2018 A.L. DIVISION SERIES WORKOUT DAY NOTES HOUSTON ASTROS (2-0) vs. CLEVELAND INDIANS (0-2) ALDS Game 3 Preview » Sunday, October 7, 2018 » Progressive Field

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

» The Indians brought the tying run to the plate in the 7th, 8th and 9th innings but fell 3-1 in Game 2 of the ALDS, giving Houston victories in both games at Minute Maid Park.

» For a second straight game, Cleveland was held to just three hits on the afternoon...**FRANCISCO LINDOR** gave Cleveland a 1-0 lead in the top of the 3rd inning with a solo homer, the first extra-base hit by a Tribe hitter this Postseason...**EDWIN ENCARNACION** (1-3) and **MELKY CARRERA** (1-3) both singled to collect the Tribe's other base hits.

» **CARLOS CARRASCO** was saddled with the loss despite leaving with a 1-0 lead...after holding the Astros scoreless through 5.0 innings, he allowed an infield single and a walk in the top of the 6th before departing...a two-run double off **ANDREW MILLER** by **Marwin González** allowed both baserunners to score...snapped Carrasco's career-opening Postseason scoreless streak at 10.2 innings, tied with **Gene Bearden** for the 3rd-longest in club history (**Duster Mails** - 15.2IP, **COREY KLUBER** - 15.1IP).

LIVE TO FIGHT ANOTHER DAY

» The Indians' loss yesterday afternoon puts them at an 0-2 deficit for just the second time in 10 ALDS appearances...they previously lost the first two contests in the 1996 ALDS vs. Baltimore...after winning Game 3 of that series at Jacobs Field, Cleveland fell in Game 4 to drop the series, three games to one.

» The Tribe has lost the first two games of a Postseason series just two other times: the 1954 World Series vs. New York-NL (lost in four games) and the 1995 World Series vs. Atlanta (lost in six games)...the 1954 World Series loss to the Giants remains Cleveland's only time ever swept in a Postseason series.

» Cleveland holds an all-time franchise record of 12-8 (.600) in Game 3 of a Postseason series...the Tribe's loss at Yankee Stadium in last year's ALDS snapped a four-game win streak by the Indians in Game 3s.

GOTTA HAVE SUNSHINE

» **MIKE CLEVINGER** enjoyed his finest season at the Major League level in 2018, setting new career highs in innings pitched (200.0, 6th), strikeouts (207, 10th) and wins (13)...marked his first career season reaching the 200 mark in both innings and strikeouts.

» Tomorrow afternoon will mark Clevinger's first career Postseason start, as well as his seventh overall October appearance...his six previous playoff outings came in relief, where he posted no record with a 6.43 ERA (5ER/7.0IP).

» Clevinger made two starts vs. Houston in the 2018 regular season, going 0-2 with a 6.17 ERA (8ER/11.2IP)...one of his most memorable career starts came in a victory at Minute Maid Park on May 20, 2017, where he carried a no-hit bid into the 7th inning (7.0+IP, 2H, 0R, 2BB, 8K) in a 3-0 Tribe win.

THE STORY OF OCTOBER | CLEVELAND POSTSEASON HISTORY

» Cleveland has gone 56-52 (.519) all-time in Postseason games, the 5th-highest winning pct. of any A.L. team since 1901 and 9th-highest by any team in the Majors...Cleveland's 108 Postseason games are 5th-most played by any A.L. team since 1901, 10th-most in the Majors.

» Cleveland's longest Postseason winning streak is 6 games (started 2016 PS 6-0, Oct. 6-17), while longest losing streak is its active five-game skid which began on October 8, 2017 (ALDS Game 3 at NYY).

» Cleveland has appeared in the World Series on six separate occasions, winning titles in 1920 (5-2 over Brooklyn Robins) & 1948 (4-2 over Boston Braves)...Tribe came up on the losing end in Fall Classics played in 1954 (4-0 to NY Giants), 1995 (4-2 to Atlanta), 1997 (4-3 to Florida) & 2016 (4-3 to Chicago-NL)...the 1903 World Series is considered to be Major League Baseball's first modern installment of the event.

