THIS SEASON:

Began season with Tampa Bay... Entered the season on a streak of 51 errorless games and 179 errorless chances, which both ranked third in club history for a shortstop...Made his sixth straight Opening Day start at shortstop (five with Miami and one with Tampa Bay)...Went 2-for-4 with an RBI on Opening Day (3/29) vs. Boston; the first Rays shortstop with a multi-hit game on Opening Day since Jason Bartlett in 2010...Homered in back-to-back games on 4/22 and 4/25 for the first time in his career...Hit safely in a season-high nine straight games from 5/13 to 6/24...Was placed on the 10-day disabled list on 5/19 (retro

to 5/18) with a right hamstring strain...Played in a total of three games on rehab with Single-A Charlotte and Triple-A Durham before being reinstated from the D.L. on 6/17...Was charged with his first error of the season on 6/30; his first miscue since 7/30/17 at New York (AL)...Went 94 games and 319 chances between errors - both the longest streaks in club history for a shortstop...Went 11-for-37 (.297) with two doubles and six RBI in his final 12 games with the Rays...Was charged with two errors in 61 games (194 total chances) with Tampa Bay before being designated for assignment on 8/1.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

2017: Hit a combined .261 (86-for-330) with 14 doubles, five triples, eight home runs and 30 RBI in 97 games between Miami and Tampa Bay...Became the only player in MLB to record at least five triples in each of the last five seasons (since 2013); his 35 triples in that time were the second-most in MLB behind Dee Gordon (36)...Established a career high in home runs...Was Miami's Opening Day starter at shortstop for the fifth straight year...Was placed on the disabled list on 4/9 with a strained left oblique...Was acquired by Tampa Bay on 6/26...Joined Tampa Bay on 6/27 at Pittsburgh after being reinstated from the disabled list; had two RBI in the game with a run-scoring single in the eighth inning and a sacrifice fly in the 10th inning...Recorded a game-tying hit with two outs in the ninth inning twice for Tampa Bay; the first Rays player to do so twice in a season since Evan Longoria in 2010...Tied the score on 6/30 at Baltimore with an RBI-single in the ninth inning en route to a 6-4, 10-inning win...Delivered an RBI-single in the ninth inning on 7/18 at Oakland in a game Tampa Bay went on to win 4-3...Had a career-high tying four hits on 6/30; the first Rays player with four hits from the ninth spot of the order since Kevin Kiermaier on 7/9/14...Hit a go-ahead solo homer in the eighth inning off New York's (AL) Sonny Gray on 9/12...Did not commit an error after 7/30 to finish the season on a 51-game errorless streak (179 errorless chances).

2016: Spent entire season with Miami, where he established a career high in games played...Tied for the team lead in triples along with Dee Gordon and Marcell Ozuna...Batted leadoff on 5/26 at Tampa Bay; homered off Drew Smyly in the second inning for his first career homer from the leadoff spot...Recorded a season-high four RBI on 6/13 at San Diego after going 2-for-5 with a double, triple and two runs scored.

2015: Was the recipient of the Jeff Conine Mr. Marlin Award by the South Florida chapter of the BBWAA...Was a Rawlings Gold Glove finalist at shortstop for the second straight season...Led all National League shortstops in batting average (.281) while ranking sixth in hits (132)...Took home N.L. Player-of-the-Week honors for the week of 4/20-26; hit .500 with a double, triple, home run and

10 RBI in that span...Hit .321 in April; the second-best monthly average of his career (minimum 86 plate appearances) behind a .324 mark in July of 2013...Recorded his first career walkoff hit on 8/2 vs. San Diego with a three-run homer...Missed the final 28 games due to left hamstring tightness, but was not placed on the disabled list.

2014: Finished season tied for second in all of MLB in triples, trailing only Dee Gordon (12)...Began campaign with 11 hits in his first five games (according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the second player in the last 10 seasons to have 11 hits at shortstop over the team's first five games, joining Edgar Renteria for San Francisco in 2010)...His 11 hits were also the second-most in Marlins history over the team's first five games behind Emilio Bonifacio in 2009 (14)...Was placed on the 15-day disabled list on 6/25 (retro to 6/21) with a right triceps strain.

2013: Ranked third in hits among all rookies, trailing only Nolan Arenado (130) and J.B. Shuck (128)...Became the fifth rookie in Marlins history to record two grand slams, and the only rookie to hit two grand slams in the Majors...Hit first grand slam on 5/5 at Philadelphia and his second on 9/4 at Wrigley Field...Tied a club record (fourth time) for RBI in a single game with seven on 5/5 at Philadelphia; had a bases loaded triple in the first inning to go with a grand slam in the third inning...Set a National League record for RBI in a game by a Cuban player, and was one short of tying Jose Canseco's MLB record from 6/13/94 at Seattle while playing for Texas...Led all rookies in triples and tied Alex Gonzalez (1999) for the second-most in a rookie campaign in club history...Hit safely in a career-high 11 straight games from 7/1-12, batting .442 (19-for-43) with four doubles and four RBI.

2012: Was promoted to the big leagues on 8/4...Made Major League debut that night at Oakland and went 0-for-3 with a walk...Collected first career hit on 8/7 at Tampa Bay off James Shields and recorded his first career home run on 8/28 at Yankee Stadium off Phil Hughes.

MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS:

2012: Was named to the Pacific Coast League's mid- and post-season All-Star teams while playing for Las Vegas (Blue Jays' Triple-A).

2011: Was named to the Eastern League's mid- and post-season All-Star teams while also being ranked by *Baseball America* as the league's "Best Defensive Shortstop".

2010: Made professional debut with Single-A Dunedin after signing with Toronto as a non-drafted free agent on 4/13.

PERSONAL: Adeiny Hechavarria Barrera (pronounced "ah-DAIN-ee etch-ah-vah-REE-yah")...Returned to his native Cuba during the 2017-18 offseason for the first time since defecting to pursue his baseball career in 2009...He and 11 others struck a

deal to escape Cuba by boat and come to the U.S. via Mexico in 2009...Lists Derek Jeter as his favorite baseball player...Enjoys fishing and playing video games...Also likes judo and soccer, along with Track and field.
