RECENT REDBIRDS: The Cardinals begin a three-game weekend series at division-rival Cincinnati today before returning to Busch for a six-game, seven-day homestand (3-SD, 3-CHI) on Monday...St. Louis went 4-3 over its most recent six-game homestand against Pittsburgh (3-1) and Miami (1-2)...the Cardinals began the day in 3rd place in the NL Central, 3.0 games back of the 1st place Milwaukee Brewers...the Redbirds are 5-5 in their last 10 games, and 10-10 over their previous 20, and 15-15 in their last 30 games.

LYONS TO 10-DAY DL; MAYERS RECALLED: The Cardinals announced prior to tonight's series opener in Cincinnati that they have placed left-handed reliever **Tyler Lyons** (left elbow sprain) on the 10-day disabled list, retroactive to June 6, and recalled right-handed pitcher **Mike Mayers** from Memphis (AAA).

RED HOT REDBIRDS: The Cardinals have won 11 straight contests against the Reds since September 14, 2017, which is tied for their 3rd-longest win streak against Cincinnati in franchise history (also July 3-Sept. 4, 1949). The Cardinals won 12 straight from June 1, 1931-April 25, 1932, while their all-time best win streak against the Reds is an 18-gamer from July 4, 1930-May 23, 1931.

STREAKING: The Cardinals have won nine straight at the Great American Ball Park, their longest win streak at the most current home of the Reds...the Cardinals longest win streak in Cincinnati is 10 from August 1, 1930-May 23, 1931 at Crosley Field. The longest road win streak by any team in Cincinnati is held by the Brooklyn Dodgers (19) from June 22, 1947-May 22, 1949. The Cardinals longest road win streak against the same opponent is 18 against the Pittsburgh Pirates at Forbes Field from May 7, 1964-April 15, 1966.

SECOND HOME: Yadier Molina has incredible success at Great American Ballpark with a career .321 average to go with 14 home runs and 54 RBI. Molina has racked up his highest numbers at GABP over all other road ballparks in hits (115), home runs, RBI, doubles (25) and extra base hits (39).

POWER PLAY: The Cardinals have homered in 42 of their first 60 games, going 30-12 (.714 win pct.) in those games (3-15 when not homering)...among NL clubs, St. Louis is tied with Atlanta (30-12; .714) and only Milwaukee (31-8; .794) has a better winning pct. when going yard.

START ME UP: The St. Louis starting rotation has surrendered a MLB-low 26 home runs, paces MLB in ground ball pct. (48.1), and ranks 2nd in the NL in ERA (2.90), H/9IP (7.43), WHIP (1.15), OPP AVG (.225), T3rd in wins (23), and T4th in quality starts (28).

MR. CARDINAL: The St. Louis Cardinals organization, the St. Louis community and baseball fans everywhere were saddened Wednesday to learn of the passing of Hall of Famer **Albert Fred "Red" Schoendienst** at the age of 95. "Red was one of the greatest Cardinals of all time, and a beloved member of the Cardinals organization for over six decades," said Cardinals Principal Owner & Chief Executive Officer **William O. DeWitt, Jr.** "His influence on this organization cannot be overstated. Red was a great player, a great manager, and a wonderful mentor to countless players, coaches, and members of the front office. He was also a fan favorite who connected with millions of Cardinals fans across multiple generations. He will be sorely missed." Schoendienst was the oldest living member of the National Baseball Hall of Fame.

CINCINNATI CONNECTIONS

Cardinals Manager **Mike Matheny** was born in Columbus, Ohio...graduated from Reynoldsburg High School (1988)...his daughter, Katie, played women's ice hockey at The Ohio State University.

Cardinals outfielder **Marcell Ozuna** and Reds pitcher **Austin Brice** were Marlins teammates in 2016.

Cardinals pitcher **Michael Wacha's** uncle, **Dusty Rogers**, was a Reds first round draft pick in 1984 and played in their minor league organization for five seasons (1984-88).

Cardinals pitcher **Mike Mayers** graduated from nearby Grove City (Ohio) High School.

Reds Executive Advisor to the CEO **Walt Jocketty** served as the Cardinals General Manager for 13 seasons (1995-2007)...during tenure, the Cardinals compiled seven NL Central Division championships (1996, 2000-02, '04-06), two NL Championships ('04, '06), and one World Series Championship ('06)...the Cardinals recorded seven straight winning seasons under Jocketty, including a pair of 100+ win seasons ('04-05)...named MLB Executive of the Year (2000, '04, '10).

