NATIONALS NEWS

WHISPERING SWEEP NOTHINGS

The Washington Nationals swept the Chicago Cubs in Saturday's doubleheader, taking Game 1, 10-3 and coming back to win Game 2, 6-5...It was Washington's first doubleheader sweep since Oct. 3, 2015 at NYM.

- **Max Scherzer** was the story of Game 1...He tossed his second complete game of the season and 10th of his career, striking out 11 batters while allowing three earned runs on nine hits...He did not walk a batter.
- Trailing 4-0 in the bottom of the fourth inning, the Nationals clawed their way back, eventually taking the lead in the seventh inning on a two-run home run by **Bryce Harper**, giving Washington the 6-5 lead.

ON-BASE MACHINE

Bryce Harper reached base safely in seven of his eight plate appearances during the doubleheader, going 2-for-3 with a home run, two RBI, five walks and three runs scored...Including yesterday, he has reached base safely in 22 of his last 33 plate appearances dating to Sept. 1 vs. Milwaukee (8th inn.).

- Harper has reached base safely in 12 straight games dating to Aug. 25...He has a .526 OBP (11 H, 19 BB) and just nine strikeouts.
- Since the All-Star break, Harper ranks in the National League in doubles (T2nd, 14), RBI (2nd, 37), OBP (3rd, .448), runs (4th, 35), OPS (6th, 1.041) and SLG (10th, .594).
- On the season, he ranks in the NL in homers (T3rd, 32), RBI (T6th, 91), OBP (5th, .391), OPS (8th, .899) and SLG (10th, .508).

DOING JUAN SOTO THINGS

Juan Soto has hit safely in 11 of his last 14 games, hitting .358 (19-for-53) with three doubles, one HR, 11 RBI, 10 walks and six runs scored.

- Soto leads all MLB rookies (min. 400 PA) in on-base percentage (.416) and OPS (.922).
- He leads all National League rookies (min. 400 PA) in slugging percentage (.506) and batting average (.298).
- Even though he was called up on May 20, he ranks among National League rookies in walks (1st, 69), runs (T2nd, 64), RBI (2nd, 56), home runs (3rd, 16), doubles (3rd, 21) and hits (4th, 102).
- Since May 15 (the first game in his game log, due to the suspended game vs. NYY), Soto ranks among all National League hitters in walks (T3rd, 69), OBP (3rd, .416), runs (5th, 64) and OPS (7th, .922).
- Among all NL hitters (min. 400 PA), he ranks in OBP (2nd, .416), OPS (7th, .922) and AVG (8th, .298).

ARMS OF NOTE

Some notes on a few members of Washington's bullpen that have been offering strong relief as of late:

- **Koda Glover** has tossed scoreless relief in seven straight outings dating to Aug. 26...During this stretch, he has allowed just one hit and issued one walk while striking out three batters in 5.2 innings...Opposing batters are 1-for-18 (.056) against him.
- Since Aug. 22, **Matt Grace** has struck out seven batters without issuing a walk in seven straight scoreless outings (5.0 IP)...Opposing batters are hitting .167 (3-for-18) against him during this stretch.
- **Greg Holland** has pitched to a 0.64 ERA (1 ER/14.0 IP) with 14 strikeouts and a .114 (5-for-44) opp. AVG since joining Washington Aug. 7.

ANTHONY'S SO EXTRA

Anthony Rendon has hit safely in six straight games and has produced at least one extra-base hit in five of the six...During this stretch, he is 10-for-27 (.370) with five doubles, one homer, five RBI, a walk and six runs scored.

- Rendon's 37 doubles this season are tied for fourth in the National League...His career-high for doubles in a season is 41 in 2017.
- He ranks third among National League third basemen in extra-base hits (57) and slugging percentage (.508)
- His .508 slugging percentage ranks 11th in the National League and behind only **Bryce Harper** among Nationals players.

NATIONALS HISTORY

September 9 (6-5 on this date)

2016 — **Trea Turner** sent the Nationals home happy with a 5-4 victory when his two-out, two-strike, 432-foot blast sailed high over the center field wall in the bottom of the ninth inning. It was the first walk-off home run of the rookie's young Major League career (and first he could remember since Little League). The home run, coming on the ninth pitch of Turner's battle with Phillies reliever **Frank Herrmann**, was Turner's second of the game, making it the first multi-homer game of his career and his 26th multi-hit game of the season.

Nationals manager, **Dave Martinez** served as the Cubs bench coach from 2015-2017 where he played an integral role in three Postseason appearances, including Chicago's 2016 World Series Championship...Martinez also made his Major League debut with the Cubs in 1986 and went on to play four seasons with the Cubs (1986-88, 2000)...Bullpen coach **Henry Blanco** served as Chicago's quality assurance coach from 2015-2017.

