THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 4-2 through six games on their 11-day homestand...tonight they will play the third of four with the White Sox...they will complete the homestand with three vs. Los Angeles-AL this weekend...15 of the Twins last 17 games have been decided by three runs-or-less with the Twins going 6-9 in those games.

TWINS SPLIT THE DAY WITH SOX: The Twins beat the White Sox in game one of yesterday's doubleheader by a score of 4-2 and lost in the night game by a score of 6-3...Fernando Romero made the start in game one and Zack Littell made his major league debut, starting in game two...the bullpen on the day combined to pitch 9.0 scoreless innings with four hits allowed, one walk and nine strikeouts...the offense had 14 hits on the day as Eduardo Escobar highlighted the club, going 5-for-8 with three doubles, one home run and five RBI over the two games.

TWINS AND SOX: The Twins and White Sox are playing the seventh of 19 games this season...the Twins have won eight of their last 10 over the Sox and 14 of their last 20.

- ☞ Brian Dozier is hitting .324 (45-for-139) with 11 doubles, 12 home runs, 24 RBI and a .405 on-base percentage in his last 36 games vs. the White Sox.
- ☞ Eduardo Escobar is hitting .341 (28-for-82) with nine doubles, four home runs, 16 RBI and a .433 on-base percentage in his last 23 games vs. his former club.
- ☞ Eddie Rosario has hit safely in nine of his last 10 games vs. the White Sox, hitting .364 (16-for-44) with five doubles, four home runs and 13 RBI in that span.
- ☞ St. Louis acquired Zach Duke from the Sox at the trade deadline in 2016 for Charlie Tilson.

THE ESCOBAR EXPRESS: Eduardo Escobar has hit safely in six of his last seven games...during that stretch he is hitting .429 (12-for-28) with five doubles, four home runs, 13 RBI and five multi-hit games.

- ☞ How Escobar got to the Twins: Minnesota drafted AJ. Pierzynski in 1994, traded him to San Francisco in the winter of 2003 for Joe Nathan, Boof Bonser and Francisco Liriano, then the Twins traded Liriano at the 2012 trade deadline for Escobar and Pedro Hernandez...Escobar was originally signed by the White Sox on January 28, 2006.

WHITE HOT ROSIE: Since the start of May, Eddie Rosario is hitting .370 (50-for-135) with 11 doubles, 10 home runs, 28 RBI, 25 runs scored, a .410 on-base percentage, .674 slugging percentage and a 1.084 OPS in 33 games...among AL players since the start of May, he ranks second in batting average, tied for third in RBI, tied for fourth in homers, sixth in OPS and seventh in slugging and OBP.

ARROWS FLYING: Fernando Rodney has converted each of his last 11 save opportunities after beginning the season 2-for-5 in save opportunities...he has held opponents scoreless in 13 of his last 14 appearances, posting to a .125 batting average with six hits allowed (1 extra-base hit - home run to Jorge Soler May 28) and five walks in that span...his save yesterday afternoon was the 313th of his career, moving him within one of tying Robb Nen for 21st place on baseball's all-time saves list...next would be Rick Aguilera with 318.

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 1983, The Twins selected pitcher Tim Belcher with the first pick in the annual June free-agent draft, but Belcher rejected the \$125,000 signing bonus offer and pitched for Team USA in the Pan American Games instead...it marked the first of three times in club history (since 1961) that the Twins have selected first overall: Joe Mauer in 2001 and Royce Lewis in 2017.

IT'S ALL ABOUT ALEX: After being named Midwest League Player of the Week in June's first week, the MWL and Minor League Baseball announced yesterday that Kernels outfielder Alex Kirilloff has been named the Midwest League Player of the month for May...Minor League Baseball selected winners for each of the 10 full season leagues for the month of May and each winner will receive an award from Minor League Baseball in recognition of the honor...in 31 games this month, Kirilloff hit .360 and led the MWL in hits (41), RBI (25) and total bases (73)...he also had 19 extra base hits, three triples, 11 doubles, a .640 slugging percentage and a 1.063 OBPS...he was selected by the Twins in the first round (15th overall) of the 2016 First Year Player Draft out of Plum (PA) HS on June 9.

DRAFT DAY TWO COMPLETED: The Twins selected seven additional players on the second day of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft to bring their two-day total to nine players...in all, the Twins have drafted three right-handed pitchers, two catchers, one infielder and three outfielders in the first two days of the draft...below are the first two days picks:

LAST START: Odorizzi did not factor in the decision for his fourth straight start May 31 vs. Cleveland, opposite Shane Bieber (ML Debut)...allowed eight runs (7 earned) on seven hits, including two home runs, and two walks with three strikeouts over 3.2 innings...the seven earned runs are a season-high and the seven hits match a season-high while the 3.2 innings is a season low and the fewest since September 11, 2017 against NYY...despite allowing eight runs, did not suffer a loss after the Twins tied the game in the seventh inning, erasing the eight-run deficit.