THAT FIRST STEP | INDIANS ALDS HISTORY

» Cleveland is making its 10th appearance in the ALDS, 3rd-most all-time among A.L. teams behind only New York-AL (21) & Boston (13)...only N.L. teams with more Division Series appearances than the Indians are Atlanta (14), Los Angeles-NL (13) and St. Louis (13)...Houston has 10 combined DS appearances between the N.L. (7) & A.L. (3)...these numbers include 2018 match-ups...the Division Series was first implemented as a solution to the 1981 mid-season strike, but did not resurface again until 1995.

» Combining all ALDS & NLDS, Cleveland's 40 Division Series games played are 6th-most by any MLB team behind the Yankees (83), Braves (52), Cardinals (51), Dodgers (47) and Red Sox (46), 3rd-most by any A.L. team...the Indians have gone 22-18 (.550) all-time in those 40 ALDS games...Tribe's 22 DS wins are 2nd-most in the A.L. & 5th-most in MLB behind the Yankees (48), Cardinals (33), Braves (27) & Dodgers (24).

» The Indians have won 5 of the 9 ALDS they have played all-time ('95, '97, '98, '07, '16)...Cleveland has had home field advantage in the ALDS six times ('95, '98, '99, '07, '16, '17), going 4-2 in those series; club is 1-2 when opponent has home field in ALDS.

» Four of the Tribe's ALDS appearances have gone 5 games ('97, '99, '01, '17), with Cleveland winning just one of those...three have gone 4 games (2-1: '96, '98, '07), while two were three-game sweeps ('95, '16, both wins).

BACK-TO-BACK-TO-BACK DIVISION CHAMPS

» The Cleveland Indians won their third consecutive A.L. Central title in 2018, marking their 10th overall since the 1994 realignment...Indians won the first ever A.L. Central crown in '95, adding the others in '96, '97, '98, '99, '01, '07, '16 & '17...marks the fourth time in six seasons that Cleveland has earned a Postseason berth (also 2013 A.L. WC Game, 2016 World Series, 2017 ALDS).

» Cleveland's 10 A.L. Central titles are most by any of the five current members, followed by Minnesota (6), Detroit (4), Chicago-AL (3) and Kansas City (1)...their active run of three straight division titles is the 2nd-longest in franchise history, behind their streak of five consecutive A.L. Central crowns from 1995-1999.

» Tribe finished with a 13.0-game lead over 2nd-place Minnesota, holding the division lead for each of the final 163 days of the season (from April 21 onward)...overall, the Tribe spent 168 total days in 1st place, their most in a single season since logging 180 days at the top in 1999.

BRINGING IT ALL BACK HOME

» The Tribe's ALDS matchup vs. Houston shifts to Progressive Field, where the Indians have gone 28-18 (.609) in 46 all-time Postseason contests...since this ballpark opened in 1994, it has hosted the 2nd-most Postseason games of any active MLB park, trailing only Fenway Park (47)...Progressive Field ranks 4th among all venues in that span, behind old Yankee Stadium (63) and Turner Field (53).

» Cleveland's .609 Postseason winning percentage at home since 1994 is T4th in the American League over that span.

» The Tribe posted a 49-32 (.605) record at home during the 2018 regular season, tied for the 5th-best record in the American League and 7th-best in MLB...since Terry Francona became manager in 2013, Cleveland's 289-196 (.596) home record is the best in the A.L. over that span and 2nd-best in MLB (Los Angeles-NL: 302-185, .620).

FRANKIE GOES DEEP

» FRANCISCO LINDOR provided the Tribe's only run yesterday afternoon, belting a 3rd-inning solo homer...marked his fourth career Postseason homer (solo, 2016 ALDS Game 1 vs. BOS; two-run, 2016 ALCS Game 1 vs. TOR; grand slam, 2017 ALDS Game 2 vs. NYY).

» Lindor matched JASON KIPNIS, ROBERTO PÉREZ and Carlos Santana for 6th place on the franchise leaderboard for Postseason home runs...Kenny Lofton and Sandy Alomar Jr. share 4th place with five homers each, while Jim Thome leads all Indians with 17.

