FISH BITES

The Marlins continue the second half of their homestand with the second of four games against the San Francisco Giants tonight at 7:10 p.m. RHP **Trevor Richards**, making his seventh start of the season for Miami, is facing the Giants for the first time in his career. San Francisco is featuring RHP Chris Stratton for the 14th time this year, with tonight's start being his first career appearance against the Marlins. Miami returned home Friday after going 3-7 on a 10-game road trip to San Diego (1-3), Arizona (0-3) and St. Louis (2-1). The current homestand began with Miami dropping two of three to the San Diego Padres. The Marlins are in a stretch that will see them play 49 games in 52 days from May 25 to the All-Star Break.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

The Marlins had to come back from three deficits and eventually came away with a 7-5 win over the San Francisco Giants. It marked the first time since July 19, 2010 vs. Colorado that the Marlins came back to win with multiple comebacks. After falling behind 1-0 through three innings, Miami scored twice in the fourth on a **Brian Anderson** leadoff solo home run and RBI-triple by **Lewis Brinson**. The Giants plated three runs in the fifth to go up 4-2 before the Marlins scored two in the bottom of the sixth to tie the game. The score didn't remain even for long, as the Giants scored one in the top of the seventh to go back in front. In the bottom of the frame, leadoff batter **Yadiel Rivera** walked and, with one out, Anderson doubled home Rivera. **J.T. Realmuto** followed with a home run to deep center to put Miami in front for good. Miami recorded eight total hits in the game coming from just three players: Anderson went 3x4 with three runs scored, two doubles, one home run and two RBI; Realmuto went 3x4 with three runs scored, a double, home run and two RBI; and Brinson went 2x4 with a triple and two RBI. **Adam Conley** picked up his second win with a scoreless seventh inning, and **Kyle Barraclough** tallied his third save.

VS. SAN FRANCISCO

The Marlins took the 2017 season series, 5-1, sweeping a three-game series at AT&T Park from July 7-9, and taking two of three at Marlins Park from August 14-16. Miami has gone 11-9 against the Giants at Marlins Park since 2012, and owns a 42-51 mark all-time in South Florida. The all-time series is in favor of San Francisco, 106-82.

PRIDE OF THE PANTHERS

Trevor Richards, who attended Drury University in Springfield, Missouri, was the first player from the Drury program to make it to the Majors since starting play after a 30-year hiatus in 2007. Other Drury University products to make it to the Majors were Bill Virdon (St. Louis and Pittsburgh; 1955-68), Ron Kanehl (Mets; 1962-64), and Roy Smalley Jr. (Cubs, Milwaukee Braves, Phillies; 1948-58).

CATCH THIS

Since coming back from the 10-day disabled list on April 17, **J.T. Realmuto** leads all Major League catchers in hits (53), runs (28), doubles (13), and slugging percentage (.528), and is tied for the lead in triples (3). Among National League backstops, he leads in at-bats (176), and average (.301), and is tied for third in RBI (22).

HOT TICKET

Last night **Brian Anderson** went 3x4 with a home run and two doubles to mark his 23rd multi-hit game of the season. He is the ninth Marlins rookie (12th time) to record three-or-more extra-base hits in a single game, and first since Logan Morrison on September 5, 2010 vs. Atlanta. Since April 20, Anderson has hit .339 (62x183) with 19 multi-hit games. His average in that span ranks fifth in the NL, behind league-leaders Brandon Crawford (.369) and Scooter Gennett (.369). He is hitting .486 (17x35) with five doubles, a triple, two home runs and eight RBI over his last nine games.

THE CLAW

Since May 11, **Kyle Barraclough** has made 13 scoreless appearances (12.2 IP) with just one hit allowed (.026 average against). The 12.2 inning scoreless streak is the longest of his career, and is the fifth-longest active streak in the National League, behind Jared Hughes (18.1), Jon Lester (15.0), Yoshihisa Hirano (13.2), and Seth Lugo (13.0). His streak is the third-longest by a Marlins pitcher this season, trailing Caleb Smith's 15.2 (April 22-May 10) and Jarlin Garcia's 14.0 (April 11-23).

ROOKIE LEADER

Brian Anderson has appeared in all 66 games for the Marlins this season - the only rookie to appear in each of his team's games in 2018. Anderson leads all qualified Major League rookies in games, at-bats (248), average (.310), runs (36), hits (77), multi-hit games (23), and on-base percentage (.383); ranks second in walks (24), doubles (18), RBI (32), and slugging percentage (.448); and is tied for third in triples (2).

- Leads all National League players 25-younger in hits, in front of Ozzie Albies (70).
- He has recorded four outfield assists in just 38 games played in right field, leading all rookie outfielders in assists. The four assists are the most by a Marlins rookie since Marcell Ozuna (8) and Jake Marisnick (5) in 2013.
- Is on pace to record 114 hits before the All-Star Break, which would be the most ever recorded by a Marlins rookie and would be the third-most by any Major League rookie since 2000 (Ichiro-133 in 2001; Hideki Matsui-114 in 2003). Alex Gonzalez currently holds the Franchise record with 99 in 1999, while Gaby Sanchez ranks second with 95 in 2010. He is also on pace to record 48 first-half RBI, which would rank as the second-most by a Marlins rookie, behind Dan Uggla (51 in 2006).

STREAKY PETE

Peter O'Brien, a Hialeah, Fla. native who is currently with the Marlins' Double-A affiliate in Jacksonville, homered twice last night to tie a Southern League record by homering in his sixth consecutive game. The only other player in Southern League history to homer in six consecutive games was former Marlin Derrek Lee, who did so for the Memphis Chicks from June 2-8, 1996. O'Brien was acquired in a Minor League trade with the Dodgers in exchange for cash on June 1, 2018. After starting 0x11 in his first three games with the Jumbo Shrimp, O'Brien has hit safely in six straight, with the only hit in each of the first five games being a home run.