AGAINST CHICAGO-AL: This will be Odorizzi's fifth career start against the White Sox and second of 2018...in four career starts against the White Sox, 1-1 with a 3.86 ERA (23.1 IP, 10 ER) with six walks and 27 strikeouts...last start against the Sox was May 3, did not factor into the decision after allowing five runs (3 earned) over 5.1 innings on six hits and two walks with eight strikeouts...last win against the Sox was June 8, 2017 at Tampa Bay, allowing three runs on eight hits and one walk with eight strikeouts over 6.2 innings...the loss came April 28, 2014 where he allowed four runs on eight hits and two walks with five strikeouts over 4.1 innings.

ON THE FIRST PITCH: Through his 12 starts this season, Odorizzi has allowed a .458 (11-for-24) average on the first pitch against a batter...on the 0-0 count, four of the 11 hits have been home runs and three have been doubles...of pitchers who have faced at least 15 batters who have put the first pitch in play, his average against is 10th highest in the AL.

- On the contrary, when Odorizzi gets two strikes on a batter he is holding hitters to a .162 (22-for-136) average.

QUALITY NOT QUANTITY: Over his 12 starts this season, Odorizzi has averaged just over 5.25 innings/start...of starters with at least 11 starts, his 63.0 innings ranks as the 12th-fewest in the AL...his 18.4 pitches/inning ranks second highest in MLB behind Danny Duffy at 18.6...he averages 4.29 pitches/batter faced which is second most in MLB and most in the AL...though his starts have been on the short side, his 29 earned runs allowed ranks tied for 20th fewest in the American League among pitchers who have started at least 11 games.

PROBLEMS WITH THE LONG BALL: Last season Odorizzi gave up 30 homers in 143.1 IP...in his 28 starts he had only five outings where he did not give up at least one home run...his 1.88 HR/9.0 IP ranked fourth highest in the AL and sixth in MLB...of the 30 HR, 15 were solo shots, eight were two-run shot five three-run homers, and two grand-slams...had five multi-homer games, four of which were at home (Tropicana Field)...he was slightly better on the road than at home last season, giving up 11 homers on the road as compared to 19 at home.

- Has surrendered 14 home runs this season, seventh most in the AL.

STILL NEED HELP: In Odorizzi's 12 starts in 2018, the Twins offense has supplied 22 total runs, good for a run support average of 3.14 runs per game...his run support average is lowest on the team among starters with at least seven starts, is sixth lowest in baseball and fifth-lowest in the AL.

A BRIGHT START: Odorizzi pitched in his first career Opening Day start and first career start for the Twins...he went 6.0 innings and allowed just two hits, while not allowing a run and striking out seven...only five other times in his career has he notched seven or more strikeouts while not allowing a run in 6.0-plus innings, the first since April 8, 2015 vs. Baltimore...he became the eighth different pitcher to start Opening Day for the Twins in the last 12 seasons.

2017 RECAP:

- In his fourth full professional season, Odorizzi started 28 games and tossed 143.1 innings...with a 10-8 record, this marked his third season of a .500 or better record
- His 7.97 K/9.0 IP ranked T-2nd best in his career (other, 2015 and best, 2014 with 9.32).
- On September 23, Odorizzi recorded nine strikeouts, a season high, while allowing just one run on three hits in 6.0 innings
- Odorizzi held right-handed batters to a .228 average and lefties to a .210 average against

FLY AWAY: In 2017 Odorizzi ranked fourth among all major league pitchers in Fly Ball Percentage (min. 140.0 IP) with a rate of 47.3%...he trailed Ariel Miranda of Seattle (52.2%), Marco Estrada of Toronto (50.3%), and Ian Kennedy of Kansas City (47.7%)...since 2014 Odorizzi has ranked in the top-10 in fly ball percentage every season: 2014 (2nd, 48.7%), 2015 (10th, 40.6%), and 2016 (9th, 44.4%)...in 2018, Odorizzi has allowed 90 fly balls, tied for fifth most in baseball.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - JOSÉ BERRÍOS [SEASON: 6-5, 3.86 ERA ; CAREER: 23-20, 4.75 ERA]

Berrios is 6-5 this year with a 3.86 ERA (74.2 IP, 32 ER) with 14 walks and 74 strikeouts...will make his seventh career start and third of the season against the White Sox...in 2018, is 2-0 with a 2.77 ERA (13.0 IP, 4 ER) with two walks and 13 strikeouts vs. Chicago-AL...last start against the White Sox was May 4, allowed four runs on six hits and two walks with two strikeouts over 6.0 innings...only loss to the White Sox came August 24, 2017, allowed five runs (three earned) on four hits and three walks with nine strikeouts over 5.1 innings.

- Selected by Milwaukee in the first round (32nd overall) of 2008 First-Year Player Draft, traded to Kansas City in 2010, then in 2012 traded to Tampa Bay where he remained until his trade to Minnesota on February 17, 2018.
- 2017 marked his fourth straight year of at least 28 starts.
- On May 29, 2016 vs. New York-AL, retired his first 16 batters-faced, tied for the 3rd-longest perfect game bid in Rays history.
- Established career-highs in 2016 for starts (33) and innings pitched (187.2).