» Lindor also became just the third shortstop in MLB history to homer in three consecutive Postseasons (2016-18)...prior to Lindor, Pittsburgh's Jay Bell hit NLCS homers in 1990, 1991 and 1992, while New York-AL's Derek Jeter homered in eight straight Octobers from 1999-2006.

FIRST-TIME FOES

» Cleveland & Houston are contesting their first-ever Postseason matchup, in a battle between the last two winners of the A.L. pennant.

» This ALDS matchup represents just the fourth Postseason series in American League history featuring the two most recent pennant winners...the 1973 ALCS featured Baltimore (1971 A.L. champions) and Oakland (1972), while Cleveland (1995, 1997) and New York-AL (1996) faced each other in the same manner in both the 1997 ALDS and 1998 ALCS...the rare feat has also occurred five times on the National League side, most recently in the 2016 Wild Card Game between San Francisco (2014) and New York-NL (2015).

» Houston is the 12th different franchise that Cleveland has played in the Postseason...the Indians hold a 6-5 record in their first-ever playoff series against an opponent.

HOUSTON, WE HAVE A MATCHUP

» Cleveland went 3-4 in their regular-season series vs. Houston, going 1-2 in a series at Minute Maid Park (May 18-20) and 2-2 in a four-game set at Progressive Field (May 24-27)...despite being outscored 45-29 across the seven contests, Cleveland was victorious in the final two games, punctuated on May 27 by a GREG ALLEN walk-off homer in the bottom of the 14th inning that gave the Tribe a dramatic 10-9 win.

» Since Terry Francona became Tribe manager in 2013, the Indians have gone 27-14 (.659) in the regular season vs. the Astros.

» EDWIN ENCARNACION paced Tribe hitters, batting .346 (9-26) in seven games vs. Houston with two homers, two doubles, five RBI and five runs scored...TREVOR BAUER is 7-0 with a 3.18 ERA (18ER/51.0IP) in eight career regular-season starts vs. the Astros.

ROTATION DOMINATION

» The Indians' most consistent force throughout the 2018 regular season was dominant starting pitching...the rotation posted a 76-42 (.644) record with a 3.39 ERA, leading the Majors in starter wins and finishing third in starter ERA (Houston - 3.16; Los Angeles-NL - 3.19)...Cleveland was one of just two teams in MLB (with Houston) claiming five pitchers with at least 10 wins.

» The Indians became the first team in Major League history to feature four pitchers with at least 200 strikeouts, with CARLOS CARRASCO (231, 4th in A.L.), COREY KLUBER (222, 5th), TREVOR BAUER (221, T6th) and MIKE CLEVINGER (207, 10th) achieving the feat...only four other teams in MLB history have had three such pitchers, including the 2018 Astros (Verlander, Cole, Morton).

» Cleveland starters combined to fan 1,066 batters over the course of the season, equaling their single-season franchise record set in 2017...all 162 games were started by right-handers, marking the second season in club history with no starts by LHP (also 1932).

TRIBE TIDBITS

» JOSÉ RAMÍREZ (39 HR) and FRANCISCO LINDOR (38 HR) each broke the single-season franchise record for home runs by a switch-hitter (Carlos Santana - 34 in 2016), becoming the first pair of switch-hitting teammates in MLB history to each hit 30 homers...Ramirez became the third 30HR/30SB player in franchise history, joining Grady Sizemore (2008) and Joe Carter (1987)...both Ramirez and Lindor have collected 80+ extra-base hits in each of the last two seasons, becoming the first pair of teammates to do so since New York-AL's Joe DiMaggio and Lou Gehrig in 1936-37 (ESPN Stats & Info)...they also became the third-ever pair of MLB teammates to record 35 HR & 25 SB each (1998 Blue Jays: Canseco/Green & 1987 Mets: Johnson/Strawberry).

» Cleveland finished the 2018 season with 135 stolen bases, leading the Majors in steals for the first time in franchise history...four different Indians players (Ramirez, Lindor, Davis, Allen) stole at least 20 bags, the first such Cleveland quartet since the 1911 season.

