## COLORADO ROCKIES (21-17) vs. MILWAUKEE BREWERS (22-16)

### WHERE THE HEART IS?

- The Colorado Rockies continue their six-game homestand with the second of four games against the Milwaukee Brewers ... split a two-game series against the Los Angeles Angels Tuesday and Wednesday, their first Interleague action of the season ... the Rockies' 15 home games thus far are tied for the fewest in the National League, second-fewest in the Major Leagues.
- Lost their second consecutive game last night, 5-2, following their season-high, six-game winning streak ... are now 1-5 in series openers at home this season.

### STILL A MILE UP

- The Rockies are batting .245 (119-for-485) at home this season, and are averaging 4.1 runs per game at Coors Field ... the lowest runs per game rate for a season in franchise history is 5.07, set in 2008.
- The Rockies went 0-for-12 with eight strikeouts with runners in scoring position Wednesday, the ninth time in franchise history they've gone hitless in at least 12 at-bats with RISP (last: May 28, 2014 at Philadelphia).

### TIME TO START A NEW ONE

- The Rockies club-record streak of nine consecutive quality starts was snapped on Wednesday after Tyler Anderson allowed four runs over five innings ... over that nine-game span, Rockies starters went 6-3 with a 1.92 ERA (61.0 IP, 13 ER) with an opponents' batting average of .190 (42-for-221).
- Rockies starters also had their 24 inning scoreless streak at home snapped on Wednesday ... it was the second-longest streak in franchise history.

### PRESS START

- After allowing 13 runs to San Diego on April 23, including nine in the seventh inning, Colorado has posted a 2.71 ERA (123.0 IP, 37 ER) over their past 14 games while going 9-5 over that span ... over that span, starting pitchers have allowed 22 earned runs over 85.0 innings of work (2.33 ERA) with 11 quality starts.
- The 2.71 ERA since April 24 ranks third in the NL, fourth in MLB.
- Over that span, the Rockies have held opponents to a .209 batting average (93-for-446), the second-lowest rate in the NL and the third-lowest in MLB.
- Have allowed greater than three runs four times over the last 14 games.

### THAT WAS THEN

- The Rockies were 6-3 on the road trip to Miami (1-2), Chicago-NL (2-1) and New York-NL (3-0) ... won the final two games in Chicago prior to a three-game sweep of the Mets, the Rockies' first sweep of 2018 ... Colorado hit .223 on the trip, including .280 in the final four games ... the

pitching staff posted a 2.31 ERA (78.0 IP, 20 ER) on the trip.

### BATTLE OF THE BREWS

- Colorado plays the Brewers seven times this season, this four-game series at home and a three-game series at Miller Park August 3-5.
- The Rockies took the season series vs. the Brewers in 2017, taking four of seven games ... lost two of three at Coors Field but took three of four at Miller Park.
- Colorado has dropped each of the past two series against Milwaukee, having last beat them in a series at home in 2015 ... are 4-9 vs. the Brewers at Coors Field since 2014.
- Nolan Arenado's .375 (33-for-88) batting average against Milwaukee is fourth-highest among all active players (min. 100 plate appearances).
- Brewers starting pitcher Jhoulys Chacin, spent the first six years of his career with Colorado after signing with the Rockies as a non-drafted international free agent in 2004 ... he ranks eighth in franchise history in starts (109) and wins (38) and seventh with 514 strikeouts.
- Rockies outfielder Gerardo Parra spent parts of two seasons with Milwaukee (2014-15), batting a combined .312 (139-for-446).
- Brewers Manager Craig Counsell was originally selected by the Rockies in the 11th round of the 1992 First-Year Player Draft, the first draft in Rockies history.
- Rockies bullpen coach Darren Holmes spent two seasons with the Brewers (1991-92) before being selected by the Rockies with the fifth pick in the 1992 Expansion Draft.

