Following last night's victory, the Braves still need to win two more games over Los Angeles to advance to the League Championship Series after losing both games at Dodger Stadium to open this series.

Dating to June 6, 2013, a span of 43 games, the Braves have won three consecutive games over the Dodgers once.

They won at Los Angeles on May 27, 2015, before taking the first two games at Turner Field, July 20 and July 21, 2015.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Dodgers continue their National League Division Series today with Game 4 at SunTrust Park...The Braves won last night to force today's game, but the Dodgers have won seven of the 10 games between the teams this season... In those 10 games, Los Angeles has outscored the Braves, 49-24.

A The Dodgers beat the Braves, 3-games-to-1, in the 2013 NLDS, the last time Atlanta was in the postseason.

A The teams' first series came June 8-10 in Los Angeles, with the Dodgers winning two of three... The clubs met again, July 25-29 at SunTrust Park, and the Dodgers won the first three before Sean Newcomb carried a no-hitter for 8.2 innings in the final game to help the Braves win, 4-1.

A From 2016 through this regular season, the Braves went 3-7 against Los Angeles in Atlanta...Over the last five years, the Braves have won consecutive games over the Dodgers in Georgia once: July 20-21, 2015.

A RHP Mike Foltynewicz is set for his second start of the series today...The righty went 2.0 innings in Game 1 and allowed four runs, earned, to take the loss...Foltynewicz will be starting on short rest for the first time in his career.

A LHP Rich Hill is 5-0 with a 1.74 ERA (9 ER/46.2 IP) in nine games, seven career starts, against the Braves...The lefty beat Atlanta, 8-2, on July 26 of this season here at SunTrust Park, tossing 7.0 shutout innings with eight strikeouts.

GRAND SLAM: 20-year-old OF Ronald Acuña Jr. became the youngest player in baseball history to hit a grand slam in a postseason game when he did so in the second inning last night.

A Prior to last night, Mickey Mantle was the youngest to hit a grand slam in the playoffs, doing so at the age of 21 in Game 5 of the 1953 World Series against Brooklyn.

A Acuña Jr.'s slam, which came on a 3-1, second-inning pitch from Walker Buehler, was the seventh in Braves postseason history and the first since Adam LaRoche hit one in Game 4 of the 2005 NLDS at Houston.

A It also marked the first slam of Acuña Jr.'s career.

NEED TO WIN: Since the inception of the divisional round in 1995, 55 series have begun 0-2, with 10 teams (18%) rebounding from that hole to win...The last club to do so was the 2017 New York Yankees...The Yankees lost the first two games in Cleveland last season, before outscoring the Indians 13-5 over the final three games to advance.

A Including best-of-seven series, the Braves have never come back from an 0-2 hole...They are 0-6 in such series.

BIG INNING: The Braves scored five runs in the second inning last night, their highest scoring inning in the playoffs since October 5, 2002, when they also scored five runs in the sixth inning of Game 3 of the NLDS at San Francisco.

A The Braves entered yesterday's second inning with one run over their previous 37 frames, dating to the start of their game on September 29 at Philadelphia.

A All five of the runs came with two outs...Atlanta had 290 two-out runs this season, the third most in the National League, and trailing only Milwaukee (316) and Washington (313) for the league lead.

ROOKIE WIN: RHP Touki Toussaint earned the victory yesterday, tossing a scoreless sixth inning to become the first Braves rookie to collect a postseason win since John Rocker on October 12, 1998 in Game 5 of the LCS at San Diego.

A The Braves had 10 pitchers debut this season, double the amount that did so last year...In all, 15 rookies pitched for Atlanta and combined to earn 26 wins, most by rookie pitchers in the National League.

FREEMAN: 1B Freddie Freeman drove the first pitch of his sixth inning at-bat with Alex Wood last night out to right field for his first career playoff home run...The drive gave the Braves a 6-5 lead and was the latest go-ahead postseason home run by a Braves player since 2010, when Brian McCann hit a solo home run off Madison Bumgarner to break a 1-1 tie in the sixth inning of Game 4 of the NLDS.

A Freeman hit .309 (63-for-204) against lefties this season, the second-best mark among left-handed hitters...Only Milwaukee's Christian Yelich was better at .337.

A Freeman has now hit safely in seven of his eight career postseason games (10-for-32, .313).

VS. LHP: The Braves went 21-26 (.447) against left-handed starters in the regular season this year...They were 69-46 (.600) in games started by a right-hander...They are 0-2 against lefties in this series.

A Despite the losing record against left-handed starters, the Braves hit .269 (426-for-1582) overall against lefties, the third-best mark in baseball...Their .336 on-base percentage was also third best, while their .444 slugging percentage was fourth.

SKID: The Braves have lost eight consecutive playoff rounds (including the 2012 Wild Card game), dating to the 2001 League Championship Series against Arizona... That streak is the second longest in MLB history... Only Chicago (NL) owns a longer such skid, losing 10 consecutive rounds from 1910 through 1998...Credit to Elias for the research.

A The Braves last won a playoff round in 2001, when they swept Houston in the NLDS.