» Tribe hitters slugged 216 home runs this year, 4th-most in the American League and 6th-most in MLB...marked the team's most longballs in a season since belting 221 in 2000...the club finished with three 30-homer hitters (J. Ramirez, Lindor, Encarnacion) for just the fifth time in franchise history (first since 1999: M. Ramirez, Sexson, Thome).

» For a third straight season, Cleveland's A.L. Central title was facilitated by success within the division...the Tribe finished their 76-game divisional slate with a 49-27 (.645) record, matching the 2016 club for their 2nd-most A.L. Central wins since the division's inception in 1994 (went 50-26 in 2017)...the Indians posted a 2.92 intradivisional ERA, the lowest mark by any MLB team against their own division this season.

MONDAY'S START

» The 27-year-old right-hander is slated to start Game 3 of the 2018 ALDS at Progressive Field tomorrow afternoon...Clevinger will make his first career playoff start (seventh appearance), owning a 0-0 record and 6.43 ERA (5ER/7.0IP) across his prior outings.
 » Last pitched on September 28 at Kansas City, earning his career-best 13th win of the season in a quality start...held the Royals to one run on three hits, walking none and striking out five batters in 6.2 innings...marked his third career start with zero walks allowed, all of which occurred in 2018.
 » Clevinger had a career year in the Tribe rotation in the 2018 regular season, going 13-8 with a 3.02 ERA (67ER/200.0IP) in 32 starts and finishing the year with the 6th-lowest ERA in the American League...reached the 200-strikeout (207K) and 200-inning (200.0IP) plateaus for the first time in his career...paired with **Corey Kluber** (222K/215.0IP) to mark the fourth time in franchise history that the Indians had two pitchers with 200+ strikeouts and 200.0+ innings pitched.
 » Went 7-3 with a 3.14 ERA (37ER/106.0IP) in 17 regular-season starts at Progressive Field, allowing two-or-fewer runs in each of his final six home outings of the year (4-0, 0.98 ERA, 4ER, 36.2IP).
 » Clevinger made two starts against Houston in the 2018 regular season, compiling an 0-2 record and 6.17 ERA (8ER/11.2IP) across the outings...owns a career 1-3 mark and 3.98 ERA (9ER/20.1IP) in four career starts vs. the Astros.

POSTSEASON CAREER

» Clevinger will make his first career Postseason start and seventh appearance in tomorrow afternoon's contest, going 0-0 with a 6.43 ERA (5ER/7.0IP), with nine walks and six strikeouts across his six prior appearances, all of which came in relief...tomorrow afternoon will also mark his first career start and appearance in the second game of a Postseason series.
 » Made two relief outings in the 2017 ALDS vs. the New York Yankees, appearing in Games 2 & 4...allowed two earned runs on one hit (1HR) in 0.2 innings (2BB, 2K) in the Tribe's 9-8 victory in Game 2 at Progressive Field...tossed 0.2 innings again in Game 4 in the Bronx (1H, 1R, 2BB, 1K), as the Indians lost 7-3.

VS. HOUSTON

» Clevinger owns a career 1-3 record and 3.98 ERA (9ER/20.1IP) in four starts against Houston, with 11 walks allowed and 21 strikeouts.
 » Made two starts vs. the Astros in the 2018 regular season, going 0-2 with a 6.17 ERA (8ER/11.2IP) across the two outings...faced Houston on May 18 at Minute Maid Park, taking the loss despite recording a quality start (6.1IP, 8H, 3R/ER, 1HR, 4BB, 6K)...allowed five runs on seven hits (one home run), with three walks and four strikeouts in 5.1 innings on May 24 at Progressive Field.
 » Two of his four career starts vs. Houston have come at Progressive Field, owning an 0-2 record and 7.71 ERA (6ER/7.0IP) across those outings.

