PITTSBURGH PIRATES (81-79) vs. CINCINNATI REDS (67-94)

September 30, 2018 at Great American Ball Park, Cincinnati, OH --- GAME #161/ROAD #81

RHP CLAY HOLMES (1-3, 7.25 ERA) vs. RHP SAL ROMANO (8-11, 5.37 ERA)

THE PIRATES... have won eight of their last 13 games and nine of their last 15...Have gone 14-8 in their last 22 games and 16-11 in their last 27...Won a season-high 11 straight games between 7/11-24...Have produced a 40-31 record since July 8 and have gone 44-38 in their last 82 games, dating back to 6/25...Were a season-high nine games over .500 following the action on 5/17 (26-17)...Were 73-87 after 160 games in 2017 (74-87 after 161 and 75-87 final).

SEE YOU IN MARCH: In just 179 days, the Pirates and Reds are scheduled begin the 2019 regular season in a 4:10 contest on Thursday, March 28 at Great American Ball Park.

ERA LEADERS: Trevor Williams (3.11) and Jameson Taillon (3.20) rank eighth and tenth respectively among the National League leaders in ERA...This marks the first time since 1991 that the Pirates will finish the season with two pitchers among the top 10 ERA leaders; Randy Tomlin (2.98) ranked eighth and Doug Drabek (3.07) was tenth that season.

THE DYNAMIC DUO: Jameson Taillon (14-9) and Trevor Williams (14-9) will share the team lead in victories this season...The last time the Pirates had two right-handed pitchers win 14 or more games in the same season was 1978 when Bert Blyleven (14-10) and Don Robinson (14-6) did so...The last season in which two Pittsburgh pitchers won 14 games or more was 1992; righthander Doug Drabek (15-11) and lefthander Randy Tomlin (14-9).

THE MEN BEHIND THE MASK: Elias Diaz hit his 10th home run of the season Friday night; his ninth from the catching position (also has one as a DH)...Along with Francisco Cervelli, who has hit 11 as a catcher, the Bucco backstops have combined for the fourth-highest total among catching units in the National League (20)...The last season in which the Pirates had two players hit 10 or more home runs from the catching position was 2012; Michael McKenry (12) and Rod Barajas (11).

MILESTONE APPROACHING: Clint Hurdle is one win shy of 1200 career victories as a Major League manager; he would join Bruce Bochy, Mike Scioscia, Buck Showalter and Terry Francona as the only current managers with 1200 career wins.

SEEING RED: The Pirates have won seven of their last eight games played against the Reds and have gone 9-2 in the last 11 meetings...The Bucs have posted a 13-5 record against Cincinnati this season.

DICKERSON DIALED IN: In 17 games played against the Reds this season, Corey Dickerson is hitting .380 (27-for-71) with nine doubles, a triple, five home runs and 13 RBI...He enters today's action with a .300 batting average after hitting .367 (22-for-60) in his last 17 games..Dickerson hit a career-high .312 with Colorado in 2014.

TRIPLE YOUR PLEASURE: The Pirates have 38 triples this season, the third-highest total in the National League and the most by the club in a single season since 2005 (also 38)...The last season in which the Bucs had more than 38 three-baggers was 2004 (39) and the last time they legged out 40 or more was 2003 (45).

THE LONG BALL: With 155 home runs hit as a team this season, the Pirates have surpassed last year's total of 151 with one game left to play...The last time the Bucs hit more home runs in a season was 2014 (156); they hit 161 in 2013...Pittsburgh has clubbed 16 home runs in the first eight games played at Great American Ball Park this year.

END OF THE ROAD: The Pirates are scheduled to wrap up the 2018 season with today's tilt in Cincinnati...The Bucs have gone 37-43 on the road in 2018, winning five of their last eight games and six of their last 10.

SEIZING THE CENTRAL: The Bucs have posted a 42-33 record against teams from the N.L. Central this season...It is Pittsburgh's second winning season against the division since it was formed in 1994...The Pirates went 45-31 against their divisional rivals in 2013.

WINNING WAYS: Dating back to July 8, the Pirates have produced the fifth-best record in the National League and the tenth-best in the Major Leagues...Pittsburgh's 41-31 record in that time trails only the Rockies (44-28), Cubs (44-31), Dodgers (42-31) and Cardinals (42-31) in the N.L....In addition, the Bucco pitching staff has posted a 3.39 ERA since July 8, the second-lowest mark in the Majors behind the Dodgers (3.25).

PROCEED WITH CAUTION: Francisco Cervelli has thrown out 21 runners attempting to steal against him and is now tied with Philadelphia's Jorge Alfaro for the most among National League catchers...Cervelli threw out a career-high 23 runners in his first season with the Pirates in 2015...Among all Major League teams this season, Pittsburgh is tied for fourth with 34 caught stealings by its catchers, trailing only Oakland (42), Baltimore (41) and Milwaukee (35).

CAN I ASSIST YOU?: Pittsburgh's 34 outfield assists this season lead all National League teams and trail only Detroit (35) for the most among all teams...The Bucco outfielders also led the National League in assists as recently as 2016 with 35.

GOLDEN IN LEFT FIELD: Among all National League left fielders, Corey Dickerson ranks first with a .996 fielding percentage and .960 zone rating...He has made one error in 263 total chances and is tied for second with his career-high seven assists...Dickerson has made a career-high 124 appearances (122 starts) in left field.

THE OUTFIELD: Pittsburgh's outfielders have recorded 210 extra base hits this season, the highest total for the club since 2008 (215)...The 210 extra base hits by the Bucco outfielders are also the most among N.L. teams and the third-most in all of Major League Baseball this season, trailing only the Red Sox (233) and Blue Jays (220).

THE NEW "K ROD": Richard Rodríguez leads all National League rookie relief pitchers with 88 strikeouts and is third among all Major League rookie relievers in that department...The only two rookie relievers in MLB with more punchouts are Tampa Bay's Ryan Yarbrough (104) and Los Angeles' Noe Ramirez (93)...His 88 strikeouts are also the most by a Pirates rookie reliever; righthander Blas Minor had the previous rookie record with 84 Ks 1993.

RECORD-SETTING RELIEVERS: For the first time in club history, the Pirates will have two relief pitchers with at least 80 strikeouts in the same season...Felipe Vázquez has whiffed 87 batters and Richard Rodríguez has punched out 88.
