TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Mets continue a three-game series tonight with the 18th meeting between the teams this season...This three-game set will close out the season series between the clubs and is the teams' first matchup since August 2-5, when the Braves took three-of-four games.

A The Braves lead the season set, 13-4, and are one shy of the single-season franchise record for most wins against the Mets...They won 14 games in 1964 and 1966...They won 13 games in 1965, 2005, and 2009.

A Atlanta has won seven of eight games in New York this season, outscoring the Mets, 39-15...The seven wins in New York tie the single-season franchise record; the 2016, 2009, 1968 and 1966 teams also won seven.

A LHP Sean Newcomb is set to face New York for the sixth time in his career and for the third time this season...He is 2-2 with a 2.12 ERA (7 ER/29.2 IP) lifetime against the Mets, and threw 7.0 shutout innings to win, 7-0, in his last start here on May 2.

A RHP Jacob deGrom is set to face the Braves for the sixth time this season...The Mets are 0-5 in his five starts against the Braves this season, despite deGrom having allowing just four runs in 33.0 innings (1.09 ERA)...The Mets have scored a total of seven runs in those five games.

WINS: The Braves have won a season high-tying six consecutive games to move a season-best 21 games over .500 at 89-68...The last time Atlanta was this far over .500 was the end of the 2013 season, when it finished 96-66 and as National League East champions.

A The Braves are looking for the franchise's 18th 90-win season since Major League Baseball went to a 162-game schedule in 1962.

A The 18 total 90-win seasons since 1962 would be tied for the second most in the National League with St. Louis (87-71 this season) and San Francisco...The Dodgers, 88-70 this year, lead with 23 such seasons.

A The Yankees have the most 90-win seasons in all of baseball with 28.

90 WINS?: With one victory in their final five games, the Braves would earn their 90th win of the season... They would become the first National League team to reach 90 wins in a season following three or more consecutive 90-loss seasons since the 1991 Braves.

A That 1991 club went 94-68 and reached the World Series after four consecutive 90-loss seasons.

A The Braves went 67-95 in 2015, 68-93 in 2016 and 72-90 last season.

LATE-GAME BRAVES: The Braves scored all seven of their runs last night following the sixth inning, and they now have 271 such runs this season, the most in the National League...Only Boston (276), Oakland (273) and Houston (273) have more.

A The Braves trailed 3-0 heading into the seventh inning before rallying with seven unanswered runs...The victory was the Braves' 28th this season in which they trailed following the sixth inning... Those are the most such wins in the National League and one off the major league lead of the Oakland Athletics...Research courtesy of STATS.

A The Braves are also tied with the San Francisco Giants for the most last at-bat wins in the National League with 20.

DOUBLES: 2B Ozzie Albies has 39 doubles and is looking to become the third Braves player to reach 40 doubles this season...1B Freddie Freeman collected his 40th two-base hit last week, while teammate Nick Markakis leads the National League with 43 doubles.

A This season marks just the second time in franchise history the Braves have had two players reach 40 doubles in a single season...Jeff Francoeur (40) and Chipper Jones (42) accomplished the feat in 2007.

A The last time a team had three or more players reach 40 doubles in a season was 2011, when Kansas City had four players (Billy Butler, Melky Cabrera, Jeff Francoeur, and Alex Gordon) and Boston had three players (Jacoby Ellsbury, Adrián González, and David Ortiz) reach the mark...The last time a National League team accomplished the feat was 2006, when Garret Atkins, Todd Helton and Matt Holliday all reached 40 doubles for the Colorado Rockies.

VS. THE N.L. EAST: The Braves are 48-23 (.676) against the National League East this season...The club has a +121 run differential against the division this season and have gone 14-3-4 in intradivision series play.

A Only Boston (.704) has a better intradivision record...Intradivision record is the second tie-breaker, after head-to-head record, for determining home-field advantage in two-team tiebreakers... Atlanta tied Chicago in the season series, 3-3.

A The Braves went 33-43 (.434) against their own division last season.

A Since moving to the N.L. East in 1994, the Braves most ever wins against the East was 51 in 2004... Their best record was 35-16 (.686) in 1999...All of Atlanta's remaining games are against their division.

