## HERE'S THE STORY...

- ♦ The D-backs' 9-3 start is tied for the best 12-game start in team history (also: 2000, '08)...they have never started 10-3.
- ♦ The D-backs have won 9 consecutive games vs. Dodgers, tied for their third longest winning streak vs. a single opponent in franchise history (16 vs. Reds from 2001-03; 10 vs. Phillies from 1999-2000).
- ♦ Arizona has swept Los Angeles in 3 consecutive series, the first time it has swept an opponent in 3 straight series of 3+ games.
- ♦ The D-backs have opened the season with 4 consecutive series victories for the first time in franchise history...prior to this season, the D-backs had never won more than their first 2 series of a season in a row.
- ♦ The D-backs are 27-10 (.730) vs. NL West opponents since Aug. 25 of last season.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is a career .306/.379 OBP/.564 SLG hitter with 28 home runs and 92 RBI in 114 career games vs. Dodgers, the most homers and RBI by an active player.
- ♦ **A.J. Pollock** has reached base safely in 19 consecutive games vs. Dodgers, hitting .292 (21-for-72)/.386 OBP/.528 SLG with 3 home runs, 11 RBI and 10 walks in that time.

## WEDNESDAY'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs won their fourth consecutive series, defeating the Giants, 7-3.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** went 2-for-4 with a home run (2), a double and 3 RBI...**John Ryan Murphy** also drove in 2 runs going 2-for-3 with a home run and a double...**Ketel Marte** was 3-for-4 with a double, 2 runs scored and a RBI.
- ♦ **Robbie Ray** allowed 3 runs and struck out 6 in 4.2 innings...**Fernando Salas** (2-1) earned the win and **Jorge De La Rosa**, **Yoshihisa Hirano**, **Archie Bradley** and **Brad Boxberger** combined to allow just 1 hit and a walk in 3.1 innings.

- ♦ **Zack Greinke** is 41-16 (.719) all-time vs. NL West, the highest winning pct. all-time within the division:
  - ☐ **BEST WIN PCT. VS. NL WEST:** .719 – Zack Greinke (41-16); .706 – Tommy John (48-20); .698 – Clayton Kershaw (74-32)...min. 50 GS.
- ♦ Was 51-15 with a 2.30 ERA in 92 games over 3 seasons with the Dodgers (2012-15), including a 1.66 ERA in 2015, the second-lowest, single-season mark in club history, behind Rube Marquard's 1.58 ERA in 1916 (w/Brooklyn).

## ROAD WARRIORS

- ♦ Over their last 25 road games since Aug. 21, 2017, the D-backs are 17-8 (.680), the best record in the NL and third best in baseball behind the Indians (.783; 18-5) and Red Sox (.731; 19-7).
- ♦ In that time, Arizona's starting pitching has gone 11-6 with a 2.84 ERA (44 ER in 139.1 IP), 158 strikeouts and 55 walks.

**GREINKE AT A GLANCE**

- ◆ Third season with the D-backs...signed a 6-year free agent contract on Dec. 11, 2015.
- ◆ Won the 2009 AL Cy Young Award and finished runner-up in 2015 race to the Cubs' Jake Arrieta.
- ◆ Is a 4-time All-Star (2009, '14-15, '17), won 3 NL Rawlings® Gold Gloves (2014-16) and earned a Louisville Slugger® Silver Slugger™ in 2013.
- ◆ 1 of 3 pitchers all-time with a Cy Young, Silver Slugger and Gold Glove (also: Fernando Valenzuela and Orel Hershiser).
- ◆ Won 2 ERA titles: 2009 (2.16) & 2015 (1.66)...1.66 ERA was the lowest in the Majors since Atlanta's Greg Maddux (1.63) in 1995...6 career 200+ strikeout seasons (2009, '11-12, '14-15, '17).

**LAST START**

- ◆ Suffered a 5-3 loss @ Cardinals on April 7, allowing 5 runs in 5.0 innings.

