RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers clinched a series victory against the White Sox with a 6-1 win on Saturday afternoon at Guaranteed Rate Field. Michael Fulmer started for Detroit and earned his first win of the season, throwing 5.1 shutout innings with six hits allowed, three walks and four strikeouts. Miguel Cabrera drove in three runs in the victory and went 1x4, while Dixon Machado was 2x5 with a double and two RBI. Jeimer Candelario also contributed two hits in the win. The Tigers and White Sox conclude their three-game series this afternoon. Following today's game, the seven-game road trip continues with four games in Cleveland (April 9-12).

ROSTER MOVES: Following yesterday's game, the Tigers optioned RHP Warwick Saupold to Triple A Toledo. The Tigers today have reinstated RHP Mike Fiers from the 10-day disabled list.

MIGGY DRIVES 'EM IN: With his three RBI in yesterday's game, Miguel Cabrera now has 118 games with three-or-more RBI in his Tigers career, breaking a tie with Hall of Famer Al Kaline and moving into third on the Tigers all-time list. Only Hank Greenberg (138) and Harry Heilmann (128) have recorded more games with three-or-more RBI in a Tigers uniform. For his Major League career, Cabrera now has 1,621 RBI and is two RBI shy of tying Chipper Jones for 34th in MLB history.

STARTED FROM THE BOTTOM: Dixon Machado has provided a spark at the bottom of the Tigers batting order so far this season. In six games in the ninth position of the batting order, Machado is hitting .320 (8x25) with three runs scored, five doubles and six RBI. He leads all No. 9 hitters with eight hits and six RBI, while he is second with a .320 batting average, fifth with a .520 slugging percentage and seventh with a .346 on-base percentage.

Machado recorded his sixth double of the season in yesterday's game and currently ranks second in the Majors, trailing only Boston's Xander Bogaerts, who has seven doubles.

FILTHY FULMER: Michael Fulmer turned in his second consecutive impressive outing to start the 2018 season yesterday, tossing 5.1 scoreless innings with four strikeouts. In two starts this season, Fulmer has a 1-1 record with a 0.68 ERA (13.1IP/1ER) and seven strikeouts. Dating back to April 29, 2016, Fulmer ranks fifth among active American League starting pitchers (min. 300.0 innings pitched) with a 3.34 ERA.

TIGERS TIDBITS: The four hit batters for the Tigers in yesterday's game were their most in a game since April 30, 1995 at Seattle...The Tigers had a season-high four stolen bases in yesterday's game, their most steals in a game since April 25, 2015 vs. Cleveland, when they swiped five bags...JaCoby Jones had two stolen bases in yesterday's game to record the first multi-stolen base game of his career.

V-MART ON THE MARK VS. THE SOX: Victor Martinez has put up impressive numbers in his career against the White Sox. Entering today's game, Martinez is hitting .325 (241x741) with 40 doubles, 31 home runs and 121 RBI in 209 games vs. Chicago (AL). He leads all active players with 241 hits and 121 RBI vs. the White Sox, while he is second with 31 home runs and a .325 batting average, third with a .403 on-base percentage and ninth with a .505 slugging percentage. In 107

career games at Guaranteed Rate Field, Martinez is batting .342 (132x386) with 17 doubles, 20 home runs and 69 RBI.

TIGERS AND WHITE SOX: With yesterday's win against the White Sox, the Tigers clinched their first series victory at Guaranteed Rate Field since winning two out of three from June 5-7, 2015. Chicago (AL) won the season series last year, going 10-9 against Detroit. It marked the first time the Tigers have lost the season series to the White Sox since 2008. Detroit went 3-6 against the White Sox last season at Guaranteed Rate Field.

ON DECK: Following today's game against the White Sox, the Tigers continue their seven-game road trip tomorrow as they begin a four-game series at Cleveland. Detroit went 6-13 against the Indians last season, including a 3-6 record at Progressive Field.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters today's game with a 3-4 (.429) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,071-1,043 (.507) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

ABOUT MIKE: Fiers will make his Tigers debut this afternoon in the series finale at Chicago (AL).

