SELLOUT SATURDAY: The Dodgers tonight take on the Chicago Cubs in their second and final Cactus League meeting with them this month, following the Cubs' 9-5 victory on Tuesday. During the regular season, the Dodgers travel to Wrigley Field June 18-20 and the Cubbies visit Dodger Stadium from June 25-28. This evening's game is the first night game at Camelback Ranch and is completely sold out. The Dodgers will also play night game's at the ranch on March 14 (vs. COL), March 19 (OAK) and March 22 (LAA). The Dodgers have 17 more exhibition games this spring; including seven at Camelback Ranch on three Spring Training weekends and will head back to Los Angeles for a three-game Freeway Series against the Angels on March 25-27. Following the I-5 matchup, the Dodgers will open the 2018 season on March 29 against the San Francisco Giants at Dodger Stadium.

BACK IN THE WIN COLUMN: Yesterday, the Dodgers downed the Royals, 6-4, at Camelback Ranch behind an 11-hit attack. At the plate, Kyle Farmer belted his second homer of the spring and Andrew Toles went 2-for-2 with a double, two RBI and a run scored. **Kenta Maeda** allowed one run in 3.0 innings while striking out four, while **Tony Cingrani** earned the win by working a scoreless frame in his 2018 Cactus League debut. Non-roster invitees Mark Lowe (1.0 IP) and Zach Neal (1.0) both contributed a scoreless inning in the victory.

- 🔪 Farmer is now hitting .500 (8-for-16) and his fellow backstop **Keibert Ruiz** is batting a scorching .667 (6-for-9) with two RBI.
- 🔪 Toles leads the Dodgers with nine hits and is batting .409 (9-for-22) with two homers and eight RBI. The eight ribbies rank second on the squad, trailing only **Jake Peter** (12).
- 🔪 Dodger outfielder **Matt Kemp** has a six-game hitting streak and is batting .348 (8-for-23) with three homers, six RBI and two doubles.
- 🔪 The Dodgers 28 home runs this spring trail just the Indians (30) and Giants (29) for the most in the Majors.
- 🔪 The Dodgers' 40 doubles this spring lead all Cactus League teams and the offense currently ranks among the top teams in the Majors this spring in hits (152, 8th), runs scored (99, 3rd), slugging percentage (.512, 3rd) and OPS (.856, 5th).
- 🔪 Dodger pitchers have recorded 136 strikeouts this spring, which ranks fourth in the Cactus League, trailing just the Indians (157), Reds (142) and Cubs (138).
- 🔪 Dodger ace **Clayton Kershaw** has fired 6.0 scoreless innings this spring, but don't overlook the relief work of **Pat Venditte** (6.0 IP, 1 ER), **J.T. Chargois** (3.0 scoreless IP), **Justin DeFratus** (6.1 IP, 1 ER) **Ross Stripling** (5.0 IP, 1 ER) and **Brian Moran** (5.1 IP, 1 ER).

CRAFTY LEFTY: Dodger left-hander **Rich Hill** is set to make his second Cactus League start tonight after making his 2018 debut on Monday vs. Cleveland. Hill struck out four and allowed just one run on one hit vs. the Indians as he tunes up for his third season in Dodger Blue. This year will be Hill's 14th in the big leagues and last season he was 12-8 with a 3.32 ERA (50 ER/135.2 IP) in 25 starts. The Massachusetts native struck out 166 batters against just 49 walks, averaging 11.01 strikeout per nine innings and posting a 3.39 strikeout-to-walk ratio. In 119 career starts, he has gone 46-34 with a 3.90 ERA and has limited batters to a .223 average. In 2017, the southpaw held opposing batters to a .203 average, including a .190 mark against right-handed hitters, which ranked sixth lowest in the Majors.

A LOOK BACK: The Dodgers posted a 104-58 record in 2017, becoming the first team in NL West history to win the division in five consecutive seasons. The team earned a World Series berth after defeating the Chicago Cubs in the NLCS, 4 games to 1, and finished the season with their first NL Pennant since 1988.

- 🔪 The Dodgers posted the seventh 100-win season in franchise history (third in Los Angeles history) and first since 1974 (102-60). The Dodgers won 90+ games for the fifth consecutive season, a feat that had only previously been accomplished once in franchise history, 1951-56 (6).
- 🔪 Los Angeles finished with the best record in the Majors for the first time since 1974 and the National League's best record for the first time since 2009. The Dodgers set a Los Angeles record for victories with 104 (104-58), tying for the second most in franchise history (also: 1942, 104-50) and finishing one shy of the club record of 105 (105-49), set in 1953.
- 🔪 The Dodgers topped the NL in ERA (3.38), opponents' batting average (.228, 1st MLB), strikeouts (1,549), WHIP (1.15, 1st MLB) and shutouts (16). Los Angeles' 3.39 starters' ERA topped the Majors, while the 3.38 ERA by the club's relievers led the NL (4th, MLB).
- 🔪 The Dodgers established franchise records with 553 extra-base hits (previous high: 541 in 1953), 312 doubles (previous high: 307 in 2006) and 221 home runs (4th, NL), which topped the club's previous high of 211 set in 2000. The club also set a Los Angeles record with a .437 slugging percentage, outpacing the previous high of .432 set in 2006.

