RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers suffered a 4-1 loss to the Indians on Friday night at Comerica Park. Miguel Cabrera and Leonys Martin each had two hits, while Nicholas Castellanos was 1x4 with a double and a RBI. Michael Fulmer started for Detroit and threw 7.0 strong innings, allowing one run on five hits with seven strikeouts. Shane Greene took the loss after giving up three runs on two hits in the ninth inning. The Tigers and Indians play the second game of their three-game series this afternoon. Following this weekend's series vs. Cleveland, the homestand continues with three games vs. Minnesota (June 12-14).

MIGGY PLAYS THE HITS: Miguel Cabrera had a pair of hits in last night's game to post his 10th multi-hit game of the season. With his two hits last night, Cabrera now has 2,675 hits in his Major League career and is two hits shy of tying Luis Aparicio for 72nd in MLB history (see chart below).

NOT YOUR AVERAGE JOE: Joe Jiménez worked a perfect eighth inning with two strikeouts last night. Jiménez has not allowed an earned run in 14 of his last 15 appearances, posting a 0.63 ERA (14.1IP/1ER) and 21 strikeouts during the span. For the season, Jiménez is tied for the Major League lead with 34 appearances, while he ranks third among American League relievers (min. 30.0 innings pitched) with a 2.30 ERA (31.1IP/8ER).

MARTIN HEATING UP: Leonys Martin had a pair of hits, including a double, last night to record the third multi-hit game in his last five contests. Martin has recorded at least one hit in nine of his 11 games and is batting .310 (13x42) with 10 runs scored, four doubles, one triple, three home runs and six RBI during the stretch.

AT COMERICA PARK: The Tigers are 0-1 on their current six-game homestand, which includes three games vs. Cleveland (0-1) and three games vs. Minnesota (June 12-14). Detroit is in the midst of a stretch that will see them play 18-of-21 games at home. The Tigers are 20-15 at Comerica Park this season, and have won 19 of their last 29 home games. The Tigers are hitting .267 (318x1193) as a team at home, while the pitching staff has compiled a 4.12 ERA (323.0IP/148ER).

TIGERS AND INDIANS: The Tigers are 2-6 against the Indians this season and the two teams have split four games played at Comerica Park. The Indians have won the season series over the Tigers in each of the last two seasons and have gone 33-12 against Detroit since the start of the 2016 season.

CENTRAL FOCUS: The Tigers are 12-15 against American League Central opponents this season. Detroit has gone 5-1 vs. Chicago (AL), 2-6 vs. Cleveland, 1-2 vs. Minnesota and 4-6 vs. Kansas City. Detroit has finished with a winning record against AL Central teams in eight of the last nine seasons.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters today's game with a 30-35 (.462) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,098-1,074 (.506) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 54th in baseball history.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

ABOUT MIKE: Fiers will make his 12th start of the season this afternoon vs. Cleveland.

LAST TIME OUT: Fiers earned his fifth win of the season in the second game of the doubleheader on Monday vs. New York (AL), allowing two runs on six hits with two walks and six strikeouts in 5.2 innings.

VS. CLEVELAND: Fiers has faced the Indians five times in his career, posting a 3-1 record with a 2.22 ERA (28.1IP/7ER) and 19 strikeouts. Fiers has allowed two runs-or-less in each of his five starts vs. Cleveland. He started against the Indians earlier this season on May 14 and picked up the win, giving up one run on three hits with one walk and five strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

AT COMERICA PARK: Fiers has made eight career starts at Comerica Park, compiling a 3-1 record with a 3.33 ERA (46.0IP/17ER) and 32 strikeouts. In six home starts this season, Fiers is 3-1 with a 3.97 ERA (34.0IP/15ER) and 23 strikeouts.

AGAINST THE AL CENTRAL: Fiers has pitched in 31 games, including 30 as a starter, in his career against teams from the American League Central, compiling a 13-5 record with a 3.12 ERA (173.0IP/60ER) and 131 strikeouts. Fiers has made five starts vs. AL Central foes this season and is 3-0 with a 4.00 ERA (27.0IP/12ER) and 16 strikeouts.

RECORD IN JUNE: Fiers has pitched in 28 games, including 23 as a starter, during the month of June, compiling a 10-7 record with a 3.12 ERA (141.1IP/49ER) and 126 strikeouts. In five June starts last season, Fiers went 3-1 with a 2.32 ERA (31.0IP/8ER) and 28 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Fiers has limited lefthanded batters to a .252 (359x1423) batting average in his career, while righties have hit .259 (416x1606) against him. In 11 starts this season, lefties are hitting .272 (28x103), while righthanded batters are hitting .286 (40x140).

IMPRESSIVE TIGERS DEBUT: Fiers made his Tigers debut on April 8 at Chicago (AL) and earned the win, throwing 6.0 shutout innings with three hits allowed, one walk and six strikeouts. According to STATS, LLC, Fiers became the third pitcher in club history to throw 6.0-or-more innings, allow zero runs and strike out six-or-more batters in his Tigers debut, joining Alex Main and Joe Niekro.

TOSSING A NO-NO: Fiers threw a no-hitter as a member of the Houston Astros on August 21, 2015 vs. Los Angeles (NL). It marked the 11th no-hitter in Astros history, the 10th individual no-hitter and the first no-hitter in Minute Maid Park history. Following the performance, Fiers was named American League Pitcher of the Week.

PILING UP THE PUNCHOUTS: From 2011-15, Fiers ranked ninth among all Major League pitchers (min. 400.0 innings) with 9.09 strikeouts per nine innings, trailing only Yu Darvish, Stephen Strasburg, Chris Sale, Max Scherzer, Clayton Kershaw, Corey Kluber, Matt Harvey and Francisco Liriano. Fiers has recorded eight double-digit strikeout games in his career, with his last coming on July 16, 2017 vs. Minnesota, when he struck out 11.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Fiers was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on December 8, 2017. He was originally drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 22nd round of the June 2009 MLB First-Year Player Draft. He was acquired by the Astros along with Carlos Gomez and slot number 76 in the 2015-16 international pool in exchange for Josh Hader, Adrian Houser, Brett Phillips and Domingo Santana on July 30, 2015. Fiers played his college baseball at Nova Southeastern University, where he led the nation with 145 strikeouts in 108.2 innings as a senior in 2009. He was inducted into the Nova Southeastern University Athletics Hall of Fame in November, 2017.

ABOUT ARTIE: Lewicki will make his eighth appearance and second start of the season tomorrow afternoon in the series finale vs. Cleveland.

LAST TIME OUT: Lewicki made his first start of the season for the Tigers on Tuesday at Boston, suffering the loss after giving up four runs, two earned, on five hits with three walks and two strikeouts in 3.2 innings.

VS. CLEVELAND/AT COMERICA PARK: Lewicki's only career outing against the Indians came earlier this season on May 16, when he pitched 4.0 shutout innings with three hits allowed, one walk and four strikeouts. Lewicki has made seven career appearances, including one start, at Comerica Park, compiling a 0-1 record with a 3.72 ERA (19.1IP/8ER) and 12 strikeouts. In four home appearances this season, Lewicki has a 0-0 record with a 0.82 ERA (11.0IP/1ER) and nine strikeouts.

AT TOLEDO: Lewicki has made six starts at Toledo this season, compiling a 3-3 record with a 5.06 ERA (32.0IP/18ER) and 29 strikeouts.
