## NATIONALS NEWS

### NICE WIN

The Washington Nationals topped the St. Louis Cardinals, 4-3, in come-from-behind, walk-off fashion on Monday afternoon...**Bryce Harper**, who tied the game in the ninth inning with this 31st home run of the season, lifted a sacrifice fly to left field to plate **Michael A. Taylor** in the 10th to propel the Nationals to the win... It was Washington's 23rd come-from-behind win and fifth walk-off win of the season.

### ROSTER MOVES

The Nationals made the following roster moves Tuesday:

- Recalled outfielder **Victor Robles**, infielder **Adrian Sanchez** and right-handed pitcher **Austin Voth** from Triple-A Syracuse
- Returned from rehab and reinstated right-handed pitcher **Erick Fedde** and right-handed pitcher **Joe Ross**
- Selected the contract of right-handed pitcher **Kyle McGowin** from Triple-A Syracuse
- Outrighted left-handed pitcher **Tommy Milone** to Triple-A Syracuse

### SECOND HALF HARPER

**Bryce Harper** clubbed his 31st home run of the season on Monday afternoon, in addition to drawing three walks...Since the All-Star break, he is hitting .319 with 12 doubles, eight home runs, 33 RBI, 23 walks, five stolen bases and 30 runs scored in 41 games.

- In the season's second "half," Harper ranks in the National League in RBI (2nd, 33), doubles (T4th, 12), runs (5th, 30), on-base percentage (6th, .420) and OPS (11th, .995).
- On the season, he ranks in the NL in homers (T2nd, 31), RBI (7th, 87) and OBP (9th, .381).

### DOING JUAN SOTO THINGS

**Juan Soto** has hit safely in eight of his last 10 games and is hitting .417 (15-for-36) with two doubles, one homer, eight RBI, seven walks and five runs scored during this stretch...He recorded his fifth three-walk game of the season.

- Soto leads all MLB rookies (min. 390 PA) in on-base percentage (.419) and OPS (.936).
- He leads all National League rookies (min. 390 PA) in slugging percentage (.517) and batting average (.302).
- Even though he was called up on May 20, he ranks among National League rookies in walks (1st, 66), runs (2nd, 63), RBI (2nd, 53), home runs (3rd, 16), doubles (T3rd, 20) and hits (T3rd, 98).
- Since May 15 (the first game in his game log, due to the suspended game vs. NYY), Soto ranks among all National League hitters in walks (T3rd, 66), OBP (3rd, .419), runs (5th, 63) and OPS (6th, .936).
- Among all NL hitters (min. 390 PA), he ranks in OBP (1st, .419), OPS (5th, .936), AVG (8th, .302) and SLG (11th, .517).

### TURNING THE HITS

**Trea Turner** has hit safely in 11 of his last 13 games dating to Aug. 21... During this stretch, he is 17-for-55 (.309) with two doubles, two homers, five RBI, five walks, three stolen bases and nine runs scored...Turner has not been held hitless in back-to-back games since Aug. 4-5.

- Turner leads the Nationals with 39 multi-hit games this season and his career-high 152 hits are tied for eighth in the National League.

### STATUS CHECK

Since the All-Star break, Washington's offense ranks in the National League in on-base percentage (1st, .341), slugging percentage (2nd, .444), runs (T1st, 218), batting average (2nd, .267), stolen bases (3rd, 29), doubles (2nd, 80) and walks (3rd, 148).

### SAVING GRACE

In 23 outings dating to July 4, **Matt Grace** has pitched to a 1.78 ERA (5 ER/25.1 IP) while striking out 23 batters and issuing just six walks...He has surrendered just five extra-base hits during this stretch (4 2B, HR).

- Among National League left-handed relievers, Grace ranks in walks per 9.0 IP (4th, 1.94), strikeout-to-walk ratio (8th, 4.00), opp. OBP (8th, .286) and WHIP (10th, 1.14).

## NATIONALS HISTORY

### September 4 (7-4 on this date)

2006 - **Ramon Ortiz** took a no-hit bid into the ninth inning of an eventual 4-1 win vs. St. Louis. Ortiz's bid for history was ended by **Aaron Miles**' clean single to left-center to lead off the ninth. In all, Ortiz allowed one run on two hits in 8.2 innings. Ortiz was then touched for an **Albert Pujols**' solo homer with two outs in the ninth. At the plate, Ortiz posted two hits, including his first career home run, a solo shot in the eighth inning off **Jorge Sosa**.

## DAVE MARTINEZ

Nationals manager **Dave Martinez** was named the seventh field manager in Nationals history on Oct. 30, 2017. He joined the Nationals for what will be his 30th season in professional baseball. A 16-year Major League outfielder, Martinez has been a Major League coach for the last 10 seasons, serving as Cubs manager **Joe Maddon**'s bench coach and right-hand man in Chicago (2015-17) as well as Tampa Bay (2008-14). This is the first Major League managerial assignment of Martinez's career.