RECAPPING SPRING TRAINING: Fiers started four games during the Grapefruit League and went 1-3 with a 9.53 ERA (11.1IP/12ER) and seven strikeouts.

VS. CHICAGO (AL): Fiers has pitched well in limited action against the White Sox in his career, posting a 1-0 record with a 0.92 ERA (19.2IP/2ER) and 18 strikeouts. He last faced Chicago (AL) on July 1, 2016 and picked up the win, throwing 6.0 shutout innings with four hits allowed, two walks and four strikeouts.

ON THE ROAD: Fiers has made 67 career appearances, including 57 starts, on the road and has compiled a 20-22 record with a 4.57 ERA (325.0IP/165ER) and 300 strikeouts. In 14 road outings, including 13 starts, last season, Fiers was 5-4 with a 6.08 ERA (66.2IP/45ER) and 67 strikeouts.

AT GUARANTEED RATE FIELD: Fiers' only career start at Guaranteed Rate Field was on June 24, 2012, when he tossed 7.1 scoreless innings and gave up five hits with one walk and seven strikeouts.

AGAINST THE AL CENTRAL: Fiers has made 26 career appearances, including 25 starts, against teams from the American League Central Division and has a 10-5 record with a 2.96 ERA (146.0IP/48ER) and 115 strikeouts. He made seven starts vs. AL Central opponents last season and was 3-2 with a 3.00 ERA (39.0IP/13ER) and 34 strikeouts.

RECORD IN APRIL: Fiers has pitched in 16 games, including 14 as a starter, during the month of April and has posted a 2-6 record with a 5.57 ERA (74.1IP/46ER) and 61 strikeouts. In four April starts last season, Fiers went 0-1 with a 5.12 ERA (19.1IP/11ER) and 16 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Fiers has limited lefthanded batters to a .251 (331x1320) batting average in his career, while righties have hit .256 (376x1466). In 29 appearances last season, lefties hit .256 (74x289) against Fiers, while righties batted .275 (83x302).

TOSSING A NO-NO: Fiers threw a no-hitter as a member of the Houston Astros on August 21, 2015 vs. Los Angeles (NL). It marked the 11th no-hitter in Astros history, the 10th individual no hitter and the first no-hitter in Minute Maid Park history. Following the performance, Fiers was named American League Pitcher of the Week.

PILING UP THE PUNCHOUTS: From 2011-15, Fiers ranked ninth among all Major League pitchers (min. 400.0 innings) with 9.09 strikeouts per nine innings, trailing only Yu Darvish, Stephen Strasburg, Chris Sale, Max Scherzer, Clayton Kershaw, Corey Kluber, Matt Harvey and Francisco Liriano. Fiers has recorded eight double-digit strikeout games in his career, with his last coming on July 16, 2017 vs. Minnesota, when he struck out 11.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Fiers was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on December 8, 2017. He was originally drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 22nd round of the June 2009 MLB First-Year Player Draft. He was acquired by the Astros along with Carlos Gomez and slot number 76 in the 2015-16 international pool in exchange for Josh Hader, Adrian Houser, Brett Phillips and Domingo Santana on July 30, 2015. Fiers played his college baseball at Nova Southeastern University, where he led the nation with 145 strikeouts in 108.2 innings as a senior in 2009. He was inducted into the Nova Southeastern University Athletics Hall of Fame in November, 2017.

LAST TIME OUT: Liriano earned the win in his Tigers debut on Monday vs. Kansas City, allowing one run on four hits with two walks and three strikeouts in 6.2 innings.

VS. CLEVELAND/AT PROGRESSIVE FIELD: Liriano has faced the Indians 20 times in his career, including 15 as a starter, and has a 5-6 record with a 4.19 ERA (86.0IP/40ER) and 97 strikeouts. He made one start against Cleveland last season and did not factor into the decision, giving up seven runs on five hits with three walks in 2.0 innings. In 10 career appearances, including seven starts, at Progressive Field, Liriano has a 2-3 record with a 4.81 ERA (39.1IP/21ER) and 54 strikeouts.
