## HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ The D-backs are 24-14 (.632) since May 28, the second-best NL record behind only the Dodgers (.667; 24-12).
- ♦ Arizona is 17-8 in its last 25 home games vs. Padres.
- ♦ **Zack Greinke** has gone 10-0 with a 1.44 ERA (15 ER in 93.2 IP) and 94 strikeouts against 13 walks in his last 13 starts in the month of July since July 25, 2014.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** has hit .376 (50-for-133)/.471 OBP/.752 SLG with 9 doubles, 1 triple, 13 home runs, 32 RBI, 22 walks and 29 runs scored since June 1.
- ♦ **Nick Ahmed** has reached base in a career-high 11 straight games since June 26, hitting .333 (13-for-39)/.925 OPS with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run, 4 RBI and 4 walks.

## LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs scored a single-game franchise record 20 runs in a 20-5 win vs. Padres.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** went 2-for-3 with a home run (20) and 3 RBI...**David Peralta** matched a D-backs record for hits in a game going 5-for-6 with a double and 3 RBI...**Steven Souza Jr.** (1), **Nick Ahmed** (11), **Alex Avila** (4) and **Ketel Marte** (8) each belted solo homers.
- ♦ **Randall Delgado** (1-0) threw 1.2 shutout frames and earned the win in his season debut.

## ABOUT LAST NIGHT...

- ♦ Arizona scored a franchise-record 20 runs vs. Padres...20 runs also matches the most by a Major League team this season (also: Phillies on April 7 vs. Marlins).
- ♦ The D-backs recorded a season-high 18 hits, their most since June 21, 2017 @ Rockies (20), and the most in a game @ Chase Field since Aug. 28, 2016 vs. Reds (18).
- ♦ The D-backs had 9 extra-base hits (4 doubles, 5 home runs), tied for their most in any game this season (also: June 8 @ Rockies; 4 doubles, 1 triple, 4 homers).
- ♦ Yesterday was the first time in franchise history the D-backs scored 3+ runs in 4 consecutive innings (5 in first//3 in second//3 in third//4 in fourth) [source: Elias Sports Bureau].
- ♦ Arizona matched a franchise record with 9 plate appearances with the bases loaded [source: STATS LLC].

## YOU ARE WATCHING RED ZONE

- ♦ Yesterday was the first time since Aug. 17, 2008 that 3 teams scored 15+ runs on the same day...D-backs (20), Nationals (18) and Red Sox (15) all a did so [Source: ESPN Stats & Info].

## THE GOLD STANDARD

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** recorded his 20th home run of the season yesterday vs. Padres, his sixth career 20-homer season, matching Luis Gonzalez's team record.
- ♦ Goldschmidt has 4 career seasons of 20+ home runs and 50+ RBI before the All-Star break (2013, '15, '17-18), making him 1 of 4 players to have 4 such seasons since 2013, joining Giancarlo Stanton (5), Nelson Cruz (5) and Edwin Encarnacion (4).
- ♦ Goldschmidt has 94 career home runs @ Chase Field, 1 shy of the Chase Field record held by Gonzalez (95).
- ♦ Goldschmidt has hit .376 (50-for-133)/.471 OBP/.752 SLG with 9 doubles, 1 triple, 13 home runs, 32 RBI, 22 walks and 29 runs scored since June 1, ranking among the NL leaders in average (1st), OBP (1st), SLG (1st), OPS (1st, 1.223), extra-base hits (1st, 23), home runs (T-1st), runs (2nd), and walks (T-7th).

## NO. 4 TO THE 400 CLUB

- ♦ **Zack Greinke** is making his 400th career start today, joining Bartolo Colon (544), CC Sabathia (525) and Justin Verlander (404) as the only active pitchers with 400+ career starts.

## PUTTING ON A DISPLAY OF SHOVERY

- ♦ **Zack Greinke** has gone 10-0 with a 1.44 ERA (15 ER in 93.2 IP) and 94 strikeouts against 13 walks in his last 13 starts in the month of July since July 25, 2014.
- ♦ Greinke has won each of his last 4 starts, posting a 1.73 ERA (5 ER in 26.0 IP), with a .235 opponent average, 22 strikeouts and 3 walks...is 6-1 with a 2.93 ERA (14 ER in 43.0 IP), 40 strikeouts and 10 walks in 7 starts since the start of June.
- ♦ He is 10-2 with a 2.07 ERA (29 ER in 126.0 IP) in 19 career starts vs. Padres, allowing 3 or fewer runs in 18 of those starts and 2 or fewer in 17.

