SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (19-18) vs PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (21-15)

Thursday, May 10, 2018 – Citizens Bank Park – 1:05 EDT – Game 37; Home 20

LHP Ty Blach (3-3, 3.60) vs RHP Vince Velasquez (2-4, 5.14)

- LAST NIGHT'S ACTION:** The Phillies defeated the San Francisco Giants, 11-3, at Citizens Bank Park ... Starter Nick Pivetta (W, 2-2) tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and allowed 4 hits with no walks and 7 strikeouts ... Carlos Santana went 3-for-5 at the plate with a career-high-tying 5 RBI, Maikel Franco stayed hot and blasted another home run and Odubel Herrera extended his on-base streak with 3 walks.
- SWEEPS WEEK:** With a win today, the Phillies will have swept four of the first 12 series this season (others: 4/9-11 vs CIN, 3-0; 4/13-15 at TB, 3-0; 4/19-22 vs PIT, 4-0) ... It would mark the first time the Phillies have swept four or more of their first 12 series of the year since 1993 (5 of first 12) ... In addition, from 2014-17, over a span of 648 games and 1,280 days from Opening Day 2014 to the end of the 2017 season, the Phillies completed a four-game sweep only twice: July 7-10, 2014 at MIL and July 28-31, 2017 at ATL ... If they win today, the Phillies will have two four-game sweeps already this year, in a span of 20 games played and 21 days (other: 4/19-22 vs PIT) ... Finally, the Phillies have not completed a four-game sweep against the Giants since May 13-16, 1982 (4-0 at PHI).
- RAGING BULL:** Odubel Herrera has now reached base safely in a career-best 38 straight games (since 9/27/17), posting a .345/.409/.524 slash line over 164 plate appearances during the streak ... Herrera, who has reached base safely in each of his 34 games to start the season, has the longest on-base streak to begin a season by a major league player since Matt Holliday began the 2015 season reaching base in 45 straight (*Elías*) ... Overall, Herrera's 38-game on-base streak is the longest active streak in baseball is tied for the 8th-longest in Phillies franchise history with Jimmy Rollins (2005-06) and Scott Rolen (1998-99) ... Willie Montanez ranks 7th on the Phillies all-time list with a 40-game on base streak (1974).

- NON-DIVISION DOMINANCE:** The Phillies have gone 7-13 against the National League East this season, but are a combined 14-2 against all other teams (7-0 vs NL Central, 4-2 vs NL West, 3-0 vs AL East) ... Philadelphia's .875 winning percentage outside of their own division is the 2nd-best mark in the majors, trailing only the Yankees, who have gone 16-2 (.889 win %) outside of the American League East (8-0 vs AL Central, 6-1 vs AL West, 1-1 vs NL East).
- CITIZENS BANK SPARK:** Dating back to last season, the Phillies have gone 25-10 in their last 35 games at Citizens Bank Park (9/12-current) and their .714 win percentage over that stretch ranks 3rd in the majors behind the Yankees (.771) and Cubs (.731) ... **This marks the first time the Phillies have won 25 games in a 35 game span at CBP since June 15-September 15, 2011** ... This season, the Phillies own the best home record in the National League at 14-5 (.737 win %) trailing only the Yankees (16-5, .762) for the major league lead ... Philadelphia has a +46 run differential at home, 2nd among all big league clubs behind only the Yankees (+55) ... Offensively, among all NL clubs, the Phils lead the league in runs at home (108 R, next: CHI, 90 R) and home runs (26 HR, next: WSH, 25 HR) ... Individually, Odubel Herrera leads all major league hitters with a .394 batting average at home and Maikel Franco ranks 10th with a .350 mark.
- STAFF NOTES:** The Phillies rotation has allowed 1 ER or none in seven of their last eight starts (since 5/1), posting a combined 2.05 ERA (10 ER, 44.0 IP) in that span ... Subtracting the game on 5/4 at WSH (6 ER, 1.0 IP), the Phillies staff has posted a 0.84 ERA (4 ER, 43.0 IP) in seven of those eight games.
- BE LIKE MAIK:** Over his last 75 plate appearances (4/17-current) **Maikel Franco** is slashing .338/.360/.606 with four doubles, five home runs and a .317 BABIP ... Over his first 48 plate appearances of the season (3/29-4/16), Franco was slashing .214/.271/.429 with two home runs and a .212 BABIP ... His recent tear has raised his season batting average 78 percentage points from .214 to .292 and his OPS 166 percentage points from .699 on 4/16 to .865 entering play today.
- ENTER STRANDMAN:** The Phillies bullpen has successfully stranded 33 of their last 37 inherited runners (4/9-current) and their 89.2% strand rate is easily tops in the majors over that stretch (next: STL, 35-43, 81.4%) ... Overall this season, the Phils pen has stranded 40 of the 52 runners they have inherited and their 76.9% strand rate ranks 4th among all major league bullpens (best: LAA, 81.2 %) ... Individually, **Luis Garcia** has stranded all 12 runners he has inherited.
- PHILLIE SPECIAL:** After getting off to a 1-4 start, the Phillies have gone 20-11 in their last 31 games (4/5-current) and their .645 winning percentage over that span is tops in the National League and ranks 3rd in the majors behind only the Yankees (.733) and Red Sox (.667).

