**ROSTER MOVES**—The Rays have added RH Tyler Glasnow and OF Tommy Pham to the active roster, reinstated RH Jake Faria (left oblique strain) from the 60-day DL, optioned RH Andrew Kittredge to Triple-A Durham and designated SS Adeiny Hechavarria for assignment.

- + Glasnow will become the 15th starting pitcher used by the Rays this season, most in the majors and a club record, passing 2003 and 2004...he and Pham will become the 49th and 50th players used, approaching the club record that was set last season (53).

**RAY MATTER**—Last night the Rays won, 10-6, to snap a 3-game losing streak, and avoided falling under .500 for the first time since the end of play on July 6 (43-44)...it was the third straight time they won a game to avoid falling under .500 (also July 8 at NYM, July 22 vs. MIA)...it was also the ninth time they won when allowing 6 runs (or more), 2nd-most in the majors behind the Cubs (11), improving to 9-18 (.333) when doing so.

- + The Rays are 5-6 since the All-Star break and 6-9 in their last 15 games since July 12...they went 13-12 in July, the second straight month they were within a game of .500...they haven't been better or worse than two games of .500 in a calendar month this season.
- + The Rays are 20-13 (.606) in 33 games since June 22 and 50-40 (.556) in 90 games since April 18 following a 4-13 start to the season.

**DOME SWEET DOME**—Yesterday the Rays began a 9-game homestand against the Angels (1-0), White Sox and Orioles...since June 11, the Rays are 18-4 (.818) at home, best winning pct. in the majors, ahead of the Red Sox (.789)...the Rays are 28-13 at home since April 18 after a 2-7 start.

- + The Rays have won via walk-off six times this season, tied for 2nd in the AL behind the Blue Jays (7) and their most since a club-record 13 walk-off wins in 2013...they have hit three walk-off home runs, more than the previous four seasons (2014-17) combined (2).
- + Entering today, the Rays are 6-1 in their last seven home series.

**NOT THE RAYS WAY**—The Rays have allowed at least 6 runs in four straight games, matching their longest streak of the season (also June 13-20 at MIN, vs. MIA)...they have allowed 12 hits (or more) in four straight games for the first time since Aug 7-13, 2013 at ARI/LAD, vs. SEA (5).

- + Rays pitching has a 6.42 ERA (130.1-IP, 104-R/93-ER) in the last 15 games since July 12, highest in the majors (Rangers, 6.07)...the 104 runs are their most allowed over a 15-game span since July 21-Aug 6, 2007 (108)...they have yielded 4 runs or more in 12 of these 15 games, 6 runs or more in 9 games and double digits in 5 games.
- + Rays pitching has allowed at least 4 runs in a frame 12 times in 21 games since July 6, compared to once in the previous 26 games.
- + The last time a Rays starter recorded a win was Nathan Eovaldi on July 8 at NYM...Rays starters are 0-6 in 18 games since then.

**ABOUT THE OFFENSE**—Last night the Rays scored 10 runs, their seventh time reaching double digits this season, first since July 14 at MIN and first at home since July 9 vs. DET...the Rays offense has averaged 5.89 runs over the last 19 games since July 8 at NYM, but the club has gone just 9-10 over that 19-game stretch...they have scored 4 runs or more in 14 of those 18 games, 5 runs or more in 12 games and 8 runs or more in 5 games.

- + Last night the Rays scored 7 runs in the 4th inning, their most in a frame since Sep 28, 2017 at NYY (7-run 5th) and most at home since Oct 4, 2015 vs. TOR (9-run 1st)...they sent 12 to the plate in the inning, matching a season high (also May 27 vs. BAL, 3rd inning).
- + All 10 runs last night were charged to Angels starter Tyler Skaggs...it was the fifth time in franchise history the Rays scored 10 runs against an opposing starter, first since Aug 13, 2014 at TEX (Miles Mikolas) and first at home since April 9, 2005 (Barry Zito).
- + Since July 13, the Rays have gone 4-5 (.444) when scoring 5 runs or more...before this, they were 31-1 (.969) when scoring 5+ runs.