## CHOO-CHOO!

- ♦ **David Peralta** matched the franchise record with 5 hits yesterday vs. Padres (22x, last: Jean Segura on Sept. 14, 2016 vs. Rockies)...it was his second career 5-hit game (also: Aug. 9, 2015 vs. Reds, was 5-for-5).
- ♦ Is hitting .341 (46-for-135)/.395 OBP/.637 SLG with 10 doubles, 3 triples, 8 home runs, 28 RBI and 19 runs scored in his last 34 games since May 30.

## NICK THE STICK

- ♦ **Nick Ahmed** has reached base in a career-high 11 straight games since June 26, hitting .333 (13-for-39)/.925 OPS with 3 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run, 4 RBI and 4 walks.

## EARLY ADVANTAGE --> D-BACKS

- ♦ Arizona is tied for second in baseball with 65 first-inning runs with Cleveland, trailing only Colorado (73).

## SERIES-LY SPEAKING

- ♦ The D-backs have won 16 series (min. 3 games) before the All-Star Break, tied for the second most in the Majors this season and tied for the second most all-time in club history [source: STATS LLC]:
  - **MOST 3+ GAME SERIES WINS IN FIRST HALF (MLB IN 2018):** 18 – Red Sox; 16 – D-backs, Astros, Mariners, Yankees.
  - **MOST 3+ GAME SERIES WINS IN FIRST HALF (ARI):** 17 – 2002; 16 – 2018, 2001, 2000; 15 – 2013, 2007, 1999.

## THESE GUYS IN THE PEN HAVE BEEN MIGHTY

- ♦ **Archie Bradley** has not yielded an earned run in 18 of his last 19 outings with a 0.53 ERA (1 ER in 17.0 IP).
- ♦ **Andrew Chafin** has held opponents scoreless in 11 of his last 12 outings (0.42 ERA; 1 ER in 21.2 IP).
- ♦ **T.J. McFarland**, who leads all NL relievers with 55.1 innings, has posted a 0.60 ERA (1 ER in 15.0 IP) over his last 10 games...his 54.1 innings are the second most by a D-backs reliever before the All-Star Break, trailing Byung-Hyun Kim (58.1 in 2001).

## LÓPEZ NAMED TO MLB ALL-STAR FUTURES GAME

- ♦ Double-A Jackson RHP **Yoan López** (World Team) has been named to the MLB All-Star Futures Game on July 15 @ Nationals Park.

## ON-DECK: COLORADO ROCKIES

- ♦ The D-backs are 5-1 vs. Rockies this season, including a 3-game series sweep @ Coors Field from June 8-10...Arizona has won 12 of its last 15 regular season games vs. Colorado.
- ♦ The D-backs have won 8 consecutive games at Coors Field since June 21, 2017, the longest streak in Denver in franchise history...the streak is tied for the longest by any team in ballpark history with the Pirates (July 27, 2014-April 27, 2016) and Angels (July 6, 2001-July 8, 2015).

## TUESDAY'S STARTER: LHP PATRICK CORBIN (6-3, 3.05)

- ♦ Has posted a 0.95 ERA (2 ER in 19.0 IP), .191 opponent average, 23 strikeouts and 3 walks in his last 3 starts since June 22.
- ♦ Earned the win in his Opening Day start vs. Colorado on March 29, allowing 2 runs with 8 strikeouts in 5.2 innings.

**GREINKE AT A GLANCE**

- ◆ Third season with the D-backs.
- ◆ Won the 2009 AL Cy Young Award and finished runner-up in 2015 race to the Cubs' Jake Arrieta.
- ◆ Is a 4-time All-Star (2009, '14-15, '17), won 3 NL Rawlings® Gold Gloves (2014-16) and earned a Louisville Slugger® Silver Slugger™ in 2013.
- ◆ 1 of 3 pitchers all-time with a Cy Young, Silver Slugger and Gold Glove (also: Fernando Valenzuela and Orel Hershiser).
- ◆ Won 2 ERA titles: 2009 (2.16) & 2015 (1.66)...1.66 ERA was the lowest in the Majors since Atlanta's Greg Maddux (1.63) in 1995...6 career 200+ strikeout seasons (2009, '11-12, '14-15, '17).

