to be inducted without a fan vote ... One of the greatest right-handers of his era, Halladay pitched with the Phillies from 2010-13, winning the 2010 NL Cy Young Award ... He authored a perfect game and a postseason no-hitter in 2010.

LAST START: 7/29 at CIN: L, 5.1 IP, 7 H, 4 R, 4 ER, BB, IBB, 4 SO, HR ... Eflin vs Castillo ... Philadelphia had opportunities to score early, as well as the 9th inning when they loaded the bases with 1 out ... Ultimately it was not to be as the Phils went 0-for-4 with RISP.

TONIGHT'S START:

- **To The Nines:** Eflin is 6-1 with a 3.20 ERA (18 ER, 50.2 IP), 1.11 WHIP, 10 BB, 43 SO in his last 9 starts since 6/5
- **Two Few:** Has allowed 2 ER or fewer in 9 of his 14 starts this season, including every start in which he has pitched more than 6.0 innings ... In his career, every one of his 18 starts in which he has gone at last 6.0 innings has been a quality start except for one (5/23/17 vs COL, 6.0 IP, 8 ER)
- **Walk It Out: Among all NL starters (min. 75.0 IP), Eflin's 2.11 BB/9.0 IP (18 BB, 76.2 IP) ranks 10th, and leads all Phillies pitchers ...** Eflin has walked 1 batter or none in 9 of his last 11 starts and 10 of 14 overall this season
- **RISPy Business:** Has faced 72 batters with RISP this season, and has allowed a hit to only 11 of them (.200 AVG, 11-55) ... Batters are 5-32 (.189) with RISP in his last 10 starts
- **Striking Difference:** He is averaging 8.45 SO/9.0 IP (72 SO, 76.2 IP) this season, almost double his average of 4.65 SO/9.0 IP (66 SO, 127.2 IP) from 2016-17 ... Prior to this season had never struck out more than 6 in a start (both times with 6 were CG), and this season has struck out 6 or more in 6 of his 14 starts
- **vs NL East:** 3-3, 3.73 ERA (25 ER, 60.1 IP) in 10 starts

HOME:

- **2018:** 4-1, 3.18 ERA (12 ER, 34.0 IP) in 6 starts
- **Career:** 5-6, 4.75 ERA (47 ER, 89.0 IP) in 15 starts

2018 SEASON:

- Won 6 straight starts, 6/5-7/3, joining Cliff Lee and Roy Halladay as the only Phillies to accomplish that since 2000 ... Posted a 1.91 ERA (8 ER, 37.2 IP) in those starts with 1 HR allowed, 6 BB and 34 SO
- Was on the 10-day DL, 7/15 (retro to 7/12) to 7/22 with a right middle finger blister
- Had a 32.2-inning homerless streak in parts of 7 starts, 5/30-7/3
- Went 5-0 with a 1.76 ERA (6 ER, 30.2 IP), 6 BB, 0 HR, 28 SO and held opponents to a .218 AVG in 5 June starts ... Was T-1st in the majors in wins in June and HR/9.0 IP, and in the NL ranked 3rd in ERA, 4th in SO/BB (4.97) and 8th in WHIP (0.98)
- He was the first Phillie to win 5 games in a month since May 2012 (Hamels) and the first Phillie to have at least 30.0 IP in a month and 0 HR allowed since April 2012 (Halladay)
- Clubbed his first major league home run on 5/25 vs TOR
- Struck out a career-high 9 batters on 5/7 vs SF ... Needed only 3.2 innings to surpass his previous high of 6 (which he did twice, both in complete games)
- Took a perfect game through 5.0 innings in his 2018 debut, 5/1 at MIA
- Began the season with Lehigh Valley (AAA) before being recalled on 4/30 by PHI (1.69 ERA in 3 starts with LHV)

2017 SEASON:

- Began the season on the 10-day DL recovering from offseason surgery on both knees
- Had a career-best 29.0-inning streak without issuing a walk, 4/18-5/10; longest by a Phillie since 2013-14 (Cliff Lee, 31.0 IP)
- Had 3 straight starts with at least 7.0 IP and no walks, 4/18-5/4
- Was on the 7-day DL, 6/3-7/8 (right elbow strain)
- Placed on the 10-day DL on 8/22 (retro to 8/19) with a right shoulder strain, causing him to miss the remainder of the season
- Posted a 2.81 ERA (10 ER, 32.0 IP) in his first 5 starts of the season and a 9.46 ERA (34 R, 32.1 IP) in his final 6

- Traded to Philadelphia from LAD with LHP Tom Windle for SS Jimmy Rollins, 12/19/14
- Originally selected by SD between 1st and 2nd rounds (33rd overall) of June 2012 draft; Traded to LAD with C Yasmani Grandal and RHP Joe Wieland for OF Matt Kemp, C Tim Federowicz and cash considerations, December 18, 2014
