WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have lost three straight games, seven of the last nine and 16 of the last 22 as they continue a season-long, 10-game trip this afternoon at Houston.
- RHP James Shields is scheduled to start for the White Sox, who are a season-high 28 games under .500.
- The Sox are 2-6 on this trip, losing the first two games at the Astros and two out of three at both Texas and Cincinnati.
- Following tomorrow's finale at Minute Maid Park, the White Sox will return to Guaranteed Rate Field for a five-game, six-day homestand vs. St. Louis (7/10-11) and Kansas City (7/13-15).
- The Sox went 4-3 on their last homestand vs. Oakland (2-2) and Minnesota (2-1) and 0-3 on their last trip to Cleveland.

TODAY'S STORYLINES

- Chicago is 2-9 in its last 11 road games (outscored 88-48).
- The White Sox have recorded four consecutive multihomer efforts (10 homers total) and hit 21 in the last 14 games.
- The Sox have lost five straight games vs. Houston and seven of the last eight ... they have scored three runs or less in seven contests, and one or less four times.
- James Shields is 2-3 with a 2.01 ERA (7 ER/31.1 IP) and .197 opponents average (23-117) over his last five starts (four QS) ... he has allowed two earned runs or less in four of the outings.
- Avisail Garcia has hit seven homers in his last 11 games, and hit safely in 15 of his last 16 games, batting .348 (24-69) with three doubles, two triples, seven HRs, 12 RBI and a 1.112 OPS.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- Houston opened up a three-run game by scoring seven times in the eighth inning en route to an 11-4 victory over Chicago.
- Lance McCullers Jr. limited the White Sox to one HBP through the first five innings before Adam Engel broke up the no-hit bid with a one-out single in the sixth and Yolmer Sánchez snapped the shutout with a RBI single.
- Reynaldo López suffered the loss after allowing three runs on six hits with five walks over 4.2 IP (97 pitches).
- Avisail Garcia (No. 8) and Daniel Palka (No. 11) hit back-to-back home runs in the ninth for the final margin.
- The Sox recorded just five hits (zero multihit efforts), walked once, struck out 13 times and went 1-2 with RISP.

BIG GAME JAMES

- James Shields has worked 6.0-plus IP in 13 of his last 14 starts, including 7.0-plus IP six times ... 10 of the outings have been quality, and he has allowed three runs or less 10 times.
- Shields is allowing 1.03 home runs per 9.0 IP in 2018, down from 2.08 in 2017 ... he has lowered his opponents average from .253 to .225, and his WHIP from 1.44 to 1.24.
- His .204 opponents average (63-309) since 5/1 is tied with the Yankees' Luis Severino for the seventh-lowest in the American League and 12th-lowest in MLB.

ON THE MEND

- OF Nicky Delmonico went 0-2 last night at Chattanooga in his first injury rehab assignment with Class AA Birmingham.
- Delmonico has been on the disabled list since 5/19 with a fractured third metacarpal on his right hand ... he suffered the injury after being hit by a Matt Moore pitch on 5/18 vs. Texas.

CEASE AND DESIST

- Dylan Cease last night allowed two hits with three walks and nine strikeouts over 5.0 scoreless IP in a win at Chattanooga.
- Cease is 10-2 with a 2.95 ERA (29 ER/88.1 IP) and 105 strikeouts between Class A Winston-Salem and Birmingham (16 GS).
- Cease has been named to the U.S. Team for the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game on 7/15 at Nationals Park.

HOMER HAPPY

- The White Sox have hit 13 homers in the last seven games and 21 in the last 14 ... Daniel Palka and Avisail Garcia have combined to hit eight of the Sox last 11 home runs since Monday.
- Palka's home runs were estimated at 428, 448, 432 and 357 feet, and Garcia's at 376, 414, 431 and 363 feet (MLB Statcast).
- Palka 14th in MLB with an average distance of 415 ft. per home run this season ... he ranks third among rookies in the American League and fourth in MLB with 11 homers in 2018.

HE'S ON FIRE ... AVI-OUSLY

- Avisail Garcia is 16-41 (.390) with three doubles, two triples, five homers and eight RBI in his last nine games, and 21-63 (.333) with seven homers and 11 RBI in his last 15 contests.
- His 14-game hitting streak from 4/22-7/4 was the longest of his career, tied for the sixth-longest in MLB in 2018 and the longest by a Sox in a season since Tim Anderson from 9/9-24/17 (15).

