PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (6-5) vs TAMPA BAY RAYS (3-9)

Friday, April 13, 2018 – Tropicana Field – 7:10 EDT – Game 12; Road 6

RHP Vince Velasquez (1-1, 5.19) vs RHP Jake Faria (0-1, 14.29)

- WEDNESDAY'S ACTION:** The Phillies were walk-off winners as they defeated the Reds, 4-3 in 12 innings at Citizens Bank Park to secure a three-game sweep ... Starter Nick Pivetta tied a career-high with 7.0 innings pitched, allowing 2 runs on 5 hits with no walks and 7 strikeouts ... J.P. Crawford hit his first major league home run in the second, and César Hernández added an upper-deck blast to make it a 3-2 game in the fifth ... The Reds tied the game in the ninth and the Phillies took the victory three innings later on a walk-off sacrifice fly from Scott Kingery.
- TAMPA BAY RAY-UNION:** Just 16.2 miles south of their spring training home in Clearwater, the Phillies will play three games in St. Petersburg this weekend against the Tampa Bay Rays ... It is the first time they have squared off against Tampa Bay since 7/20-22/2015 in Philadelphia, and the first time at Tropicana Field since 6/23-25/2009 ... In that series, current Phillies manager Gabe Kapler started two games in right field for the Rays, going 2-for-4, with two doubles, two walks and a run, and Phillies Wall of Famer Pat Burrell was the Tampa Bay DH for all three games ... Today will mark the beginning of just the fourth regular season series the two teams have ever played at Tropicana Field, as they also played three-game sets in 2001 and 1999 in addition to the 2009 series ... Philadelphia played two games in Tampa Bay during the 2008 World Series (1-1), before returning home to take the championship in Philadelphia.
- A KING AMONGST MEN:** Scott Kingery earned the walk-off winner with a sacrifice fly on Wednesday night for the Phillies, capping a memorable series for the rookie ... On Monday, he hit his first career home run and on Tuesday he became just the 16th Phillies rookie ever to hit a grand slam as his first or second career homer ... **Per Elias, Kingery is the only major league player in the modern era (since 1900) to record his first career home run, grand slam, and walk-off RBI in three consecutive games (in no particular order for those achievements)** ... Kingery has three extra-base hits (2B, 2 HR) and 7 RBI in his last five games ... Among all major league rookies thus far, he is tied with MIA's Brian Anderson and SD's Christian Villanueva for the most extra-base hits (5), is T-2nd in doubles (3), T-3rd in hits (9) & homers (2) and 4th in RBI (7) ... Kingery, who started his first career game in left field Wednesday, recorded his first outfield assist and has now appeared in games at shortstop (4), third base (3), left field (2), right field (1) and second base (1).
- ARMS RACE:** Over their last eight games (since 4/3), Phillies starters have combined to post a 2.87 ERA (15 ER, 47.0 IP) with 49 strikeouts, just three home runs allowed and a .220 opponents' batting average (38-173) ... In those eight games, the rotation has allowed two earned runs or fewer seven times and four hits or fewer five times ... Overall this season, only one team in baseball (SF, 2) has allowed fewer home runs by its starters than the Phillies (3), and they also rank 6th among ML clubs in fewest walks issued by starters (18).
- HAIL CESAR:** César Hernández is now batting .291 (160-549) with a .375 OBP and 71 walks since the start of 2017 ... Among all major league second basemen, only MIN's Brian Dozier (85) has more walks in that span, and the only other qualifying second basemen to bat at least .290 with a .375 OBP are HOU's Jose Altuve (.347/.409), WSH's Daniel Murphy (.326/.387), COL's DJ LeMahieu (.315/.380) and BOS' Dustin Pedroia (.304/.380).
- TOUGH LEAVING HOME:** In their season-opening homestand, which ended on Wednesday, Philadelphia won five of six games (.833 winning percentage) ... The last time they went 5-1 or better in a homestand of at least six games was 7/1-6/2015 vs KC & ATL (5-1) ... In those six contests, they scored 44 runs (7.33 per game), clubbed 11 home runs and posted a 2.37 ERA (15 ER, 57.0 IP) with 64 strikeouts.
- INTERLEAGUE INTRIGUE:** This series marks the first Interleague series for the Phillies in 2018 ... They finished the 2017 campaign with just a 5-15 against American League ballclubs, but went 5-7 in their final 12 contests ... Philadelphia has not played an American League team on the road this early in the season since they opened 2014 with a three-game series in Texas.
- FIRST DIBS:** With Scott Kingery and J.P. Crawford already hitting their first career home runs this season, the Phillies have now had nine different players hit their first major league homer since the beginning of the 2017 season: Crawford (4/11), Kingery (4/9), Cameron Perkins (9/14/17), Jorge Alfaro (8/15/17), Rhys Hoskins (8/14/17), Nick Williams (7/9/17), Ben Lively (6/24/17), Andrew Knapp (4/29/17) and Brock Stassi (4/10/17) ... In that span, only one other team (SD) has even had seven players do so.
- THANK YOU FOR YOUR PATIENCE:** The Phillies have seen a total of 1,842 pitches over 429 plate appearances this season ... Philadelphia's 4.29 pitches per plate appearance are the most among all ML clubs thus far (next: STL, 4.18)... **Philadelphia has three players who rank in the top 6 in pitches per plate appearance in the National League: Cesar Hernandez (2nd, 4.67), Rhys Hoskins (3rd, 4.53) and Carlos Santana (6th, 4.47)** ... Additionally, the Phillies have drawn 51 walks over those 429 plate appearances, an average of one walk every 8.41 plate appearances, which ranks 2nd in the majors to only WSH (8.35 PA/BB) ... Their 51 walks rank 5th in the majors and 3rd in the National League.