LAST START: 5/5 at WSH: W, 5.0 IP, H, R, 4 BB, 4 SO ... Velasquez vs Roark ... Rhys Hoskins put the Phils in front early working a seven pitch at bat in the first inning that culminated with a 2-run home run ... Maikel Franco would add an insurance run via an RBI single to give the Phils a 3-1 lead ... The bullpen continued to thrive as they tossed 4.0 shutout innings in relief of Velasquez.

TODAY'S START:

- On-Hit Wonder:** His last start was the first of his career he has held the opponent to 1 or 0 hits over 5.0 or more IP ... It was the third start of the season he has allowed just 1 run
- Right On:** Has held RHH to a .115 (3-26) mark with 10 SO in his last 4 starts, and a .196 (11-56) AVG overall this season ... It is the second-lowest mark on the team among starters vs RHH (best: Nola, .174) and 17th out of 81 ML pitchers to face at least 50 RHH this season
- Third Time's a Charm:** Opponents are batting .283 the first time through the lineup, .269 the second time, and .192 the third time against Velasquez this season
- Swing It:** Is 4-for-12 (.364) with a run and RBI at the plate in his first 7 starts ... **His .364 AVG is tops among all ML pitchers (min. 10 PA) by more than 30 points (next closest: Patrick Corbin and German Marquez, .333)** ... In his career, is a .240 hitter (18-75)
- vs NL West:** 3-3, 4.58 ERA (30 ER, 59.0 IP) in 13 games (10 starts) ... 2 of his 4 10+ strikeout games are against NL West clubs

HOME:

- 2018:** 1-2, 6.75 ERA (11 ER, 14.2 IP) in 3 starts
- Career:** 7-10, 4.55 ERA (77 ER, 152.1 IP) in 32 games (27 starts)

2018 SEASON:

- Made a career-best 7 straight starts (8/10/17-4/29/18) issuing 2 or fewer walks
- Had 282 SO through his first 50 career starts, which when achieved was the 7th-most by any ML starter through his first 50 career starts since 2015
- Did not allow a home run in his first 16.2 IP this season
- Made his 3rd consecutive Opening Day roster

2017 SEASON:

- Made his 2nd consecutive Opening Day roster
- Struck out 10 batters in 4.0 innings in his season debut on 4/7 vs WSH ... Was the first Phillies starter to strike out 10 or more batters in the first 4.0 innings of a game since Cole Hamels, 7/24/06 vs ATL ... Was the first Phillie in the modern era (since 1900) to finish a game with 10 or more strikeouts and 4.0 or fewer IP ... It was his 4th career 10+ strikeout game
- Was on the 10-day DL, 5/31-7/17, with a right flexor strain; included rehab assignments to Lehigh Valley (AAA), Reading (AA) and Clearwater (A)
- Had a 2.96 ERA (9 ER, 27.1 IP) in 6 starts from 5/25-8/4
- Stranded 74.4% of the runners he allowed on base
- Placed on the 10-day DL on 8/11 with a right middle finger injury ... Had surgery on right middle finger on 9/6 and missed the remainder of season
- Snapped a career-long 6-game losing streak on 4/26 vs MIA (began on 7/29/16) ... Was tied for the longest active losing streak among ML starters at the time it was broken
