The Cubs and Nationals today finally close out their seven-game season series ... the Cubs won two-of-three games at Wrigley Field, August 10-12, then dropped two-of-three in a rain shortened series here this past weekend ... Chicago went 5-2 against Washington during the 2016 regular season before going 3-4 last regular season ... the teams met in last year's NLDS, with the Cubs taking a 9-8 victory in the decisive Game Five here at Nationals Park.

AND ... WE'RE BACK!: The Chicago Cubs today play a make-up of Sunday's rainout here in the Nation's Capital against the Washington Nationals ... this contest comes in the middle of an originally scheduled six-game seven-day homestand against the Brewers (1-2) and Reds (3 games, starting tomorrow), and will extend what was originally 23-straight scheduled game dates beginning August 21 to 30-consecutive game days through September 19.

© The team's previous true off day was August 20 in Detroit, and it's most recent off day in Chicago was August 13 ... the team's lone remaining off day this season is a week from now, September 20, following a series in Arizona.

© This pit stop in Washington D.C. marks the Cubs second make-up road game in roughly two-and-a-half weeks as Chicago also lost an off-day on August 30 to make-up a game in Atlanta against the Braves (5-4 win) ... that game was necessitated due to a rain out on May 17.

© Not that a refresher is needed, but last week's series here between the Cubs and Nationals included nearly 11 hours of rain delays and exactly 10 hours of gameplay spanning three contests and two rainouts ... Chicago's nine postponements this season lead the majors.

MR. VERSATILITY: Today's hurler, Mike Montgomery, brings with a 3.85 ERA in 19 relief appearances and 15 starts this season ... just two Cubs in the last 43 seasons since 1975 have had campaigns with at least 15 starts and 15 relief appearances and an ERA lower than Montgomery's current mark.

© Glendon Rusch turned the trick in 2004, posting a 3.47 ERA spanning 16 starts and 16 games out of the bullpen ... Carlos Zambrano did so both in 2002 (3.66 ERA in 16 starts and 16 relief apps.) and 2010 (3.33 ERA in 20 starts and 16 relief apps.).

BEASTS AGAINST N.L. EAST: The Cubs this season are 21-11 (.656) against N.L. East opponents, the third-best winning percentage against the division in the majors this season ... Boston is 14-3 (.824) against the N.L. East while Atlanta is 42-21 (.667) against its own division ... entering this year, Chicago's highest single-season winning percentage against the N.L. East is .647 (22-12), done in 2015.

FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS: Tomorrow's game time vs. the Reds at Wrigley Field has been moved to 7:05 p.m. CT, marking the Cubs second-ever Friday night game at The Friendly Confines, joining Sept. 8, 2017's contest vs. the Brewers (2-0 loss).

WE'RE ALL ABOUT DRS: Watching Albert Almora Jr. dive around center field last night made us wonder, "where do the Cubs rank in defensive runs saved this season?" ... well, Chicago ranks fifth in the majors with 41 defensive runs saved, trailing only Arizona (113), Milwaukee (88), Atlanta (55) and San Diego (42).

SWEET RELIEF: Cubs relievers have combined for a N.L.-best 3.38 ERA (199 ER/530.2 IP) this season, the fourth-best mark among major league bullpens ... Carl Edwards Jr. (2.28 ERA), Pedro Strop (2.33 ERA) and Steve Cishek (2.34 ERA) form the only N.L. trio of qualifying relievers with sub-2.50 ERAs this season.

© Jesse Chavez has posted a 1.50 ERA (5 ER/30.0 IP) in 25 games since he was acquired by Chicago, July 19 ... Jorge De La Rosa, signed by Chicago on August 10, has a 1.76 ERA (3 ER/15.1 IP) in 11 relief outings.

THE FINAL 17: The Cubs have 17 games remaining this regular season, with just four of them coming outside of Chicago, and 10 of those contests at Wrigley Field ... the team's lone remaining road games include today's make-up at the Nationals, three games at the D-backs (Sept. 17-19) and three games eight miles from Wrigley Field, Sept. 21-23 at the White Sox.

© The Cubs are tied for the second-most home games (10) remaining in baseball with Atlanta, Boston, the Angels, St. Louis and Tampa Bay ... Baltimore has 11 home games remaining.