### LEAVE A MINT ON THE PILLOW

- The Rockies' 15 road wins are the most in the NL, tied for the most in MLB ... their .652 win percentage (15-8) ranks second in the National League and is sixth in MLB.
- Their 3.35 road ERA (199.0 IP, 74 ER) is fourth-best in the NL ... rank third in the NL with 191 road strikeouts.
- Over their 23 road games Colorado starters have posted a 3.06 ERA (129.1 IP, 44 ER) with 13 quality starts ... are 10-7.
- Have averaged 3.78 runs scored per game with a .215 batting average (163-for-759), ranking 14th in the NL and 28th in MLB.

### #COORS?

- 33 of the Rockies' 47 home runs have come on the road, the most road home runs in the NL and tied with Boston for the most in MLB.
- Charlie Blackmon leads MLB with 10 road home runs ... hit his first seven home runs on the road before homering at Coors Field on April 22 vs. Chicago-NL ... per Elias, he is the first Rockies player to have his first seven home runs come on the road since Ian Stewart in 2010.

### USE WHAT I GOT TO GET WHAT I NEED

- The Rockies have five wins in which they have scored two or fewer runs ... their most wins in games in which they scored two or fewer was 10 in 2010 ... have won four or fewer such games in 19 of their previous 25 seasons ... went 2-36 in games in which they scored two or fewer runs in 2017.

### BEAT THE STREAK

- Nolan Arenado has reached base in 20 consecutive games since April 12, tied for the second-longest active streak in MLB and the second-longest streak of his career ... reached base in 30 consecutive games in 2014.
- Has batted .319 (23-for-72) with four doubles, seven home runs, 15 RBI, 14 walks and 19 strikeouts over the course of the streak.

**ACROSS THE BOARD**

- The Lubbock, Texas, native was a member of his third career Opening Day roster in his sixth Major League season.
- Selected by the Rockies in the second round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft out of Texas Tech University.
- Attended Monterey High School in Lubbock ... was named to the all-region team before his senior season ... drafted by the Houston Astros in the eighth round of the 2007 First-Year Player Draft, but did not sign.

**GREAT CHETTIS**

- Ranks tied for fourth in the National League with four wins and fourth in the NL with a 2.05 ERA (44.0 IP, 10 ER) ... is tied for 10th in the league with a .206 batting average against.
- His 2.1 Baseball Reference WAR ranks second in the National League.
- Streak of four starts to begin '18 in which he pitched five or more innings with two or fewer runs and five or fewer hits allowed, the longest such string to start a season in Rockies history.

**A BITE OUT OF THE APPLE**

- Pitched seven shutout innings his last time out, May 5 at New York-NL, his second start of seven scoreless innings this season ... is one of seven pitchers, a list that also includes Jon Gray, to have multiple starts of seven or more scoreless innings.
- Allowed six hits with one walk and two strikeouts in the game ... allowed one extra-base hit, a double to Jay Bruce in the fourth inning.

**THE GOOD LAND**

- In four career starts against the Brewers, is 2-1 with a 2.88 ERA (25.0 IP, 8 ER), 13 walks and 19 strikeouts ... in three starts at Coors Field vs. Milwaukee, is 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA (20.0 IP, 5 ER).
- Made one start vs. the Brewers in 2017, a 6-3 Rockies loss at Coors Field ... allowed three runs on eight hits with one walk and six strikeouts across seven innings pitched ... left with the game tied 3-3.

**DARK HORSE**

- His 1.35 road ERA (33.1 IP, 5 ER) ranks second in the National League, sixth in the Majors ... his 33.1 innings pitched on the road are second-most in the Majors, the most in the National League.
- Is 4-1 in his five road starts this season and has allowed a total of five earned runs on 23 hits in 33.1 innings of work.
- In 52 career appearances on the road, including 41 starts, is 15-16 with a 4.29 ERA (239.1 IP, 114 ER) ... as a starter, has gone 15-15 with a 4.26 ERA (228.0 IP, 108 ER).