**DID YOU KNOW?**

- ◆ Gave his 2009 AL Cy Young Award to his parents but kept the samurai sword Mizuno presented him in recognition of his season.
- ◆ Was a tennis prodigy at 8 years old.
- ◆ Began his career at Rookie level as a shortstop and pitcher...after just 1 workout, he gave his infielder glove to Andres Blanco because he decided to become a pitcher.
- ◆ During his 2004 rookie season with the Royals, lived with Hall of Famer George Brett.
- ◆ Donates 1% of his annual salary to the Arizona Diamondbacks Foundation.

**SNAKEBITES**

- ◆ Has allowed 1 run in each of his last 2 outings vs. Dodgers and has 3 straight quality starts vs. Dodgers, going 1-1 with a 2.29 ERA (5 ER in 19.2 IP), .182 opponent average, 7 walks and 20 strikeouts.
- ◆ Has not issued a walk in his first 2 starts of the season, first back-to-back starts with 0 walks since 2015 (July 4 vs. Mets; July 9 vs. Phillies)...has done it in 3 straight games twice (July 26-Aug. 1, 2007; Aug. 16-20, 2007), 6 straight once (June 24-July 8, 2007) and a career-best 7 straight once (May 17-June 2, 2007).

**VS. DODGERS**

- ◆ In 11 career starts (8 quality), is 4-4 with a 3.74 ERA (28 ER in 67.1 IP), a .265 opponent average, 24 walks and 66 strikeouts.
- ◆ Has 2 quality outings in 4 career starts at Dodger Stadium, most recently on Sept. 5 last season in a 3-1 win (1 ER in 7.0 IP).

**PLAYER PROFILE**

- ◆ Is an avid fantasy football player.
- ◆ 2002 Gatorade National Baseball Player of the Year...played shortstop at Apopka (Fla.) High School before transitioning to starting pitcher his senior season.
- ◆ Committed to Clemson University before signing with the Royals.

**START NOTES**

- ◆ In his first start, March 31 vs. Rockies, tossed 5.2 innings with 1 run on 5 hits with 9 strikeouts but did not figure in a 2-1 loss.

**CLIMBING THE K CHARTS**

- ◆ His 2,245 career strikeouts are tied for sixth among active pitchers with Cole Hamels behind C.C. Sabathia (2,853), Bartolo Colon (2,464), Justin Verlander (2,439), Felix Hernandez (2,350) and John Lackey (2,294).

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN**

- ◆ In his last 11 road starts, since June 1 last season, he is 3-4 with a 3.68 ERA (27 ER in 66.0 IP), .266 opponent average, 16 walks and 66 strikeouts (team is 6-5).

**2018 SPRING TRAINING**

- ◆ Was 2-1 with a 1.04 ERA in 3 starts.

**2017 RECAP**

- ◆ Went 17-7 with a 3.20 ERA, 215 strikeouts and a .230 opponents average...made fourth All-Star team (2009, '14-15, '17), first with Arizona.
- ◆ 5.3 pitchers WAR was third in NL/seventh in Majors with, trailing Chris Sale (8.1), Corey Kluber (7.5), Max Scherzer (5.9), Carlos Carrasco (5.7), Stephen Strasburg (5.6) and Luis Severino (5.5).
- ◆ Fifth career 200.0+ IP/200+ K season tied for third most since 2008 (David Price, Clayton Kershaw, Max Scherzer, Cole Hamels) behind Justin Verlander (7) and Felix Hernandez (6).
- ◆ Rated by *Baseball America* as NL's Best Change-up, Best Control (No. 2) and Best Pitcher (No. 3).
- ◆ Went 14-1 with a 3.24 ERA (46 ER in 127.2 IP) when he received 3+ runs of support, including 11-0 with a 3.16 ERA (29 ER in 82.2 IP) at home.

**#31 • BRAD BOXBERGER • R/R**

**SF Series:** 0 ER/1.0 IP, 2 K

- ◆ Has a 13-game scoreless streak (13.0 IP) dating back to Sept. 9, 2017.
- ◆ Left-handers are 0-for-7 with 1 walk.
- ◆ Named the D-backs closer by manager Torey Lovullo on March 27.
- ◆ Limited to 30 games in 2017 due to a strained right flexor muscle, going 4-4 with a 3.38 ERA and 40 strikeouts (12.27 SO/9.0 IP).
- ◆ Was a 2015 American League All-Star and led the league in saves (41).
- ◆ Acquired from the Rays on Nov. 30, 2017 for RHP Curtis Taylor.