**RAYS vs. ANGELS**—The Rays are 4-1 against the Angels this season (1-0 at home, 3-1 on the road), clinching the season series for a third consecutive year while improving to 3-0-1 in the last four season series...they are 78-98 all-time against them (38-47 at home, 40-51 on the road), including 46-35 in the Rays era...the Rays are averaging 6.4 runs per game against them this season, incl. 3 games with 7+ runs...since the start of 2010, the visiting team has dominated the matchup of these two clubs: the Angels have gone 17-12 at Tropicana Field, including 7-1-1 in series play, while the Rays are 26-11 at Angel Stadium and have gone 9-1-1 in series play.

**PITCHING PLANS**—Tonight's game will be started by Tyler Glasnow, his first start in the majors since Sep 13, 2017 at MIL (with PIT)...the Rays announced in spring training a season-opening rotation of Chris Archer (traded), Blake Snell (DL), Nathan Eovaldi (traded) and Jake Faria, but they have used other starters in 50 of their 107 games (46.7 pct.).

- + The Rays have used an opener in 25 games (12-13), employed a bullpen day in 19 games (9-10) and used a traditional starter in 63 games (33-30)...as a result, Rays starters have gone 3 IP or fewer 38 times, most for a team in a single season since the 1956 Washington Senators (38)...their starters have gone 2 IP or fewer 30 times, most by a team since Baseball Reference data is available (1908).

**REDEFINING RELIEF**—So far this season, Rays relievers have totaled:

- + 35 apps of at least 50 pitches, most in the majors, ahead of the Marlins (14), and their most for any season in club history (2003, 29)
- + 16 apps of at least 70 pitches, most in the majors, ahead of the Marlins (7), and their most for any season in club history (2004, 7)
- + 88 apps of at least 2 IP, most in the majors (Padres, 74)
- + 41 apps of at least 3 IP, most in the majors (Padres/Royals, 16)
- + 25 apps of at least 4 IP, most in the majors (Marlins, 8)
- + Rays relievers lead the majors with 506 IP, most in the majors by 81.2 IP (Marlins/Padres) and most in the AL by 101.2 IP (Angels).

**CLOSE SHAVES**—The Rays are 20-23 (.465) in 1-run games this season, leading the majors in 1-run games (Mariners, 41) and 1-run losses (Orioles, 20)...they started the season 0-5 and 5-12 in 1-run games; since then, they are 20-18 and 15-11 in 1-run games, respectively, and they are 10-4 in 1-run games since June 19...40.2 pct. of Rays games have been decided by 1 run, compared to 27.6 pct. of games in the majors...47.8 pct. of their 1-run losses have come against the Red Sox (1-6) and Mariners (0-5).

**THEN vs. NOW**—This is the second straight season the Rays have held a 54-53 record through 107 games, but they are currently 20 GB of the first-place Red Sox in the AL East and 9 GB of the Mariners for the AL's second Wild Card, compared to 4.5 GB in the division and 2.5 GB of the second Wild Card through 107 games last season...last season, the Rays were positioned to make the postseason as late as the end of July 22, when they were 51-47 and tied with the Yankees for the two Wild Card spots.

- + The Rays traded eight veterans over the 10 weeks leading up to this season's trade deadline: Denard Span, Alex Colomé, Brad Miller, Nathan Eovaldi, Matt Andriese, Jonny Venters, Wilson Ramos and Chris Archer...last season the Rays acquired six players over the six weeks leading up to the trade deadline, all with at least six seasons in the majors: Trevor Plouffe, Adeiny Hechavarria, Sergio Romo, Dan Jennings, Lucas Duda and Steve Cishek.

**ROSTER MAKEOVER**—Thirteen players on tonight's active roster weren't on it for the series finale on May 20 at Angel Stadium (52.0 pct.)...five of these players have been recalled from the minor leaguers (Willy Adames, Jake Bauers, Diego Castillo, Jaime Schultz, Hunter Wood), three have been reinstated from the disabled list (Yonny Chirinos, Carlos Gómez, Kevin Kiermaier) and five have been acquired via trade (Jalen Beeks, Ji-Man Choi, Tyler Glasnow, Michael Perez, Tommy Pham).

- + Only 15 of the 41 players (36.6 pct.) from last year's season-ending active roster or disabled list remain in the organization.
- + Only one player remains in the organization from Kevin Cash's managerial debut on April 6, 2015: CF Kevin Kiermaier.
- + Only four players have been on the active roster all season, without a stint on the disabled list or in the minors: C.J. Cron, Sergio Romo, Mallex Smith and Jesús Sucre.