YEAR OF THE FAN SWEEPSTAKES

The Marlins, in partnership with AutoNation, America's largest automotive retailer, will be awarding a prize of a 24-month car lease to a select fan tonight, the eighth of 25 dates this season where a fan will drive off with a new car. The "Marlins Year of the Fan Sweepstakes, Driven by AutoNation" is open to any eligible fan in attendance at each select home date. Fans will be eligible for that date's drawing by scanning their valid, digital game ticket, stored on a mobile device, upon entry to Marlins Park prior to the end of the third inning. The 24-month car lease awarded to the winner of each game date's random drawing among all eligible entries will drive away with either a 2018 Ford Focus or 2018 Chevy Cruze. The next Sweepstakes game after tonight will be Tuesday, June 26 vs. Arizona.

Trevor Richards will make his seventh start of the season for Miami tonight - the first of his career against San Francisco - as the clubs meet in Game 2 of this four-game set.

Went 2-0 with 0.75 ERA (12.0 ip/1 er) in four Spring appearances (two starts) with Miami. He had his contract selected on April 2 and made his Major League debut that night against Boston.

He went 0-2 with a 4.94 ERA (23.2 ip/13 er) across five starts in his first stint with the Marlins. Tossed 7.0 shutout innings with just two hits allowed on April 14 vs. Pittsburgh, and tossed 4.2 shutout innings, with a career-high 10 strikeouts, on April 25 at the Dodgers, his final start before being optioned back to NOLA.

In the Pittsburgh start, became the first Marlins rookie starter to work at least 7.0 innings and allow two or fewer hits since Justin Nicolino on September 26, 2015 vs. Atlanta (7.0 ip, 2 h). He became just the 15th pitcher in Club history to do so (22nd time).

Allowed two-or-fewer earned runs in each of his six starts after returning to New Orleans. Tossed a career-high 7.1 innings against Round Rock in his first game back, on May 1. Struck out nine batters in that game, a Minor League season-high that he tied on May 26 at Iowa.

Posted 37 strikeouts against just four walks with the Baby Cakes.

Recalled from New Orleans prior to his last start, on June 7 at St. Louis (L, 5.0 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 so, hr).

Road ERA stands at 5.71 (17.1/11), while home ERA is 3.97 (11.1/5). Allowed career-high six runs in road start at Milwaukee on April 20, before rebounding with the 4.2 shutout innings at the Dodgers in his next start.

On April 8 at Philadelphia, surrendered three runs, six hits, and three walks, with two strikeouts, over 4.0 innings.

Took loss in debut MLB debut vs. Boston, allowing five runs on eight hits and a walk, while striking out five, over 4.1 innings. Surrendered just two hits over first three innings, but was touched for three runs in fourth and two in fifth, leaving with one out and a runner on first.

In 2017, split second affiliated and third professional season between Single-A Jupiter (13 games, 11 starts) and Double-A Jacksonville (14 starts). Combined to go 12-11 with a 2.53 ERA (146.0 ip/41 er) overall and earned Marlins' Minor League Pitcher of the Year honors.

Led all Marlins farmhands in strikeouts (158), ranked second in wins, ERA and WHIP (1.03), and fifth in innings pitched.

Opened campaign at Jupiter, going 7-4, 2.17 (70.2/17) to earn Florida State League Midseason All-Star honors.

Set career high with 11 strikeouts on June 2 at Dunedin, when he allowed just one hit and no walks over 6.0 shutout innings, earning FSL Pitcher of the Week honors for May 29-June 4.

Did not appear in FSL All-Star Game due to starting three days prior (June 14) at St. Lucie, his final start with Jupiter before June 21 promotion to Jumbo Shrimp.

Tossed at least 6.0 innings in seven of last nine starts for Hammerheads, including 6.1 on May 27 vs. Bradenton, his season-high with Jupiter.

Posted 3-0 record with 0.53 ERA (17.0/1) over final three starts with Jupiter.

Won first start with Jacksonville, on June 23 at Jackson (5.1 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, hr, 3 bb, 3 so).

Caleb Smith will make his 14th start of the season tomorrow when the Marlins and Giants play the third game of this four-game set at Marlins Park. It will mark Smith's first career start against San Francisco.

Made first career Opening Day roster after going 0-2 with 5.21 ERA (19.0 ip/11 er) in six Spring outings (two starts). Acquired by Miami this offseason, along with INF Garrett Cooper on November 20, from Yankees.

Leads all MLB rookies in strikeouts (79), ahead of Tyler Mahle (67).

His 79 strikeouts are tied with Scott Olsen (2006) and Dontrelle Willis (2003) for the most by a left-handed rookie in the first half in Club history. They are tied for the second-most overall in Club history, behind only José Fernández (103 in 2013).

Among pitchers with at least 13 starts, ranks fourth in National League (11th in MLB) with a strikeout rate of 29.2% (79/271). He trails only Max Scherzer (38.8), Jacob deGrom (33.3), and Patrick Corbin (31.8) in the NL.

Also among pitchers with at least 13 starts, ranks sixth in the NL (12th in MLB) in hits allowed per 9.0 innings (6.58). Trails only Scherzer (5.51), Aaron Nola (6.30), Patrick Corbin (6.31), Michael Wacha (6.46), and deGrom (6.50) in NL.

Has allowed two-or-fewer runs in seven of his last nine starts. He is 5-4 with a 2.70 ERA (50.0/15) and a .185 AVG against (32x173) in that time.