© Chicago's .634 home winning percentage (45-26) leads the N.L. and is fourth-best in the majors behind Boston (51-20, .718), the Yankees (48-24, .667) and the Rays (46-25, .648) ... the Cubs have won 14 of their last 21 home games dating to July 25.

© Chicago hosts N.L. Central foes (the Reds, Pirates and Cardinals) one more time at Wrigley Field to account for all 10 home games remaining ... the Cubs are 19-10 against divisional foes at home this season, a .655 winning percentage that exceeds their overall N.L. best home winning percentage.

© The Cubs are 10-1-3 in their last 14 home series starting May 25 with a three-game set vs. the Giants, with the lone series setback coming this week vs. the Brewers.

IN GOOD STANDING: Since finding themselves 29-23 and 4.5-games behind Milwaukee in the N.L. Central Division when waking up on May 31, the Cubs have since gone 55-38 (.591) in their last 93 games to make up 5.5 games in the standings over the second-place Milwaukee Brewers ... the Cubs have played 3.0 games better than the third-place St. Louis Cardinals in this span.

© Winners of 13 of their last 21 games, the Cubs own the best record in the N.L. at 84-61 ... the Cubs are guaranteed a winning record for a fourth season in a row for the first time since a six-year run from 1967-72.

DISHING IT OUT: Starting May 1, Anthony Rizzo's 83 RBI are fourth in the N.L. behind only Milwaukee's Jesus Aguilar (89), Cincinnati's Eugenio Suarez (87) and Colorado's Nolan Arenado (86) ... Rizzo's .299 average (11th, NL), .393 OBP (6th) and .915 OPS (9th) all rank nicely ... Rizzo began the season with a .149 average and .259 OBP in his first 18 games through April 30.

© With one more homer, Rizzo will become just the ninth Cub ever with five or more 25-homer campaigns, and just the third left-handed hitter (Billy Williams and Bill Nicholson).

OUR BÁE: Javier Báez reached 30 homers and 100 RBI with a solo home run Sept. 2 to become just the fifth Cub to record a 30-homer, 100-RBI campaign before or in their age 25 season, joining Ernie Banks (1955), Kris Bryant (2016), Anthony Rizzo (2015) and Ron Santo (1964, 1965).

© Báez is already just the fifth player in major league history to reach 35 doubles, nine triples, 30 homers, 100 RBI and 20 stolen bases in a single season, joining Carlos Beltran (2004), Andre Dawson (1983), Hank Aaron (1961) and Chuck Klein (1932).

© Báez is already the first player in franchise history to reach 35 doubles, 30 homers, 100 RBI and 20 stolen bases in the same season.

© Báez is one of six players to reach 30 homers and 100 RBI this season, including three in the N.L. ... the others in the Senior Circuit to accomplish the feat: Cincinnati's Eugenio Suarez (32 homers, 101 RBI) and Colorado's Trevor Story (32 homers, 100 RBI).

© Javy is just the fourth Cubs middle infielder to reach the 30-homer mark, joining Rogers Hornsby in 1929, Ernie Banks (five times from 1955 and 1957-60) and Ryne Sandberg (twice in 1989-90) ... thanks to Ed Hartig.

© Báez's 100 RBI are tied for second in the N.L. and are tied for fourth-most in the majors (J.D. Martinez leads, 121) ... Báez also ranks at or near the top in several offensive categories, as seen on the left side of this page.

Mike today will make his 16th start of the season, tying his career-high set previously in 2015 ... has gone at least 5.0 innings in 13 of his 15 starts.

- ⊙ Was placed on the disabled list August 17 (retro to August 14) with left shoulder inflammation ... activated August 30.
- ⊙ Since his first start this season on May 28, Montgomery leads all Cubs starters (min. 10 starts) in ERA (3.39) and opponents slugging (.361).
- ⊙ Had a 1.38 ERA (5 ER/32.2 IP) in first 14 road outings this season, but has a 5.64 ERA (19 ER/30.1 IP) in his last six road outings.
- ⊙ Pitched a team-high 35.0 innings in June, tied for sixth-most among N.L. pitchers.
- ⊙ Made his first start of the season, May 28 at Pittsburgh ... retired the first 13 batters and finished with 5.2-scoreless innings.
- ⊙ Pitched at least 5.0 innings and allowed one or fewer runs in each of his first five starts this season ... was the first Cubs pitcher to do so since at least 1913.
- ⊙ Has tossed six quality starts and the Cubs are 6-9 in his 15 starts.
- ⊙ Allowed a season-high six runs in 2.1 IP against Cleveland on Tuesday, May 22 ... had a 0.84 ERA (1 ER/10.2 IP) in his previous eight outings dating back to May 8.
- ⊙ Has twice pitched 3.0 innings out of relief: April 20 at Colorado (5 H, 1 R) and May 6 at St. Louis (0 R).
- ⊙ Spun 2.0 scoreless innings on May 15 at Atlanta in a 3-2 win.