WHITE SOX VS. HOUSTON ASTROS

- Houston leads the season series, 5-0, including a sweep from 4/20-22 at Guaranteed Rate Field ... the Astros have outscored the White Sox, 42-9, this season.
- The Sox are batting .171/.241/.296 (26-152) with five home runs, and own an 8.52 ERA (41 ER/43.1 IP) with one QS in 2018.
- The Sox have lost seven of the last eight games, are 6-7 in the last 13 and 12-11 in the last 23 ... Chicago is 6-7 in the last 13 games at Minute Maid Park.
- The Sox went 4-2 in 2017, including a 3-0 mark in Chicago.
- Chicago is 29-28 all-time, going 19-14 at Guaranteed Rate Field and 10-14 in Houston (9-12 at Minute Maid Park).

WINDY AND SPACE CITY CONNECTIONS

- The White Sox swept the Astros in the 2005 World Series to capture the club's first title since 1917 ... Houston TV analyst Geoff Blum hit a game-winning HR in the 14th inning of Game 3.
- Houston's first-base coach Alex Cintrón played for the White Sox from 2006-07 ... Gary Pettis, the Astros' third-base coach, served as the Sox first-base and outfield coach from 2001-02.
- Houston RHP Chris Devenski was selected by Chicago in the 25th round of the 2011 MLB First-Year Player Draft.

WILD WILD WEST

- The White Sox are 7-15 vs. the American League West in 2018, going 5-8 at home and 1-7 on the road ... they have won six of their last 13 games after losing eight of the first nine.
- Chicago has lost seven of the last eight games and 13 of 17 on the road against the division ... the club has scored four runs or less 12 times and allowed seven-plus nine times.
- The Sox are 185-169 vs. the West since 2008 (77-96 on road).

BARRELING BACKSTOPS

- Omar Narváez and Kevan Smith are hitting a combined .354 (46-130) with six doubles, two home runs, 15 RBI and 14 multihit efforts in 36 games since 6/1 ... they have hit safely in 30 contests.
- Narváez (1st, .393) and Smith (2nd, .324) lead all MLB catchers in average since 6/1 (minimum 60 PAs).
- Narváez owns eight multihit efforts and has hit safely in 14 games since 6/1 ... Smith has hit safely in 17 of his 19 games in 2018 since being recalled from Class AAA Charlotte on 6/5.

BULLPEN BREAKDOWN

- The Sox bullpen has allowed a run in 10 straight games, recording a 6.39 ERA (27 ER/38.0 IP) and .245 opp. average.
- Joakim Soria has not allowed a run in 15 of his last 16 appearances (2 ER/15.2 IP; 19 SO), going 8-9 in save chances.
- Rookie Jace Fry owns a 2.63 ERA (8 ER/27.1 IP) with 33 strikeouts and a .146 (14-96) opp. average in 27 games in 2018.
- Xavier Cedeño has allowed just one earned run over 15 relief appearances (15 SO/12.0 IP) since joining the White Sox on 6/7.

STOP! THIEF!

- The Sox lead MLB with 69 stolen bases in 2018 ... Chicago is on pace to steal 127 bases, which would be its most since 2010 (160) ... they have not led MLB in steals since 1966 (153).
- Tim Anderson ranks second in the AL with 20 steals in 2018 ... he has stolen a base in each of his last three games.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY

- Reynaldo López (T12th, 11) and James Shields (T12th, 11) rank in the Top 15 in the American League in QS in 2018.
- The White Sox have made a major-league leading 1,351 quality starts since the start of the 2003 season, two more than the second-place New York Mets (1,349) and 43 more than Oakland (1,308), the next-closest American League team.

WELCOME TO THE (MILB) SHOW

- Nick Madrigal made his professional debut on Thursday with the Arizona Rookie League White Sox, going 0-1 with two HBP.
- The White Sox signed Madrigal, their first-round pick to a minor-league contract with a \$6,411,400 signing bonus.
- Madrigal helped lead Oregon State to the 2018 national title.