DAVE MARTINEZ

Nationals manager **Dave Martinez** was named the seventh field manager in Nationals history on Oct. 30, 2017. He joined the Nationals for what will be his 30th season in professional baseball. A 16-year Major League outfielder, Martinez has been a Major League coach for the last 10 seasons, serving as Cubs manager **Joe Maddon's** bench coach and right-hand man in Chicago (2015-17) as well as Tampa Bay (2008-14). This is the first Major League managerial assignment of Martinez's career.

#23 - ERICK FEDDE - RHP

Former first-round pick (No. 18) in the 2014 First-Year Player Draft has provided depth to Washington's starting rotation since making his debut in 2017...Has made three starts in his Major League career...Entered the 2018 season rated as the No. 3 prospect in Washington's Minor League system per Baseball America...As a starter, has recorded 8.7 strikeouts per nine innings across 60 career Minor League starts.

AGAINST THE CUBS: Faced the Cubs in his second career start, Aug. 6, 2017 at CHI...Allowed four earned runs on eight hits with seven strikeouts as the Nationals topped the Cubs, 9-4...He did no factor into the decision.

LAST START: Returned to action after missing two months with right shoulder inflammation...Allowed four earned runs on four hits with two walks and seven strikeouts in 5.0 innings of work in the Nationals' 11-8 loss to the Cardinals.

2018 NOTES

- Made three rehab starts before returning to the active roster on 9/4...Recorded a 2.45 ERA (4 ER/14.2 IP) with 13 strikeouts against five walks.
- Allowed just three Triple-A home runs in 14 starts for the Chiefs...All three homers came on May 2 at Lehigh Valley.
- Did not issue a walk in his previous two Minor League starts prior to his promotion on June 13...Has posted a 4.07 strikeout-to-walk ratio in 11 Triple-A starts (61 SO/15 BB).
- He tossed 5.0 innings giving up four runs on six hits, while walking one and striking out three against the New York Yankees on June 13 ...Did not earn a decision in the Nationals 5-4 win over the Yankees.
- Made his first MLB start of the season on May 23 vs. San Diego...Allowed three earned runs on six hits in 5.2 innings of work as the Nationals fell to the Padres, 3-1...Struck out six batters while walking just one.
- Began the season with Triple-A Syracuse...Made eight starts, going 1-1 with 4.35 ERA (20 ER/ 41.1 IP) before being recalled on May 23.
- On May 18 vs. Lehigh Valley (PHI), tossed 6.2 innings, allowing one unearned run on four hits...Struck out six and walked two.
- Fanned a season-high 10 batters on May 7 vs. Scranton-Wilkes/Barre (NYY).
- Started the season strong, allowing three earned runs in 15.0 IP (1.80 ERA) across his first three starts.
- Tossed shutout appearances on April 8 at Scranton-Wilkes/Barre (5.0 IP, 4 H, BB, 2 SO) and April 20 at Louisville (5.0 IP, 2 H, BB 7 SO).

2017 NOTES

- Began the season with Double-A Harrisburg before being promoted to Triple-A Syracuse on June 13...Made seven starts for Harrisburg (2-3, 3.16 ERA, 35 SO, 14 BB, 3 HR) and 10 appearances out of the bullpen (1-0, 2.63 ERA, 19 SO, 4 BB, HR).
- Began his stint with Syracuse in the bullpen (6 G, 1-0, 3.86 ERA, 7 SO, BB) before moving to the rotation (6 GS, 0-2, 5.11 ERA, 18 SO, 4 BB).
- Had his contract selected from Syracuse on July 30...Made his MLB debut that day against Colorado (4.0 IP, 10 H, 7 ER, 2 BB, 3 SO).
- In his second start, Aug. 6 at CHI, struck out seven batters in 5.1 innings of work...Enjoyed four MLB stints with Washington.
- Placed on the 60-day DL on Sept. 4 with a right forearm flexor strain, ending his 2017 season.

2016 NOTES

- Went 8-5 with a 3.12 ERA in 23 games (22 starts) between Single-A Potomac and Double-A Harrisburg.
- Ranked second among Nationals farmhands in ERA (3.12) and fourth in strikeouts (123).
- Posted a 4.24 strikeout-to-walk ratio (123 SO/29 BB).
- Was named Carolina League Pitcher of the Week on July 17.
- From May 23 to Aug. 5, posted a 0.62 ERA (4 ER/57.2 IP), struck out 60 batters and walked 10 while posting a 4-1 record over 11 games (10 starts).
- Entered the season rated as the No. 82 prospect in all of baseball, according to *Baseball America*...For the second straight season, boasted the "Best Slider" in the organization, per BA.

- Pronounced fed-EE...Graduated from Las Vegas High School...Attended the University of Nevada-Las Vegas.
- Was named the 2014 Mountain West Pitcher of the Year and to the All-Mountain West First Team...Named a Louisville Slugger Second-Team All American by Collegiate Baseball and to the midseason Golden Spikes Award watch list.
- A graduate of Las Vegas High School where he played alongside Nationals outfielder Bryce Harper.