## #23 - ERICK FEDDE - RHP

Former first-round pick (No. 18) in the 2014 First-Year Player Draft has provided depth to Washington's starting rotation since making his debut in 2017...Has made three starts in his Major League career...Entered the 2018 season rated as the No. 3 prospect in Washington's Minor League system per Baseball America...As a starter, has recorded 8.7 strikeouts per nine innings across 60 career Minor League starts.

**AGAINST THE CARDINALS:** Has never faced the St. Louis Cardinals.

**LAST START:** Was removed from the game after 1.0 IP on July 4 in Washington's 3-0 loss to the Boston Red Sox.

### 2018 NOTES

- Made three rehab starts before returning to the active roster...Recorded a 2.45 ERA (4 ER/14.2 IP) with 13 strikeouts against five walks.
- Allowed just three Triple-A home runs in 14 starts for the Chiefs...All three homers came on May 2 at Lehigh Valley.
- Did not issue a walk in his previous two Minor League starts prior to his promotion on June 13...Has posted a 4.07 strikeout-to-walk ratio in 11 Triple-A starts (61 SO/15 BB).
- He tossed 5.0 innings giving up four runs on six hits, while walking one and striking out three against the New York Yankees on June 13 ...Did not earn a decision in the Nationals 5-4 win over the Yankees.
- Made his first MLB start of the season on May 23 vs. San Diego...Allowed three earned runs on six hits in 5.2 innings of work as the Nationals fell to the Padres, 3-1...Struck out six batters while walking just one.
- Began the season with Triple-A Syracuse...Made eight starts, going 1-1 with 4.35 ERA (20 ER/ 41.1 IP) before being recalled on May 23.
- On May 18 vs. Lehigh Valley (PHI), tossed 6.2 innings, allowing one unearned run on four hits...Struck out six and walked two.
- Fanned a season-high 10 batters on May 7 vs. Scranton-Wilkes/Barre (NYY).
- Started the season strong, allowing three earned runs in 15.0 IP (1.80 ERA) across his first three starts.
- Tossed shutout appearances on April 8 at Scranton-Wilkes/Barre (5.0 IP, 4 H, BB, 2 SO) and April 20 at Louisville (5.0 IP, 2 H, BB 7 SO).

### 2017 NOTES

- Began the season with Double-A Harrisburg before being promoted to Triple-A Syracuse on June 13...Made seven starts for Harrisburg (2-3, 3.16 ERA, 35 SO, 14 BB, 3 HR) and 10 appearances out of the bullpen (1-0, 2.63 ERA, 19 SO, 4 BB, HR).
- Began his stint with Syracuse in the bullpen (6 G, 1-0, 3.86 ERA, 7 SO, BB) before moving to the rotation (6 GS, 0-2, 5.11 ERA, 18 SO, 4 BB).
- Had his contract selected from Syracuse on July 30...Made his MLB debut that day against Colorado (4.0 IP, 10 H, 7 ER, 2 BB, 3 SO).
- In his second start, Aug. 6 at CHI, struck out seven batters in 5.1 innings of work...Enjoyed four MLB stints with Washington.
- Placed on the 60-day DL on Sept. 4 with a right forearm flexor strain, ending his 2017 season.

### 2016 NOTES

- Went 8-5 with a 3.12 ERA in 23 games (22 starts) between Single-A Potomac and Double-A Harrisburg.
- Ranked second among Nationals farmhands in ERA (3.12) and fourth in strikeouts (123).
- Posted a 4.24 strikeout-to-walk ratio (123 SO/29 BB).
- Was named Carolina League Pitcher of the Week on July 17.
- From May 23 to Aug. 5, posted a 0.62 ERA (4 ER/57.2 IP), struck out 60 batters and walked 10 while posting a 4-1 record over 11 games (10 starts).
- Entered the season rated as the No. 82 prospect in all of baseball, according to *Baseball America*...For the second straight season, boasted the "Best Slider" in the organization, per BA.

- Pronounced fed-EE...Graduated from Las Vegas High School...Attended the University of Nevada-Las Vegas.
- Was named the 2014 Mountain West Pitcher of the Year and to the All-Mountain West First Team...Named a Louisville Slugger Second-Team All American by Collegiate Baseball and to the midseason Golden Spikes Award watch list.
- A graduate of Las Vegas High School where he played alongside Nationals outfielder Bryce Harper... Was also an all-state soccer player and helped lead LVHS to a soccer state championship in 2009... Was selected by SDP in the 24th round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft but chose to attend UNLV.