PITO STILL FIRST AT FIRST

- José Abreu led American League first basemen in fan balloting for the Major League Baseball All-Star Game at the time of yesterday's final update ... voting at MLB.com ended on Thursday.
- Starters/reserves will be announced this Sunday on the ASG Selection Show pres. by Camping World at 6 p.m. CT on ESPN.
- Abreu is the first White Sox to lead at any point in the balloting process since Frank Thomas won the fan election at 1B in 1996.
- He would be the sixth Sox player (11th time) to be fan-elected as a starter, joining Thomas (1994-96), Carlton Fisk (1981-82), Richie Zisk (1977), Dick Allen (1972-74) and Luis Aparicio (1970).

SHIELDS AT A GLANCE

- Is scheduled to make his 20th appearance (19th start), eighth on the road and second vs. Houston ... is looking for his second road win of the season (first on Opening Day/3/29 at Kansas City).
Is tied for fifth in MLB with nine losses in 2018, and is tied for eighth in the American League with seven no decisions.
Surrendered three earned runs or less in each of his last five starts, going 2-2 with a 2.01 ERA (7 ER/31.1 IP), 1.12 WHIP and .197 opponents average ... four of the starts have been quality.
Has worked at least 6.0 IP in 13 of his last 14 starts since 4/25 vs. Seattle ... is 2-7 with a 3.59 ERA (36 ER/90.1 IP), 1.12 WHIP and .207 opponents average during the 14-start span.
Is tied with Tim Wakefield for 67th all-time in major-league history with 2,156 strikeouts ... is 11 behind Camilo Pascual (2,167) for 66th place.
Is 12-28 with a 5.37 ERA (206 ER/345.0 IP), 257 strikeouts, 71 home runs allowed and a 1.46 WHIP over 62 appearances (61 GS/28 QS) since being acquired by the White Sox from the Padres in a trade on 6/4/16.
Ranks among the active MLB leaders since 2007 in games started (2nd, 369), IP (2nd, 2,400.1), pitches thrown (2nd, 37,766), quality starts (T4th, 227), shutouts (5th, 9), opponents GIDP (5th, 195), complete games (T5th, 22), strikeouts (8th, 2,052) and wins (11th, 135).

LAST START

- Received a no decision on 7/2 at Cincinnati despite allowing just one run on four hits with four walks and three strikeouts over 6.2 IP.
Surrendered his only run on a Scott Shebler leadoff home run ... held the Reds hitless from the second through the fourth inning, and retired 11 of 12 from the first through the fifth.
Allowed one or zero runs for the third time in his last five starts, made his fourth quality start in his last five outings and surrendered a home run for the fifth time in his last seven starts.
Left the game in the seventh with the White Sox leading, 2-1, after throwing 88 pitches (49 strikes) ... the Sox scored once in the eighth but Cincinnati answered with four in the bottom half and went on to a 5-3 win.

WINS DON'T TELL THE STORY

- Is 2-6 with a 3.42 ERA (32 ER/84.1 IP), .204 opponents average and 1.08 WHIP over his 13 starts (10 QS) since 5/1 ... has worked 7.0-plus IP six times and allowed three earned runs or less in 11 outings.
Ranked among the MLB May leaders in opponents SLG (5th, .252), opponents average (6th, .173), hits per 9.0 IP (6th, 5.40), opponents OPS (6th, .500), WHIP (T10th, 0.93) and opponents OBP (11th, .248).

LOW AND SLOW

- Opponents are hitting just .204 (63-309) since 5/1, tied with the Yankees' Luis Severino for the seventh-lowest mark in the American League ... his .173 opp. average in May was the fourth-lowest in the AL behind Seattle's James Paxton (.144) and Houston's Justin Verlander (.153) and Gerrit Cole (.164).
Is limiting opponents to the following averages: .184 (30-163) at night, .194 (42-216) vs. left-handers, .226 (33-146) on the road and .224 average (63-281) at Guaranteed Rate Field.
Has picked off three baserunners, and attempted basestealers are 4-9 (44.4 percent) this season.