**FAST TRACK**

- Is 13-7 with a 4.57 ERA (201.0 IP, 102 ER) in 35 career starts at Coors Field ... his .636 winning percentage at Coors Field ranks sixth among Colorado pitchers all-time with 150.0 or more innings ... is 1-1 with a 11.51 ERA (20.1 IP, 26 ER) in 18 relief appearances in Denver.
- Made two starts at Coors Field this season and combined to pitch 10.2 innings with five runs allowed (4.22 ERA) ... does not yet have a decision in Denver.
- Since the beginning of 2016, has gone 9-3 with a 4.17 ERA (123.0 IP, 57 ER) in 21 starts at Coors Field ... the Rockies have gone 16-5 at home over that span.
- Colorado won 11 consecutive games at Coors Field in his starts from June 9, 2016-Aug. 14, 2017 ... over that span, he went 7-0 with a 3.50 ERA (64.1 IP, 25 ER).

**DON'T BET AGAINST HIM**

- Returned to the starting rotation in 2017 after recovering from a testicular cancer diagnosis and subsequent surgery ... was originally diagnosed and underwent surgery in November, 2016 ... a biopsy in March, 2017 showed the cancer had spread and he underwent chemotherapy treatments throughout the spring and beginning of summer.
- Placed on the 60-day disabled list March 26, 2017, sent to Double-A Hartford to begin rehab July 13 ... was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list and optioned to Triple-A Albuquerque Aug. 4.
- Made his first Major League start of the season on Aug. 14 vs. the Atlanta Braves ... pitched seven shutout innings and allowed six hits with no walks and two strikeouts in a 3-0 Rockies win.
- Made nine Major League starts and went 2-4 with a 5.05 ERA (46.1 IP, 26 ER), 11 walks and 30 strikeouts.

**ALL OUT**

- Was the recipient of the 207 Tony Conigliaro Award, which is given to a Major Leaguer who has overcome adversity through the attributes of spirit, determination and courage that were trademarks of Tony C. ... Bettis became the second Rockies pitcher to receive the award (Aaron Cook, 2005).

**BREEZE**

- Went 14-8 with a 4.79 ERA (186.0 IP, 99 ER), 59 walks and 138 strikeouts in 32 starts in 2016, setting career highs in wins, starts, innings pitched and strikeouts.
- Led the Rockies in wins, starts and innings pitched.
- Pitched his first career complete-game shutout on Sept. 5 vs. San Francisco at Coors Field ... allowed two hits with no walks and seven strikeouts, becoming the seventh Rockies pitcher to throw a nine-inning shutout and allow two hits or fewer, the second to accomplish the feat at Coors Field.
- The Rockies went 21-11 in his 32 starts, including 16-4 over his final 20 starts of 2016 ... Colorado went 10-0 over his final 10 starts at Coors Field.

**YEARLING**

- Made his Major League debut in 2013, making eight starts and eight relief appearances.
- Was used solely as a reliever in 2014, making 21 relief appearances for the Rockies ... returned to the starting rotation in 2015, making 20 starts.

24-year-old Denver native will make his eighth start, third at home ... earned his second win of the season May 6 at New York-NL, a 3-2 Rockies win ... pitched seven innings and allowed two runs on four hits with one walk and a season-high tying eight strikeouts ... allowed both runs and three hits in the first inning ... has worked seven innings in three consecutive starts ... in two starts at Coors Field this season, is 1-1 with a 2.08 ERA (13.0 IP, 3 ER), four walks and 13 strikeouts ... in 21 career appearances, 18 starts, at Coors Field, is 7-9 with a 3.51 ERA (100.0 IP, 39 ER) ... his 3.51 ERA is the third-lowest at Coors Field in franchise history (min. 100 IP), second-lowest among starting pitchers behind teammate Tyler Anderson ... lost in his lone start vs. Milwaukee, Aug. 20, 2017 at Coors Field (5.2,4,3,2,5,7).