The story of the night was the offense, Maikel Franco posted a career-best 6 RBI as he and Aaron Altherr each hit grand slams ... Of the 12 players who had a plate appearance for Philadelphia, 11 of them had a hit and scored a run.

TONIGHT'S START:

- **Striking Success:** Is averaging 9.78 SO/9.0 IP (230 SO, 211.2 IP) since the start of 2016, more than any Phillies' starter in that span (min. 200.0 IP) ... He has struck out at least as many batters as he's had innings pitched in 29 of his 48 career starts
- **Super Six:** When Velasquez has been able to work past the 6th inning in his career, he has finished the start with 2 ER or fewer 13 times in those 23 such starts (3.32 ERA in games he has pitched at least 6.0 innings)
- **Spring Success:** April his historically one of his best months, as he is 5-3 with a 3.59 ERA (21 ER, 52.2 IP) and 61 SO in 9 career April starts ... 2 of his 4 career double-digit strikeout games have come in April
- **Vinny Velo:** Of the 158 pitchers to make a start this year, Velasquez's average fastball velocity of 94.0 mph through his 2 starts is 24th-highest (hardest: Luis Severino, 97.7 mph)
- **Getting Ahead:** In the first pitch of an opponent's plate appearance, threw a strike 63.4% of the time in 2017 (up from 59.9% in 2016)
- **vs AL East:** 1-0, 3.77 ERA (6 ER, 14.1 IP) in 3 games (2 starts)
- **Interleague:** 2-1, 4.50 ERA (14 ER, 28.0 IP) in 8 games (5 starts) ... Made just 1 Interleague start in 2017 (7/24 vs HOU)

- Was on the 10-day DL, 5/31-7/17, with a right flexor strain; included rehab assignments to Lehigh Valley (AAA), Reading (AA) and Clearwater (A)
- Had a 2.96 ERA (9 ER, 27.1 IP) in 6 starts from 5/25-8/4
- Stranded 74.4% of the runners he allowed on base
- Placed on the 10-day DL on 8/11 with a right middle finger injury ... Had surgery on right middle finger on 9/6 and missed the remainder of season
- Snapped a career-long 6-game losing streak on 4/26 vs MIA (began on 7/29/16) ... Was tied for the longest active losing streak among ML starters at the time it was broken