A The club's best ever intradivision record was 55-23 (.705) in 1993, their last in the N.L. West.

A The Braves have not had a winning intradivision record since 2014, when they went 40-36...Over the three previous seasons, the club went 103-124 (.454) against the N.L. East.

Tonight's Game

- A** Makes his 30th start of the season and the 49th of his career.

 - A** Went 8-2 and pitched to a 2.59 ERA (25 ER/87.0 IP) over his first 15 starts of the season...Among N.L. starters with at least 85.0 innings in that span, his ERA ranked fifth lowest.
 - A** In the 14 turns that have followed, is 4-7 with a 5.80 ERA (46 ER/71.1 IP)... His ERA ranks highest among 51 National League pitchers with at least 70.0 innings in that span.
- A** Returns to the mound after starting last on September 16 vs. Washington, 10 days ago...It is the longest break between starts of his career, one day longer than a pair of nine-day layoffs earlier this season and one nine-day spell last year.

 - A** In eight starts this season on four days' rest, is 3-3 with a 5.61 ERA (27 ER/43.1 IP)...When getting five or more days between starts, is 9-6 with a 3.44 ERA (44 ER/115.0 IP).
- A** Faces New York for the sixth time in his career and makes his third start against them this season...Is 2-2 with a 2.12 ERA (7 ER/29.2 IP) over his first five turns.

 - A** Last started against them on May 2 at Citi Field and fired 7.0 scoreless innings, allowing just two hits and three walks while fanning eight.
 - A** His six career starts against the Mets will tie for his most against any one team in the majors...Has also faced Miami six times.
- A** Makes his 11th intradivision start of the season, and is 6-2 with a 2.67 ERA (17 ER/57.1 IP) over his first 10 turns against the N.L. East.

 - A** Lost his first start of the season against his own division, April 2 vs. Washington, while Atlanta also dropped his next start, April 20 vs. New York...Since then, Newcomb is 6-1 with a 1.91 ERA (10 ER/47.0 IP) in eight intradivision starts, and Atlanta is 7-1 as a team.

2018 Recap

- A** His 12 wins are tied for most on the Atlanta staff...Became the first left-hander to win 12 games for Atlanta since Mike Minor won 13 in 2013.

 - A** The Braves logged just 33 wins by left-handed starters from 2014-2017, tied for fifth fewest in the National League.
- A** Did not walk a batter, 9/10 at SF, just the second such start of his career...His 76 walks on the season are tied for seventh most in the majors.

 - A** Has 22 starts in his career in which he walks no more than two batters, and is 10-6 with a 3.53 ERA and a .295 opponents' on-base percentage.
 - A** In 26 career starts in which he walks at least three batters, is 6-12 with a 4.73 ERA while opponents reach base at a .370 clip.
- A** Tossed 6.0 scoreless innings, 8/23 at MIA, to defeat the Marlins 5-0.

 - A** Went 4-0 with a 0.75 ERA (2 ER/24.0 IP) in his four starts against Miami this season...Became the third Atlanta starter in franchise history to beat the Marlins four times in a single season, joining Tom Glavine and Greg Maddux, who both did so in 2002.
- A** Fell one strike shy of a no-hitter, 7/29 vs. LAD...Chris Taylor hit a two-strike single to left with two outs in the ninth for the Dodgers first hit.

 - A** Newcomb's performance was the longest a Braves pitcher took a no-hit attempt since Shelby Miller also went 8.2 no-hit innings on 5/17/15 at Miami...Miller allowed a first-pitch single to Justin Bour.
 - A** Miller and Newcomb are the only two pitchers in Atlanta franchise history to lose a no-hitter with two outs in the ninth inning, according to research from the Elias Sports Bureau.
- A** Held Miami to four hits and one run, 7/23 at Marlins Park...Stopped a season-worst three-game losing streak, and stopped a five-game skid by Atlanta in his starts.

