That streak is the second longest in MLB history. The Braves last won a playoff round in 2001, sweeping Houston in the NLDS.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Dodgers open their National League Division Series tonight with Game 1 at Dodger Stadium...The clubs met seven times in the regular season, with the Dodgers winning five of the games, and outscoring the Braves by a combined score of 35-18...The Dodgers beat the Braves, 3-games-to-1, in the 2013 NLDS, the last time Atlanta was in the postseason.

A The teams' first series came June 8-10 here in Los Angeles, with the Dodgers winning two of three... The clubs met again, July 25-29 at SunTrust Park, and the Dodgers won the first three before Sean Newcomb carried a no-hitter for 8.2 innings in the final game to help the Braves win, 4-1.

A Since the beginning of 2013, the Braves are 6-16 here at Dodger Stadium, including losing Game 3 and 4 of the NLDS in 2013.

A RHP Mike Foltynewicz is set for his postseason debut tonight, and is facing a Dodgers team that beat him, 4-1, on July 27 at SunTrust Park...The righty, who became the first pitcher in Braves franchise history to have 200 strikeouts and an opponents' average below .200 in a single season, won his only career start at Dodger Stadium, beating Los Angeles, 6-3, on July 20, 2017.

A LHP Hyun-Jin Ryu is scheduled to face the Braves for the first time since the 2014 regular season...The lefty started and went 3.0 innings in Game 3 of the 2013 NLDS in his only postseason appearance against Atlanta, a 13-6 win...Overall, Ryu is 0-1 with a 4.22 ERA (10 ER/21.1 IP) in four games, all starts, against Atlanta.

18 IN '18: The Braves clinched the 18th division title in franchise history this season, beating the Phillies, 5-3 on September 22 to win the National League East...The 18 division titles are tied for the most in major league history with New York (AL)...This season also marks the franchise's 24th postseason berth in the modern era and its first since 2013.

A The Braves won a major league-record 14 consecutive division titles from 1991-2005, with the first three coming as N.L. West champs before moving into the N.L. East in the strike-shortened 1994 season...They also won the West in 1969 and 1982, and the East in 2013.

A The Braves became the first National League team to clinch a playoff berth this season and the third division winner in baseball...Boston won the A.L. East, while Cleveland took the A.L. Central prior to the Braves.

A The Braves clinched the title on September 22, exactly five years to the day of their last division title in 2013...The Braves won the N.L. East that day after second-place Washington lost to Miami during the Braves' 5-2 win at Chicago.

A The Braves also clinched their division titles in 1996 and 1997 on September 22.

THE POSTSEASON: This series will be the Braves' 35th postseason matchup in franchise history, and their first since losing 3-1 in 2013 Division Series to the Los Angeles Dodgers...They are 78-86 (.476) all-time in the postseason, despite having outscored the opposition 657-625 (+32 run differential).

A The Braves have played in 13 division series (6-7), 11 league championship series (5-6), nine World Series (3-6) and one wild card game (0-1).

GAME 1: The Braves are set to play their 34th Game 1 of a playoff round tonight (that total does not include a wild card game loss in 2012), and are 15-18 in these games...They have also lost seven consecutive series openers in the postseason; they last won a Game 1 in 2001 when they swept Houston in the NLDS.

A The Braves are 11-4 in series when they win Game 1 and 3-15 when they drop the opener.

A They last won a series when dropping Game 1 in 1999, when they lost 6-1 vs. Houston in the NLDS before going on to win the next three games...They last lost a series when winning the opener in 1996, when they won the first two games of the World Series at Yankee Stadium, before dropping the next four.

VS. LHP: The Braves are set to face LHP Hyun-Jin Ryu and LHP Clayton Kershaw to open this series, and went 21-26 (.447) against left-handed starters in the regular season this year...They were 69-46 (.600) in games started by a right-hander.

A Despite the losing record against left-handed starters, the Braves hit .269 (426-for-1582) overall against lefties, the third-best mark in baseball...Their .336 on-base percentage was also third best, while their .444 slugging percentage was fourth.