**SNAKEBITES**

- ◆ Has a 4-game winning streak with a 1.73 ERA (5 ER in 26.0 IP), .235 opp. average, 22 strikeouts.
- ◆ In his last 13 starts in the month of July since July 25, 2014, 10-0 with a 1.44 ERA (15 ER in 93.2 IP) and 94 strikeouts against 13 walks.
- ◆ Has held opponents scoreless in his last 2 day starts (13.0 IP).
- ◆ Had a 14.0-inning scoreless streak over 3 games from June 23-July 3.
- ◆ In his last 4 starts, has allowed 2 hit with runners in scoring position (.200, 2-for-10).

**LAST START**

- ◆ Got the 4-2 win vs. Cardinals on July 3, allowing 2 runs in 6.2 innings.

**VS. PADRES**

- ◆ In his last 5 starts, is 3-1 with a 2.53 ERA, .229 opponent average and 40 strikeouts (11.25 K/9).
- ◆ In 3 starts vs. Padres at Chase Field, is 3-0 with a 4.24 ERA (8 ER in 17.0 IP) and 21 strikeouts.
- ◆ In 19 career starts vs. Padres, is 10-2 with a 2.07 ERA (29 ER in 126.0 IP), .195 opponent average and 122 strikeouts.

**DAYMAN**

- ◆ In 5 day starts, is 2-3 with a 3.77 ERA (12 ER in 28.2 IP), .259 opp. average and 30 strikeouts.

**HOME SWEET HOME**

- ◆ Among NL pitchers at home, is eighth in ERA (2.44) and WHIP (0.99) and tied for 10th in opponent average (.214).
- ◆ In 9 home starts (6 quality), is 4-1 with a 2.44 ERA (15 ER in 55.1 IP), .214 opponent average (44-for-206) and 54 strikeouts, including 6 starts with 1 run allowed and 2 starts with 2 runs.
- ◆ In 9 home games, has held lefties to a .214 average (18-for-84) with 23 strikeouts (5 BB) and righties to a .213 average (26-for-122) with 31 strikeouts (6 BB).

**PLAYER PROFILE**

- ◆ Is an avid fantasy football player.
- ◆ Was a tennis prodigy at 8 years old.
- ◆ 2002 Gatorade National Baseball Player of the Year at Apopka (Fla.) High School...played shortstop...transitioned to pitcher as a senior.
- ◆ Began his career at Rookie level as a shortstop and pitcher...after just 1 workout, he gave his infielder glove to Andres Blanco because he decided to become a pitcher.
- ◆ During his 2004 rookie season with the Royals, lived with Hall of Famer George Brett.
- ◆ Gave his 2009 AL Cy Young Award to his parents but kept the samurai sword Mizuno presented him in recognition of his season.
- ◆ Committed to Clemson University.

**DEFENSE RULES**

- ◆ Has 69 straight games errorless games (112 TC) since May 12, 2016, 1 of 13 active error-free pitchers (min. 40 GS, 30 TC) during that span.

**DUCKS ON THE POND**

- ◆ Among NL pitchers with runners on base, is tied for 11th with a .168 opponent average (27-for-145) with 12 walks and 45 strikeouts.

**CLIMBING THE K CHARTS**

- ◆ His 112 strikeouts are seventh in the NL.
- ◆ His 2,348 career strikeouts are 49th on the all-time strikeout list, surpassing Early Wynn (50th, 2,334)...next is Robin Roberts (48th, 2,357).
- ◆ His 2,348 career strikeouts are fifth among active pitchers behind C.C. Sabathia (2,917), Justin Verlander (2,570), Bartolo Colon (2,513) and Felix Hernandez (2,429).

**QUALITY STARTS**

- ◆ Since joining the D-backs in 2016, has had 4-or-more quality starts in a row 4 times:
  - 4 straight (June 2-18, 2016, **June 18-July 3**)
  - 5 straight (April 19-May 11, 2017; August 25-September 16, 2017)

**ON REGULAR REST**

- ◆ When starting with 4 days between starts, is 5-1 with a 2.44 ERA (15 ER in 55.1 IP), .216 opponent average (45-for-208) and 55 strikeouts.

**JUNE FLASHBACK**

- ◆ In 6 starts (4 quality) in June, went 5-1 with a 2.97 ERA (12 ER in 36.1 IP), .250 opponent average and 36 strikeouts.