**#25 • ARCHIE BRADLEY • R/R**

**SF Series:** 1-1 SV, 0 ER/2.0 IP, 2 K

- ◆ 7 of his 8 games have been scoreless.
- ◆ Has 1+ strikeout in 8 of his last 9 outings dating back to 2017 (13 SO total).
- ◆ Went 3-3 with 1 save, a 1.73 ERA, 79 strikeouts, 21 walks and a .207 opponents average in 63 games in 2017, his first season as a reliever...ranked among NL relievers in holds (T-2nd, 25), ERA (5th), WHIP (11th, 1.04) and strikeouts (T-11th).
- ◆ Set the single-season, club reliever record in ERA.
- ◆ Recorded the fifth triple by a pitcher (first by a reliever) in Postseason history in the 2017 Wild Card Game vs. Rockies.

**#40 • ANDREW CHAFIN • R/L**

**SF Series:** 1 R-0 ER/1.0 IP, 2 K

- ◆ His 9-game scoreless streak (5.1 IP) dating back to 2017 ended on April 2 vs. Dodgers.
- ◆ In 2017, posted career highs in appearances (71) and strikeouts (61), going 1-0 with a 3.51 ERA and .246 opponents average...his 71 appearances were the second most by a D-backs lefty reliever all time (Randy Choate, 74 in 2004).
- ◆ Ranked among NL relievers in 2017 in inherited runners (4th, 49) and groundball/flyball ratio (T-6th, 3.08).
- ◆ Has lived in a RV during the season since 2016.

**#29 • JORGE DE LA ROSA • L/L**

**SF Series:** HLD, 1 ER/0.2 IP

- ◆ Had an 8-game scoreless streak (5.0 IP) Sept. 22, 2017-April 2, 2018.
- ◆ Is the first D-backs pitcher to appear in the club's first 4 games of a season.
- ◆ Went 3-1 with a 4.21 ERA in a career-high 65 games in 2017, his first as primarily a reliever since 2006 with the Brewers and Royals...lefties hit .194/.253 OBP/.292 SLG.
- ◆ Led the Majors with a 3.0 inherited runners scored pct. (1 IRS/33 IR) in 2017, tied for the lowest pct. since 1974 (also: Wilton Lopez/HOU in 2010)...stranded his first 24 inherited runners to start the season (allowed run on Aug. 18 @ Twins).
- ◆ 1 of 5 Mexican-born pitchers with 100+ wins (104): Fernando Valenzuela (173), Esteban Loaiza (126), Yovani Gallardo (113), Jorge De La Rosa (104), Ismael Valdez (104).

**#66 • YOSHIHISA HIRANO • R/R**

**SF Series:** HLD, 1 ER/2.0 IP, K

- ◆ Has held opponents scoreless in 6 of 8 outings...has issued 1 walk (27 BF).
- ◆ Earned his first Major League win on April 8 vs. Cardinals.
- ◆ Is the second player of Japanese descent to play for the D-backs (also: Takashi Saito).
- ◆ Appeared in 58 games for the Orix Buffaloes of Japan's Nippon Professional Baseball League in 2017, going 3-7 with 29 saves and 2.67 ERA.
- ◆ Led the NPBL in saves (40) in 2014 and earned the league's Most Valuable Middle Reliever honors in 2011...played 12 seasons (2006-17) with Orix, going 48-69 with 156 saves, a 3.10 ERA and 884 strikeouts in 549 appearances (68 starts).
- ◆ Signed a 2-year contract with the D-backs on Jan. 12.

**#30 • T.J. McFARLAND • L/L**

**SF Series:** -

- ◆ Went 4-5 with a 5.33 ERA in a career-high 43 appearances in 2017.
- ◆ Ranked among NL relief leaders last season in groundball pct. (1st, 69.8) and groundball/flyball ratio (2nd, 4.88).
- ◆ Limited lefties to a .222 average (16-for-72) with 3 extra-base hits and 16 strikeouts.
- ◆ Had 16 outings of more than 1.0 inning.