**BIG WEEKEND AHEAD**—During this weekend's series against the White Sox, the Rays will hold a 10-year celebration of the 2008 American League Championship club...more than 20 alumni are confirmed to attend...at 2:00 p.m. on Friday, the Rays will hold a press conference at the 20th Anniversary Exhibit, adjacent to the Ted Williams Museum, including Jason Bartlett, Aki Iwamura, Scott Kazmir, James Shields and B.J. Upton...see separate press release for details...media seeking one-on-one interviews with any 2008 Rays alumni on Friday or Saturday should email their requests to [media@raysbaseball.com](mailto:media@raysbaseball.com)...fans are encouraged to arrive early to Friday and Saturday's games, especially for Saturday's pre-game ceremony beginning at 5:45 p.m.

**LAST OUTING**—On Thurs vs. NYM, entered with the Pirates trailing, 6-4, in the 4th inning, and did not allow a hit in 3 IP, his longest outing since April 27 vs. STL (3 IP)... yielded a run in the 4th inning, on two errors (E4, E5) and 2 BB, and pitched around a 2-out walk in the 5th inning and a 1-out walk in the 6th inning...it matched the longest hitless app by a Pirates reliever this season, and it was the first time a Pirates reliever allowed a run in at least three hitless innings since **Matt Ruebels** on June 4, 1997 vs. STL (3.2 IP)...his line: ND, 3 IP, 0 H, 1 R/0 ER, 4 BB, 1 SO, 57 pit, 28 str.

**THE NEW GUY**—Will be making his Rays debut, and it will be first start since Sep 13, 2017 at MIL (with PIT)...acquired from the Pirates yesterday, along with OF **Austin Meadows** and a player to be named, in exchange for RH **Chris Archer**...in his career, is 2-9 with a 7.24 ERA (73.1-IP, 59-ER), 45 BB, 69 SO and 15 HR in 17 starts.

- + His 72 SO rank 3rd among NL relievers, behind MIL **Josh Hader** (99) and COL **Adam Ottavino** (77)...has gone at least 2 IP in 19 of his 34 apps, and his season highs are 3.2 IP and 73 pitches on April 19 at PHI...his 19 relief apps of at least 2 IP are the most in the majors, ahead of TB/ARI **Matt Andriese** (18).
- + Is 1-1 with a 2.72 ERA (43-IP, 13-ER) in outings of 2 IP or more this season.

**STANDING TALL**—Will become the fifth pitcher in club history standing 6'8" or taller, according to Baseball Reference, following **Jeff Niemann** (6'9"), **Adam Russell** (6'8"), **Mark Hendrickson** (6'9") and **Billy Taylor** (6'8")...Rays pitching coach **Kyle Snyder** is also listed by BB-Ref at 6'8" and spent parts of five years in the majors.

**MAKING THE LEAP**—Made the Pirates Opening Day roster for a second consecutive season...has pitched to a 3.43 ERA (21-IP, 8-ER) and .219 opp avg. (16-for-73) in 15 apps dating back to June 15 vs. CIN...has pitched to a lower ERA in each calendar month this season: 4.70 in April, 4.30 in May, 4.20 in June and 4.09 in July.

- + Was ranked by *Baseball America* as a Top 50 prospect in the minors for four consecutive seasons (2014-17), including No. 16 entering the 2015 season and No. 14 entering the 2016 season...is 45-21 with a 2.02 ERA (593.1-IP, 133-ER) and 785 SO over parts of six minor league seasons, and 19-6 with a 1.95 ERA (245-IP, 53-ER) and 321 SO over three seasons at the Triple-A level.
- + Despite spending the first two months of last season in the Pirates rotation, his 140 SO for Triple-A Indianapolis ranked 3rd in the International League behind Durham's **Ryan Yarbrough** (159) and **Brent Honeywell** (152).

**MIX & MATCH**—Will become the 15th starting pitcher used by the Rays this season, most in the majors and a club record, passing 2003 and 2004...the Rays used eight starters all of last season—in fact, the 15 starters this season is more than their total from the previous three seasons combined (14).

- + Will become the 31st pitcher used by the Rays this season, passing 2017 for the most in a single season in franchise history.

**ON THE CLOCK**—Was selected by the Pirates in the fifth round of the 2011 June Draft out of William S. Hart High School in Santa Clarita, Calif.—the same school that produced former Rays pitcher **James Shields**.

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

- to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.
- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
