### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**July 31, 2007:** The Yankees match a franchise record with eight home runs in a 16-3 win vs. the White Sox (also on 6/28/39 at Philadelphia). Seven different Yankees homered in the game, with Hideki Matsui hitting a pair.

**July 31, 1938:** In the Yankees' longest game of the season, New York's Spud Chandler pitches 15 innings (8H, 0BB, 3K) in Game 2 of a doubleheader as the Yanks beat the White Sox, 7-3.

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**Aug. 1, 1975:** Billy Martin replaces Bill Virdon as manager after the Yankees get off to a 53-51 start. The club would finish third in the AL East with an 83-77 record.

**Aug. 1, 1941:** Lefty Gomez records a 9-0 shutout victory vs. the St. Louis Browns, despite walking 11 batters. Gomez remains one of only two pitchers in MLB history to record at least 11BB and allow 0R (also Mel Stottlemyre on 5/21/70 vs. WSH—11BB, 0R).

**Aug. 1, 1937:** In a 14-5 victory over the St. Louis Browns, Lou Gehrig hits for the cycle for the second time in his career.

**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees begin a two-game series tonight vs. Baltimore...are 3-1 on their six-game homestand after taking a four-game series vs. Kansas City...depart for a seven-game road trip on Thursday, including 4G at Boston (Thurs.-Sun.) and 3G at Chicago-AL (8/6-8).

- ▶ **At 67-37 (.644), have the Majors' second-best record** behind Boston (75-33, .694)...the Yankees and Red Sox have held (at least a share of) the Majors' two best records on 81 of the last 89 days (since the end of play on 5/3).
- ▶ **Are 30G over .500, tying their season high** (third time, also at 61-31 on 7/12 and 62-32 on 7/14).
- ▶ **Are 6.0G behind first-place Boston** in the AL East.
- ▶ **Have lost just four of their last 30 series**, going 21-4-5 since 4/19...are 58-28 in their last 86G...are 49-8 (.860) when scoring first...are a Major League-best 41-6 (.872) when their starter tosses at least 6.0 innings.
- ▶ **Have not won more than two straight games since winning four straight from 6/18-21**, going 17-15 since that streak.

**WHERE WE LEFT OFF:** The Yankees capped their four-game series vs. Kansas City with a 6-3 win on Sunday...**LHP J.A. Happ** (6.0IP, 3H, 1ER, 1BB, 2K, 1HR, 1HP, 1WP) started and won his Yankees debut, taking a shutout into the sixth...**CF Aaron Hicks** (3-for-3, 2R, 1 double, 1HR, 2RBI, 1BB) reached in all 4PA...was the fourth time in his career he reached in each of four-or-more plate appearances in a game...**DH Neil Walker** (1-for-2, 1R, 1BB, 1HP) reached in 3-of-4 plate appearances...**LHP Aroldis Chapman** (1.0IP, 3K) struck out all 3BF in the ninth to record his 28th save.

- ▶ Marked only the second time in 9G since the All-Star break that a Yankees starter completed 6.0IP (Tanaka-CG SHO on Wed. at Tampa Bay).

**SHAKE IT OFF:** After being out-homered, 3-1, by the Royals on Sunday, the Yankees are 6-2 when allowing at least 3HR in a game...are the only Major League team with a winning record in such games this season.

**SAVES THE DAY:** **LHP Aroldis Chapman** struck out all 3BF on Sunday to record his 28th save of the season...had struck out only three of his previous 16BF.

- ▶ Ranks fifth in the Majors in saves...his 96.6% save conversion rate (28-for-29) leads all relievers (min. 15 save opps.).
- ▶ Has converted 21 consecutive save chances since 5/8, the third-longest streak of his career (29 straight from 7/4/14-5/30/15; 27 straight from 6/26-9/4/12)...is the longest streak by a Yankee since Andrew Miller converted 24 in a row from 4/8-8/6/15.
- ▶ Opponents are hitting .133 (19-for-143) this season, the lowest opp. BA among qualified AL relievers and second-lowest among all relievers (Josh Hader-.124).
- ▶ His 15.64 K/9.0IP ratio (73K/42.0IP) is second among MLB relievers (Josh Hader-16.60).

**THE WALK SHOW:** **INF Neil Walker** has multiple hits in three of his last 4G (8-for-13) after going his first 65G this season without consecutive multi-hit games.

- ▶ Is batting .419/.481/.581 (18-for-43) with 8R, 4 doubles, 1HR, 10RBI and 6BB in his last 14G (since 7/9-G1) to raise his season BA by 46 points...has RBI in seven of his last 10G.

**LEADING OFF:** The Yankees have scored multiple first-inning runs in 3-of-4 games on this homestand...have scored at least 1R in the first inning of 14-of-21 wins since 6/18.

**FAN FAVORITES:** Through 52 home gates, the Yankees lead the AL in total home attendance (2,246,667) and average attendance per home gate (43,205), trailing only the Dodgers in both categories (2,475,795 / 46,713).

- ▶ **Have tied a current Yankee Stadium sellouts record with 20 sellouts this season** (also 20 in 2011)...have sold out 13 of their last 17 home gates (since 6/16).
- ▶ Also lead the AL in average road attendance at 32,808 per gate...no other AL team is averaging more than 31,000 per road gate.

**PICK UP HICKS:** **CF Aaron Hicks** went 7-for-10 with 4R, 1 double, 1HR, 3RBI and 4BB in the Kansas City series...reached in all 4PA on Sunday, going 3-for-3 with 2R, 1 double, 1HR, 2RBI, 1BB and 1CS.