2017 Season

In his first full season with Chicago, Mike went 7-8 with a 3.38 ERA (49 ER/130.2 IP) in 44 outings (14 starts).

- ⊙ Went 2-3 with a 2.49 ERA (17 ER/61.1 IP) as a reliever compared to 5-5 with a 4.15 ERA (32 ER/69.1 IP) as a starter ... was just the second Cubs pitcher in the last 25 seasons to start at least 10 games while recording 30 relief outings in a season, joining Carlos Villanueva in 2013 (15 starts, 32 relief appearances).
- ⊙ Became the first Cubs pitcher since Randy Martz in 1981 to make at least 12 starts and also record three saves as a reliever ... Martz started 14 games and notched six saves.
- ⊙ Went 6-2 after the All-Star Break after going 1-6 in the season's first half ... won a career-best four-straight decisions, July 19-August 28.
- ⊙ Was inserted into the starting rotation, June 9, after Kyle Hendricks was placed on the disabled list ... made eight starts with the club before moving back into the bullpen following his start, July 19 ... rejoined the rotation from August 23-September 9 and made starts on September 19 and October 1.

Career Notes

Mike today makes his 53rd-career start ... is 19-24 with three saves and a 3.55 ERA (169 ER/428.1 IP) in 143 career games, including 52 starts, with Seattle (2015-16) and the Cubs (2016-18) ... is in his 11th pro season since being a first round selection (36th overall) in the 2008 draft by Kansas City.

- ⊙ Allowed two-or-fewer hits in five consecutive starts from September 9, 2017-June 2, 2018, the longest streak by any Cubs starter since at least 1908.
- ⊙ Recorded the final out of the 2016 World Series, inducing a 5-3 groundout after entering with the tying run on base in the 10th inning ... marked his first-career save in the regular season or postseason.
- ⊙ Has gone 5-8 with a 2.78 ERA (47 ER/152.0 IP) in 91 appearances out of the bullpen, compared to 14-16 with a 3.97 ERA (122 ER/276.1 IP) in 52 career starts.
- ⊙ Originally drafted by Kansas City, he was acquired by Tampa Bay, December 9, 2012, in a seven-player trade along with INF Patrick Leonard, OF Wil Myers and RHP Jake Odorizzi for RHP Wade Davis, RHP James Shields and INF Elliot Johnson ... was dealt to Seattle, March 31, 2015 for RHP Erasmo Ramirez.
- ⊙ Was acquired by the Cubs from Seattle, July 20, 2016, with RHP Jordan Pries for INF Dan Vogelbach and RHP Paul Blackburn.
- ⊙ Made his major league debut, June 2, 2015, with Seattle vs. the Yankees ... pitched exclusively as a starter in 2015, going 4-6 with a 4.60 ERA (46 ER/90.0 IP) in 16 games.

Cole tomorrow makes his 29th start this season and ninth with the Cubs ... allowed three runs in 5.2 innings in the nightcap of the doubleheader last Saturday at Washington ... walked a season-high five batters in the Cubs' 6-5 setback.

- ⊙ Owns a 2.54 ERA (24 ER/85.0 IP) in 15 road starts this season, compared to a 6.41 ERA (42 ER/59.0 IP) in 10 home starts at Globe Life Park and a 0.86 ERA (2 ER/21.0 IP) in three home starts at Wrigley Field ... went 5-9 with a 4.72 ERA (60 ER/114.1 IP) in 20 starts with the Rangers this season.
- ⊙ Has gone 11-1 with a 1.86 ERA (23 ER/111.1 IP) in 16-career starts against the Reds, including a complete game victory, August 23 of this season at Wrigley Field (9.0 IP, 8 H, 1 R) ... his teams are 15-1 in those 16 starts.