COLLEGE BASEBALL CLASSIC: Dodger Stadium will host the annual College Baseball Classic tomorrow, March 11, as three of college baseball's top 25 ranked teams will take the field at Chavez Ravine. Seventh-ranked Texas Christian University will face 21st-ranked Vanderbilt at 10:30 a.m. followed by the annual local matchup of UCLA (#11) vs. USC at 3:00p.m. Tickets begin at just \$10 for both matchups (student tickets are \$5) and can be purchased at Dodgers.com/classic.

TODAY'S PITCHING PROBABLES

- RHP Walker Buehler** is expected to make his Cactus League debut today. The 2015 first round draft pick (24th overall) saw his first big league action in just his second professional season and made eight relief appearances going 1-0 with a 7.71 ERA (8 ER/9.1 IP). He recorded his first Major League win on Sept. 21, 2017 at Philadelphia, tossing a scoreless inning of relief with two strikeouts in the Dodgers' 5-4 victory. Buehler enters 2018 rated by MLB.com and Baseball America as the Dodgers' No. 1 prospect as well as the 13th best overall prospect in baseball by Baseball America in 2018.
- Right-handed reliever **Pedro Báez** will appear in his third Cactus League game, after allowing just one hit in a scoreless inning of relief with one strikeout on Tuesday against the Cubs. In 66 relief appearances last season, Báez went 3-5 with a 2.95 ERA (21ER/64.0 IP) and held hitters to a .225 average. The Dominican Republic native has gone 10-10 with a 3.04 ERA and a 1.12 WHIP in 211 career relief appearances over four Major League seasons with the Dodgers.
- Yimi Garcia** will make his third appearance of the spring tonight, after pitching on Tuesday against the Cubs where he allowed two runs and issues a walk. Garcia, who returns after recovering from Tommy John surgery that made him miss the entire 2017 season, has gone 3-5 with one save and a 3.12 ERA (26 ER/75.0 IP) in 76 career big league games (one start). He has struck out 81 batters against just 12 walks, while holding the opposition to a .215 average.
- Righty reliever **J.T. Chargois** is set to make his fourth appearance of the spring, after tossing a 3.0 scoreless innings of relief with four strikeouts in three Cactus League games. He allowed his first hit on Tuesday against the Cubs. Chargois, who was claimed off waivers by the Dodgers on Feb. 23 from Minnesota, appeared in just two games with the Twins' Triple-A Rochester in 2017, tossing 2.2 scoreless innings of relief with one save before being placed on the disabled list for the remainder of the season.
- Right-handed pitcher **Joe Broussard**, who will make his fifth appearance of the spring this afternoon, has gone 0-1 with a 2.25 ERA (1 ER/4.0 IP) in four relief appearances in Cactus League play. He last pitched on Wednesday against the Angels, tossing a scoreless inning of relief. Broussard, who was drafted by the Dodgers in the 15th round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of Louisiana State University, enters his fifth professional season and his first big league camp. Last season, he went a combined 5-1 with five saves and posted a 3.27 ERA (23 ER/63.1 IP) in 48 relief appearances with Triple-A Oklahoma City and Double-A Tulsa.
- Southpaw reliever **Brian Moran** is set to make his sixth appearance of the spring tonight. He last pitched on Wednesday against the Angels, allowing one home run and striking out two batters in 1.0 inning. In five appearances (5.1 IP) in Cactus League play, the New York native has only given up two hits and tallied eight strikeouts. Moran was signed by the Dodgers on July 15, 2017 and appeared in 19 games with Double-A Tulsa last year, going 0-1 with a 1.89 ERA (4 ER/19.0 IP) and one save. He struck out 27 batters while posting a 0.79 WHIP.
- Righty reliever **Brian Schlitter** will appear in his fifth outing of the spring today, after pitching a scoreless inning of relief on March 7 against the Angels. In four Cactus League games, he has posted a 4.91 ERA (2 ER/3.2 IP). The 32-year-old enters his 10th professional season and his first with the Dodgers, as he returns to the states following a stint with the Saitama Seibu Lions of the Nippon Professional Baseball League in 2017. With the Lions, he went 1-5 with a 2.83 ERA (20 ER/63.2 IP) and struck out 23 batters in 64 relief appearances.