AT PROGRESSIVE FIELD

» Clevinger posted a 7-3 record and 3.14 ERA (37ER/106.0IP) in 17 starts at Progressive Field during the 2018 regular season...ranked 10th in the American League in home ERA and T12th in wins at home.
 » Recorded quality starts in 11 of his 17 home outings, tied with three others for the 4th-most such starts in the American League.
 » Won each of his last four home decisions and allowed two-or-fewer runs in each of his final six home starts of the regular season, posting a 0.98 ERA (4ER/36.2IP) at Progressive Field from August 3 to the end of the year.

SUNSHINE IS BRIGHTEST DURING THE DAY

» Clevinger went 7-2 with a 2.04 ERA (20ER/88.1IP) in 13 daytime starts in the 2018 regular season...ranked 3rd in the American League and 4th in MLB in day ERA, as well as 7th in the A.L. (10th in MLB) in daytime wins.

SECOND HALF STUD

» Clevinger ended the regular season on a strong run, going 6-3 with a 2.31 ERA (20ER/78.0IP) in 13 second-half starts.
 » Owned the 3rd-lowest second-half ERA in the American League (min. 60.0IP), behind Tampa Bay's **Blake Snell** (1.17 ERA) and Boston's **David Price** (2.25 ERA).

A MOST EXCELLENT YEAR

» Clevinger set a number of career bests in the 2018 regular season, including wins (13), starts (32), innings pitched (200.0), strikeouts (207) and WHIP (1.15)...also notched a career-best 21 quality starts, 3rd-most in the American League.
 » Set a new career high with 11 strikeouts on June 14 at Chicago-AL and matched the feat on July 9 vs. Cincinnati...finished the year with five 10+ strikeout starts, the first five such outings of his career.

PICK(OFF) OF THE LITTER

» Clevinger recorded six pickoffs during the regular season, 2nd-most in the American League behind Seattle left-hander **Marco Gonzales** (7), as well as T3rd-most in MLB.
 » Clevinger's six pickoffs are tied with four others for the 4th-highest single-season total by a Tribe hurler in franchise history...also marked the most by a single pitcher since **Tom Candiotti** and **Greg Swindell** each had six in 1989.

2018 HIGHLIGHTS

» Clevinger recorded his 200th strikeout of the season on September 22, becoming the fourth Indians pitcher to reach 200K this year and setting a new Major League record.
 » Held right-handed hitters to a .211 (79-374) batting average, the 2nd-lowest mark among American League pitchers...opponents also hit .195 (55-282) against him with runners on base, the 6th-lowest mark in the A.L.
 » Went 3-1 with a 2.12 ERA (7ER/29.2IP) in five September starts, marking his 2nd-lowest ERA in a single month (min. 5GS), behind Sept./Oct. 2017 (0.99 ERA).
 » Clevinger posted a 3-0 record and 2.21 ERA (9ER/36.2IP) in six August starts, and his 39 punchouts tied his most in a single month, alongside May and July 2018.
 » Collected his 10th win of the season on August 30 vs. Minnesota (6.2IP, 4H, 2R/0ER, 1HR, 1BB, 9K), reaching the 10-win mark for the second time in his career after notching 12 victories in 2017.
 » Tossed his first career complete-game shutout on April 21 at Baltimore, holding the Orioles to two hits and two walks, with three strikeouts across the 9.0-inning effort... his two hits allowed in the game marking the fewest such hits in a complete-game shutout by an Indians starting pitcher since **Carlos Carrasco** allowed one hit in a CGSO at Kansas City on September 25, 2015 (9.0IP, 2BB, 15K).

CAREER SNAPSHOT

» Clevinger is in his fourth season in the Indians organization...was selected in the 4th round (135th overall) by Los Angeles-AL in the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Seminole State College (FL)...acquired by the Indians in exchange for reliever **Vinnie Pestano** on Aug. 7, 2014...added to Cleveland's 40-man roster on November 20, 2015.
 » Made his Major League debut on May 18, 2016 against Cincinnati...did not factor into the decision, tossing 5.1 innings (5H, 4R/ER, 1HR, 1BB, 5K) in the Tribe's 8-7 win...struck out Joey Votto in the first inning for his first career MLB punchout...went 3-3 with a 5.26 ERA 31ER/53.0IP) in 17 games (10 starts) across three stints with the Indians.