 - A** Went 7-1 with a 2.49 ERA over his first 12 starts of the season...Went 1-4 with a 5.45 ERA in his next seven turns.
- A** Made 19 starts before the All-Star break in his first full major league season, going 8-5 with a 3.51 ERA and 97 strikeouts.
- A** Set career lows in innings pitched (2.2) and pitches (70), 7/3 at NYY...Allowed a then season high-tying five earned runs.
- A** Finished the month of May 5-0 with a 1.54 ERA (6 ER/35.0 IP) and no home runs allowed...Atlanta went 5-1 in his six starts.

 - A** His five wins in the month were most in the majors, while his 1.54 ERA ranked sixth best in the N.L...His batting average against of .158 was the lowest in the league among qualifying pitchers.
- A** Tossed 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed a career-low one hit, 5/13 at MIA...The start was his third consecutive scoreless turn.

 - A** Became the first Braves pitcher over the last 110 seasons to allow two hits or fewer and no runs in three consecutive starts.

- A** Selected by the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim in the first round (15th overall) of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft.
- A** Acquired by the Atlanta Braves along with SS Erick Aybar, RHP Chris Ellis and cash considerations, from the Los Angeles of Anaheim in exchange for SS Andrelton Simmons and C Jose Briceno on 11/12/15.

- Recalled, 8/29, from Triple-A Gwinnett for his fourth stint on the active roster...Was also up from 8/11-18, and on 8/7 and 7/31...Was added to the roster as the 26th man for the doubleheader on 8/7...Had his contract selected, 7/31, and started versus Miami in his major league debut...Optioned to Triple-A Gwinnett postgame that night.
- Has allowed seven earned runs over 3.0 innings in two relief appearances with the Braves...Last pitched for Atlanta on 8/17 vs. COL (1.0 IP, 4 H, 3 R).
- Started vs. MIA, 7/31, in his major league debut...Allowed nine hits and five runs (four earned) over 5.0 innings to earn the win...At the age of 20 years, 352 days, became the youngest left-hander to win his debut for the Braves since Charlie Vaughan did so on September 3, 1966 at the age of 18 years, 332 days.
- Is 6-4 with a 2.72 ERA (34 ER/112.1 IP) in 19 starts for Triple-A Gwinnett this season.

- Allowed a season-most three earned runs, 9/17 vs. STL, after walking two and allowing a three-run homer...Ten of the 20 earned runs he has allowed this season have come via home run, including four of his last five.
- Has a 2.89 ERA in 58 relief appearances for Atlanta this season, the fifth-lowest ERA by a left-handed rookie reliever in franchise history...Jonny Venters' 1.95 ERA in 2010 is lowest.
- Earned his sixth win of the season with 0.2 scoreless innings, 9/20 vs. PHI...His six wins are most among Atlanta relievers and tied for fifth most on the pitching staff.
- Pitched more than 1.0 inning in 14 outings this season, compiling a 0.95 ERA (3 ER/28.1 IP) with 43 strikeouts...Three of his five wins this season have come in outings longer than 1.0 inning.
- Opponents are 10-for-49 (.204) with runners in scoring position, including 4-for-22 (.182) with two outs.
- Set career highs in IP (3.0) and strikeouts (8), 6/2 vs. WSH... Became the first Braves reliever in 110 seasons to strike out at least eight batters in that few innings...MIL's Josh Hader struck out eight in 2.2 IP, 4/30/18 at CIN.

- Has allowed 10 hits, two walks and one hit by pitch in his last 7.2 innings (1.57 WHIP).
- Has allowed just three earned runs in 25 appearances (22.0 IP) since the Braves acquired him on 7/29...Earned his first save with Atlanta, 9/6 at ARI, and has eight holds since being acquired.
- Took his second loss with Atlanta, 8/31 vs. PIT after allowing one unearned run in 0.2 innings...Both of his losses with the Braves, and his two blown saves, have come in games in which he did not allow an earned run.
- Holding right-handed batters to a .243 (36-for-148) average, while lefties are hitting .337/.430/.423 in 122 PA.
- Atlanta acquired him, 7/29, from the Baltimore Orioles in exchange for an international signing slot...Made his Braves debut, 7/30 vs. MIA, with a scoreless eighth inning to earn his fourth hold of the season.
- Went 1-2 with a 4.85 ERA (21 ER/39.0 IP) in 42 games with Baltimore, converting 11-of-13 save chances.