Today's Game

- A* Set for his second postseason start in his fifth major league campaign.
 - A* Started Game 1 of this series last Thursday at Dodger Stadium and allowed three hits, three walks and four runs over 2.0 innings to take the loss.
 - A* The start was the shortest of his career...Previously went a career-low 2.2 innings on August 11, 2017 at St. Louis.
- A* Made a career-high 31 starts in the regular season, and set career bests in wins (13), innings (183.0 IP), ERA (2.85) and strikeouts (202)...Went 13-10 and allowed opponents to bat just .195 against him.
 - A* Among qualified N.L. pitchers, ranked among league leaders in complete games (T1st, 2), shutouts (T1st, 1), opponents' batting average (2nd, .195) ERA (6th, 2.85) and strikeouts (6th, 202).
- A* Has faced Los Angeles three total times in his major league career, and is 1-2 with a 7.43 ERA (11 ER/13.1 IP)...Dodgers batters have reached base at a .375 clip.
 - A* Made one regular-season start against them this season, July 27, and was touched for six hits and four runs over 5.0 innings at SunTrust Park.
- A* Fanned Phillies outfielder Roman Quinn in the end of the third inning in his final start of the season to notch his 200th strikeout...Finished the season fanning 202 batters to become the first Braves pitcher with 200 strikeouts since Javier Vazquez fanned 238 in 2009.
 - A* Since the club moved to Atlanta in 1966, only five pitchers prior to Foltyniewicz had reached 200 strikeouts in a season: John Smoltz (five times), Phil Niekro (three times), Vazquez (once), Kevin Millwood (once), and Greg Maddux (once).
- A* Allowed one hit over 5.0 innings in his final start of the season, dropping his batting average against to a franchise single season-low .195 (130-for-666)...Foltyniewicz passed Julio Teheran, who had a .196 mark (122-for-623) this season.
 - A* Greg Maddux held the previous record with a .197 mark (147-for-748) set in 1995...Prior to this season, Maddux was the only qualifying Braves pitcher to ever finish a season with a batting average against lower than .200.
 - A* The only National League pitcher with a better mark than Foltyniewicz and Teheran this season was RHP Max Scherzer (.188).

2018 Recap

- A* Had 17 starts this season in which he allowed no more than one run, the second-most such starts in the National League...Jacob deGrom had 18.
 - A* Only Greg Maddux had more starts of one run or less in a single season for Atlanta...Maddux set the Atlanta franchise record with 19 such starts in 2002, and he also had 18 starts in 1995.
- A* Was selected to his first major league All-Star Game after going 7-5 with a 2.66 ERA (30 ER/101.2 IP) over 18 games to open the season...Fanned 120 batters over 101.2 innings of work.
 - A* Tossed a scoreless fourth inning in his All-Star Game debut, retiring José Ramírez, Manny Machado and José Abreu, while walking Aaron Judge.
- A* Made his final regular season start at SunTrust Park, 9/22 vs. PHI...Earned the win as Atlanta clinched the N.L. East division title...Finished the season 5-4 with a 3.19 ERA (34 ER/96.0 IP) in his home park.
 - A* Opponents batted just .199 against him at SunTrust Park, logging 66 hits in 345 at-bats.
 - A* Since the Braves moved to Atlanta in 1966, only three pitchers allowed a lower opponents average at home in a single season...Damian Moss set the Atlanta-era record with a .184 average in 2002, while Tom Glavine allowed a .186 mark in 1997 and opponents hit just .189 against John Smoltz in 1989.
- A* Tossed his second complete game of the season, 9/11 at San Francisco...Held the Giants to six hits and one run on 108 pitches, fanning seven.
 - A* Lost the bid for his second shutout of the season when San Francisco plated its only run of the game in the bottom of the ninth...Shut out Washington on 6/1, the first of his career.
 - A* The complete game was the first for a Braves pitcher on the road since 2016, when Julio Teheran blanked the Mets on June 19.
 - A* Foltyniewicz became the first Atlanta pitcher with two complete games in a single season since Shelby Miller logged two in 2015.
- A* Made six starts in August, and went 3-2 with a 2.09 ERA (9 ER/38.2 IP) and 41 strikeouts.
 - A* His run last month followed five starts in July during which he went 2-3 with a 5.72 ERA (18 ER/28.1 IP).
- A* Threw the first shutout of his major league career, 6/1 vs. Washington...Allowed just two hits and struck out 11.
 - A* Became the seventh pitcher in Atlanta-era history to throw a two-hitter or better with double-digit strikeouts and the first since Greg Maddux fanned 14 Brewers in a two-hit, 1-0 win on May 2, 2001 at Turner Field.

- A* Acquired by the Atlanta Braves along with RHP Andrew Thurman and INF Rio Ruiz from the Houston Astros in exchange for C/OF Evan Gattis and RHP James Hoyt on 1/14/15.

- Makes his third postseason appearance...Was with Baltimore during the 2014 ALDS vs. Detroit and the ALCS vs. Kansas City, as well as the 2016 Wild Card at Toronto...Is 1-0 with a 1.80 ERA in four postseason games.
- Is 1-1 with a 2.57 ERA (6 ER/21.0 IP) in 19 career games against Los Angeles...Allowed a solo home run to Kike Hernández in Game 1.
- Atlanta acquired him, 7/29, from the Baltimore Orioles in exchange for an international signing slot...Allowed just four earned runs in 27 regular season appearances (23.2 IP) with Atlanta, pitching to a 1.52 ERA...Went 1-2 with a 4.85 ERA (21 ER/39.0 IP) in 42 games with Baltimore, converting 11-of-13 save chances.
- Has a 1.76 ERA (6 ER/30.2 IP) in 34 regular season appearances against the National League this season...In 35 games against A.L. opponents, went 2-2 with a 5.34 ERA (19 ER/32.0 IP).

- Went 1-4 with a 2.94 ERA (11 ER/33.2 IP) in 14 games with Atlanta this season, including five starts..In nine relief appearances this season, went 0-2 with a 3.75 ERA (5 ER/12.0 IP) and 17 strikeouts...Was 1-2 with a 2.49 ERA in five starts...For his career, has a 2.93 ERA in nine starts and a 4.12 ERA in 14 games in relief.
- Five of his final six appearances of the season were in relief, including each of his last four...Allowed just seven hits and one run over 8.0 innings (1.13 ERA) in that span, fanning 12.