- ▶ Has a career-high-tying 33 extra-base hits (14 doubles, 2 triples, 17HR), matching his 2017 season.
- ▶ In four career starts hitting cleanup (all this season), is hitting .545/.706/1.364 (6-for-11) with 7R, 1 double, 1 triple, 2HR, 5RBI and 6BB.
- ▶ Ranks ninth among Major League outfielders with a 3.2 WAR (FanGraphs)...is 0.1 shy of his career high (3.3 in 2017).

**JUST DÚ IT:** **3B Miguel Andújar** has hit safely in 20-of-23 games in July, batting .333/.385/.417 (28-for-84) with 12R, 7 doubles, 5RBI, 6BB and 1HP.

- ▶ Is batting .293 (103-for-352) this season...only 10 rookies in Yankees history have qualified for the batting title with a BA of .290-or-better, most recently Robinson Canó in 2005 (.297).

**SIR DID!** **SS Didi Gregorius** has 16RBI in 24G this month after totaling just 13RBI in 47G over May and June.

- ▶ **Since the start of 2017, has hit safely in 24-of-25 games vs. Baltimore**, batting .386/.439/.683 (39-for-101) with 26R, 12 doubles, 6HR, 23RBI, 9BB, 2HP and 45B.

**VIC-TORR-E.S.:** The Yankees are 48-20 (.706) when **INF Gleyber Torres** plays this season, and 19-17 in games without him.

**HOME COOKING:** The Yankees are 37-15 (.712) at Yankee Stadium in 2018, the second-best home record in the Majors to Boston (38-14, .731)...are 32-10 in 42 home games since 4/21.

- ▶ Are in the midst of a stretch of 19-of-29 games at home...are 5-4 so far (4-2 at home, 1-2 on the road).
- ▶ Since their only home series loss of the season (1-3 from 4/5-8 vs. Baltimore), are 12-0-3 in 15 home series, their longest streak without dropping a series at home since going 20-0-5 over 25 home series from 9/15/97-8/16/98...**are 12-0-2 in 14 home series since 4/19**.
- ▶ Are 19-1-3 in their last 23 home series (since 8/31/17), going 51-19 in 70G over that span.
- ▶ Are in the middle of a stretch of three straight home series vs. the AL's three last-place teams (3-1 through the first 4-of-10 games): 3-1 vs. Kansas City, 2G vs. Baltimore, 4G vs. Texas.
- ▶ **Have scored at least 5R in eight consecutive home games**, tied for their longest streak at the current Yankee Stadium (third time, also 7/13-28/12 and 5/17-31/10)...is tied for the second-longest streak in the Majors this season (Baltimore-9G, 4/26-5/12; Cleveland-8G, 4/30-5/13)...have scored 63R in 10 home games in July.

**BRONX BOMBERS:** **Yankees batters** are hitting .284/.356/.473 with 46 doubles, 2 triples and 36HR this month while averaging 5.58 runs per game (134R/24G)...**have not compiled a team BA of .280-or-better in a calendar month since hitting .288 in August 2011**.

- ▶ **Have hit a Major League-leading 167HR**...are on pace to hit 260HR (the MLB record is 264HR by Seattle in 1997).
- ▶ Despite hitting 17HR more than the next-highest club (Cleveland-150), have not led the Majors in HRs in any calendar month this season...are tied with Cleveland for the July home run lead with 36HR.
- ▶ Have homered in four straight games (5HR total) after hitting just 1HR in their previous 5G...have 6HR in 9G since the All-Star break after hitting 30HR in their first 15G in July.
- ▶ Lead the Majors in slugging (.459) and OPS (.792) and rank second in XBH (375) and runs per game (5.19).

**BACK HOME:** Tonight marks **RHP Masahiro Tanaka's** first start at Yankee Stadium since 5/27 vs. Los Angeles-AL...has made five consecutive starts on the road...has allowed 2R-or-fewer in eight of his last 11 home starts (since 7/28/17) while going 7-3 with a 2.52 ERA (71.1IP, 20ER).

- ▶ Is 6-0 with a 3.47 ERA (70.0IP, 27ER) in his last 12 starts overall, the longest unbeaten streak of his career.

# YANKEES vs. BALTIMORE ORIOLES

**OVERALL TRENDS:** The Yankees are 5-5 vs. the Orioles in 2018...will meet 19 times in 2018 (9G in the Bronx, 10G in Baltimore)...won three straight series between the clubs from 6/9-9/17/17...was their longest streak of series won against the O's since winning three in a row from 7/5-9/12/13...are 220-142-2 vs. Baltimore since 1998, the club's most wins over any opponent in that span (next: 214-149 vs. Tampa Bay)...  
**IN SEASON SERIES:** With a 12-7 mark in 2017, snapped a streak of three consecutive season series losses (2014-16), which marked their first time losing consecutive season series to the O's since 1980-82...are 15-3-2 in 20 season series since 1998... **AT YANKEE STADIUM:** Are 1-3 at Yankee Stadium in 2018...went 8-2 vs. Baltimore at Yankee Stadium in 2017, their most home wins vs. the Orioles since 1960 (10-1 at the original Yankee Stadium) and tied for the second-highest single-season win total against any opponent at the current Stadium (10-0 vs. Toronto in 2013, 8-2 vs. Tampa Bay in 2017)...are 56-33 (.629) vs. the O's at the current Yankee Stadium, their second most wins vs. any opponent here (first: 57-31 vs. Toronto)...  
**IN POSTSEASON:** Have won both postseason meetings (2012 ALDS, 3-2; 1996 ALCS, 4-1).

- ✦ His 29BF were tied for the fewest by a Yankee in a 9.0-inning complete game since 2002.