A 1B Freddie Freeman hit .309 (63-for-204) against lefties this season, the second-best mark among left-handed hitters...Only Milwaukee's Christian Yelich was better at .337.

A 2B Ozzie Albies, a switch hitter, compiled a .905 OPS against lefties, and a .695 OPS against righties.

ON THE ROAD: The Braves finished 47-34 (.580) away from SunTrust Park this season, tied for the best road record in the National League with Los Angeles.

A The 47 road wins are the most since the 2004 club also won 47 away from Turner Field.

POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE: Twelve of the 25 players on the Braves' NLDS roster have previous postseason experience, including three who have been on a World Series roster...Five of the players are rookies.

Tonight's Game

- A* Set for his postseason debut in his fifth major league campaign.
- A* Made a career-high 31 starts in the regular season, and set career bests in wins (13), innings (183.0 IP), ERA (2.85) and strikeouts (202)...Went 13-10 and allowed opponents to bat just .195 against him.
 - A* Among qualified N.L. pitchers, ranked among league leaders in complete games (T1st, 2), shutouts (T1st, 1), opponents' batting average (2nd, .195) ERA (6th, 2.85) and strikeouts (6th, 202).
- A* Has faced Los Angeles just twice in his major league career, and is 1-1 with a 5.56 ERA (7 ER/11.1 IP)...Dodgers batters have reached base at a .333 clip.
 - A* Earned the win in his only career start at Dodger Stadium, July 20, 2017... Allowed six hits and three runs over 6.1 innings in Atlanta's 6-3 win.
 - A* Made one start against them this season, July 27, and was touched for six hits and four runs over 5.0 innings to take the loss at SunTrust Park.
- A* Fanned Phillies outfielder Roman Quinn in the end of the third inning in his final start of the season to notch his 200th strikeout...Finished the season fanning 202 batters to become the first Braves pitcher with 200 strikeouts since Javier Vazquez fanned 238 in 2009.
 - A* Since the club moved to Atlanta in 1966, only five different pitchers prior to Foltyniewicz had reached 200 strikeouts in a season: John Smoltz (five times), Phil Niekro (three times), Vazquez (once), Kevin Millwood (once), and Greg Maddux (once).
- A* Allowed one hit over 5.0 innings in his final start of the season, dropping his batting average against to a franchise single season-low .195 (130-for-666)...Foltyniewicz passed Julio Teheran, who had a .196 mark (122-for-623) this season.
 - A* Greg Maddux held the previous record with a .197 mark (147-for-748) set in 1995...Prior to this season, Maddux was the only qualifying Braves pitcher to ever finish a season with a batting average against lower than .200.
 - A* The only National League pitcher with a better mark than Foltyniewicz and Teheran this season was RHP Max Scherzer (.188).