HELP WANTED

- Owns a 3.25 run support average in 2018, seventh-lowest in the American League and ninth-lowest in MLB ... received two runs or less of support in 11 of his last 13 starts (one or less seven times) and three or less in 14 of last 16 (2.12 RSA; 24 RS/102.0 IP) since 4/11... the club scored 17 runs in his first two outings.
His 11-start stretch of three runs or less of support from 4/11-6/7 was his longest since 9/27/15-6/8/16 (13 consecutive starts; 1.90 RSA, 16 RS).
His 3.22 RSA in 2016 was the lowest in baseball and the lowest of his career.
Owns a 4.26 RSA (163 RS/344.1 IP) as a starter since joining the White Sox (61 starts), receiving the following run support marks: zero runs (16x), one (10x), two (11x), three (7x), four (4x), five (5x) and six-plus (8x) ... has received one run or less of support in 42.6 percent (26-61) of his outings with the Sox.

NOT DIGGING THE LONG BALL

- Has surrendered 13 home runs this season, including nine in his last seven starts ... allowed three homers in each outing on 6/2 vs. Milwaukee and 6/7 at Minnesota after going 14 consecutive appearances without allowing multiple homers from 9/20/17-5/27/18, the second-longest stretch of his career.
Has allowed 80 homers since 2016 and 113 since 2015 ... his 113 homers allowed since 2015 are the second-most in MLB behind Kansas City's Ian Kennedy (115).
Allowed 27 home runs last season, his fewest since 2014 (23) ... surrendered a major-league leading 40 home runs in 2016 after leading baseball with 33 in 2015 ... became the first pitcher to lead MLB in homers allowed in consecutive seasons since Tom Browning in 1988-89.
Has allowed 1.65 homers per 9.0 IP since 2015 (614.2 IP), the fourth-highest mark in MLB.

LET'S NOT GO WEST

- Is 1-10 with a 6.96 ERA (59 ER/76.1 IP), 18 home runs allowed, .270 opponents average (82-304) and 1.66 WHIP over his last 15 appearances (14 starts/three QS) vs. the American League West ... is 0-4 with a 5.63 mark (15 ER/24.0 IP), two home runs and 15 walks allowed and 20 strikeouts in 2018 (5 G/4 GS).
His last two wins vs. the AL West came on 9/25/17 vs. the Angels and 5/13/15 at Seattle.
Owns an 0-4 record with a 7.52 ERA (27 ER/32.1 IP), 1.70 WHIP and .272 opponents average over his last seven appearances (six starts/one quality start) vs. the AL West.

OPENING DAY HONORS

- His season debut marked his eighth career Opening Day start following four with Tampa Bay (2008-10, '12), two with Kansas City (2013-14) and one with San Diego (2015).
Is 2-2 with a 4.98 ERA (26 ER/47.0 IP) and 30 strikeouts in the eight OD outings.
Tied the Dodgers' Clayton Kershaw for the fourth-most Opening Day starts among active pitchers ... joined Edinson Volquez as the only active pitchers to start season openers for four different teams (STATS).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Has made 20-plus starts in every MLB season, joining Cole Hamels and Justin Verlander as the only pitchers since 2006 to accomplish the feat ... recorded at least 10 victories, 200.0 IP and 160 strikeouts each season from 2007-15 ... was an AL All-Star with Tampa Bay in 2011.
Is 3-6 with a 5.46 ERA (36 ER/59.1 IP) and 45 strikeouts over 11 career postseason starts (four quality starts) ... pitched in the postseason with Tampa Bay (2008, 2010-11) and Kansas City (2014) ... made three World Series starts with the Rays (2008) and Royals (2014).

- Is 2-3 with a 3.19 ERA (17 ER/48.0 IP), 55 strikeouts, a 1.21 WHIP and .243 opponents average in seven career starts ... five of the starts have been quality and has allowed three runs or less six times.
Has gone 0-2 with a 5.82 ERA (11 ER/17.0 IP), 21 strikeouts and just one home run allowed over his last three starts.
Suffered the loss in his last start on 4/20 in Chicago after allowing seven runs on eight hits with four walks and four strikeouts in 5.1 IP.
Is 2-2 with a 2.12 ERA (7 ER/29.2 IP), 33 strikeouts, an 0.91 WHIP and .194 opponents average in four career outings at Minute Maid Park ... suffered the loss in his last start on 9/20/17 (3 ER/5.2 IP).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER

- RHP Lucas Giolito (5-7, 6.93 ERA) is scheduled to make his 18th start of 2018, eighth on the road and second vs. Houston.