Reds Player Performance Special Asst. **Eric Davis** played two seasons (1999-2000) for St. Louis.

Reds interim manager **Jim Riggleman** spent 18 seasons (1976-90, 2005-07) in the Cardinals system as a minor league player (1976-81), minor league coach (AA-Arkansas, 1981), minor league manager (High-A-St. Petersburg, '82-84 & AA-Arkansas, '85-88), Director of Player Development ('88-89), St. Louis First Base Coach (1989-90) and minor league fielding coordinator (2005-07).

Reds assistant pitching/bullpen coach **Ted Power** pitched in 23 games for St. Louis in 1989.

Reds catching coach **Mike Stefanski** played parts for six seasons in the Cardinals minors (1996-2001)...originally acquired by St. Louis from Milwaukee for catcher **Marc Ronan** (Nov. 19, 1995).

Reds Special Assistant to the GM **John Morris** played five seasons for St. Louis from 1986-90.

Reds Special Assistant to the General Manager, Player Personnel **Cam Bonifay** worked for the Cardinals as a special assistant, evaluating the American League East from October of 2007-08.

Reds pro scout **Bruce Manno** worked in the Cardinals front office for six seasons as Director of Player Development (2002-06) and Senior Director of Pro Scouting & Special Assistant to the General Manager (2007) before joining Atlanta.

Reds Special Assistant to the GM **Marty Maier** spent 24 seasons with St. Louis as an area scout, Latin American coordinator, asst. director of scouting, scouting director and special asst. to the GM.

Reds broadcaster **Jeff Brantley** pitched in 48 games for St. Louis in 1998.

Cardinals broadcaster and Hall of Famer **Jim Edmonds** played 13 games for the Reds during his final professional season in 2010.

Reds broadcaster **George Grande** was a Cardinals play-by-play announcer for two seasons (1991-92).

Cardinals Principal Owner and Chief Executive Officer **William DeWitt Jr.** was a prior owner of the Reds, and a shareholder of the Cincinnati Bengals...is father, **William O. DeWitt**, was a sole owner of the Reds from 1961-67.

Reds President and Chief Executive Office **Robert Castellini**, Chairman **W. Joseph Williams Jr.** and Vice Chairman **Thomas Williams** were investors in the Cardinals from 1995-2006...their interests were sold as a condition of their acquisition of a controlling ownership stake of the Reds.

Reds Media Relations Intern **Ben Barnette** was a 2015 Cardinals Spring Training Intern and 2016 Memphis Redbirds (AAA) Media Relations Intern.

- Of his 31 runs allowed, 12 have come in the 2nd inning.

CAREER

- Averaging 9.79 K/9 IP over his career 160.0 Major League innings.
- His 174 career strikeouts are 3rd to Rick Ankiel (185) and Shelby Miller (177) for the highest total all-time among Cardinals through their first 34 career games.
- Has three double-digit strikeout games in his first 34 games, trailing only Rick Ankiel (5) and tied with Paul Derringer (3) and Alan Benes (3) on the Cardinals all-time list.
- Won team-leading seven consecutive 2017 starts (8/2-9/20/17), was the 4th-longest in the National League and longest by a MLB rookie in 2017...is the first Cardinals rookie to achieve the feat since Ted Wilks (1944) & Johnny Beazley (1942) (*Elias*).
- Became the fifth rookie pitcher in the last 70 years to allow two runs or fewer over seven consecutive winning starts, joining Fernando Valenzuela (eight straight in 1981), Cal Eldred (1992), Jered Weaver (2006) and Steven Matz (2016) (*Elias*).

2017

- Pitched the majority of the second half of the season with St. Louis, pitching in 13 games (10 starts) over three stints. Was the 7th different Cardinals pitcher to make a start behind the original starting five and Marco Gonzales.
- Struck out 72 over 60.1 IP to average 10.74 K/9 IP, the 5th-highest mark among National League starters (min. 60.0 IP), trailing Robbie Ray (12.11), Max Scherzer (12.02), Rich Hill (11.01) and Dinelson Lamet (10.94).