2018 Recap

- A* Had 17 starts this season in which he allowed no more than one run, the second-most such starts in the National League...Jacob deGrom had 18.
- A* Only Greg Maddux had more starts of one run or less in a single season for Atlanta...Maddux set the Atlanta franchise record with 19 such starts in 2002, and he also had 18 starts in 1995.
- A* Was selected to his first major league All-Star Game after going 7-5 with a 2.66 ERA (30 ER/101.2 IP) over 18 games to open the season...Fanned 120 batters over 101.2 innings of work.
 - A* Tossed a scoreless fourth inning in his All-Star Game debut, retiring José Ramírez, Manny Machado and José Abreu, while walking Aaron Judge.
- A* Made his final regular season start at SunTrust Park, 9/22 vs. PHI...Earned the win as Atlanta clinched the N.L. East division title...Finished the season 5-4 with a 3.19 ERA (34 ER/96.0 IP) in his home park.
 - A* Opponents batted just .199 against him at SunTrust Park, logging 66 hits in 345 at-bats.
 - A* Since the Braves moved to Atlanta in 1966, only three pitchers allowed a lower opponents average at home in a single season...Damian Moss set the Atlanta-era record with a .184 average in 2002, while Tom Glavine allowed a .186 mark in 1997 and opponents hit just .189 against John Smoltz at Atlanta-Fulton County Stadium in 1989.
- A* Tossed his second complete game of the season, 9/11 at San Francisco...Held the Giants to six hits and one run on 108 pitches, fanning seven.
 - A* Lost the bid for his second shutout of the season when San Francisco plated its only run of the game in the bottom of the ninth...Shut out Washington on 6/1, the first of his career.
 - A* The complete game was the first for a Braves pitcher on the road since 2016, when Julio Teheran blanked the Mets on June 19.
 - A* Foltyniewicz became the first Atlanta pitcher with two complete games in a single season since Shelby Miller logged two in 2015.
- A* Made six starts in August, and went 3-2 with a 2.09 ERA (9 ER/38.2 IP) and 41 strikeouts.
 - A* His run last month followed five starts in July during which he went 2-3 with a 5.72 ERA (18 ER/28.1 IP).
- A* Threw the first shutout of his major league career, 6/1 vs. Washington...Allowed just two hits and struck out 11.
 - A* Became the seventh pitcher in Atlanta-era history to throw a two-hitter or better with double-digit strikeouts and the first since Greg Maddux fanned 14 Brewers in a two-hit, 1-0 win on May 2, 2001 at Turner Field.

- A* Acquired by the Atlanta Braves along with RHP Andrew Thurman and INF Rio Ruiz from the Houston Astros in exchange for C/OF Evan Gattis and RHP James Hoyt on 1/14/15.

- Makes his third postseason appearance...Was with Baltimore during the 2014 ALDS vs. Detroit and the ALCS vs. Kansas City, as well as the 2016 Wild Card at Toronto...Is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (3.2 IP) in three postseason games.
- Is 1-1 with a 2.29 ERA (5 ER/19.2 IP) in 18 career games against Los Angeles...Last faced them in 2016.
- Atlanta acquired him, 7/29, from the Baltimore Orioles in exchange for an international signing slot...Allowed just four earned runs in 27 appearances (23.2 IP) with Atlanta, pitching to a 1.52 ERA...Went 1-2 with a 4.85 ERA (21 ER/39.0 IP) in 42 games with Baltimore, converting 11-of-13 save chances.
- Has a 1.76 ERA (6 ER/30.2 IP) in 34 appearances against the National League this season...In 35 games against A.L. opponents, went 2-2 with a 5.34 ERA (19 ER/32.0 IP).

- Makes his first postseason roster...Allowed just two hits and one run over 5.0 innings in his only career appearance vs. the Dodgers, a start on 7/28 of this season at SunTrust Park.
- Went 1-4 with a 2.94 ERA (11 ER/33.2 IP) in 14 games with Atlanta this season, including five starts...In nine relief appearances this season, went 0-2 with a 3.75 ERA (5 ER/12.0 IP) and 17 strikeouts...Was 1-2 with a 2.49 ERA in five starts...For his career, has a 2.93 ERA in nine starts and a 4.12 ERA in 14 games in relief.
- Five of his final six appearances of the season were in relief, including each of his last four...Allowed just seven hits and one run over 8.0 innings (1.13 ERA) in that span, fanning 12.
- Allowed just one hit with runners in scoring position on the season, holding opponents to a .033 (1-for-30) average, including an 0-for-14 mark in such situations with two outs.

- Made one career appearance against the Dodgers, 7/6 of last season while with Baltimore...Allowed eight hits and four runs over 5.0 innings in a no-decision.
- Has not pitched in relief since the 2015 season, but has 23 career appearances out of the bullpen...Is 4-2 with a 3.86 ERA (15 ER/35.0 IP) and three holds.
- Atlanta acquired him from the Baltimore Orioles on 7/31 in a six-player trade...Made 10 starts for Atlanta after being acquired, and went 5-3 with a 2.87 ERA (19 ER/59.2 IP).
